

OF THE

PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH IN CANADA.

At Chatham, and within St. Andrew's Church there, the twentieth day At Unatham, and within St. Andrew's Church there, the twenteen day of April, one thousand eight hundred and ninety six years, at half past seven o'clock p. m., which day and place, the Synod of Hamilton and London, of the Presbyterian Church in Canada met, and after sermon by the retiring Moderator, the Rev. J. L. Murray, M. A., of Kincardine, from John's Gospel, chapter 4th, verse 24., was duly constituted by prayer. The Clerk then called the roll of all the ministers and elders within the bounds of the Synod, as attested by the several Presbytery Clerks.

The Moderator was, on motion duly made and seconded, requested to nominate a committee to strike standing committees for the ensuing Syncdical year.

COMMITTEE ON THE LICENSING OF STUDENTS.

Drs. Laing and McMullen.

SEDERUNTS OF SYNOD.

It was agreed that the Sederunts of Synod should be from 9.80 a. m., to 12 noon; from 2 p. m., to 5.30 p. m.; and from 7.30 to 10 p. m.; and that the first hour of the Sederunt to-morrow should be spent in devotional exercises, the Synod to meet for business at 10.80 a. m.

The Synod then adjourned, to meet to morrow morning for devotional exercises, at 9.80 a.m., and for business at 10.80 a.m., and was closed by the Moderator pronouncing the benediction.

SECOND SEDERUNT.

At Chatham, and within St. Andrews Church there, the twenty-first day of April, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-six, at 9 30 a.m.

The Synod met pursuant to adjournment, and engaged in devotional exercises from 9.30 to 10.30 a.m., the Moderator presiding. The following brethren took part in the devotions of the hour, at the Moderator's request: Drs. Jnc. Thompson, Battisby, A. D. McDonald and Messrs. Leich and Clark, ministers, and Messrs. Rutherford, Barrie, Rathburn and Reid, elders.

The minutes of last Sederunt were read and sustained.

REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON BILLS AND OVERTURES.

The Committee on Bills and Overtures presented their report, which was adopted, as the order of business for the forenoon and afternoon.

- 2. Communication from Rev. R. D. Fraser, regarding Young People's Societies.
- 3. Minutes of Assembly, disposing of the case of Mr. James Munroe.
- 4. Communication from Diocese of Toronto, anent Religious Instruction in Public Schools.
- Appeal of Mrs. Ross against a decision of the Presbytery of Huron, with recommendation that the case be sent for consideration to a judicial committee, to report at a later sederunt, after the papers have been read.

BUXTON FUND.

Dr. Laing, from the Committee appointed at last Synod to receive from . the Presbytery of Chatham the amount remaining from the Buxton Fund, and appropriate said amount, if the way be clear, in accordance with the decisions of former courts, reported that after full consideration, the Committee agreed to obtain the approval of the General Assembly for the final disposition of the Fund. This had been obtained, and the stock transferred, and the money, amounting to \$56.00, paid over to Dr. Reid, the late treasurer of the church, the entire proceeds being about \$3,800.

The Clerk read the minutes of the last General Assembly, finally disposing of the matter, as follows :-

There was read a memorial from the Synod of Hamilton and London, asking that the Assembly sanction the transference of the Buxton Trust Fund to the Agent of the Church, to be applied in aid of the Aged and Infirm Ministers' Fund. It was agreed, on the motion of Dr. Laing, to receive the memorial and grant its prayer."

YOUNG PEOPLE'S SOCIETIES.

A communication from Rev. B. Douglas Fraser, Convener of the General Assembly's Committee on Young People's Societies, was read, asking the appointment of a committee to be specially charged with the interests of such societies, and correspond with the General Assembly's Committee.

The nominating of such a committee was remitted to the committee to be appointed, to nominate standing committees for the year.

