Washademoak Lake.

Musquash Island.—Fixed white light, visible 10 miles.

Hendry Farm.—Fixed white light, visible 10 miles. In coming down, these two lights to be kept in range until opposite N W end of Hog Island, whence a southerly course to be kept to the foot of Musquash Island. In going up, the two lights to be brought in range opposite N W end of Hog Island, and kept in range until within $\frac{1}{2}$ mile of the light on Hendry Farm.

Light Houses in Nova Scotia.

Cape Sable.—On Cape. Latitude $43^{\circ} 23' 19''$. Longitude $65^{\circ} 37' 11''$. Revolving white light; bright 15s, dark 25s; visible in clear weather 12 miles. Octagonal white tower; stands 53 feet above high water mark. A steam fog whistle on southern point of Cape, elevated about 40 feet above high water. Sounds a blast of 10 seconds duration in each minute.

Stoddard Island.—On N. E. of Island. Latitude $43^{\circ} 28' 30''$. Longitude $63^{\circ} 43' 10''$. Red revolving light every minute. White Tower to guide vessels into the anchorage of Stoddard Harbor and Shag Harbor Sound.

Bon Portage Island.—On S. Point. Latitude $43^{\circ} 27' 16''$. Longitude $65^{\circ} 54' 39''$. Fixed white light. White octagonal tower for guiding vessels into Barrington, West Bay and Shag Harbor.

Seal Island.—On south point, one-eighth of a mile inland. Latitude $43^{\circ} 23' 34''$; longitude $66^{\circ} 0' 52''$. A fixed white light, visible 18 miles in clear weather. A white octagonal tower, 98 feet in height above high water. The Blond Rock lies S by W $3\frac{1}{2}$ miles from light house. A fog whistle near light house; sounds in each minute a blast of 5 seconds duration, and after an interval of 5 seconds another blast of 5 seconds.

Yarmouth, or Cape Forchu.—On Cape, south point. Latitude $43^{\circ} 47' 28''$; longitude $66^{\circ} 9' 21''$. Intermittent white light; light $1\frac{1}{2}$ m, dark $1\frac{1}{2}$ m; visible 18 miles in clear weather. Octagonal tower, vertical stripes, red and white; stands 117 feet above high water. Fog whistle on west side; sounds 10 seconds in every minute.

Pictou.—South point of entrance to harbor. Latitude $45^{\circ} 41' 30''$; longitude $62^{\circ} 39' 30''$. Two vertical fixed lights, 25 feet apart; upper part white, lower part red. Visible 11 miles in clear weather. Striped red and white vertically. Octagonal wooden tower; stands 65 feet above high water; lighted when navi-

gation is open; a small red light is seen below lantern. By keeping light W S W, vessels clear the east reefs off Pictou Island.

In Tower of Custom House, latitude $45^{\circ} 49' 10''$, longitude $62^{\circ} 30' 30''$; fixed white light, visible 8 miles; stands 60 feet above high water; in range with lights at entrance to harbor; leads to the channel up to the bar.

Bay of Fundy.

Cape Saint Mary.—East side Bay of Fundy. Latitude $44^{\circ} 5' 20''$; longitude $66^{\circ} 12' 40''$. Alternate red and white light every 30 seconds; visible 17 miles in clear weather; white octagonal tower; stands 103 feet above high water.

Brier Island.—N W point. Latitude $44^{\circ} 14' 57''$; longitude $66^{\circ} 23' 30''$; visible 13 miles; white octagonal tower; stands 92 feet above high water. Fog whistle on N W of Brier Island, south side of light house; sounds 3 blasts of 4 seconds duration, with interval of 4 seconds between them, each minute.

Boar's Head.—17 yards from edge of cliff. Latitude $44^{\circ} 24' 16''$; longitude $66^{\circ} 13' 0''$; alternate red and white every minute; visible 14 miles in clear weather; square white tower, 70 feet above high water. On south entrance to Petite Passage.

Point Prim.—South point of entrance to Annapolis Basin; latitude $44^{\circ} 41' 34''$; longitude $65^{\circ} 47' 20''$; fixed white light, visible 13 miles; square tower, vertical red and white striped; 76 feet above high water. Fog whistle on Prim Point, sounds eight seconds in each minute.

Port William, or Marshall Cove.—South shore. Latitude $44^{\circ} 56' 52''$; longitude $65^{\circ} 16' 0''$; two vertical fixed white lights, 22 feet apart, visible 10 miles; square white tower 92 and 70 feet above high water; lantern on top of dwelling, lower light in bow window, visible from W S W round N to E N E.

Margareville.—On extremity of Point S shore. Latitude $45^{\circ} 2' 57''$; longitude $65^{\circ} 4' 0''$; red fixed light, visible 8 miles in clear weather; square tower, horizontal black and white striped, 30 feet above high water; visible from W S W to E N E.

Isle Haute.—On highest point. Latitude $45^{\circ} 14' 35''$; longitude $65^{\circ} 0' 45''$; white intermittent light, showing 40s in every minute, visible 20 miles in clear weather, white square wooden tower, dwelling attached, almost hidden by trees; 365 feet above high water.

Black Rock.—South shore. Latitude $45^{\circ} 10' 10''$; longitude $64^{\circ} 46' 0''$; fixed white light, visible 12 miles; white square tower 45 feet above high water; visible from all points of approach.

Cape D'Or.—Fog whistle, on extreme point opposite side of channel from Black Rock; sounds during thick weather for 6s in every 30s; the whistle should be heard from 5 to 10 miles, according to the state of the wind and atmosphere.

Kingsport.—On Oak Point Pier. Latitude $45^{\circ} 9' 30''$; longitude $64^{\circ} 21' 45''$; fixed white light, visible 8 miles; upper enclosed part white, open frame brown, 30 feet above high water; visible from S W $\frac{1}{2}$ W, round by E to N W by W $\frac{3}{4}$ W.

Horton.—On bluff west side of Avon River. Latitude $46^{\circ} 6' 15''$; longitude $64^{\circ} 13' 30''$; fixed white light, visible 20 miles; white square tower, 92 feet above high water; light in window.

Walton Harbor.—Basin of Minas. Latitude $45^{\circ} 14' 0''$; longitude $64^{\circ} 0' 45''$. Fixed red light, visible 10 miles; white square tower, 92 feet above high water.

ASHTON'S PRINTS BY THE BALE.

Burnt Coat.—Basin of Minas, N W extremity of Head S shore. Latitude $45^{\circ} 18' 40''$; longitude $63^{\circ} 48' 30''$; fixed white light, visible 13 miles; white square tower, with lantern on dwelling, 75 feet high above high water; visible from all points of approach.

Spencer Point.—On north shore Cobequid Bay; latitude $45^{\circ} 23' 30''$; longitude $63^{\circ} 37' 0''$; fixed white light, visible 6 miles; 35 ft above high water.

Advocate Harbor.—On N W entrance; latitude, N, $45^{\circ} 19' 25''$; longitude, W, $64^{\circ} 47' 30''$; fixed red light; 36 feet above high water; visible 7 miles; square wood tower, painted white.

Parrsboro', or Partridge Island Light.—W side of river; latitude $45^{\circ} 23' 0''$; longitude $64^{\circ} 19' 0''$; fixed white light, visible 9 miles; white square tower, with lantern on dwelling, 37 feet above high water.

Apple River.—On Cape Capstow or Hetty Point, N entrance; latitude $45^{\circ} 28' 20''$; longitude $64^{\circ} 51' 30''$; fixed white light, visible 12 miles; white oblong tower, 64 feet above high water.

Hillsborough Wharf.—Petitcodiac River; latitude $45^{\circ} 55' 15''$; longitude $64^{\circ} 37' 45''$; fixed white light, visible 5 miles; open frame.

Grindstone.—W part of Island; latitude $45^{\circ} 43' 13''$; longitude $64^{\circ} 37' 25''$; fixed white light, visible 12 miles; white octagonal tower 60 feet above high water; visible from N E by E, round by N to E by S, Cape Enrage lighthouse S W by W $\frac{1}{2}$ W about 10 miles; in thick weather a trumpet sounds 4 blasts in every minute.

Cape Enrage.—Pitch of Cape; latitude $45^{\circ} 35' 34''$; longitude $64^{\circ} 46' 55''$; fixed white light, visible 15 miles; white square tower, 120 feet above high water; visible between the bearings of N W round by S to N E; a steam fog whistle 150 feet N E from lighthouse sounds 4 seconds in each minute; will be heard from 3 to 10 miles.

Quaco.—Temporary light on the Pitch of the Cape at West Head; latitude N, $45^{\circ} 19' 20''$; longitude W, $65^{\circ} 31' 55''$; a fixed white light on pole 20 ft high, and visible 6 miles.

Cape Spencer.—Pitch of Cape; latitude $45^{\circ} 12' 30''$; longitude $64^{\circ} 54' 0''$; alternate red and white light every 45 seconds, visible 20 miles; white square building with tower 207 feet above high water, visible between the bearings from E S E round by S to W N W, Partridge Island light bearing by compass N W by W $\frac{1}{2}$ W northerly, distant $6\frac{1}{2}$ miles.

Split Rock Automatic Buoy.—Moored in deep water about $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles S from Musquash Light. From a position $\frac{1}{2}$ mile outside of it steer E N E for Partridge Island, about 11 miles from this buoy, Point Lepreaux bears W about 11 miles.

Partridge Island.—St. John Harbor; latitude $45^{\circ} 14' 20''$; longitude $66^{\circ} 3' 20''$; fixed white light, visible 20 miles; tower vertical red and white stripes, 119 feet above high water; in foggy weather a steam whistle sounds for ten seconds every minute; a bell buoy near E side of Partridge Island reef.

Negro Point.—On end of Government Breakwater, W entrance Port of St. John. Fixed red light, 40 feet high; visible 8 miles.

St. John Harbor.—Beacon; latitude $45^{\circ} 15' 10''$; longitude $66^{\circ} 3' 40''$; fixed white light, visible 10 miles; vertical red and white stripes, 35 feet above high water.

