

The hatch coverings opening to the lower deck, where the convicts were confined, were removed; and around each hatchway, reaching from the upper deck, or roof of the convict's room, to the lower deck or floor, was one immense grating, formed of strong iron bars. This

Seen from below, on the convicts deck, every hatchway stood in the centre of the ship like a great iron cage, with a door by which the warders entered, and a

ladder to reach the upper deck.