The recommendation of the Assembly's Judicial Committee was adopted, and is as follows:— "Sustain the finding of the Synod, and recommend the Session of St. Andrews Church, London, should Mr. Munro apply in regular form for restoration to church membership, to consider his case favorably, in view of his present state of mind, and, if it seems proper in their judgment, to grant bine a certificate of moments and the sense proper in the sense of t him a certificate of membership and disjunction from St. Andrews congregation.'

COMMITTEE TO STRIKE STANDING COMMITTEES.

The Moderator of Synod nominated the following as a Committee to strike Standing Committees: Dr. McMullen, John Thompson, C. Fletcher, John Ross, Dr. McIntyre, R. Pettigrew, ministers, and Messrs. Reid and Barrie, elders.

RELIGIOUS INSTRUCTION IN THE PUBLIC SCHOOLS OF ONTARIO.

The Clerk read a communication from the Anglican Synod of the Diocese of Toronto, adopted June 14th, 1895, asking the co-operation of the Synod to petition the Legislature of Ontario, so to amend the School Law as to make provision for such instruction being given for one half-hour daily during

school hours, by the ministers of the various Christian communities or their representatives, to the children of their own communion. The resolutions adopted by the Anglican Synod were also read.

After consideration, the following resolution was proposed by Dr. A. Hamilton, seconded by Dr. Laing: A communication from the Anglican Synod of the Docese of Toronto, regarding Religious Instruction in Public Schools having been read, resolved that a committee be appointed to draw up a resolution, to be submitted to the Synod at a future Sederunt, in reference to this communication.

It was moved in amendment by Dr. McMullen, and seconded by Dr. Thompson, that the Clerk be instructed to acknowledge receipt of the communication from this Synod of the Diocese of Toronto, and further that this Synod decline to take any action at present in the direction requested.

The vote being taken, the motion was carried by a majority, and the following appointed a committee in terms thereof: Drs. McMullen, Thompson, Hamilton and Laing, ministers, and Dr. McDonald, elder.

APPEAL OF MRS. ROSS AGAINST THE PRESBYTERY OF HURON.

The Synod then proceeded to consider the appeal of Mrs. Gavin Ross, against a decision of the Huron Presbytery. Parties were called to the bar, when there appeared for the Presbytery of Huron, Dr. A. D. McDonald and Mr. Neil Shaw; Mr. Henderson. of Hensall, for himselt; Mrs. Ross, and Mr. J. Rankin, B.A., elder, (who was allowed by the Synod to represent her in the conduct of the case.) The papers having been read, on motion of Mr. Dey, the conduct of the case.) The papers having been read, on motion of ar. Dey, it was agreed to appoint a judicial committee to meet with all parties, with a view to an amicable settlement of the case. Mr. Alex. Miller and Mr. Angus McKay dissented from this decision. The Moderator was instructed to nominate the committee.

The hour of adjournment having arrived, the Synod adjourned, to meet again at 2 p. m., the Moderator pronouncing the benediction.

THIRD SEDERUNT.

St. Andrews Church, Chatham, the 21st day of April, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-six. The Synod met pursuant to adjournment, and was duly constituted by the Moderator.

The minutes of last Sederunt were read and sustained.

RULING ELDERS AS MODERATORS.

The following remit from last General Assembly was read :-

⁴ It having come to the attention of the General Assembly, and it being admitted, that the Presbytery of Hamilton has appointed a Ruling Elder as their Moderator, the Synod of Hamilton and London is hereby enjoined to consider said appointment, and deal with the same according to the laws of the Church, and report to next General Assembly.

On motion of Dr. McMullen, the Hamilton Presbyterv was called to the Dr. Laing, Dr. Lyle and Dr. McDonald (Elder) were heard on behalf bar. of the Presbytery, in vindication of their right to appoint a Ruling El.er as Moderator of the Presbytery.