Musquash, east side of entrance; latitude $45^{\circ} 8' 35''$; longitude $66^{\circ} 14' 30''$; fixed catoptric light, green to seaward, white towards harbor, visible 10 miles; white square tower, dwelling attached; 112 feet above high water; an automatic signal buoy moored in 30 fathoms, S W by S $\frac{1}{4}$ S from light, S $\frac{1}{4}$

MAGOG PRINTS BY THE CASE,

W from western head of Musquash, and W S W from Partridge Island; latitude N $45^{\circ} 7' 10''$; longitude W $66^{\circ} 14' 50''$.

Lepreaux, on Point; latitude $45^{\circ} 3' 40''$; longitude $66^{\circ} 27' 39''$; lights one above the other 27 feet apart; fixed white lights, visible 15 miles, striped horizontally red and white octagonal; 81 and 53 feet high; visible between the bearings of W N W around by S to E by N. A *Fog Trumpet* on the extreme end of the point on the south side of the lighthouse gives a blast of five seconds duration and a pause of 25 seconds then another blast of 5 seconds and a pause 25 seconds in each minute, making two blasts of five seconds each every minute. There will also be a *Fog Whistle* in the same building, which will be operated in the event of the *Fog Trumpet* being out of order, and will sound as follows: viz., giving two blasts of 5 seconds duration with an interval of 5 seconds between them in each minute, then a pause of 45 seconds to complete the minute.

Point Lepreaux Automatic Signal Buoy.—S S W one nautical mile off Point Lepreaux Light House; latitude N $45^{\circ} 2' 30''$; longitude W $66^{\circ} 27' 45''$.

Grindstone Point, Clifton.—Latitude $47^{\circ} 45' 40''$; longitude W $65^{\circ} 21' 0''$; fixed red light 88 feet above high water mark, visible 15 miles; square wooden tower, white.

St. Martins Head Fog Alarm.—Latitude N $45^{\circ} 29' 10''$; longitude W $65^{\circ} 11' 25''$; horn on summit of head will sound blasts of 14 seconds duration with intervals of 46 seconds.

Drew's Head, on west side of Beaver Harbor; latitude $45^{\circ} 3' 45''$; longitude $66^{\circ} 44' 0''$; fixed white light, visible 10 miles; white square tower 45 ft above high water, seen at all points between eastern and western head of harbor.

Pea Point, east side of entrance to L'Etang harbor; latitude $45^{\circ} 2' 20''$; longitude $66^{\circ} 48' 40''$; fixed green light, visible 10 miles; white square tower, dwelling attached, 51 feet above high water, visible from E round by S to N.

Bliss Island, west end of Island, south side of western entrance to Bliss harbor; latitude $45^{\circ} 1' 15''$; longitude $66^{\circ} 51' 0''$; fixed red light, visible 12 miles; white square tower 45 feet above high water; leave on starboard hand going in a deep water harbor and very plain, follow the starboard hand shore to the inner harbor.

L'Tete Passage on Mascabon Point; latitude $45^{\circ} 2' 20''$; longitude $66^{\circ} 53' 30''$; a fog trumpet sounds blasts of 7 seconds, with an interval of 30 seconds between each. Leave on starboard hand going in.

Midjic Bluff—Passamaquoddy Bay; latitude $45^{\circ} 6' 53''$; longitude $66^{\circ} 54' 30''$; fixed white light, visible 15 miles; white square tower 130 feet above high water; a Bar extends E N E from lighthouse, and vessels require to keep off a distance of 260 yards to clear it at low water.

St. Andrews, on sandy reef at east entrance; latitude $45^{\circ} 3' 45''$; longitude $67^{\circ} 0' 50''$; fixed white light, visible 10 miles; white square tower 40 feet above high water; to guide to all parts in inner Bay, and to vessels going up the river St. Croix from L'Tete Passage or West Quoddy. There is only a depth of 4 feet on the N W extension of the reef towards the mainland.

St. Andrews, north point of entrance; latitude $45^{\circ} 4' 10''$; longitude $67^{\circ} 2' 50''$; fixed white light, visible 10 miles; white octagonal tower 42 feet above high water; visible between the bearings of N W by N and S E by S.

Spruce Point, St. Croix River.—latitude $45^{\circ} 10' 0''$; longitude $67^{\circ} 11' 0''$; fixed white light; white square tower 32 feet above high water mark.

Mark Point, St. Croix River.—Latitude $45^{\circ} 10' 10''$; longitude $67^{\circ} 12' 30''$; fixed white light; white square tower 32 feet above high water mark.

Campobello Island, north point of Head Harbor; latitude $44^{\circ} 57' 10''$; longitude $65^{\circ} 54' 10''$; fixed white light, visible 15 miles; octagonal tower, white, with red cross, 64 feet above high water. Light on starboard hand in entering Head Harbor, and on port hand on entering Eastport, Me.

Lubec Narrows Light on Mulholland Point, Campobello.—Latitude $N 44^{\circ} 51' 47''$; longitude $W 66^{\circ} 58' 50''$; fixed white light, 60 feet above high water mark; visible 13 miles from N N E round by S to S S E; white wooden tower.

Head Harbor.—Fog trumpet at north point of Head Harbor; latitude $N 44^{\circ} 47' 50''$; longitude $W 66^{\circ} 54' 10''$; during thick weather and snow storm the trumpet will sound blasts of 8 seconds duration, with intervals of 35 seconds between them. Bring it to bear W S W to clear the Light House point. By keeping the middle of the river no dangers will be found between here and Eastport.

South West Wolf Island, on south east point of the Island; latitude $44^{\circ} 56' 30''$; longitude $66^{\circ} 44' 10''$; revolving white light every $1\frac{1}{2}$ minutes, visible 17 to 20 miles; white square tower 111 feet above high water; lantern on dwelling, visible from all points of approach.

Swallow Tail, north east part of Grand Manan; latitude $44^{\circ} 45' 52''$; longitude $64^{\circ} 44' 0''$; fixed white light, visible 17 miles; white octagonal tower 148 feet above high water; visible between the bearings of S W round by S to N W. A steam fog whistle on extreme north west head of Grand Manan; 80 feet above high water, sounds blasts of 4 seconds duration in each minute, with an interval of 16 seconds between each blast.

Grand Harbor, Grand Manan—on Fish Fluke Point, eastern side of Grand Harbor; latitude $N 44^{\circ} 40' 2''$; longitude $W 66^{\circ} 45' 2''$; fixed white catoptric light 40 feet above high water; visible 11 miles; square tower, painted white.

South West Head, Grand Manan—on Gull Cliff; latitude $N 44^{\circ} 36' 0''$; longitude $W 66^{\circ} 54' 16''$; revolving catoptric light; makes complete revolution in 2 minutes, showing 3 white and 3 red flashes at intervals of 20 seconds; 200 feet above high water; visible 24 miles; white square tower.

Old Proprietor Ledge, to the S E of Grand Manan Ledge. Latitude $44^{\circ} 33' 10''$; longitude $66^{\circ} 40' 0''$; visible 8 or 10 miles; a spindle beacon, painted red; a cage elevated 31 feet above high water mark.

Gannet Rock, on rock. Latitude $44^{\circ} 0' 38''$; longitude $66^{\circ} 47' 0''$; intermittent white light, 45'; eclipse $5\frac{1}{4}$ s, flash $4\frac{1}{4}$ s; eclipse $5\frac{1}{4}$ s in every 60 seconds; visible 12 miles; octagonal tower, vertical black and white stripes, 66 feet above high water; a gun is fired once every hour to answer signals during fogs and snow storms; dangerous rocks extend 4 miles eastward of the lighthouse.

Machias Seal Island, near middle of Island. Two lights 64 yards from each other. Latitude $44^{\circ} 30' 7''$; longitude $67^{\circ} 6' 13''$; fixed white lights, visible 14 miles; white towers 54 and 66 feet above high water; a fog whistle sounds in thick weather, fogs and snow storms, 5 seconds in each half minute.

New Brunswick—Gulf of St. Lawrence.

Point Peter, on Flat Rock, Gaspe. Latitude $48^{\circ} 37' 30''$; longitude $64^{\circ} 8' 45''$; revolving red catoptric, square tower, 50 feet high; visible 10 miles.

Dalhousie, south side of entrance to harbor. Latitude $48^{\circ} 3' 45''$; longitude $66^{\circ} 20' 50''$; fixed white light, visible 13 miles; white square tower 49 feet above high water, seen from all points of approach.

Dalhousie Range Lights. Front Tower on public wharf; fixed white light;

Latitude N 48° 4' 40''; longitude W 66° 22' 30''; back tower on Montgomery Island; front tower 24 feet, and back tower 27 feet above high water.

Heron Island, Chaleur Bay. Latitude 48° 0' 0''; longitude 66° 8' 0''; fixed white light, visible 15 miles; white square tower, 66 feet above high water, visible from all points seaward.

Petit Rocher, on Elm Tree Point; latitude 47° 48' 39''; longitude 65° 43' 13''; fixed light, visible 12 miles; white square tower 49 feet above high water mark.

Bathurst, on Caron's Point. Latitude 47° 39' 10''; longitude 65° 36' 40''; two fixed white lights, one visible 10 miles, white tower; the other visible 14 miles, square tower striped red and white, 43 feet above high water; range light to guide vessels into the harbor.

Campbellton Range Lights. Front tower on pier beside railway wharf; 24 feet above high water; back tower on Moffat's wharf; fixed white light, 24 feet above high water; Latitude N 48° 0' 50''; longitude W 66° 39' 40''.

Caraquet, on Island, Bay of Chaleur. Latitude 47° 49' 40''; longitude 65° 54' 0''; fixed white light, visible 14 miles; white square tower on dwelling 52 feet above high water.

Little Belledune Point. Latitude 47° 55m 20s; longitude 65° 53m 20s; a mast 28 feet high, fixed white dioptric; visible 11 miles.

Point a La Garde, Light Boat. Latitude 48° 3m 10s; longitude 66° 32m 10s.

Goose Lake, west side of Miscou Island. Latitude 47° 55' 43''; longitude 64° 35' 40''; revolving white light every minute, visible ten miles; white square tower, 40 feet above high water, complete revolution every 2 minutes.

Shippegan, Alexander Point. Latitude N 47° 43' 30''; longitude W 64° 39' 25''; fixed white catoptric light, 32 feet above high water, visible 11 miles; square white tower. A small light has been established 484 yards S W by W from main light 22 feet above high water, visible 9 miles in direction of range. Two lights range with buoy outside the harbor.

