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BYE LAWS.

OF THE INCORPORATED

DIOCESAN CHURCH SOCIETY.

1st. At all Meetings of the Society or its Committees, before entering upon business, the "appointed prayers" shall be said.

2nd. His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor for the time being, if a member of the Church of England, shall be respectfully requested to be joint Patron of this Society, with the Societies for the Propagation of the Gospel and for Promoting Christian Knowledge.

3rd. The Bishop of the Diocese shall be President of the Society, with a control over all its proceedings, and no alteration shall be made in the Bye-Laws without his approval.

4th. The Archdeacon of Nova Scotia shall be the first of the Vice Presidents, whose number shall be limited to seven. There shall be also a Secretary, an Assistant Secretary and a Treasurer.

5th. All Members of the Church are invited to unite with this Society as Subscribers; and every Clergyman licensed by the Bishop, and all Lay-members of the Church of England subscribing not less than Five Shillings annually, or Ten Pounds at one payment, shall be Members of the Incorporated Society, and entitled to vote at all meetings of the same. But no Subscriber shall enjoy any of the privileges of an Incorporated Member, whose subscription is more than one year in arroar. The annual subscriptions shall be considered due upon the first day of January in each year.

6th. The Executive Committee shall consist of the President, Vice Presidents, Secretary, Assistant Secretary, and Treasurer of the Society, who shall fill the same offices in the Committee; of all Clergymen licensed by the Bishop of the Diocese; together with twenty Laymen to be chosen as hereafter provided; and such other members of the Society as may be chosen by the Local Committees, according to the ninth Bye-Law.

7th. An Annual meeting of the Society shall be held at Halifax on the Second Thursday in February, at which the twenty Lay-Members of the Executive Committee, together with the Secretaries and Treasurer shall be elected, and any vacancies in the number of Vice Presidents may be filled up at the

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ner, Esq. Ir. Esq. pleasure of the Society. A Special General Meeting may be called at any time when the President, or, in his absence, two or more Vice Presidents, or the Executive Committee, shall consider it desirable to appoint such Special General Meeting.

8th. The Executive Committee shall meet monthly during the year, with the exception of the months of July, August and September; and a Special Meeting may be called by the President, or, in his absence, by a Vice President.

9th. The Members of the Church in every part of the Province are invited to co-operate with the Diocesan Church Society, by forming Local Comittees under the direction of their respective Clergymen, either in each Mission or Parish, or in more than one Mission or Parish united, as shall be deemed most convenient, and in strict accordance with the designs and rules of the Diocesan Church Society. Every Rural Local Committee shall have the power of appointing one of its rembers, resident within its district, to be a member of the Executive Committee. It is recommended to the Local Committees to forward their funds, as they may be collected, to the Executive Committee, who will faithfully apply them to the general objects of the Society: but when the Local Committee desire it, they shall receive Books at cost and charges, to the amount of one-fourth of their remittances, or the said one-fourth may be placed in the hands of the Endowment Sub-Committee, for the benefit of the Parish or Mission where the money was contributed.

10th. The following objects shall more particularly engage the attention of the Society, as soon as their means may enable them to afford such attention:

- 1 .- Provision for Assistant Missionaries.
- Missionary visits to neglected and destitute places, under the direction of the Bishop.
- 3.-Assistance to the Endowment of Parishes.
- 4.—Assistance to the erection and enlargement of Churches and Chapels belonging to the Church of England, in peculiar, or extreme cases.
- 5.— Supplies of Books and Tracts published by the Society for Promoting Christian Knowledge, and such other Books and Tracts in strict conformity with the principles of the Church of England, as, having been first carefully examined and approved by a Committee of Revision, to be appointed by the Executive Committee, shall then have received the approval of the Executive Committee, and lastly the written approbation of the Bishop.
- 6.—Assistance to the erection of Parsonage Houses.
- 7.—Assistance to deserving young men, desirous of being qualified for the Ministry of the Church, but requiring aid in pursuing their studies at the Collegiate Establishment at Windsor.

8.—Aid to Su struction i

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fied for the Minr studies at the 8 .- Aid to Sunday and other Schools, in which due attention is paid to instruction in the principles of the Church of England.

9 .- Encouragement to the instruction and training of respectable Teachers for Sunday and Daily Schools.