The Presbytery having been heard, was removed from the bar, and the Synod proceeded to give its judgment,

Dr. McMullen moved, seconded by Mr. Alex. Bartlet, as follows :-The Synod of Hamilton and London having, as enjoined by the General Assembly, considered the action of the Presbytery of Hamilton, in appoint-ing a Ruling Elder, Moderator of Presbytery, and having heard the Presbytery in justification of said action: in view of the far-reaching nature of such a change in the practice of the Presbyterian Church as that involved in the case under consideration, the Synod deems it expedient to refer the case, simpliciter, to the General Assembly. The Presbytery of Hamilton was cited apud acta to appear before the

next General Assembly, in view of said reference.

REPORT OF AUDITORS.

Mr. Alexander Henderson, on behalf of the Auditors, reported that they had examined the Treasurer's books and vouchers, and found the same carefully and correctly kept. The report was received and a unanimous vote of thanks given by the Synod to Mr. Rutherford, for his long-continued services as Treasurer.

BRANTFORD YOUNG LADIES' COLLEGE.

Dr. Cochrane presented the report of the Brantford Young Ladies' College for the year 1895-96, in which it was stated that in spite of the widespread financial stagnation prevalent during the years the strind nor of pupils was greater than last year; that the College had been visited and examined by the representatives of the Synod and General Assembly, and that there would be twelve graduates in the Arts and other departments in June next. The Directors of the College gratefully acknowledged the patronage extended the institution by the Ministers and officebearers of the Church in the past, and their continued assistance in making the College worthy of the denomination with which it is identified.

Dr. Cochrane having spoken in reference to the work done in the College, the following resolution was moved by Dr. John Thompson, seconded by Mr. Neil McPherson, and unanimously adopted :

That the report of the Brantford Ladies' College be received and adopted. Further, the Synod expresses its gratification at the high standard of efficiency maintained in all the departments of the College, and at the large attendance of students.

The Synod especially congratulates the Board of Directors on the superior attainments, ability and success of the present teaching staff, making special mention of Mrs. Rolls, the lady principal; and also notes with its highest approval the careful attention given to religious instruction.

The Synod confidently commends the College to the cordial sympathy and generous support of the Church at large, as an institution unsurpassed for its religious influence, pleasant surroundings, home-like comfort and thorough culture; and appoints the Rev. E. Cockburn, M.A., of Puris, visitor for the ensuing year.

COMMITTEE ON THE APPEAL OF MRS. GAVIN ROSS.

The Moderator nominated the following committee to meet with all the parties in the appeal of Mrs. Ross, with a view to an amicable settlement of the case: Dr. McMullen, Convener; Dr. Laing, Dr. Sutherland, Dr. Battisby, Dr. Thompson, Mr. Crawford, Mr. Tolmie, Ministers, and Messrs. Reid, Bartlett, Barrie and Wilson.

RELIGIOUS INSTRUCTION IN PUBLIC SCHOOLS.

Dr. McMullen, from the committée appointed to prepare a reply to the communication from the Anglican Synod of the Diocese of Toronto, reported the following resolution, which was unanimously adopted :-

That the Synod of Hamilton and London of the Prespyterian Church acknowledge receipt of the communication of the Anglican Synod of the Diocese of Toronto, in reference to Religious Instruction in the Public Schools of Ontario, and further, that this Synod, while holding very strongly the importance of the religious element in education, decline, in present circumstances, to take part in a public agitation on this question.

TRANSFERENCE OF CHURCHES.

Minutes of the Presbyteries of Paris and Hamilton were read, asking that Delhi, in the Presbytery of Hamilton, be transferred to the Presbytewy of Paris, the congregations and Presbyteries being united in the desire of Delhi being united to Windham, to form one congregation. The Synod agreed to grant the transference asked, and to place Delhi under the care of the Presbytery of Paris.

Minutes of the Presbyteries of Maitland and Bruce were read, asking a transference of the congregation of North Kinloss, Riversdale and Enniskillen from the Presbytery of Bruce to the Presbytery of Maitland. Both Presbyteries having united in this application, and the congregation having petitioned for the transference, it was unanimously granted by the Synod, and the congregation of North Kinloss, Riversdale and Enniskillen placed under the care of the Maitland Presbytery.