Miscou Island, Bireh Point. Latitude 48° 1' 0''; longitude 64° 29m 25s; fixed red light, visible 12 miles, white octagonal tower, 79 feet above high water. A steam fog whistle placed in the year 1875, and situate 107 yards east from lighthouse; sounds blast of 5 seconds duration, every half minute.

Pokenouche.—Latitude 47° 40' 5''; longitude 64° 45' 5''; fixed green light, visible 8 miles; white square tower with dwelling attached, 35 feet above high water.

Pokenouche Gully.—Latitude 47° 40m 10s; longitude W 64° 46m 0s; fixed red light, and buoys; visible 5 miles.

North Tracadie, one on north side of Gully, the other south side of Bar; latitude 47° 33' 14''; longitude 64° 51' 35''; two fixed white lights, visible 12 miles; white square tower, open frame, 30 and 39 feet above high water; coast and harbor range lights.

South Tracadie, north side of Gully. Latitude 47° 30' 0''; longitude 64° 52' 10''; two lights, back light 166 yards north from front one; fixed lights, front one white and back one red; visible 8 miles; front building an open white tower, back building square red tower; 20 and 26 feet above high water. Vessels crossing the Bar from sea should steer north, keeping the lights in range; width of Bar two cable lengths.

Tabusintac, Crab Island. Latitude 47° 18' 54''; longitude 64° 59' 30''; two fixed lights, front red and back white; visible 7 miles; white square tower 30 feet above high water; coast and harbor range lights.

Neguac. Latitude 47° 17' 47''; longitude 65° 3' 20''; two fixed white

lights, visible 11 miles; white square tower; 32 feet above high water; coast and harbor range lights situate north east of Gully.

Portage Island, on south point of Island. Latitude $47^{\circ} 9' 50''$; longitude $65^{\circ} 2' 40''$; fixed white light, visible 12 miles; white tower, 46 ft above high water.

Hay Island Range Lights, two Range Lights upon Hay Island, Miramichi Bay, to enable vessels, in seeking shelter, to clear the point of the shoal off the east end of the Island. Latitude $N 47^{\circ} 14' 10''$; longitude $W 65^{\circ} 3m 40s$; the front light is fixed white catoptric, exhibited from a lantern hoisted on a mast 15 feet high: it is elevated 23 feet above high water, and should be visible 10 miles: at the base of the mast is a small shed painted red. The back light is distant 210 feet from the front one: it is fixed white catoptric, elevated 30 feet above high water, and should be visible 11 miles; the building is a square wooden tower, 21 feet high from base to vane, and is painted white.

Oak Point, Miramichi Bay. Latitude $47^{\circ} 7' 40''$; longitude $65^{\circ} 15m 10s$; two fixed white lights, half a mile apart, visible 10 miles; white tower, 40 and 60 feet above high water. Beacons.

Sheldrake Island, Miramichi Bay. Latitude $47^{\circ} 6' 50''$; longitude $65^{\circ} 18m 0s$; two fixed white lights, quarter mile apart, visible 9 miles; 48 feet above high water. Beacons.

Grant's Beach, Miramichi Bay. Latitude $47^{\circ} 5' 30''$; longitude $65^{\circ} 28' 10''$; two fixed white lights, bearing S W and N E from each other, visible 10 miles; white tower 120 and 140 feet above high water. Beacons.

Middle Island, Miramichi River. Latitude $47^{\circ} 0' 3''$; longitude $65^{\circ} 19' 9''$; fixed white light, 45 feet above high water. Beacons.

Newcastle Light, on Lime Kiln Bank. Latitude $N 47^{\circ} 0m 45s$; longitude $W 65^{\circ} 33m 40s$; fixed red dioptric, 87 feet above high water; visible 9 miles; square wooden tower, white, with red roof.

Fox Island, north west point of Island. Latitude $47^{\circ} 8' 5''$; longitude $65^{\circ} 2' 20''$; three fixed white lights, visible 8 miles. One of the lights is situated within 100 feet of the most northern point of the Island: it is 50 feet above high water, and has a post 40 feet high. Second light is 1051 feet S E $\frac{1}{2}$ S from the first named, and will be 46 feet above high water, with a post 38 feet high. Third light is 954 feet S W from the first named, and 36 feet above high water, with a post 28 feet high. The first and second in line range N W $\frac{1}{2}$ W with the old Horseshoe Channel. The first and third in line range N E through Portage Island Channel. The second and third in line range W by N leading to the upper buoy of Horseshoe Shoal.

Fox Island, east end; latitude $47^{\circ} 6' 50''$; longitude $65^{\circ} 0' 10''$; two fixed white lights, visible 10 miles; white tower, 30 feet above high water mark; range lights to guide vessels through the Swashway Channel.

Miramichi Bay Light Ship, Horseshoe Bar, between Fox and Portage Island. Latitude $47^{\circ} 8' 0''$; longitude $65^{\circ} 3' 0''$; fixed red light, visible 8 miles; 35 feet above high water. A schooner rigged ship.

Preston's Beach, Miramichi Bay. Latitude $47^{\circ} 4' 50''$; longitude $65^{\circ} 54' 40''$; two fixed white lights, visible 10 miles, 55 and 60 feet above high water. White Beacons.

Escuminac, on Point. Lat. $47^{\circ} 4' 32''$; lon. $64^{\circ} 47' 30''$; fixed white light, visible 14 miles; white tower, 70 feet above high water. A steam fog whistle situated 100 yards west of the lighthouse, sounds 10 seconds in each minute.

Richibucto Head, on Headland. Latitude $46^{\circ} 39' 40''$; longitude $64^{\circ} 42' 30''$; fixed white light, visible 14 miles; white square tower, 70 feet above high water.

MONCTON AND HALIFAX SUGAR

Richibucto Harbor Range Lights, two range light towers, close to the present day beacons upon the South Beach, at the entrance to the Richibucto River. The front building is on the outside of the bank; white square tower, 33 feet high to vane on lantern; latitude N 46° 42' 45''; longitude W 64° 46' 10''; the light is fixed white catoptric, elevated 40 feet above high water mark, and should be visible 12 miles. The back tower is distant W by S $\frac{1}{2}$ S 306 feet from the front one; it is an open white square tower, 43 feet high to vane on lantern; the light is fixed red catoptric, elevated 44 feet above high water mark, and should be visible 12 miles. These two lights are intended to replace the day beacons, and in one lead through the channel over the bar at the mouth of the river.

Buctouche Range Lights.—Two Range Lights upon Dixon's Point, on the south side of Buctouche Harbor; latitude N 46° 27' 40''; longitude W 64° 38' 50''. The light is fixed white catoptric, 36 feet above high water mark, and visible 11 miles in direction of Range Tower, 30 feet high; white. The back range light is 1050 feet N W by W from the front one. The building is similar, 34 feet high, similar light, 41 feet above high water; visible 12 miles.

South Beach, entrance to Richibucto River; two range light towers; latitude N 46° 42' 45''; longitude W 64° 46' 10''; fixed white catoptric light 40 feet above high water, visible 12 miles. The back tower is distant W by S $\frac{1}{2}$ S 306 feet from the front one; open frame square tower 43 feet high, painted white. The light is fixed, red catoptric, 44 ft above high water, visible 12 miles.

Cassie's Point, on Point; latitude 46° 19' 15''; longitude 64° 30' 20''; revolving white light every half minute, visible 14 miles; white square tower, 40 feet above high water.

Shediac Island.—Latitude 46° 15' 20''; longitude 64° 31' 50''; two fixed white lights, visible 10 miles; white tower, 48 and 56 feet above high water. Beacons.

Shediac Harbor, Point du Chene Wharf. Latitude 46° 14' 20''; longitude 64° 31' 0''; fixed white light, visible 6 miles; 15 feet above high water.

Jourimain, on Cape. Latitude 46° 10' 0''; longitude 63° 48' 30''; flashing white light every 10 seconds, visible 14 miles; white octagonal tower, 72 feet above high water; visible from S W round to N W.

United States—Eastport to Boston.

[Sea Coast Lights are distinguished from Harbor Lights by the latitude and longitude being given. Sailing Directions are also given, not true nautical, but according to general compass courses and bearings].

West Quoddy Light. Latitude 44° 48' 54'' N; longitude 66° 57' 1'' W; tower of brick, painted with red and white horizontal stripes, connected with dwelling house by white building; fixed white light, visible 16 miles; situated on the west side of the entrance to Eastport and the St. Croix River, via Lubec Narrows. Fair anchorage in West Quoddy Bay 1 mile N W by N from the entrance. The Narrows have lately been dredged to a depth of 12 feet at low water, the Channel being 200 feet wide; but strangers should not attempt to pass through without a pilot. There is a Steam Fog Whistle at West Quoddy Head, giving a blast of 8 seconds duration at intervals of 52 seconds. Sail Rock, a dry ledge, lies $\frac{1}{2}$ of a mile from this Light, and when the tide is running should be carefully avoided.

Little River Light, on an Island at the mouth of Little River Harbor; tower white, attached to Keeper's dwelling; fixed white light varied by a flash 1m

30s; visible 11 miles; seen from N E by E $\frac{1}{2}$ E, via eastward to south. Also, fog bell, struck by machinery twice a minute. Latitude $44^{\circ} 39' 45''$ N; longitude $67^{\circ} 12' 5''$ W. Good anchorage for a small number of vessels just inside the Island. To enter harbor pass to eastward of the light, leaving a spar buoy on starboard hand.