10 .- Upholding, by all possible and proper means, the Collegiate Establishments at Windsor.

11 .- It shall also be one of the objects of the Society to provide for the widows and orphacs of deceased Clergymen, but no part of the Society's funds shall be appropriated to this object, except such as shall be specifically given and paid into the Society therefor.

To these objects, generally, the contributions will be applied; while those who desire it may have their individual contributions scrupulously confined to any one or more of these objects. And as some Members of the Church, who are not unminiful of the great spiritual wants of their own neighborhood, still feel constrained, in pious gratitude for the blessings they enjoy, to allot something, however small, from the means with which a gracious Providence has blessed them, towards the spread of the glorious Gospel among the nations which still sit in darkness-

11th. This Society will gladly receive and forward to the Society for the Propagation of the Gospel, whatever sums may be given for the conversion and instruction of the Heathen; to which object such sums will be strictly confined by the East India Committee of that Society.

12th. The Accounts of the Society shall be closed on the 31st December in each year, and shall be audited in one month from that time, by auditors to be appointed by the Executive Committee.

13th. An Annual Sermon shall be preached before the Society. Preacher, time and place, to be appointed by the President. The

14th. None of the above Bye-Laws shall be altered except at a general meeting of the Incorporated Society; and a full year's notice of a proposal to change any of them must be given previous to the meeting at which the proposed alteration is to be effected.

15th. At each Annual Meeting of the Society the first five on the Executive Committee shall go cut of office; but all or any of them shall be eligible for re-election. The new members shall be placed at the bottom of the list.

And may Thy Holy Spirit direct all our consultations to the advancement of Thy Glory and the good of Thy Church, through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

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ANNUAL MEETING.

The 16th Annual Meeting of the Society was held in the National School, on Thursday, Feb'y. 9th, 1854. The Right Reverend the Lord Bishop in the Chair.

After Prayers, the President in opening the Meeting mentioned to the Society the efforts which he, while in England, had made to procure an Endowment for King's College, Windsor, and warmly recommended the subject to the Society.

The President drew the attention of the Society to the "Colonial Church Bill," and spoke of the necessity of a Synod in this Diocese, in which the voice of the Laity, the Clergy and the Bishop, might separately have its influence.

The President informed the Society, that he had received while in England some valuable donations of Books for the formation of a Diocesan Library in Nova Scotia; and also some useful architectural plans.

It was moved by the Venerable Archdeacon, seconded by the Rev J. Shreve, D. D., and

Resolved, That the Society gratefully acknowledge the liberality of all those who contributed.

The Secretary read a Report of the proceedings of the Executive Committee during the past year, and it was moved by the Rev. H. L. Owen, seconded by the Rev. J. Shreve, D. D., and

Resolved, That the Report now read be adopted, and printed and circulated under the direction of the Executive Committee.

The following members of the Society were appointed a standing Sub-Committee on Investments, and were clothed with ample power to invest according to their best judgment, the monies intrusted to their care, viz:—The Honble. M. B. Almon, L. Hartshorne, Esq., H. Pryor, Esq., A. M. Uniacke, Esq.

A Report was read from the Sub-Committee appointed to consider means for making some provision for widows and orphans of Clergymen. The Report was referred to the Clergy, at the time in Halifax, to consider and express their opinion upon.

A. M. Uniacke, Esq., proposed the following "Bye-Law," of which notice had been given at the last Annual Meeting:

"At each Annual Meeting of the Society the first five on the list of the "Executive Committee shall go out of office, but that all or any of them shall be eligible for re-election: and that the new members shall be placed at "the bottom of the list."

The proposed "Bye Law" was adopted, and under it the Society elected by Ballot, the Honble. M. B. Almon, Mr. W. Marvin, W. Almon, Esq. M. D., B. Collins, Esq. and H. Hartshorne, Esq., as Members of the Executive Committee, in place of the first five on the list who retired.

The Rev. Edwin Gilpin, Jr., was appointed Secretary; H. Pryor, Esq. Ass't. Secretary; and L. Hartshorne, Esq. Treasurer for the ensuing year. A vote of thanks was passed to those Officers of the Society for their services during the past year.

The Right Rev. the President proposed to change the time of the Annual Meeting from "the second Thursday in February," to "the Thursday after

the second Sunday in February."

