FINANCIAL.

Henry Claws & Co., report under date New York, August 16th.

The wheat crop now promises to surpass in quantity and quality the earlier estimates, 880 to 900 million bushels being now regarded as an impossible task for the special importance attached to this fact that wheat being largely an export crop the unprecedented supply of it gives us the greater power for controlling the return of the abnormal excess of gold for the last eight months. If Europe should need double the average supply of American wheat of the last ten years, we shall be in a position to send it. This fact cannot be reasonably denied a favorable allowance in estimating the probabilities of a reflux of gold to the United States.

It is quite possible that unfavorable features in the condition of European finances and commerce have been exaggerated in the common estimate. It always happens, after a panic, that fear is exaggerated and the effects are more serious than they might be. But it is well to remember that two panics never come in immediate succession. Immediately after the crash, recesses in the demand for money are usually timidly and caution on every side, yet the process is one of improvement. Extraneous factors have been some of the aspects of the late European panic, and the practical financiers of London, Paris and Berlin know how to gauge the market.
