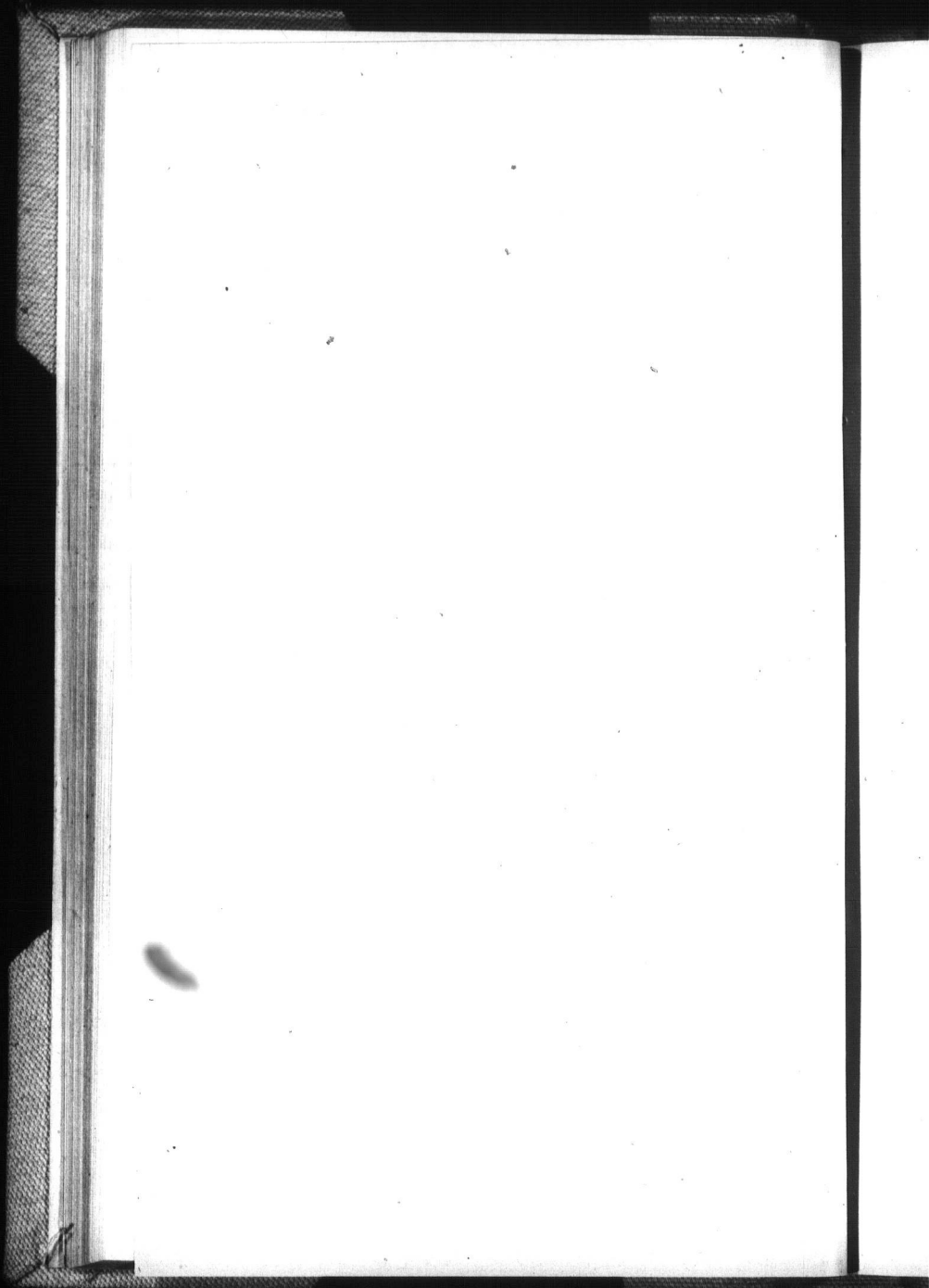

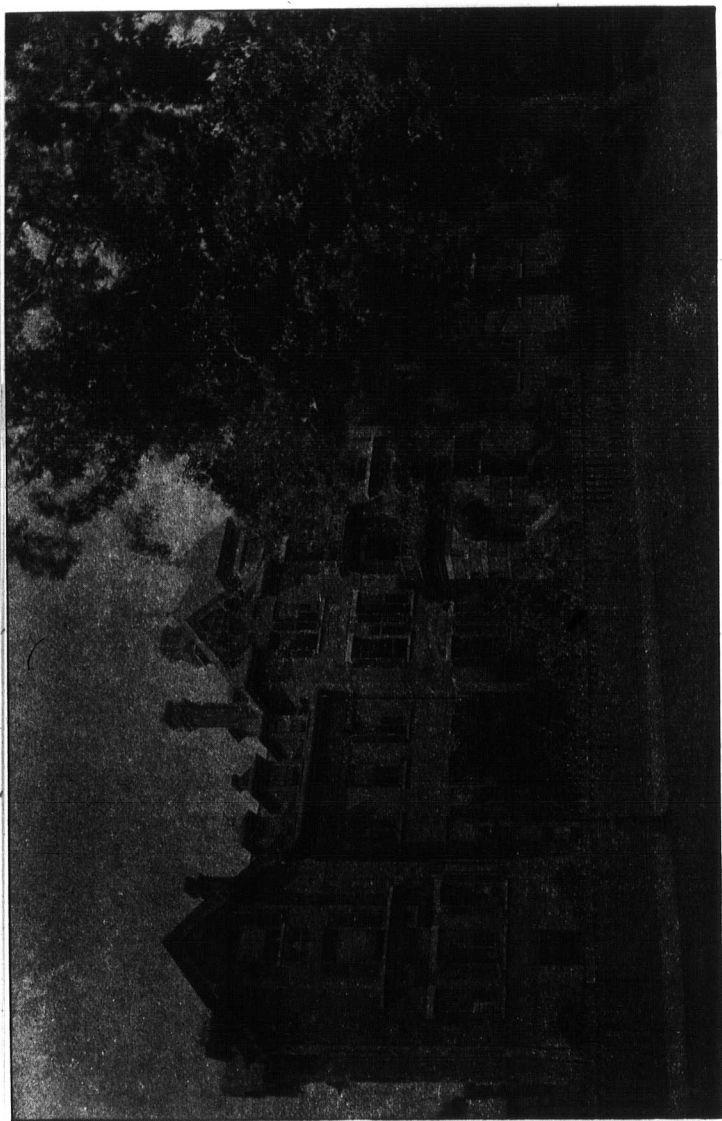

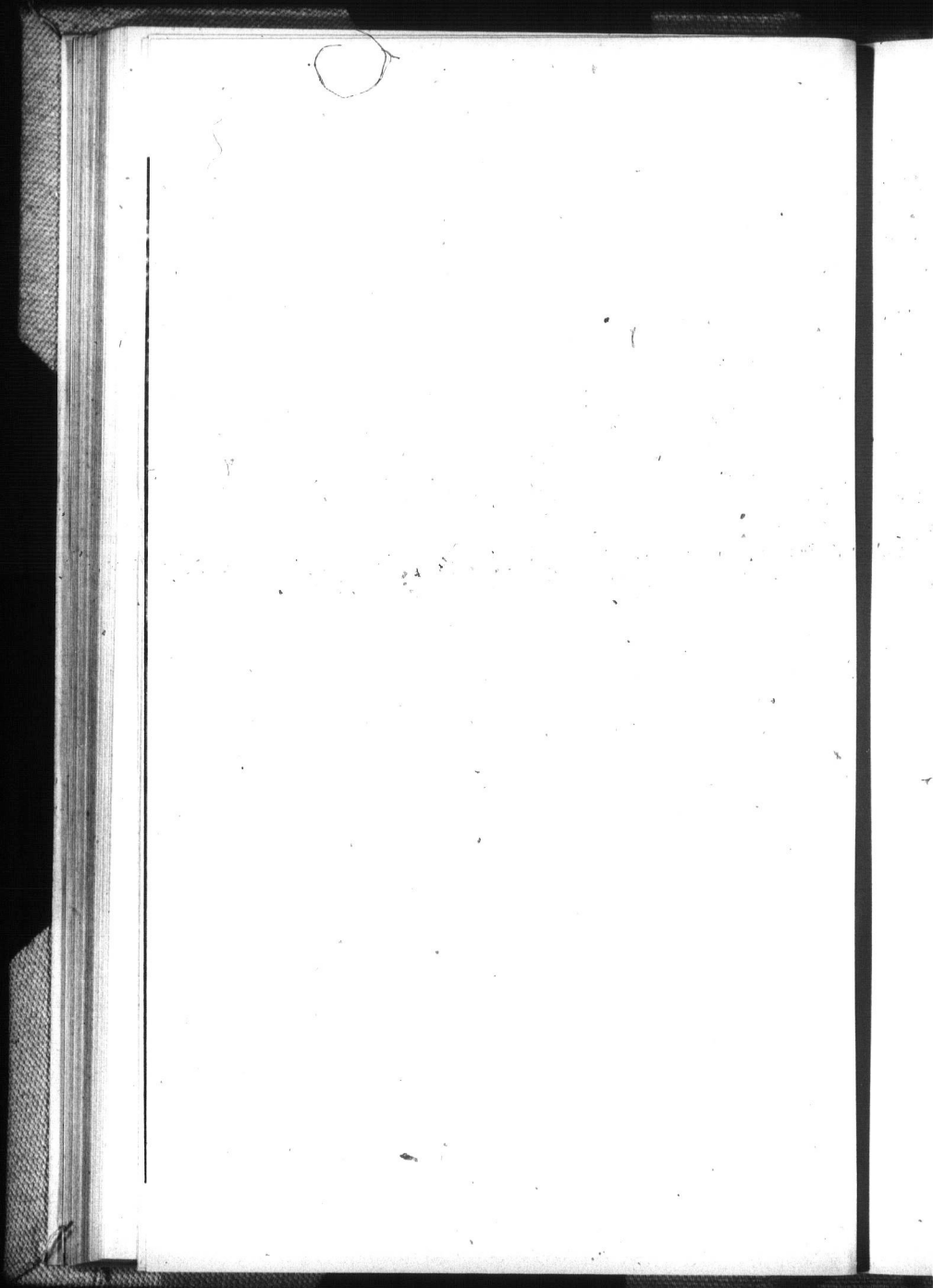

PROTESTANT ORPHANS' HOME.

There was a large attendance of ladies at the fortieth annual meeting of the Protestant Orphans' Home, held at the home in Dovercourt Road June 2nd, 1891.

Rev. J. D. Cayley presided over the meeting in the absence of his Worship the Mayor. Among those on the platform were the chairman, Dr. Goldwin Smith, Rev. Septimus Jones, Rev. Dr. Thomas, Rev. John Alexander, Rev. Alfred Reid, Rev. W. P. Lewis, Mr. W. B. Hamilton, Mr. James Beatty, and Mr. Lelean.

The president opened the proceedings with prayer. The children then sang a chorus, "Our Own Canadian Home."

The secretary's report was then read by Rev. Mr. Reid. The report was presented by Mrs. M. R. VanKoughnet, the first directoress, and Mrs. Leigh, the corresponding secretary. The report also stated that during the year ninety-four children had been admitted, fifty-six from the city, and the balance from outside places. At present the attendance was one hundred and sixteen. The report referred also to improvements to the building, and stated that owing to the bequest of the late William Gooderham the debt had been reduced to \$14,000. The treasurer's report was also read, giving the financial statement.