It was moved by N. Clarke, Esq., seconded by Rev. H. L. Owen, and Resolved, That the Rev. the Secretary's name be added to the list of Life Members.

A M. Uniacke, Esq., proposed the following change in the 9th Bye Law.

"That the Rural Local Committee of any Parish shall have power to appoint any Member of the Society as its Representative in the Executive

"Committee at Halifax."

It was proposed in amendment by N. Clarke, Esq., and seconded by H. Pryor, Esq.

"That the choice of Representatives be limited to Members of the Execu-

" tive Committee."

The customary Grant for the support of an Assistant Missionary, was made on the usual terms for the ensuing year, to-

Stewiacke and Musquodoboit, Wilmot, Albion Mines, Chester, Liverpool, Westport, Annapolis, Pugwash and Newport. Also for a Travelling Missionary on the Western coast, and to the Rev. J. Breading, Eastern Shore.

The Meeting adjourned to Saturday the 11th inst.

At the adjourned Meeting of the Society, the Right Rev. the President in the Chair, The Venble. the Archdeacon, in the name of the Clergy, presented a Report relative to the proposed plan of assistance to Widows and Orphans. It contained a thankful acceptance of the proposal, and an expression of opinion from those present, that the plan of mutual assurance would meet with the ready and general co-operation of the Clergy in this Diocese.

It was directed that in future the title of the Report should be "The Annual Report of the Executive Committee of D. C. S."

The Rev. J. Shreve, D. D., gave notice of a proposal that the Annual Meeting of the Society should be held in the Autumn.

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ANNUAL PUBLIC MEETING.

THE Annual Public Meeting of the Society was held in the Temperance Hall, on Wednesday evening, the 15th Feb'y. 1854.

The Right Reverend, the President, took the Chair at 7 o'clock.

The Rev. W. Bullock read the prayers appointed for the use of the Society.

The Right Reverend the President, opened the Meeting, urging upon the Society the necessity for greater exertion and self-denial, and reminding them that the Church in this Diocese will with each succeeding year be thrown more and more upon its own resources.

An abstract from the 16th Annual Report was then read.

It was moved by the Honble. the Chief Justice, seconded by the Rev. H. Bullock, and

Resolved, That the measure of success which it has pleased Almighty God to bestow upon the labors of this Society during the past year, should encourage us thankfully and with faithful hearts to continue our efforts in the great cause of Christ's Church Militant.

Moved by A. M. Uniacke, Esq., seconded by the Rev. G. W. Hill, and Resolved, That the present critical state of King's College, Windsor, demands the attention of all Churchmen in the Diocese, and should arouse their exertions to provide that support upon which the further existence of the Institution depends.

A Collection was made in aid of the Society's funds, amounting to £24 19s. 6d.

It was moved by P. C. Hill, Esq., seconded by W. M. Brown, Esq., and Resolved, That it is very desirable that vigorous measures should be immediately taken to provide some future assistance for the Widows and Children of Clergymen when their day of labor and trial is ended.

It was moved by the Rev. T. C. Leaver, seconded by the Rev. J. Shreve, D. D., and

Resolved, That we gladly embrace this opportunity of expressing our undiminished gratitude to the Parent Societies in England, and our continued interest in the prosperity of the Sister Societies in the neighbouring Provinces.

The thanks of the Meeting were most cordially offered to the Right Reverend the President, at the suggestion of the Rev. J. Shreve, D. D., seconded by B. Zwicker, Esq., M. P. P.

The Doxology was sung and the meeting dismissed with the Episcopal Benediction,

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REPORT.