Libby Island Light, on S W end of Libby Island, at mouth of Machias Bay and River; latitude $44^{\circ} 34' 5''$ N; longitude $67^{\circ} 22' 2''$ W; grey tower; fixed white light, visible 13 miles. Island is divided in two parts, with the Light situated on the S W end of the western part. To enter the harbor via eastern entrance, get Avery's Rock Light to bear N by E and run for it, leaving it handy on starboard hand, then N by E $\frac{1}{4}$ E, to a high, bluff, woody Island, which leave not less than $\frac{1}{4}$ of a mile on the port hand, then N $\frac{1}{2}$ W half a mile and anchor. In using this Channel, keep a sharp look out for the eastern end of Libby Island, which runs low, and extends 1 mile E N E from the Light, and for Cross Island Ledges, which make off from Cross Island on your starboard, and off which is a red can buoy. The Channel here is about a mile wide. To enter via western entrance: Pass Libby Island Light a fair berth on your starboard hand, and get it to bear S S W half a mile, then run N E by E until Avery's Rock bears N by E, then continue as via eastern entrance. A Fog Trumpet has recently been established here, located on the extreme S W end of the Island, giving in thick weather blasts of 7 seconds duration at intervals of 40 seconds. If the Trumpet becomes disabled, a bell will be struck by machinery, one blow every 10 seconds.

Avery's Rock, in Machias Bay, near mouth of River; tower built from the top of Keeper's dwelling, painted white; fixed red light, visible 12 miles.

Moosepeak Light. Latitude $44^{\circ} 28' 27''$ N; longitude $67^{\circ} 31' 57''$ W; white tower, white flash light, 30 seconds between flashes, visible 13 miles. Mistake Island is to the northwest side of entrance to Bay of Fundy. For entering Moosepeak harbor, leave the light a fair berth on your port hand, and steer about a N W course 1 mile, keeping midway between the shores on either hand, and as soon as passing through the Narrows haul towards the N E a few lengths and anchor. There is another small harbor about N N E, $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles from the light, called the Cow Yard. From Moosepeak Light, Libby Island bears N E by E $\frac{1}{2}$ E, 9 miles. Petit Menan Light W $\frac{1}{4}$ S, 17 miles.

Moosepeak Automatic Buoy, in deep water, off Moosepeak light; works by action of the sea; often heard 4 miles; Bearings—Moosepeak light bears N by W 2 miles, Petit Menan Ledge W $\frac{3}{4}$ S 15 miles, Petit Menan light W 15 miles, Libby Island light $\frac{3}{4}$ E 9 miles.

Nashe's Island Light: white tower; fixed red light, visible 12 miles. To enter Moosepeak Reach, west entrance, leave light on starboard hand; also, a guide to Pleasant River.

Narraguagus Light; in top of a white dwelling house; fixed white light, visible 12 miles. Located on Pond Island, at port hand side of entrance to Narraguagus Bay and Millbridge. Bell struck by hand to answer signals in thick weather.

Petit Menan Light; on Petit Menan Island. Latitude $44^{\circ} 22' 2''$ N; longitude $67^{\circ} 51' 51''$ W. Tall grey tower; white light, varied by a flash once in two minutes, visible 17 miles. This light is a warning against dangerous shoals, of which Petit Menan Ledge, or South East Breaker, bears S S E $3\frac{1}{2}$ miles, on which is 6 feet at low water, (Iron Nun Buoy) painted vertically red and black stripes. Sims' Rock bears S $\frac{1}{2}$ E 2 miles; 9 feet at low water.

(Spar Buoy). Tibbett's ledge bears E by N 3 miles, 9 feet at low water; no buoy. On Petit Menan there is also a steam fog alarm giving two blasts a minute; intervals between blasts 8 and 42 seconds; heard 8 miles. A dangerous neighborhood for strangers.

Prospect Harbor Light; on the eastern side of entrance to Prospect Harbor. White tower, showing a flashing red and white light, visible 11 miles. In running for the Harbor, bring the light to bear N $\frac{1}{2}$ E. But it is a dangerous locality for strangers.

Winter Harbor Light; white tower; fixed white light, visible 11 miles. On south point of Mark Island, western entrance to Harbor, leave on port hand; also, guide to Musquito Harbor.

Egg Rock Light; on Egg Rock, in Frenchman's Bay. White tower, rising from the middle of a square white dwelling. Fixed red light, visible 12 miles. Fog bell struck by hand for passing vessels. Bearings—Bar Harbor bears N W $\frac{1}{2}$ N 4 miles; Baker's Island bears S W by S $\frac{1}{2}$ S 8 miles.

Baker's Island Light; latitude 44° 14' 27'' N; longitude 68° 11' 56'' W; white tower, connected with Keeper's house; white light, varied by a flash every 90 seconds; on Baker's Island, off Mount Desert; a guide to Cranberry Island, north east and south west harbors. On entering either of these, leave light on port hand; but in going to Bass harbor leave it on starboard hand 1 mile. Bearings—Bass Harbor Head bears W $\frac{3}{4}$ N, 5 miles; Mount Desert Rock bears S $\frac{1}{2}$ W, 18 miles; Petit Menan Light bears E by N $\frac{1}{2}$ N, 16 miles.

North East Harbor Light; tower painted brown, with black lantern; fixed white light, visible 14 miles, on Bear Island; a guide to N E harbor by leaving it on the starboard hand.

Bass Harbor Head and Light; tower painted white; fixed red light, visible 13 miles; north east side of entrance to Bass Harbor and Blue Hill Bay, Mount Desert; a bell struck by hand to answer signals. To enter Blue Hill Bay and Bass Harbor bring this light within the bearings of W by N $\frac{3}{4}$ N and N W, and run for it, leaving the light 150 yards on starboard hand, to cross the bar in best water (10 feet at low water). When the light bears N by E you are in best water on the bar. If bound to Bass Harbor, when the light bears N E $\frac{1}{4}$ of a mile steer N $\frac{1}{2}$ W into the harbor, keeping the starboard hand shore within $\frac{1}{4}$ of a mile to clear Weaver Ledge, and anchor at will.

Mount Desert Rock; latitude 43° 58m 7s; longitude 69° 7m 42s; grey tower; fixed white light, visible round entire horizon 14 miles; on Mount Desert Rock, Maine; a bell struck by machinery. Bearings—Baker's Island bears N $\frac{1}{4}$ E, 18 miles; Petit Menan light bears N E $\frac{1}{2}$ E, 23 miles; Moosepeak bears N E by E $\frac{1}{4}$ E, 38 miles; Matinicus light W $\frac{1}{4}$ S, 33 miles. Vessels bound to St. John will run E N E straight up between Grand Manan and the American shore.

Burnt Coat Harbor Light; has recently been changed from two lights, to a single white light, visible 11 miles; on south end of Swan's Island. To enter harbor, bring the light to bear N E $\frac{3}{4}$ N, and run for it until quite close aboard, then haul to E by N about $\frac{1}{4}$ of a mile to anchorage.

Eggemoggin Light; white tower; fixed white light, visible 9 miles; on Green Island, at entrance to Eggemoggin Reach; also, guide to Ellsworth.

Saddle-Back Light; tower, upper part, grey; lower part, white; on an Islet near S W end of Isle au Haute; a guide to Isle au Haute Bay, and to East Penobscot Bay; fixed white light, visible 12 miles; leave on port hand fair berth and steer N $\frac{1}{2}$ W for Eagle Head light.

Mark Island Light, on an Island at the western entrance to Deer Island Thoroughfare, or to Merchants' Row; white tower; fixed white light, visible 12 miles. This station is in Isle au Haute Bay, bearing about N N E from Saddle Back 4 miles. To enter Thoroughfare, leave light on starboard hand; to enter Merchants' Row leave it on port hand.

Heron's Neck Light, on the south point of Green Island, the most southern one of the Fox Islands; a guide to Carver's Harbor and to Hurricane Sound; white tower, fixed red light; visible 14 miles.

Eagle Head Light, on Eagle Island, at the head of Isle au Haute Bay; guide to the N E entrance to Penobscot Bay. Vessels on entering will leave Saddle Back on the port hand and run straight for Eagle Head, leaving it on the port side; white tower, fixed white light; visible 13 miles.

Pumpkin Island; white tower; fixed white light, visible 9 miles; a guide to Eggemoggin Reach from the west; leave it on the starboard hand.

Diec's Head; white tower; fixed white light, visible 17 miles; west side of entrance to Castine Harbor, Maine.

Fort Point Light; white tower; fixed white light, on Old Fort Point; left hand side of entrance to Penobscot River.

Grindel's Point; white tower; fixed white light, visible 11 miles; on the north side of entrance to Gilkey's Harbor, on Long Island, Penobscot Bay.

Negro Island Light; white tower; fixed white light, visible 12 miles; at south side of entrance to Camden Harbor.

Indian Island Light; white tower; fixed red light, visible 12 miles; east side of entrance to Rockport Harbor, Penobscot Bay.

Brown's Head Light; white tower, attached to Keeper's dwelling; fixed white light, but showing red between the bearings S W by W $\frac{3}{4}$ W and W by S $\frac{1}{4}$ S, visible 11 miles. In entering Fox Island Thoroughfare from the bay, keep in the red light to clear the Fiddler and the Bay Ledges. Situated on western side of Fox Island, and at east side of western entrance to Thoroughfare. Is extinguished when Thoroughfare is closed by ice.

Owl's Head Light; white tower; fixed white light, visible 15 miles; guide to Rockland harbor; also to vessels bound up or down western Penobscot Bay. Fog bell struck by machinery 4 times a minute.

White Head Light; latitude 43° 58m 42s N; longitude 69° 7m 28s W; grey tower, connected with white dwelling; fixed white light, visible 13 miles; at western side of western entrance to Penobscot Bay; also a steam fog alarm, giving a blast of 4 seconds duration, followed by interval of 26 seconds.

Matinicus Light; this has recently been changed from two white lights, to a single fixed red light of the 2nd order, which proves to be more a source of annoyance to navigators, than a benefit. Also, a 12 inch steam fog whistle, sounding blasts of 5 seconds duration with intervals of 25 seconds. Located on Matinicus Rock. Latitude 43° 47' 0'' N; longitude 58° 51' 18'' W. Bearings—Mount Desert Rock bears E $\frac{1}{4}$ N, 33 miles; Monheigan Light bears W by N 21 miles. Course to Portland Head, W $\frac{3}{4}$ N, 64 miles.

Monheigan Light; latitude 43° 45m 52s N; longitude 69° 18m 57s W; grey tower; white flash light, visible 19 miles, flashing once a minute; on Monheigan Island. Bearings—Matinicus bears E by S, 21 miles; Seguin Light bears W $\frac{3}{4}$ N, 20 miles; White Head Light bears N E $\frac{3}{4}$ E, 18 miles. Also, on Manancus Island, near Monheigan, a steam fog alarm, giving a blast of 15 seconds duration, at intervals of 40 seconds.

