ANTIDOTE FOR INFECTIOUS DISEASES .-The bonzoate of soda has lately been The bonzoate of soda has lately been recommended as a superior antiseptic in all infectious diseases; it acts very powerfully, and it is claimed that a daily dose of from thirty to fifty grains to a full grown man will render the poison of diphtheria inoperative. The benzoate is prepared by dissolving crystallized benzoic acid in water, neutralizing at a slight heat with a solution of caustic soda, drying, and then allowing the solution to crystalize over sulphuric acid under a bell glass.
