



cort of 'injine' power, said the statement of the minister of railways regarding the cost of printing and advertising for the Grand Trunk was not correct. Hos. Mr. Haggart-I have gives the figures from a letter just received from Mr. Sergeant, general manager of the Gr.nd Trunk. (Applause). Mr. McAlister disapproved of the action of the railway department in re ducing the train sorvice and the staff on the I. C. R. He complained that under the preset arrangement the people in the northern part of New Brunswick, particularly in Restigouche, had poor railway accommodation, and urged that the minister of railways restore the former service. He maintained that such sweeping dismissals as had been made could have been avoided, as employes were gradually leaving, and instead of making new appointments, the service could be reorganized as necessity would require. He was informed on good authority that the present staff was not sufficient to do the work required.

Mr. Haggart gave comparisons of the working expences and earnings per train mile for the various railways in Canada with other records in the dominion. He stated that the summer time table would make the rervice more satisfactory.

Mr. Kenny said that if there was a loss in the transport of freight on the railway it was in respect to flour and grain and not coal. The road carried a very much more quantity of flour and grain than coal. He wanted to show that whatever loss there was in the road (that whatever loss there was in the roady carrying freight this was not all for the benefit of the maritime provinces as some Ontario members were fond of saying. Indeed the road was in this regard as much a benefit to the millers and manufacturers of Ontario as it was the maritime transitions. As to the to the maritime provinces.