REFERENCE OF CHATHAM PRESBYTERY.

Minutes of the Presbytery of Chatham were read to the effect that a call had been given to a congregation within their bounds. to a student who at the time was not licensed, this fact not being known to the presiding Minister. The Presbytery asked the Synod that, as there was no intentional violation of the law, the Synod condone and sustain the action of the Presbytery in all the circumstances of the case. This was agreed to.

AUGMENTATION FUND.

Mr. J. C. Tolmie presented the report of the Synd's Augmentation Compiltee for the past year, which, after discussion, was accepted, and the following recommendations of the committee adopted :--

 That Presbyteries be instructed to send a deputation to each of those congregations which are markedly deficient in their contributions to this fund.

2. That Presbyteries, where it is possible, rearrange the fields so as to lessen the number of congregations now dependent on the fund.

The following were reappointed as the Synodical Augmentation Committee for the year: Hamilton Presbytery, Dr. Lyle; Paris, Mr. E. R. Hutt; London, Mr. Currie; Sarnia, Mr. McPherson; Chatham, Mr. Tolmie; Stratford, Mr. Duncan Stewart; Huron, Mr. Fletcher; Maitland, Mr. Robert Harrison; Bruce, Mr. John Johnston.

Synod should adopt and transmit to the General Assembly, with the view of its being considered by the Hymnal Committee :--

To the venerable, the General Assembly of the Presbyterian Church in Canada. The overture of the Synod of Hamilton and London humbly sheweth that :

Whereas, the Assembly's Hymnal Committee have revised the proposed selection of Psalms, with the aid of the Irish Version, thereby greatly improving the parts revised.

Whereas, there are many remaining inaccurracies, in rendering rhyme and rhythm some obsolete forms, and many uncouthnesses of style; and Whereas, these defects have been largely removed in the version used by

the U. P. Church of the U. S. of America, and that by very slight changes.

Therefore the General Assembly is humbly overtured to instruct its Hymnal Committee to revise still further the whole of Rouse's Version of the Psalms, or at least the proposed selections, making such mencations as may be suggested by the said U. P. Version, or any other version of the Psalms.

The overture was adopted, and Rev. W. J. Dey and Rev. John Thomson appointed to support it before the General Assembly.

NEXT MEETING OF SYNOD.

On motion of Dr. Cochrane, the Synod resolved to meet next year in River Street Presbyterian Church, Paris, on the last Monday of April, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-seven, at half-past seven o'clock.

The hour of adjournment having arrived, the Synod adjourned, to meet again at 7.30 p. m., the Moderator pronouncing the benediction.

At Chatham, and within St. Andrews Church there, the twenty-first day . of April, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-six, at half-past seven o'clock p. m., the Synod again met pursuant to adjournment, and was duly constituted, the Rev. Dr. Sutherland leading in prayer.

The minutes of former Sederunt were read and sustained.

APPLICATIONS ON BEHALF OF STUDENTS SEEKING TO BE LICENSED.

Dr. Laing, on behalf of the Committee on Applications for License, reported, recommending that leave be given to the Presbytery of Hamilton, to license Mr. J. T. Hall and Mr. H. A. McPherson, to the Presbytery of Paris, to license Mr. P. W. Anderson, and to Maitland, to license Mr. W. M. Burton. The report was adopted.

CHURCH LIFE AND WORK.

It was agreed to hear read the Synod's Report on Church Life and Work. as prepared by the Rev. Peter Wright, of Portage La Prairie, the convener of the committee on this subject, and afterwards, the reports prepared on certain departments of the subject by the conveners appointed by the Synod at its last meeting.

After the report had been read by the Clerk, Dr. Hamilton moved, duly seconded, that the Synod express its sincere thanks to Mr. Wright, for his

able, comprehensive and exhaustive report, and also for the many causes for gratitude that the returns from the various Presbyteries contain. Brief reports on the state of religion, on Sabbath observance, and Sabbath

schools, were presented by Dr. McIntyre, Mr. Shearer, and Mr. Ross, and the following resolutions on these questions adopted :-

ON THE STATE OF RELIGION.

