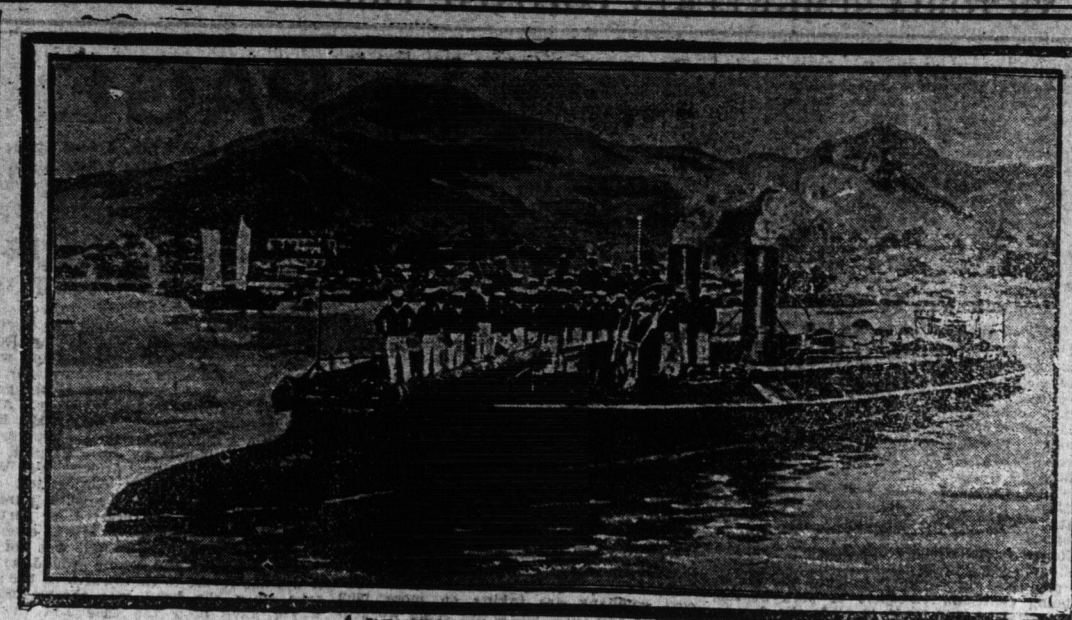

THE GRAND TRUNK PACIFIC RAILWAY.

Now that the shareholders of the Grand Trunk Railway Company have approved of the amended agreement with the Dominion Government for the construction and operation of the Grand Trunk Pacific Railway, the last obstacle to the carrying out of the enterprise may be considered as removed.

From the reports of the meeting of the shareholders in London on Tuesday last, it appears there was strong and well organized opposition to the Grand Trunk Company undertaking any responsibility in connection with the project.

It is not difficult to understand the reason for this opposition. While it is quite possible that the Vice-President of the Company was correct in his assertion that interested rivals had attempted to block the scheme, it is probable that another reason was advanced by many of the shareholders in their attempt to defeat or, at least, to postpone the proposal to approve the agreement with the Dominion Government.

The history of the Grand Trunk Company for nearly thirty years was a record of financial difficulties and disappointing results. The ordinary shareholders seemed for ever declaring the possibility of any return upon their capital, which through the straits to which the Company was often reduced had been in a constant state of liquidation.

The report telegraphed from Ottawa shows that the Dominion authorities will not pass the bill passed by the Provincial Legislature at the session last year regarding the construction of a transcontinental railway west of the land in question.