Franklin Light; white tower; fixed white light, varied by flash; on Franklin Island; a guide to vessels entering Thomaston, Me.; leave it on starboard hand going in.

Pemaquid Point; white tower; fixed white light, visible 14 miles; west side of entrance to Bristol Bay, and east side of entrance to John's Bay.

Townsend Light; white tower; fixed white light, visible 13 miles; on Burnt Island, west side of entrance to Townsend Harbor, Boothbay, Maine.

Ram Island Light; on Ram Island at eastern entrance to Townsend Harbor. Fixed white light with a red ray between bearings $W \frac{1}{4} N$ and $W \frac{3}{4} N$, and another between $N E$ by E , and $N E$. In entering from seaward mariners should keep within the red light to avoid dangers.

Sheepscott Light; white tower; white flash light, visible 12 miles, flashing twice a minute; on Hendrick's Head, on the east side of Sheepscott Bay, and entrance to Sheepscott River; guide to Southport and Wiscasset.

Kennebec Light; on Pond Island, at entrance to the Kennebec River. White tower; fixed white light, visible 13 miles. Also, a bell struck by machinery 8 times a minute. This light will be left on the port hand by vessels entering the Kennebec River.

Seguin Light; latitude $43^{\circ} 42m 25s N$; longitude $69^{\circ} 45m 31s W$; grey tower; fixed white light of the first order, visible 24 miles; on Seguin Island, off the mouth of the Kennebec River; to enter the river, leave the light on the starboard hand, and run for Pond Island. Also, a steam fog whistle, sounding blasts of 8 seconds duration at intervals of 52 seconds. Bearings—Half-way Rock light bears $W \frac{1}{4} N$, 13 miles; Pond Island light bears N , $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles; Cape Elizabeth bears W by S , 22 miles; Monheigan light bears $E \frac{1}{2} S$, 20 miles.

Half-Way Rock Light; latitude $43^{\circ} 38m 21s N$; longitude $70^{\circ} 2m 13s W$; grey tower; fixed white light, varied by red flashes, flashing red once a minute; on Half-Way Rock, Casco Bay. Bearings—Seguin light bears E , 13 miles; Portland Head bears W , 8 miles; Cape Elizabeth bears $W S W$, 9 miles.

Portland Head Light; latitude $43^{\circ} 37m 22s N$; longitude $70^{\circ} 12m 29s W$; white tower; fixed white light, visible 15 miles; on west side of entrance to Portland Harbor. Also, a Daboll's air trumpet, giving blasts of 8 seconds duration once in 40 seconds.

Portland Breakwater; white tower; fixed red light, varied by a red flash every 40 seconds, visible 8 miles. This is a harbor light, and stands on the end of the granite breakwater extending out from the south side of the harbor; to be left on the port hand in passing up the harbor.

Cape Elizabeth Lights; latitude $43^{\circ} 33m 50s N$; longitude $70^{\circ} 12m 9s W$; two white towers, 900 feet apart, and ranging $N E$ by E and $S W$ by W ; easterly light white, fixed; westerly light white, varied by flash once a minute, visible 18 miles. Also, a fog trumpet, giving two blasts of 5 seconds each with an interval of 8 seconds between them, then a pause of 42 seconds. Bearings—Boon Island Light bears $S W \frac{1}{4} S$, 30 miles; Thatcher's Island bears $S W \frac{3}{4} S$, 62 miles. These lights are a warning against dangerous shoals, of which Alden's Rock is mostly to be feared, bearing $S E$ by $E 2\frac{1}{2}$ miles, on which is 6 feet of water at low

water; the others range from 14 to 18 feet at low water. To approach Portland at night, get Portland Head Light to bear N N W and run for it, leaving it a fair berth on the port hand, then run N by W 1 mile, then N $\frac{3}{4}$ W till Breakwater light bears N W by W $\frac{1}{4}$ W, then run N W 1 mile and anchor.

Automatic Buoy; a whistling buoy of the largest class is placed near Old Anthony Shoal, on which is 18 feet at low tide. In making this buoy in thick weather and wishing to enter Portland, pass $\frac{1}{2}$ of a mile inside of it and run N by E $\frac{1}{2}$ E $4\frac{1}{2}$ miles, when Portland Head will bear about N N W, when proceed as before. This buoy is often heard six miles.

Wood Island Light; latitude 48° 27m 23s N; longitude 70° 19m 45s W; white tower; red flash light, visible 13 miles, flashing once a minute; near entrance to Saco River, and guide to Winter Harbor and Biddeford Pool, by leaving it on port hand. Also, a bell struck by machinery, two blows in rapid succession, followed by an interval of 25 seconds, then one blow. To enter the north-eastern channel in day time run in to north-eastward of the light until the church steeple in the Pool settlement bears S W by S $\frac{1}{4}$ S, and run for it, leaving Negro Island on the left and Stage Island on the right and anchor as soon as in past Negro Island. There is another channel to the westward of the light, but more dangerous.

Goat Island; latitude 43° 21m 27s N; longitude 70° 25m 31s W; white tower; fixed white light, visible 11 miles; (harbor of refuge) on the north side of entrance to Cape Porpoise harbor (near Kennebunk); leave on starboard hand going in.

Boon Island; latitude 43° 7m 16s N; longitude 70° 28m 36s W; grey granite tower, 133 feet above high water; fixed white light, visible 18 miles; off York. Bearings—Cape Elizabeth lights bear N E by N, 30 miles; Matinicus lights bear E by N, 80 miles; Cape Ann lights bear S by W $\frac{3}{4}$ W, 30 miles; Isle Shoals light bears S W $\frac{1}{4}$ S 12 miles.

Automatic Buoy; a whistling buoy is placed just off Boon Island ledge; it is painted red and black in horizontal stripes, with "B I L" painted in white on the middle black band. Is often heard 6 miles. It bears E by S $3\frac{1}{2}$ miles from Boon Island light. The ledge is a wash at low water.

Cape Neddock Light; white tower; fixed red light, visible 15 miles. Also, a bell striking one blow every 30 seconds. Two dangerous ledges, York Ledge and the Triangle, lie S by W and S S W, respectively, from this light about 4 miles distant. York Ledge is marked with an Iron Spindle. The Triangle simply with a common can buoy.

Isle of Shoals; latitude 42° 58m 0s N; longitude 70° 37m 25s W; white tower; light, flashing, red and white, visible 15 miles, flashing every 20 secs; on White Island, the most south western of the Isle of Shoals cluster, off Portsmouth, N. H. Bearings—Boon Island light bears N E $\frac{1}{2}$ N, 12 miles; Whale's Back light bears N N W, 7 miles; Newburyport Bar bears S W by W 13 miles; Cape Ann lights bear S, 17 miles.

Whale's Back Light; latitude 43° 3m 30s N; longitude 70° 41m 48s W; old tower white, new tower natural granite color; fixed white light, varied by flashes, visible 13 miles; flashes once in $1\frac{1}{2}$ minutes. Fog trumpet giving blasts at intervals of 30 seconds. Also, a bell, struck by hand, both located in the old tower; all to be left on starboard hand going into Portsmouth.

Portsmouth Harbor Light; white tower; fixed white light, visible 14 miles; on left side of inner entrance to Portsmouth harbor. To enter Portsmouth harbor get Portsmouth light to bear N $\frac{3}{4}$ W, and run for it until Whale's

Back light bears S E by E and you are abreast the southern end of Wood Island, then steer N $\frac{1}{2}$ E until past Fort Point, and Portsmouth lighthouse bears W by S $\frac{1}{2}$ S, then steer N W until the light bears S by E, and anchor; or, when Portsmouth light bears S by E, steer S W $\frac{3}{4}$ S, and anchor close in shore in the cove to the westward of Fort Constitution in from 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ to 6 fathoms. Strangers in entering Portsmouth harbor should take a pilot if possible.

Newburyport Harbor Light; white tower; fixed white light, visible 12 miles. Also, a beacon, range of light, 336 feet in front of main light; black and white tower; fixed white light, visible 8 miles. These lights, in range, guide across the bar, in best water; bar constantly changes; outer bar buoy is in range with inner bar buoy and both lights; the beacon is moved as the channel changes. This station is on the north end of Plum Island, and on the south side of entrance to the Merrimac River, Mass. (Strangers should not attempt to enter.)

Newburyport Upper Harbor; two lights (beacons); outer beacon, black tower, fixed red light, visible 10 mls.; inner beacon, red tower, fixed green light, visible 12 miles.; both on Bailey's wharf, and to be left on port side passing up the harbor.

Ipswich Lights; on Castle Neck, south side of entrance to Ipswich River; a main light, with a range light in front; main light fixed, white, varied by flashes, visible 11 miles, flashing once in 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ minutes, shown from a white tower; range light, fixed, white, visible 8 miles, shown from a black tower; the lights are 625 feet apart, N E $\frac{1}{2}$ E and S W $\frac{1}{2}$ W; in range, they guide to entrance of channel across Ipswich Bar in the best water, which at present is but 6 feet at low water.

Annisquam Light; white tower; fixed white light, visible 13 miles; a harbor of refuge for small vessels; on Wigwam Point, east side of entrance to Annisquam harbor; 6 feet of water on Squam Bar at low tide. To cross the bar, bring the light to bear south and run for it, leaving it on the port side; then run for the Lobster Rock Beacon, and leave it on the port side also.

Straitmouth Island; on south side of Sandy Bay, entrance to Rockport harbor; white tower; fixed white light, visible 11 miles; to be left on port hand in going to Rockport. Bad ledges lie off this light. Strangers should keep the north shore of Sandy Bay best aboard on entering Rockport; shelter only for a few small vessels.

