

The Reverend Georges Antoine Belcour was born on the 23rd of April, 1803, at La Baie du Febvre, then in the diocese of Three Rivers, His father was named Antoine Belcour; his mother Josephte Semire. The young Belcour made his studies in the Seminary of Nicolet, and was a ordained priest on the 10th March, 1827. His first clerical functions were performed as vicaire at Three Rivers. In 1829 he was appointed curs of St. Frascois du Lac; in 1830 he had charge of St. Martine. In 1831 the young priest volunteered for the arduous mission of the Red River.