1. That over the children of our congregations, who by their baptism have been recognized as members of the Church, and therefore under the affectionate oversight of Sessions, Ministers and Sessions be urged to exercise constant zeal and wise judgment to lead them to hearty public confession of Christ as their Saviour and King.

2. That Sessions be requested to consider the advisability of the reading of Scripture passages concerning Christian giving, before or during the taking of the offerings in our public services, in order to emphasize the fact that the offering of our substance unto the Lord is an important act of

worship. 3. That the Synod views with appreciation the beginnings of Missionary and would encourage and Libraries by the Y. P. S. C. E. of our Churches, and would encourage and approve of the founding of Missionary Libraries in every congregation.

ON SABBATH OBSERVANCE.

1. Resolved that we affirm our continued adherence to the historic teaching of the Presbyterian Church, on the universality and permanency of the Sabbath Law, and urge all Ministers and Christian workers to diligence and perseverance in systematic and positive instruction on this great and growingly important question.

2. Whereas, thure seems to be a growing tendency to desecrate the Lord's day, even on the part of members of our Churches, by spending the whole or a portion of it in the pursuit of pleasure, whether by driving, boating, cycling, social visiting, or such like. Therefore resolved, that the Synod affectionately but earnestly calls upon

all the members and adherents of the Churches within its bounds to do all in their power, both by example and precept, to counteract this dangerous tendency, threatening, as it does, to change the Holy day of God into a holiday of the world.

3. Whereas, there has been within the bounds of the Synod, a widespread outbreak on the part of street and radial railway and steamboat companies, of the profanation of the Lord's day, and of inroads upon its quiet and rest, by carrying on their local traffic for purposes of gain.

Therefore resolved, that the Synod earnestly counsels the Christian people within its bounds not in any way to compromise themselves by sharing in the profits of such unholy traffic, or, by their patronage, adding to such profits; and expresses its appreciation of the efforts of the Lord's Day Alliance, to enforce the law forbidding it, and cordially recommends the members of Bynod, acing in harmony with other Christians, to do all that lies in their power to increase the influence of the Alliance, by organizing new branches where none exist, or strengthening these already existing. 4. Whereas, the God given right of the working men, to a weekly day of

rest. is seriously threatened by the encroachments of enforced labor, whether on the Lord's day, or on the late hours of Saturday.

Therefore resolved, that the Synod expresses its hearty sympathy with them in this serious danger, and pledges them every assistance in its power in their efforts to preserve intact the Lord's day, and as well as to secure the early closing of shops on Saturday night, and if possible of a general weekly half-holiday in addition. 5. That the Synod strongly deprecates the holding, on the Lord's day, of

political and semi-political meetings, semi-sacred concerts, and public parades, accompanied, as they often are, by bands of music, whether by secret or fraternal societies, companies of militia, or other organizations, and would urge Christians generally and Ministers in particular, to discourage as far as they possibly can such gatherings, believing them to be a profanation of the Lord's day, and strongly tending to make it a day of amusement and pleasure.

6. That the Synod expresses its appreciation of the noble efforts of Mr. John Charlton. M. P., and other worthy laymen of our Church, in endeavoring to secure the enactment of a Dominion Act for the closing of canals on the Lord's day; prohibiting the publication of Sunday newspapers, and in other ways promoting the better observance of the day God has given for rest, worship, and the development of spiritual life.

ON SABBATH SCHCOLS.

1. That Pastors and parents be instructed to make efforts to secure a fuller attendance of the young people of the Church at the regular Sabbath services.

2. That the attention of Sessions be called to the desirability of having a larger number of their members actively engaged in Sabbath school work. 3. That parents and Sabbath school teachers be directed to encourage the

3. That parents and Sabbath school teachers be directed to encourage the memorizing of the Scriptures and the Shorter Catechism to a greater extent than is practised at present.