Cape Ann Lights; latitude 42° 38m 15s; longitude 70° 34m 30s W; two grey granite towers, 165 feet above sea level; fixed white light, visible 20 miles; the lights are 900 feet apart, in range at S S W and N N E; located on Thatcher's Island off Cape Ann, and the northern limit of Massachusetts Bay; to be left on the starboard hand in going towards Boston. Bearings—Isle of Shoals bears N, 17 miles; Boon Island N N E, 30 miles; Gloucester Light S W by W $\frac{1}{4}$ W, 6 miles; Long Island Light S W by W, 24 miles; Cape Cod Highland Light S by E $\frac{3}{4}$ E, 43 miles; Londoner Ledge S E by E, $\frac{1}{2}$ mile; Salvage Ledge N N E, 2 miles. Also, a 10 inch steam whistle, giving each minute a blast of 8 seconds and a blast of 4 seconds, with alternate intervals of 4 and 44 seconds.

Gloucester Light, on Eastern Point; on east side of entrance to Gloucester harbor; white tower; a revolving red light, showing once every 5 seconds, visible 9 miles. When coming from the Eastward, bound into Gloucester harbor, give the light a good berth to clear Eastern Point Ledge (spar buoy); then, when the light bears N E $\frac{3}{4}$ N, run N W $\frac{1}{2}$ N until the upper harbor light bears N E by N $\frac{1}{2}$ N, then run for it, and anchor $\frac{1}{2}$ mile S by W from

the light. Also, a bell on Eastern Point, alternately giving a double and single blow, then an interval of 30 seconds, then a single blow followed by an interval of 30 seconds.

Gloucester Harbor Light, on Ten Pound Island, east side of entrance to inner harbor; white tower; fixed white light, visible 11 miles; to enter harbor, bring this light to bear N E by N $\frac{1}{2}$ N, and run for it until Eastern Point Light bears S S E, and anchor in channel way or continue until Eastern Point light bears S, then steer E N E until Ten Pound Island light bears N, and anchor in S E harbor, in from 4 to 6 fathoms—hard mud; or, from this point steer about N W by N between Ten Pound Island Ledge buoy and Ten Pound Island, (giving the point of the Island a good berth) until the light bears E, then steer N $\frac{1}{2}$ E until the light bears S by E, and anchor in western harbor.

Automatic Buoy; a whistling buoy is moored three fourths of a mile, S by W from Eastern Point Light, which is removed from May 15th to October 15th of each year.

Baker's Island Lights; latitude 42° 32m 10s N; longitude 70° 47m 10s W; two white towers, ranging S E and N W; fixed white light, visible 15 miles; located on the north end of Baker's Island, south side of entrance to Salem and Beverly harbors. In coming from the southward vessels bound to Salem keep the lowest light open to the east of the high light, and run for it; this guides to the eastward of the South-east Breakers and Sear's Rock. Give Baker's Island a berth of not less than half a mile, leaving it on the port hand, then run for Hospital Point Light, bearing about W by N $\frac{1}{2}$ N, until Derby Wharf light is in range with Fort Pickering light, when Salem harbor will be to the W S W of you, and Beverly harbor W by N $\frac{1}{2}$ N. Also, on Baker's Island a bell which strikes two quick blows each half minute. For better information, a lens panel has been placed in "Hospital Point" Light, which makes a more brilliant light in the line of the ships' channel from Baker's Island than on either side, and serves to keep vessels from danger on either side.

Hospital Point; grey tower; fixed white light, visible 13 miles; on Hospital Point, north side of entrance to Salem and Beverly harbor.

Fort Pickering Light; red tower; fixed white light, visible 10 miles; on Winter Island, north side of entrance to Salem harbor. On entering Salem harbor from near Hospital Point, get Derby Wharf light in range with Fort Pickering light to clear the Haste Shoal; good anchorage half a mile S W by S from this light, with Derby Wharf light bearing W by S.

Derby Wharf Light; on the end of Derby Wharf, Salem upper harbor; red tower, fixed red light, visible 9 miles.

Marblehead Light, on Marblehead Neck, south side of entrance to Marblehead, and to Salem South Channel; white tower; fixed white light, visible 11 miles; good anchorage half a mile W by S from this light. To enter harbor, bring the light to bear N W, and run for it until within two miles of it, then bring it to bear W N W, and run for it, leaving Marblehead Rock (a high rocky Islet with beacon at top) 150 yards on your port hand, and when it bears S W run N W $\frac{3}{4}$ N until the light bears S by W, then run S W $\frac{3}{4}$ W into the harbor, and anchor between the light and the town.

Egg Rock Light; white tower; fixed red light, visible 12 miles; guide to Swampscot anchorage and to Broad Sound. Leave it 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ miles on the starboard hand on entering Broad Sound.

Minot's Ledge Light; latitude $42^{\circ} 16m 9s N$; longitude $70^{\circ} 45m 34s W$; entrance to Boston Bay; granite tower, natural color, 100 feet high; fixed white light, visible 17 miles. Davis' Ledge Buoy bears E by S; Boston light bears N W $\frac{1}{2}$ W, 7 miles. This course must be kept good, northerly, to pass Bell Boat, off the north side of the Harding's Ledge (about $4\frac{1}{2}$ miles from Minot's Ledge Light). A good mark to clear the Harding's Bell Boat, after passing Minot's light, is to keep Long Island Head light (fixed white) just open to the north of the Narrows light, which is a red light.

Boston Light; latitude $24^{\circ} 19m 39s N$; longitude $70^{\circ} 53m 25s W$; on Little Brewster Island, north side of entrance to main ship channel to Boston; white tower; white flash light, flashing once every half minute, visible 17 miles. Also, an air trumpet, giving blasts of 7 seconds, followed by interval of 43 seconds. From Cape Cod highlands the course for Boston Light is N W by W $\frac{1}{4}$ W, which well clears Minot's Ledge and the Hardings; then, when well past Minot's, bring Boston light to bear W by N $\frac{1}{2}$ N and run for it until within $\frac{1}{2}$ of a mile of it or until the Beacon light bears about W by N, then run W $\frac{1}{4}$ S until the Beacon light bears W N W, then run W by N leaving the Beacon light 100 yards on your starboard hand, then steer S W $\frac{1}{4}$ W (keeping the middle of the channel) for the Narrows between Galloups and Lovell's Islands, then about N W $\frac{3}{4}$ N for the bell buoy off Nix's Mate, which leave on port hand, then run W by N $\frac{1}{4}$ N for Fort Independence, leaving the lower middle buoy, red can, No. 6, a good berth on your starboard, and State Ledge buoy, red, Nun, No. 8 close aboard on your starboard; then run about N W $\frac{1}{4}$ N for the upper middle buoy, black, Nun, No. 9, which, leave on your port, then the course to Long Wharf or to good anchorage is about N W $\frac{1}{4}$ W. If making Boston ship channel from Cape Ann, get Thatcher's Island light to bear N N W from 2 to 3 miles, then steer S W $\frac{1}{4}$ W until Boston light bears W. by N $\frac{1}{2}$ N. Then proceed as before given.

Narrows Light; brown house; fixed red light, on the right hand side of Narrows, in ship channel entrance to Boston harbor.

Long Island Light; on the N E end of Long Island and southern side of entrance to Boston inner harbor: white tower; fixed white light, visible 16 miles. In coming up ship channel, and after leaving Nix's Mate buoy on the port hand, and Long Island Light bears W by S $\frac{1}{2}$ S, run W by N $\frac{1}{4}$ N for the south end of the Castle until the Castle North Wharf bears N W by W $\frac{3}{4}$ W, or abreast of the State Ledge Buoy (red, No. 8), then N W $\frac{1}{4}$ N to the Upper Middle Buoy (black, No. 9), which leave on port hand, then the course to Long Wharf is N W $\frac{1}{4}$ W. But if approaching Boston from Cape Ann, via Broad Sound, bring Long Island Light to bear S W by W, and run for it until Deer Island Point Beacon bears N W by N $\frac{1}{2}$ N, three-eighths of a mile distant, then W by N $\frac{1}{4}$ N up the harbor. Strangers should bear in mind that in the middle of Broad Sound there is but 8 feet of water at low tide; but by keeping on the southern side of the Sound, leaving the Graves Automatic Buoy half a mile on the port hand and the Devil's Limb Buoy (black can No. 1) $\frac{1}{2}$ mile on port hand, and running straight to Ram's Head buoy (black can buoy No. 5) about W S W, passing Aldrich's Ledge buoy (black can No. 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ mile on port), then leaving Ram's head 50 yards distant on port, and run about W $\frac{1}{4}$ S to clear Deer Island Point Beacon, you can carry 12 feet safely. From the Beacon you will steer W $\frac{3}{4}$ N for lower middle buoy, then W by N $\frac{3}{4}$ N for State Ledge buoy, when proceed as before given.

Explanatory.

Aphelion—The point of a Planet's orbit farthest from the Sun.

Apogee—That part of the Moon's orbit farthest from the Earth.

Astronomical Day is reckoned from noon to noon through the 24 hours. Thus, July 21, 9h, is 9h A of July 21, and July 21, 15h, is 3h M of July 22.

Conjunction—A Planet directly between the Earth and the Sun is said to be in Inferior Conjunction with the Sun. A Planet with the Sun directly between it and the Earth is said to be in Superior Conjunction with the Sun. Planets are said to be in conjunction with each other, or with the Moon, when they are in the same sign and degree.

Declination—The distance of a heavenly body from the Equinoctial, measured north or south, in degrees or minutes, on a Meridian.

Ecliptic—The plane of the Earth's orbit, so called because Eclipses can take place only when the Moon is on or near it.

Elongation—The distance of a Planet from the Sun as seen from the Earth.

Equinoctial—The circle in the heavens traced by the Earth's Equator.

Node—That part of the orbit of a heavenly body which intersects the Ecliptic. If the body is passing from south to north, it is called the Ascending Node; if from north to south, Descending.

Opposition—A Planet with the Earth directly between it and the Sun is said to be in opposition to the Sun.

Penumbra—That portion of space around the shadow of the Earth passing through which the Moon diminishes in brightness, in consequence of a part only of the Sun's rays reaching her surface.

Perigee—That part of the Moon's Orbit nearest to the Earth.

Perihelion—That part of a Planet's Orbit nearest to the Sun.

Quadrature—Two heavenly bodies are said to be in Quadrature when they are distant from each other by one-fourth of the Zodiac, or three signs apart.

The Sun's Declination and fast or slow of clock are given for apparent noon, or time of passing the Meridian of St. John.

The Moon's Southing is given in Astronomical time for the Meridian passage at St. John; and her Declination, when on the Meridian.

