(Coal Age.) The village of Gary, W. Va., has but one industry—coal mining—so the busi-ness of the Gary National Bank is al-most entirely with miners and not with farmers. There are 377 accounts held by for-eigners, representing 74.22 per cent. of those on the books of the bank, 109 held by native whites, representing 21.44 per cent. of the accounts, and 22 held by colored people, representing 4.84 per cent. of the accounts. In all, there are 508 accounts. The average deposit of the foreign born is \$308.79, of the na-tive white, \$811.84 and of the colored, \$217.19.

8217.19. The greater number of deposits held by foreigners is explained partly by the larger number of these men employed. The foreigners compose 58 per cent. of the men engaged, the native white 28 per cent. and the colored 24 per cent. It will be seen, however, how much more ready the foreign-born are to save money.

ready the foreign-born are to save money. The bank pays 8 per cent. interest semi-annually on deposits. As 3087 men were working for the company in No-vember, 1918, 16.4 per cent. of them must have been depositors at this bank. The deposits would probably be even larger if the purchase of U. S. MATRIMONY IN AUSTRALIA The striking increase in the birth and marriage rates of South Australia dur-ing recent years can be taken as an in-dication that the prosperity of the last decade has been shared by all classes of the community. Preliminary vital stat-istics for the year ended December 81, 1918, show that the improvement in the number of births and marriages propor-tionate to the population was well main-tained during the twelve months. The number of births was 12,627 (males 6.-500 and females 6127) the highest total registered in any one year and 548 more than in 1912. The number exceeded the average of the previous five years by 1928 or 20 per cent. The marriages during 1918 totalled 4094, the largest number on record, and thirty-eight more than in 1912. In his memorandum accompany-ing the statistics the registrar-general states that the figures for determining the mean population for the year are not yet available, but a rough estimate seems to show that South Australia, which had the highest marriage rate in the