A REVIEW of the Society's proceedings during the past year, will shew that we have been engaged to the utmost of our strength in the duties entrusted to our care. The result of our labors, although comparatively small, must yet be regarded as of sacred importance: for it is a part, however minute, of the great scheme by which it pleases Almighty God to hand down his revealed will to all ages of the world. Although the sphere of our actions be narrow we cannot tell how great may be their influence upon the time when "the Earth shall be filled with the knowledge of the glory of God as the waters cover the sea." We are therefore bound to use as much diligence and exertion in the discharge of our duty to this Society, and to watch over its interests with as jealous care, as if our influence were extended over a world. While we ever bear in mind the words of Wisdom, "Whatsoever thine hand findeth to do, do it with thy might." Our efforts are also of great importance from their fundamental connexion with the future maintenance of the Church in this Province. This Society appears to be the means appointed by Divine Providence for the furtherance of this great work. It is the offspring of our own It has been matured by our own experience. It has been from time to time adapted to the more pressing wants of the Diocese, and with humble faith it looks forward to the future as to a period of greater exertion, and more widely spread usefulness. This Society should not therefore be looked upon only in the aspect which it now presents. It does not demand our attention and support only on account of the good which it is doubtless doing at present in various parts of the Province, but it is to be regarded as with the Divine blessing, the main support of the Church among us for ages yet to come—as a Society which is to be the instrument for providing to our Children's Children the word of truth in all its purity, attended by the living voice of the Church-by duly authorized teachers, who through forms consonant with the Holy Scriptures and sanctioned by the reverence of ages, may a lminister the consolations of Divine promise.

For such reasons our Society claims a prominent place in the regard of every Churchman. For such reasons, and planted upon such principles, its branches should be spread through every part of the Diocese: while each member of the Church enrolled as its supporter, should be led to acknowledge the bond of unity which springs from devotion to a common cause.

During the past year the efforts of our Society have been directed almost exclusively toward supplying the services of assistant missionaries. We have been laboring for that object to the full extent of our means. There is much cause for devout gratitude to Almighty God that he has given his blessing and so far supported us in our course of Christian usefulness. Yet it has been a subject of painful regret to your Committee that they have been unable to answer the undeniable claims for assistance which have been advanced from several quarters. Many fields for the labourer yet remain unoccupied, where the

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As all grants the College had Diocese procure

For some time for the Widows a recognised; but opportunity may be lost for a long time of establishing the ministrations of our beloved Church.

The time cannot be very far distant when the calls upon this Society for aid in supporting Clergymen will be even more urgent than at present. Those missions which are now receiving assistance from abroad must ere long, in the natural course of events, be dependant upon their own resources, and such help as can be given through this Society. It might not therefore be inexpedient even now, out of the very limited amount at the Society's diposal, to make some provision against the time when more missionaries must be supported by local exertion. This might be done indirectly by an annual donation to encourage those who are endeavoring to make a permanent provision for the ministrations of the Church among them.

The total amount received by the Society during the past year is £1656 8s. 2d., of which £809 1s. 5d. arises from the reserved fourths of contributions, and from donations for specific objects. The actual income of the Society for general purposes during 1853, was £847 6s. 9d. The similar income for the preceding year was £707 18s.; shewing an actual increase in the available funds of the Society during 1853, of £139 8s. 9d. It is earnestly hoped that the ratio of increase may be still greater during the year we are now commencing. The last year was begun with a debt of £147 16s.

This year the deficiency is but £83 14s. 2d.

We would gladly turn attention to the 10th object, viz: "upholding by all possible and proper means, the Collegiate Establishments at Windsor." Although the Society is unable to grant any pecuniary assistance, yet it readily acknowledges the great importance of the object. The critical position in which this Institution has been placed by the withdrawal of parliamentary aid and the provincial grant, makes a combined effort for its support imperatively necessary. The beneficial effects of the College, both with reference to the Church in this Diocese, and to the general cause of Education throughout the Province, are too numerous and apparent to admit of dispute. During the past year the Right Revd. the President of this Society, assisted by the Rev. G. Hill, made great exertions in England to procure something toward a permanent endowment for the Institution. In furtherance of this object the Society gladly lends its voice in urging the claims which the friends of the College have lately advanced in their appeal to the public. The Society for Promoting Christian Knowledge has offered £1000 towards its Endowment, providing £2000 be raised from other sources. Of this sum £1300 has been already secured in England. To enjoy the benefit of £3000 we are therefore called upon to contribute £700 stg.