The Rising of the Moon is given from Full Moon to New Moon; and the Setting from New Moon to Full Moon.

TIDES.

The Tides in the Calendar are the Morning and Afternoon Tides at St. John and Charlottetown. In the Tide Table (page 36) will be found Constants for finding the time of High Water at each of the places given in the Table.

In editions of this Almanac prior to 1885 the Tides were only given approximately, but ever since they have been corrected for the varying distance of the Moon from the Earth, and also her angular distance from the Sun. They can now be depended on as accurate to at least the same degree as the Admiralty Tide Tables.

It will sometimes be found that when a Constant is added to the time of High Water at the Port of reference the sum exceeds 12 hours; in this case

subtract 12 hours from the sum and the remainder will be the time of High Water at the required Port on the succeeding afternoon or morning, according as the Tide at Port of reference was a Morning or Afternoon Tide.

EXAMPLE.

High Water at St. John, January 10th,.....	11h. 38m. M.
Moncton add,.....	54m.

	12h. 32m.
Subtract,	12 0

High Water at Moncton, January 10th,	0h. 32m. A.

It will sometimes be found that a Constant to be subtracted is greater than the time of High Water at the Port of reference: in this case add 12 hours to the Time at the Port, subtract the Constant, and the remainder will be time of High Water at the required place for the previous Morning or Afternoon, according as the Tide at the Port of reference was an Afternoon or Morning Tide.

FORECASTING THE WEATHER.

Men have, from a very early period, studied the weather, on account of its great influence on their pursuits, in order if possible to predict its nature, and prevent those losses to the Farmer and the Sailor which result from violent storms.

The earlier students based their predictions on the phases of the moon, but an examination of the Greenwich observations for more than half a century has shown that this theory is entirely unfounded. Weather prophets like Moore, Zadkiel and Vennor claim in their Almanacs to be able to forecast the weather day by day for a whole year; but meteorological science in the British Isles, and the Signal Service of the United States, with the Weather Bureau of the Dominion, does not claim to forecast, with any certainty, the weather for more than three or four days at the most.

If an observer could obtain, at regular and repeated intervals, readings of the Barometer at stations distributed over a large area, he would be enabled to trace the march of the storm, for it has been found that the wind always blows towards the place of the lowest barometer reading; and so, by means of the telegraph, he may warn those places the storm is approaching. Still, mistakes are often made, and the forecasts are not always infallible, so that much remains to be done before meteorology can be ranked among the exact sciences.

County Courts.

The Courts were established by 30th Victoria, cap. 10, passed June 17, 1867. The Act authorizes the appointment of one County Court Judge for the Counties of Charlotte, Carleton, Victoria and Madawaska; one County Court Judge for the Counties of York, Sunbury and Queens; one County Court Judge for the Counties of Westmorland and Kent; one County Court Judge for the Counties of Northumberland, Gloucester and Restigouche; one County Court Judge for the County of the City and County of St. John; and one County Court Judge for the Counties of Kings and Albert; provided always that said Court for the City and County of St. John shall not have or exercise any jurisdiction in any cause in which the City Court of St. John, or the City of Portland have jurisdiction.

The act also authorizes the appointment of a Clerk for each Court, who shall be an Attorney. The sittings of the respective Courts shall be held at or near the County Court House in the shire town.

The County Courts have not cognizances of any action —

1st. When the title to land is brought in question; or

2nd. In which the validity of any devise, bequest, or limitation is disputed, except as hereinafter mentioned; or

Subject to the above, the County Courts have jurisdiction, and may hold plea in all personal actions of debt, covenant and assumpsit, when the debt or damages do not exceed the sum of four hundred dollars; and in all actions of tort, when the damages claimed do not exceed two hundred dollars; and in actions on bonds given to a Sheriff or otherwise in any case in a County Court, whatever may be the penalty or amounts sought to be recovered.

Sittings of the County Courts.

The Courts hold Terms every year in each County, which Terms annually commence as follows:—

Charlotte County—On the second Tuesday in the month of June; on the fourth Tuesday in February and October.

Carleton County—On the second Tuesday in March and December, and the second Tuesday in July.

Victoria County—On the Tuesday after the fourth Wednesday in March, the fourth Wednesday in June, and the third Wednesday in November; and on the first Tuesday in December for return of executions only.

York County—On the second Tuesday in January, third Tuesday in March, and first Tuesday in June and October.

Sunbury County—On the third Tuesday in the months of January and June, and on the Wednesday next after the second Tuesday in October.

Queen's County—On the fourth Tuesday in January and June, and on the third Tuesday in October.

King's County—On the first Tuesday in January, April, July and October.

St. John County—On the fourth Tuesday in the months of January, April, July and October.

Albert County—On the third Tuesday in June, and on the second Tuesday in November.

Westmorland County—On the first Tuesday in June, and the second Tuesday in September and December, and on the first Tuesday in March; the September Term only for return of executions.

Kent County—On the third Tuesday in January, on the last Tuesday in April, and on the first Tuesday in July and fourth Tuesday in October.

Northumberland County—On the fourth Tuesday in January, the first Tuesday in April, the fourth Tuesday in July, and the third Tuesday in October.

Gloucester County—On the third Tuesday in March, and second Tuesday in July, and the first Tuesday in November.

Restigouche County—On the fourth Tuesday in March, the third Tuesday in July, and the second Tuesday in November.

Weights and Measures Inspection.

The Weights and Measures Act provides that two gallons shall be a peck and eight gallons a bushel, and that after January 1st, 1886, in contracts for the sale and delivery of any of the under-mentioned articles, the bushel shall be determined by weight, unless conveniences for weighing are not available, or unless a bushel by measure is specially agreed on in writing, the weight equivalent to a bushel being as follows: Wheat, 60 pounds; Indian Corn, 56 pounds; rye, 56 pounds; peas, beans and clover seed, 60 pounds; barley, timothy seed and buckwheat, 48 pounds; malt, 36 pounds; oats, 34 pounds; flaxseed, 50 pounds; hempseed, 44 pounds; blue grass seed, 14 pounds; castor beans, 40 pounds; potatoes, turnips, carrots, parsnips, beets and onions, 60 pounds; bituminous coal, 70 pounds. Power is also given to the Governor—

in-Council to specify the weight of other articles equivalent to a bushel. Violations of the foregoing provisions subject the offender to a penalty not exceeding \$25 for the first offence and not exceeding \$50 for each subsequent offence.

ADDITIONAL REGULATIONS.

1. All apples packed in Canada for sale by the barrel shall be packed in good and strong barrels of seasoned wood made as nearly cylindrical as may be; the staves of such barrels shall be twenty-seven inches in length from Croe to Croe, with heads from sixteen and one half to seventeen inches in diameter; and such barrels shall be sufficiently hooped with a lining hoop within the chimes, the whole well secured by nails.

2. Every person who offers or exposes apples for sale by the barrel, otherwise than in accordance with the foregoing provisions of this section, shall be liable to a penalty of twenty-five cents, for each barrel of apples so offered or exposed for sale.

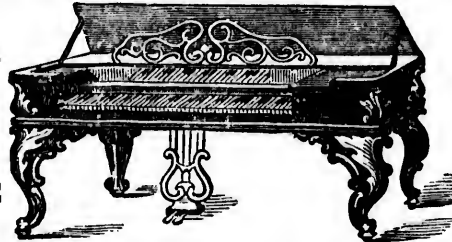

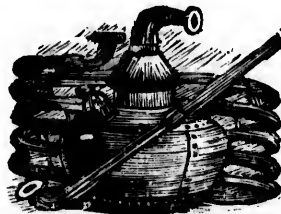

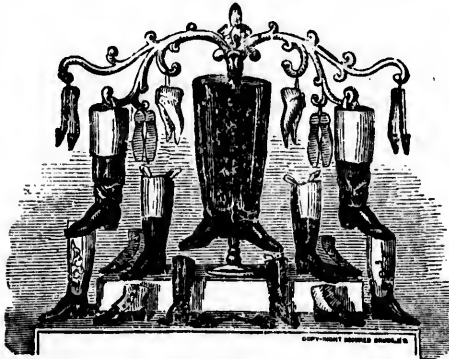

HACKNEY CARRIAGES—Rates of Fare.

The prices or rates of fare to be taken and recovered by and paid to the owner, driver, or other person having charge of any licensed Hackney Carriage shall be as follows; that is to say: for conveying one passenger from any public stand to any other part of the City, or from any one part of the City to any other part thereof, the sum of thirty cents, and for every additional passenger of the same household, each twenty cents; other passengers, not of the same household, each thirty cents. When detained at any place by any passenger, there shall be an additional fare of fifty cents every half hour detention. When agreement for hire is made by the hour, the fare shall be the sum of one dollar for each hour, and in that proportion for each division by the quarter of the hour. In case any driver shall be required to cross the ferry of the harbour to or from Carleton, he shall in addition to the above fare, receive twenty cents additional rate for one passenger, or more than one of the same household; but if not of the same household, then twenty cents such additional fare for each passenger; and also in addition to the fare, he shall receive the ferriage charges for himself, his carriage and horses, both going

Every owner, driver or person having charge of any Hackney Carriage shall, when requested so to do, carry with each passenger one trunk and also an additional valise, carpet-bag, portmanteau, bundle, basket, or other article used in travelling, without charge or compensation therefor; and for every additional trunk or other article more than hereinbefore provided, he shall be entitled to demand and receive the sum of five cents.

Cartage Districts.

First District—To comprise all that part of the City lying between and within the North side of Union street, the East side of Prince William street, and the South side of Duke Street.

Second District—To comprise all that part of the City outside of the First District, which lies between and within the East side of Mill Street, at the City line, North side of Pond Street, East side of Peel Street, North side of Carleton Street, East side of Coburg and Charlotte Streets, and South side of Queen Street.

Third District—To comprise all that part of the City outside of the Second District that lies between the City line on the North, the East side of Dorchester Street, North side of Hazen Street, East side of Garden Street, Northerly side of Paddock Street, Easterly side of Waterloo Street, East side of Sydney Street, and South side of Saint James Street.

