

# EVERYTHING IS GONE, ALL IS LOST.

## TELLS HIS STORY OF THE TRANSACTIONS LEADING UP TO THE DISASTER—ATTRIBUTES ALL LOSSES TO PALMERSTON BRANCH—LITTLE LEFT FOR DEPOSITORS—SAYS TROUBLE IS NOT DUE TO STOCK DEALINGS.

"Everything is lost; nothing is left," is the startling announcement of Bert Anderson, manager of the Oakville bank, making for the information of the hundreds of depositors.

Clearly the bank of Anderson & Son, which closed its doors last week, was in a desperate condition. No hope is left out to those having an interest in the business.

The statement is significant, since it omits from the only man who knows intimately the details of the business. It was made deliberately and after mature reflection by Mr. Anderson. When his attention was called to the fact that his father had said Friday night that the depositors would perhaps realize from 75 to 100 per cent. on their accounts, Bert Anderson observed: "Well, Anderson really knows nothing about the situation."

The only ray of hope for the depositors is contained in an after thought of the discouraged man, "but what I want is my money and I will pay back every dollar involved."

A world representative went to Palmerston to interview Mr. Anderson on the occasion of the wrecked bank. Calling upon C. K. Scott, his brother-in-law and former partner with Cyrus Anderson in the bank of Anderson & Scott of that place, the information was elicited that he had been three days before the bank was forced to suspend. Mr. Scott said that in response to repeated telegrams from the depositors he would return to Oakville Monday evening.

**Anderson Much Depressed.**

Just as the afternoon express was leaving Palmerston Bert Anderson arrived. He was clearly much depressed. He carried a small bag and the weight seemed a burden. Sinking wearily into a seat at a table in an abstracted way on the dreary landscape. All the cheery manner and genial air that distinguished Bert Anderson in the past was gone. Evidently the wreck of the bank had taken its toll on his mind. He did not seem to care for the prospect of the future. He was not interested in the story of the bank's ruin, the causes which led up to the disaster. He was only anxious to get home to the wife and the children.

## PRINCESS CAN'T BE FOUND

### Wife of the Crown Prince of Saxony Fled From Her Home at Salzburg After Midnight Dec. 12 and Has Left No Trace Behind.

Dresden, Saxony, Dec. 22.—The Crown Princess of Saxony fled from her home during the night of Dec. 11-12. The Dresden Journal to-day says:

"The Princess, in a state of intense mental excitement, suddenly deserted her family at Salzburg and went abroad. The Saxony court functions for the winter, including the New Year's reception, have been cancelled."

At dawn the police of Hamburg were informed of the disappearance, and inquiries were made through the whole country, but with no tangible result. The inquiry, by the end of the day, had extended to all parts of the kingdom of Saxony, and on authority from Dresden on the end of the second day, to all of Europe. The theory of suicide was suggested, and a fruitless search for the Princess had been made. All the ponds and other pieces of water in the vicinity of the castle had been dragged without success. The disappearance of the Princess would doubtless cause the circulation of many stories. It is already rumored that she had fled to the coast, but inquiries made here have brought out nothing to substantiate or support this supposition.

**Princess Stayed on.**

Accompanied by the Crown Prince, the Princess went to the castle of Emperor Francis Joseph, near Salzburg, a month ago. A week after their arrival the Prince broke his leg while hunting and was brought back to Dresden. The Princess, however, still remained at the Castle. Why she did so the people of the court did not know, except that the Princess, with gloomy forebodings, usually does what she wants. For a little while this explanation sufficed, but fragments of gossip began to reach Dresden. It was said that the Princess had surrendered herself to periods of nervous excitement, and that her eccentricities of deportment were much more pronounced than she was in some of her Austrian kinsfolk, who were staying in the castle with her. It is now believed that she was under surveillance.

Over 3000 families will be given their Christmas dinner by one or other of these societies, and all day yesterday the secretaries of the St. George's Society, the Irish Protestant Benevolent Association, the Fred Victor Mission, the House of Industry, and the Salvation Army, as well as the many church societies, were kept busy getting things in readiness for distribution.

The St. George Society will make their distribution on Wednesday morning, commencing at 10 o'clock. The society has purchased 7000 pounds of beef to be cut into roasts of various sizes, according to the size of the family they go to. Besides this they will give out 1500 loaves of bread and hundreds of pounds of tea, sugar and other groceries. On Wednesday during the distribution a free concert will be given in the big hall, in which several well-known singers will take part.

The Salvation Army have arranged to supply dinners to 1200 families, and for the past week they have had members out getting a list of needy persons. The plan adopted by the Army is a good one. They will make up the dinners in baskets and deliver them. These baskets will contain either food or beef, as well as tea, sugar and other groceries. Then on New Year's Day the Army will give a dinner to 500 children.

The House of Industry will give the inmates of their annual Christmas dinner at noon on Thursday. The Fred Victor Mission will give a dinner to the poor of their mission on Dec. 30, and they will prepare to feed 400. On Jan. 2 they will give a dinner for children only.

The hospitals have arranged to give concerts for their patients on Christmas Eve.