For some time past the Society has felt the necessity of providing assistance for the Widows and Orphans of deceased Clergymen. This object has been recognised; but by the present Rules no part of the General funds of the

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There is much his blessing and Yet it has been a been unable to dvanced from seupied, where the Society can be thus expended; and only special donations for that purpose have been reserved according to the wishes of the donor. This mode of proceeding is however quite insufficient to meet the necessity, and it is thought advisable at this time to bring the subject so prominently forward, as to excite the interest and sympathy of all members of the Society in this benevolent object. The subject however, from its great importance and difficulty of detail, requires mature deliberation. A Sub Committee was appointed to take the matter under their consideration, and based upon their Report the following Resolutions have been adopted by the Executive Committee:—

"That a standing Sub Committee be formed, to whom shall be intrusted the subject of assistance to Widows and Orphans of Clergymen, in accordance with the 11th object of the Society. 2nd. That it is the opinion of the Committee that we should endeavour immediately to procure the sum of £1,000 toward a capital fund for carrying out the 11th object of the Society with re-

ference to the above Resolution.'

This object so thoroughly recommends itself to sound judgement and kind feeling, that all will no doubt heartily co-operate in its advancement. We trust that an appeal in its behalf will never be made in vain to any congrega-

tion in this Diocese.

The fund for the Endowment of the Bishopric is at present represented by a bond and mortgage for £1,500, a deposit receipt from the Halifax Banking Company for £260, and £40 12 3 yet uninvested. While mentioning this subject your Committee have great gratification in acknowledging that the deep debt of gratitude we already owe to the Venble. S. P. G. has lately been largely increased. The following extract from their Report for 1853 will shew that we have abundant reason:—

" The Society has also contributed to the completion of the Endowment of "the Bishopric of Nova Scotia, by appropriating, in lieu of the annual sum " at present paid to the Bishop from the interest of the American Bishops " Fund, a portion of the capital of that fund, amounting to £8,250. This "sum is to be vested in Trustees, and together with the local Endow-" ment Fund above mentioned, and the Grant of £2,000 from the Society " for Promoting Christian Knowledge, and Bishop's Farm, near Halifax, " will form the permanent Endowment of the See. During the incumbency " of the present Bishop a payment will be made also from the interest of the " remainder of the American Bishops Fund." The Venerable Society still continues to co-operate with us by allowing £50 stg. yearly to the Assistant Missionaries upon the lists of the Society. Our undiminished gratitude is due to that Society for the many benefits they have conferred upon us, and especially for the judgement they have hitherto evinced in selecting for this Diocese men earnest and diligent in their calling, and devoted to the duties of their sacred profession.

Your Committee submit the following abstract of the Society's expenditure during the past year. The particulars will be found in the Treasurer's account. Books to the value of £44 17s. 11d. have been purchased from the N.S.

Several claims have been advanced and acknowledged in the following order—New Church at Pugwash, new Church at Turns Bay, new Church at Ship Harbour, new Church at Old Barns, Truro, Church at Hubbard's Cove.

The second moiety of a grant to the Parsonage at Beaver Harbour has been paid, amounting to £25. The building is now finished. The inhabitants of Musquodoboit are making laudable exertions to erect a parsonage house there. They have he sitated to make any application for aid to this Society, which is contributing toward the support of a Missionary in that district.

There has been transferred to the care of the Endowment Sub Committee, £160 18 2. Of which amount £50 was collected in Jersey by the Rev. J. Stannage, for the benefit of St. Margaret's Bay. The remainder is the amount of the fourths of contributions reserved by several missions for their own benefit. There has also been placed in the hands of the Endowment Committee, £595 16 8 collected in England by the Rev. J. Stannage for the benefit of his mission. It affords us much gratification to notice that the disinterested efforts of this noble-hearted Missionary have been crowned with great success. He informs your Committee that these collections have been made "toward the permanent support of an additional Missionary in his parish. Not for the sup-

port of the present Rector, who is already provided for, but for an increase of Clergy in his Mission." The Revd. Gentleman expresses a hope that as the Society has promised some encouragement to exertions of this sort, a small grant of £15 or £20 will be made by way of encouragement to his friends, his people and himself. He thus ends the letter accompanying the last remittance. "I have this morning received the promise of £50 from "one individual—God be praised!" St Margaret's Bay will therefore be partially endowed, when many wealthier places are left without provision. For this a deep debt of gratitude is due from the Fishermen of that place to their devoted Pastor.

