## Emigration to Manitoba.

WHATS WANTED TO START.

(From the Manitoba Liberal.)

A man coming to Manitoba to farm requires to take with him a team; and if he prefers coming by the States, he can purchase a team; plough and waggon at St. Paul nearly as cheap as in Cauda. In addition to these few requirments, he should have sufficient money to purchase a cow or two, and to support him for one year. The reason of this is that they rarely get settled carly enough in the Spring to get in full crops. Potatoes, barley, turnips, etc., can be grown the first ploughing.

The best time for a man to come to this country is about the middle of May, or, if possible, to be in soon after the snow disappears in the spring. By so doing he will be enabled to make a location, plough and fence a little, raise some cereals and roots, precure hay for the winter; and be able to creet a house to live in; and then for the following season he will be prepared to get in a good crop. 
