LAX AMERICAN LAWS.

More Deaths From Murder and Suicide Than Died in Boer War. London, Dec. 6.—Lord Chief Justice Alverstone was the principal guest at the dinner of the Authors' Club last night. Sir Arthur Conan Doyle, who presided, referred to the laxity of the laws and regulations in the United States, and said that that great nation had outgrown its legal strength with appalling results.

Lord Alverstone, in replying, said he agreed with every word Sir Arthur Conan Doyle had spoken, and that his remarks were no stronger than had been made by many Americans themselves. But in regard to the treatment and reconstruction of convicted criminals, Lord Alverstone said that Great Britain had much to learn from America, and Americans were working hard to make their system not only humane, but truly preventive of crime.

German Birth Rate Low. Berlin, Dec. 6.—Official statistics covering 20 years show a steady and noticeable decrease in the birth-rate in the large cities in Germany. In spite of the fact that the marriage-rate is higher than in cities of less than 100,000 inhabitants and in the country, Berlin, which passed the two-million mark in December, presents the heaviest decrease in birth-rate in the period from 1880 to 1890 it averaged 25.9, against 41.0 from 1875 to 1880.

GOING OUT OF HOGS. Farmers in Esqueau Township See No Money in the Business Now. Action.—The Township of Esqueau has always since the land was tilled been a wheat and barley country, and the past season did not fulfill the anticipations of the farmers. While the grain was in process of ripening, a blight overtook the crop, causing the grain to rot, and the yield was only about 40 lbs. to the bushel, the average being about 55 lbs. Barley and oats are a fair crop, also, but the yield is not so good as in former years.

EARLY MARKET REPORTS. Farmers Combine to Secure Quick Market Information. "Farmers in Davies County have about the best way of getting the early reports of the markets that I know of," said George K. Nickell, who was at Kansas City recently. "We have a mutual telephone company in our county there, which is practically owned by the farmers. The telephone line connects with the exchanges in some of the larger towns, and this gets to where long-distance connection is easy. Now the way we get the market report is this: The proprietor of the exchange at Gallatin gets the reports from all markets each morning, gets the weather report at the same time, and if he has a good line of reports ready, he gives five rings on the whole system through the county, and the farmers get the news for the patrons to get to the phones by this report. As there are 120 party lines in the county and each line has sixteen phones on it, the number of farmers getting these reports makes up much of the stock raising population of the county."

MODERATE RUN OF STOCK AT THE CITY MARKET

Cattle Prices Steady—Lambs Were Firmer, and for Hogs Unchanged.

Receipts of live stock at the City Market were 57 carloads, composed of 684 cattle, 1300 hogs, 2002 sheep and lambs, with about 40 calves. The quality of fat cattle in general was not good, only a limited number of good to choice butchers' being offered.