The sum of £575 has been expended during the past year in paying the Society's contribution toward the Salaries of the Assistant Missionaries. The following is a list of the Missionaries now receiving part of their support from

The responsibility of the Society thus incurred is £625 per anuum. The Revd. H. Spike has removed, by the direction of the Bishop, from Tusket to Newport. The Committee have consented to continue his Salary at the latter place until the end of March next. The Revd. J. Griffiths, selected for this Diocese, from St. Augustin's College, Canterbury, by the S. P. G., has sent to the Committee an abstract, arguing a well filled journal of labors during the past year at Westport and Digby Neck. This Gentleman, from the advantages of his training, has been able to administer relief to the bodily sufferings of those around him, when medical aid could not be obtained. It will no doubt be gratifying to the supporters of this Society to learn, that the Missionaries to whom their contributions have been paid, are diligently and earnestly devoting themselves to the duties of their sacred office.

There has been paid to the Governors of King's College £2, especially

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fore was necessarily both slight and imperfect in construction This building has of late been thoroughly renewed both externally and internally, at a cost of more than £200, made up by the voluntary subscription of the inhabitants residing near the Church, aided by the sale of pews since the completion of the repairs last summer. Thus from having been one of the most dilapidated Churches in this part of the country, it has now become one of the most substantial and comfortable, with a small surplus revenue, and proving to all engaged in that good work (who have need of such a proof) that as, notwithstanding such an outlay on their parts, the means and comforts of none of them have been thereby abridged; so they may reasonably hope that no future exertions of theirs in the cause of God and true religion, will leave them in a worse condition as to worldly means than they were before, but may happily bring down a blessing upon themselves and their substance. If such considerations have the effect of promoting the interests of the D. C. Society among them, I shall greatly rejoice, while I am persuaded that their own good will in this way be effectually advanced."

OF THE

ENDOWMENT SUB COMMITEE.

The very limited action of this Committee during the past year, so far from being a subject of regret, proves that the quiet working of this branch of the Society's operations, is winning the confidence of the several Local Committees. It generally appears to them most prudent to let their money remain with the Society, accumulating against the day when the Missionaries, receiving less support from abroad, will be dependent upon the local resources of the Mission.

At the commencement of the year your Committee had in hand £344 17. During 1853 there has been added to this £1101 11 10, which with £15 18 4 interest from money invested, makes the total amount received £1117 10 2. There has been returned to St. John's Parish, Truro, the sum of £5, there to be invested in accordance with the Endowment Rules. The amount now under the Society's care is £1112 10 2. The following is a memorandum of the several deposits up to the end of 1853, for which the Committee is responsible.

Every application for aid in the erection of a Church, must contain the following information:

- 1.—The precise situation, especially with reference to the nearest Church, and to the amount of population within five miles of the Church.
- 2.- The Title of the Ground on which the Building is to be erected.
- 3.—The size of the Building; the numbers it can accommodate; and probable amount of the Congregation that will usually attend it.
- 4.—The supposed cost of the Building; the progress it has made towards completion; and the amount of contributions on the spot in money or labour.

It is the wish of the Executive Committee that no Clergyman should, when building a Church, rely upon aid from this Society without first ascertaining whether it is in the power of the Society to grant any assistance.

All grants to Churches are made on the following terms, viz.—That the first moiety be called for within one year, and the second within two years from the date of the grant. The first moiety may be claimed when the exterior is finished, the second when the interior is finished.

With reference to a Resolution authorizing the employment of Assistant Missionaries, it was Resolved on the 17th August, 1849:

"That no part of the Funds of this Society shall be paid under that Resolution, until the first and each subsequent Quarterly payment of the £50 to be provided by the People in such cases, is actually paid in advance to the Treasurer of the Local Committee."

A question having arisen whether a Member of the Society might devote his annual subscription to any particular object of the Society, the matter was referred to the Executive Committee on the 19th March, 1852; and the following opinion was expressed:

"Resolved,—That it is the opinion of the Executive Committee, that it is the intention of the fifth Bye Law, that the annual payment of five shillings to the general objects of the Society constitutes a Member; but that any person may devote his money to any particular object which is recognized by the Society."

A Sub Committee, consisting of the Honble. M. B. Almon, L. Hartshorne, Esq., H. Pryor, Esq., and A. M. Uniacke, Esq., has been appointed to invest the funds collected for the Endowment of this Bishopric.

In Feb'y, 1854, £50 additional was devoted to Missionary purposes, and its disposal left to the recommendation of the Bishop.