Fourth District—To comprise all that part of the City outside of the Third District that lies between and within the City line on the North, to the Westward of a line at right angles to the said City line; and which strikes the intersection of the Easterly line of Coburg with the Northerly line of Hazen Street, the Easterly side of Coburg Street, Northerly line of Cliff Street, Westerly side of Waterloo Street, Northerly side of Richmond Street, Easterly side of Brussels Street, Easterly side of Carmarthen Street, and Southerly side of Main St.

Fifth District—To comprise all that part of the City outside of the Fourth District that lies between and within the City line on the North, the Southerly line of the General Public Hospital Grounds, the Northerly side of Jordan's Alley (so called), lying between Waterloo and Brussels Sts., Easterly side of Brussels Street, Northerly side of Clarence Street, Easterly side of St Patrick Street, Easterly side of Wentworth Street, and Southerly side of Main Street.

Sixth District—To comprise all that part of the City outside of the Fifth District which lies between and within the Northerly side of Clarence Street, Easterly side of Saint David Street, East side of Pitt Street, and South side of Main Street.

Seventh District—To comprise all that part of the City lying to the South of the South side of Main Street, and to the East of the East side of Pitt and Saint David Streets, and to the South of the North side of Clarence Street.

Eighth District—To comprise all that part of the City lying to the Northward of the North side of Clarence Street, to the Eastward of the East side of Brussels, and Northward of the Northerly side of the said Jordan's Alley, and Northward of the Southerly line and bound of the General Public Hospital Grounds.

Rates of Pilotage.

By-Laws to amend the Pilotage By-Laws of 1875 and the By-Laws amending the same.

Transporting—If any Pilot shall be employed in the removal of any ship or vessel within the port or Harbour of St. John, from any mooring ground to any wharf, or from any wharf to any mooring ground, or from one wharf to another wharf, and such Pilot shall see said vessel properly secured and moored, he shall be entitled to demand and receive for such services as follows: Provided always, that if on the arrival of any ship or vessel into the Harbour of St John, circumstances prevent ship or vessel from being placed on the mooring ground or at the berth intended by the master, owner or consignee of such ship or vessel, it shall be the duty of the Pilot piloting such ship or vessel inward, to pilot the same when being removed to such mooring ground or berth, if such removal takes place within twenty-four hours after the arrival of such ship or vessel as aforesaid, without any extra charge for the same.

A Chronometer keeping correct Greenwich time should then show 5h 24m 15s, and the difference between this and the time shown by a Chronometer, is its true error on Greenwich time at the moment. As the above hour of one o'clock when the Ball drops, represents 5h 24m 15s at Greenwich, the error of a Chronometer may be ascertained, no matter where the ship is lying. Masters of vessels arriving at Saint John should compare their Chronometers by the time Ball, as it will enable them to get the sea rate, which frequently varies from harbour rates. Rule for Measuring the Capacity of a Square Cistern.

Multiply the length in feet by the width in feet, and multiply that by 1.728, then divide by 231. The quotient will be the number of gallons capacity of one foot in depth.

Rule for Measuring the Capacity of a Circular Cistern.

Multiply the square of the diameter by .7854, or the square of the circumference by .07958, in order to find the area of the cistern, then multiply the

area by the depth in inches, and divide the product by 231. The quotient will equal the number of gallons the cistern will contain.

In measuring cisterns, etc., $31\frac{1}{2}$ gallons are estimated to one barrel; 63 gallons to one hogshead.

Capacity of Boxes.

A box 24 inches long by 16 inches wide and 28 inches deep will contain five bushels.

A box 24 inches long by 16 inches wide and 14 inches deep will contain two and one-half bushels.

A box 14 inches wide, 23 1-25 inches long and 10 inches deep, will contain one and one-half bushels.

A box 16 inches square and 8 2-5 inches deep will contain one bushel.

A box 16 inches long by 8 2-5 inches wide and 8 inches deep will contain one-half bushel.

A box 8 inches square and 8 2-5 inches deep will contain one peck.

A box 8 inches long by 8 2-5 inches wide and 4 inches deep will contain one gallon.

A box 8 inches long by 4 inches wide and 4 1-5 inches deep will contain one-half gallon.

A box 4 inches square and 4 1-5 inches deep will contain one quart.

Facts for Builders.

One-fifth more siding and flooring is needed than the number of square feet of surface to be covered, on account of the lap in siding and matching of flooring.

A cord of stone, 3 bushels of lime and one cubic yard of sand will lay 100 cubic feet of wall.

Twenty-two cubic feet of stone, when built into the wall is 1 perch.

Three pecks of lime and four bushels of sand are required to each perch of wall.

There are 20 common bricks to a cubic foot when laid; and 15 common bricks to a foot of 8-inch wall when laid.

Five courses of brick will lay one foot in height on a chimney; 8 bricks in a course will make a flue 4 inches wide and 10 inches long.

Fifty feet of boards will build one rod of fence five boards high, first board being 10 inches wide, second 8 inches, third 7 inches, fourth 6 inches, fifth 5 inches.

Cement, 1 bushel, and sand, 2 bushels, will cover $3\frac{1}{2}$ square yards 1 inch thick, $4\frac{1}{2}$ square yards $\frac{3}{4}$ inch thick, and $6\frac{3}{4}$ square yards $\frac{1}{2}$ inch thick. One bushel of cement and 1 of sand will cover $2\frac{1}{2}$ square yards 1 inch thick, 3 square yards $\frac{3}{4}$ inch thick, and $4\frac{1}{2}$ square yards $\frac{1}{2}$ inch thick.

Two thousand shingles, laid 4 inches to the weather, will cover 200 square feet of roof, and $10\frac{1}{2}$ pounds of four-penny nails will fasten them on.

Antidotes for Poisons.

When the poison is unknown, give a prompt emetic of warm water and mustard, ipecac or salt water, and then give white of eggs freely, lard, olive or other bland oil, except in case of phosphorous poisoning. If the source of poisoning is known, the following treatment will be indicated :

For Arsenic or White Precipitate.—Give a prompt emetic, followed by a mixture of chalk and castor oil, until sesqui-oxide of iron can be obtained from the druggist.

For Lead Poisoning, Corrosive Sublimate, Saltpeter, White Vitriol, Blue Vitriol, Vermilion.—A prompt emetic, followed by white of egg, and fresh milk, given freely.

For Lye Poisoning.—Give freely of oil or warm lard and white of egg, followed by warm water and mustard, or ipecac.

'CHRISTMAS, NEW YEAR, EASTER AND BIRTHDAY CARDS.

Nitrate of Silver, or Lunar Caustic.—Use moderately of strong solution of common salt, and then give freely of fresh milk.

For Strychnia and its Salts.—An emetic, followed by tannic acid and chlorine.

For Carbohc Acid.—Olive or castor oil, given freely.

For Ammonia, Caustic Soda, Caustic Potash.—Give oil freely; and afterward give water with vinegar or lemon juice in it.

For Opium, Laudanum, Morphine, Aconite, Belladonna, Digitalis.—A prompt emetic, followed by strong coffee; cold applications to shock the system. Lower the head to cause flow of blood to the brain, keep in motion.

A good emetic is one teaspoonful of salt mixed with one teaspoonful of mustard in a pint of warm water.

For eruptions caused by poison oak or ivy, the following prescription is most valuable. Have it filled at the druggist's:

R. Acid Carbolic.....half a drachm.

Ol. Sassafras and Ol. Juniper..... each one drachm.

Ung. Zinc Oxide (Benz.)one ounce.

Apply two or four times daily.

Hints for Housekeepers.

ANTS, RED.—Sprigs of winter-green or ground ivy will drive away red ants. Branches of wormwood will serve the same purpose for black ants. The insects may be kept out of sugar barrels by drawing a wide chalk mark around the top, near the edge.

BOOTS.—To make leather boots waterproof, saturate them with castor oil; to stop squeaking, drive a peg in the middle of the sole.

CLINKERS.—To remove clinkers from stoves or fire brick, put in about half a peck of oyster shells on top of a bright fire. This may need repeating.

GREASE SPOTS.—To remove grease spots, thoroughly saturate with turpentine, place a soft blotting paper beneath and another on top of the spot, and press it hard. The fat is dissolved, then absorbed by the paper, and entirely removed from the cloth.

GILT FRAMES.—To restore gilt frames, rub with a sponge moistened in turpentine.

INK STAINS.—To remove stains of ink, wash carefully with pure water, and apply oxalic acid. If the latter changes the dye to a red tinge, restore the color with ammonia.

PAINT.—Chloroform will remove paint. When the color of a fabric has been destroyed by an acid, ammonia is applied to neutralize the same; after which an application of chloroform will, in almost all cases, restore the original color.

SILVERWARE.—To prevent articles of silverware from tarnishing, first warm them, and then paint them over with a thin solution of collodion in alcohol, using a wide, soft brush for the purpose.

STARCH.—To prevent starch from souring when boiled, add a little sulphate of copper.

FURNITURE, TO CLEAN.—First rub with cotton waste, dipped in boiled linseed oil; then rub clean and dry with a soft flannel cloth. Care should be taken that the oil is all removed.

EGG STAINS.—To remove from spoons, rub with common salt.

HAIR.—To clean hair, wash well with a mixture of soft water, 1 pint; sal-soda, 1 ounce; cream tartar, $\frac{1}{4}$ ounce.

CUTS.—A drop or two of creosote on a cut will stop its bleeding.

BITES AND STINGS OF INSECTS.—Wash with a solution of ammonia water.

BITES OF MAD DOGS.—Apply caustic potash at once to the wound, and give enough whiskey to cause sleep.

BURNS.—Make a paste of common baking soda and water, and apply it promptly to the burn. It will quickly check the pain and inflammation.

SCREW.—To remove an obdurate screw, apply a red hot iron to the head for a short time, the screw-driver being applied immediately while the screw is hot.

FRUIT STAINS.—To remove the stains of acid fruit from the hands, wash your hands in clear water, dry slightly, and while yet moist, strike a match and hold your hands around the flame. The stains will immediately disappear.

IRON RUST.—To remove from muslin or white goods, thoroughly saturate the spots with lemon juice and salt, and expose to the sun. Usually more than one application is required. A good way to prevent its appearance on clothes is when washing to always have them inclosed in a muslin bag while being boiled.
