When wardrobe and bureau drawers have a tendency to stick a thorough ap-plication of scap almost invariably proves effective. Take the drawers completely out, then use a piece of new and rather soft scap, or if hard, moisten it a little. Rub the scap inside the bureau over the trips on which the drawer slides, not for-setting the wide front piece. Treat the ower edges of the drawer itself in the ameway. Apply the scap until it comes off to the touch. Now put the drawer in gain, and pull it back and forth to dis-ribute the scap evenly, and you will no onger lose energy and temper on a stub-one drawer.

Now remove them with a poker, rinse in clear water and set on the stove to dry. This method takes out all the grease.


