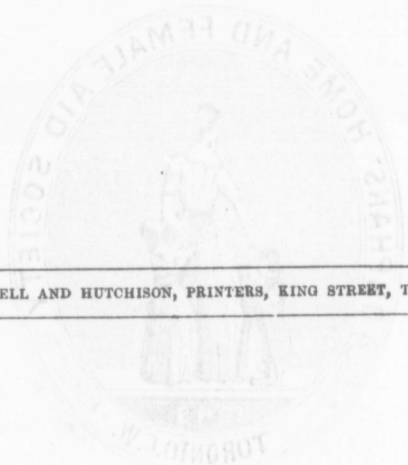

THE TWENTY-THIRD ANNUAL REPORT

OF THE MANAGERS OF

The Protestant Orphans' Home
AND FEMALE AID SOCIETY.

In presenting their Twenty-third Annual Report, the Lady Managers of the Protestant Orphans' Home beg to return thanks to Almighty God for the many gracious benefits the Institution has received at His hands during the past year.

Since the last Annual Meeting the number of inmates in the "Home" has reached 106, of whom six have been apprenticed, 24 taken by their friends, and 40 have been admitted. The number of inmates in the "Home" at present is 93.

During the past year the benevolent objects, for which the "Home" was founded, have been most abundantly furthered, and the ladies have great pleasure in reporting its continued prosperity and the uninterrupted advancement of its interests. Many of the boys and girls who have left the Institution are succeeding well in life, and evidences are regularly being received that much of this success is attributable to the habits of industry formed during their residence at the "Home," and the useful and religious knowledge there imparted to them. The children have been blessed with unusually good health during the year, and it is a matter for deep thankfulness that the "Home" has been visited by no serious illness.

The Managers acknowledge, with grateful thanks, the receipt of a cheque for \$600, being a bequest to the "Home" from the

late Mrs. Samuel Street, which, in accordance with the wishes of Mrs. Fuller, through whom the amount was received, has been invested in Township Debentures.

Thanks are also due to the Rev. E. H. Cole and to the gentlemen belonging to the Y. M. C. A., who have so kindly given their services as teachers in the Sunday School attached to the "Home," and whose efforts to impart Christian knowledge to the children it is sincerely hoped will prove beneficial to them, as they are appreciated by the ladies managing the Institution.

Thanks are again due to Dr. Ogden for his unremitting care of the health of the inmates, and to Mr. VanKoughnet, solicitor for the "Home," for continued attentions to its monetary affairs.

The Lady Managers also desire to return their thanks to the captain and owners of the steamer City of Toronto for a free trip given the children to Niagara, and to the captain of the steamer Bouquet for free trips to the Island, which excursions were heartily enjoyed by the children; also to the editors of *The Mail*, *Leader* and *Patriot* for gratuitous insertions of all notices connected with the "Home;" and to P. S. Barnum, Esq., for his kindness in giving the children free admission to his grand exhibition of animals.

The donations from the Orangemen of Ontario have been as large and as frequent as hitherto; but, as they appear in detail in the Treasurer's statement, the Managers will only draw attention to their continued liberality. Special thanks are due to the old and zealous friend of the "Home," Mr. A. Fleming, for his exertion at Christmas, whereby he obtained a great amount of most excellent Christmas cheer for the inmates of the "Home," and practical expressions of interest in the welfare of the "Home."

The cantata of "Esther" was performed in the Music Hall, in February last, by amateurs of the city, in aid of the local charities, and the Managers desire to express their thanks for \$92 received out of the proceeds.

Thanks are also due to the various butchers, bakers, market gardeners, grocers, and confectioners, for the many generous contributions to the "Home" during the year.

We cannot close this Report without drawing attention to the unremitting care and kindness shewn by the Matron to the children in the "Home."

As the Secretary will be unavoidably absent at the General Meeting, she regrets to be obliged to notify the Managers that she wishes to retire from that office.
