NOVA SCOTIA. An army officer narrowly escaped drowning in Halifax on Tuesday evening.

Quick Passage.—The brigantine North Star, Anderson, master, arrived at Queenstown on the 28th inst., from Sackville, N. B., having made the passage in the remarkably short time of 18 days.

The steamer Northern, from Quebec for Pictou, N. S., stranded at Point St. Pierre, and was sold by auction at Quebec.

The ship Crown Prince, Hutchinson, master, from Montreal on the 10th ult., for London, grounded in Lake St. Peter.

Wrecked and Abandoned.—The Montana, which arrived at Queenstown previous to the 26th ult., reports having, on the 24th, in lat. 38 N., lon. 39 W., passed a vessel of about 1000 tons, bottom up, newly mated, with bow and stern gone, apparently not long in the water.

The bark Emma F. Secor.—The Triton arrived at Mauritius from Pondichery previous to the 5th inst., and reports having spoken on the 7th inst., brought Captain Crossman and crew of the schooner from London, New York, which went ashore at Marie Joseph on the 8th inst., in a thick fog, and became a total wreck.

The M. was from Port Caledonia, for New Bedford, Mass., with a cargo of coal. On the 8th inst. the hull and cargo were sold at public auction for \$10—eight dollars for the hull and material, and two dollars for the cargo.