4. That all interested in the young be urged to use their most earnest and prayerful endeavors to lead them to a sincere and immediate decision for Christ, and to the manifestation of a true Christian life in the full membership of the Church.

⁵5. That the Synod strongly recommends that the Helps published by the Sabbath School Committee be used by the Sabbath schools within our bounds, and that liberal contributions be made to the funds of the committee.

ADDRESS OF REV. DR. ROBERTSON.

The Rev. Dr. Robertson, Superintendent of North West Missions and Moderator of the General Assembly, addressed the Synod at length on the Home Mission Work of the Church in the North West and British Columbia. His address was full of interesting details as to the progress and demands of the field. On motion of Mr. W. J. Clark. seconded by Mr. George Rutherford, of Hamilton, a cordial vote of thanks was tendered him for his eloquent appeal.

The Synod then adjourned, to meet again at 9.30 a. m. to-morrow morning, and was closed by the Moderator pronouncing the benediction.

St. Andrews Church, Chatham, the twenty-second day of April, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-six. The Synod met again pursuant to adjournment, at half-past nine a. m., and was constituted by the Moderator pro tem, Rev. Dr. George Sutherland, who presided until the arrival of Dr. Lyle, a few minutes later.

The minutes of last Sederunt were read and sustained.

STANDING COMMITTEES.

Mr. Colin Fletcher, from the committee appointed to strike standing committees, reported the following nominations, which were accepted by the Synod, end are as follows:-

PRERBYTERY RECORDS.

The committees appointed to examine the records of the Presbyteries of Hamilton, Paris, London, Sarnia, Chatham, Huron. Maitland, Bruce and Stratford, reported that they had examined these records and found them carefully and correctly kept. The Moderator was instructed to attest them in the usual form.

APPEAL OF MRS. ROSS.

The committee appointed on the appeal of Mrs. Ross presented their report through Dr. McMullen. the convener. The report was read in full and then on motion, was received by the Synol.

The Synod then proceeded to consider the report clause by clause.

During the discussion on these clauses, after questions had been asked, the Synod referred the matter back to the Judicial Committee, for further consideration, to report again, if possible, in half an hour.

The committee having returned, presented another report, which was, on motion received. Thereafter Dr. Hamilton moved, seconded by Mr. Becket, the adoption of the report, which was unanimously agreed to. The finding is as follows: The committee recommend that the so-called appeal of Mrs. Ross against the action of the Presbytery of Huron, on certain charges preferred by her against Mr. Henderson he dismissed; at the same time, as it appears from the Record that Mrs. Ross has for years had a grivenace against the Session of Hensall, inasmuch as she has been denied a certificate of Church membership, on the ground of certain charges never investigated, and from which she was given no opportunity of clearing herself, and that Mrs. Ross has not made any formal complaint against the action of the Session of Hensall, the committee recommend that the Presbytery be instructed to cite the Session before them, with a view to the removal of the grievance of which Mrs. Ross complains, and in order to the vindication of her good standing.

Parties having been called to the bar, all parties acquiesced in the finding of the Synod. Mr. E. H. Larkin, at the request of the Moderator, afterwards engaged in prayer.

Dr. A. D. McDonald, on behalf of the Huron Presbytery, craved extracts. The Clerk was also requested to send extracts to Mrs. Ross.

VOTE OF THANKS.

On motion of Dr. Cochrane, duly seconded, the cordial thanks of the Synod were tendered to the Minister and of office-bearers of St. Andrews Church, Chathâm, for the use of their building; to the Committee of Arrangement; to the friends in the city, for their kind hospitality; to the railway companies, and to the daily press, for the very full reports of the proceedings published by it.

The business being concluded, the Moderator, after devotional exercises, declared the Synod adjourned, to meet again in the Presbyterian Church, Paris, on the last Monday of April, 1897, at 7,80 p. m., and was closed with the benediction.