Mr. Goldwin Smith, on moving the adoption of the report, said that to refer to the Home in terms of commendation would be to paint the lily or gild the refined gold. The care of the orphan was one of the duties of Christianity. Homer gave a picture of the orphaned Greek in his day deprived of companions, scantily fed and clothed by relatives, and driven by the more fortunate children from the banquet table; but this was all changed, and semi-barbaric care of the orphan was not to be compared with that of Christian civilization. Perhaps there was no more touching passages in English literature than those referring to the youth of the orphan hero of John Halifax, Gentleman. He considered, however, that much mischief was done by the zeal of philanthropists in taking children from parents for neglect. Children should not be removed except in extreme cases, as it tended to remove parental responsibility, which was a basis of society. Even if the children were half

neglected, it was better to leave them with their parents. In many instances this interference tended to have the parents neglect their children so that they could get rid of them or see them reared with greater possibilities than they could furnish. In the Home parental affection could only be replaced by maternal care, but children could be reared without reference to popular ideas upon a firm basis. It was a matter of congratulation to know that the Home was flourishing and on a solid financial basis. Charitable institutions should always be possessed of funds, for it was folly to make any drafts upon futurity. The excellence of the work could not be doubted by anyone.

Rev. Dr. Thomas seconded the motion, and said that the presence of the rose was always made known by its perfume, and on entering the Home the good work done was easily noticeable. The work was just such as Christ Himself who loved little children would commend. The reports were adopted unanimously.

Dr. Burt read the medical report, which was also adopted. The children then sang "The Mower's Song."

The election of the lady managers and officers was then moved by Rev. Septimus Jones, second by Rev. Mr. Alexander, as follows:—

A resolution was moved by Dr. McConnell, seconded by Dr. Ellis, and carried, thanking the city, the managers, and others for the interest taken in the institution. A vote of thanks to donors and friends was moved by Mr. Beatty, seconded by Mr. Lelean, and also carried. A vote of thanks to the chair, some music by the children, and prayer by Rev. Mr. Alexander closed the exercises.

THE 40th ANNUAL REPORT OF THE PROTESTANT
ORPHANS' HOME, 1891.

It is with a feeling of devout thankfulness, not unmingled with dignity, that the Lady Managers of the Protestant Orphans' Home present the 40th Report of their work to the public, with an assurance of its cordial reception, judging from the kindness of former days.

Their institution has now entered upon the forties, a period which in most human lives is very full of effort and result; with the inexperience of youth left behind, and the calm judgment, the knowledge of things as they are steadily fastened upon the mind, as the consequence of its practical training for so long a time.

The work is still the same, children received and children taken out, in one continued stream; the managers having in many cases to enter into the feelings of the bereaved father or desolate widow parting for the first time from their little ones, while they ask with anxious faces if they will be kindly treated in the Home. It is the constant effort of all to have this carried out, and there are several special committees for the purchasing of clothing, seeing that the food is sufficient in quantity, good in quality, and comfortably served to the inmates, beside overlooking the building to see that everything is kept in good order and repair.

There are also committees on printing and entertainments, either outside, in aid of the funds, or those within, for the amusement of the children.

Since the last annual meeting 94 children have been admitted into the Home, 75 from the city and 16 from other places, namely, Port Hope, Campbellford, Barrie, Cookstown, Chapleau, Hudson, Lindsay and Sault Ste Marie.

Two boys were born in England, one of whom soon returned with his mother. One girl was born in Italy.

The religious denominations were represented by 1 Congregationalist, 3 Roman Catholics, 6 Baptists, 17 Methodists, 18 Presbyterians, and 36 belonging to the Church of England.

Since the last meeting 96 children have left the Home, 56 boys and 40 girls; of these 73 were removed by relatives and friends; 6 girls and 10 boys were apprenticed out in the country; 1 boy was hired out in town; 1 girl sent to another institution; 1 girl of defective intellect was taken by her mother to Orillia; 1 boy was sent to his father and another boy to the Industrial School. A little boy and girl were adopted out into good homes, leaving at the present time 161 children in the Home. The

average number has been 167 during the year. 177 inmates altogether.

In June last Miss E. Pechell was engaged as assistant matron and remained until the Board thought it advisable to engage a man to take charge of the furnaces, etc., and his wife as boys' nurse. The heating of the house was satisfactory during the cold weather. The Managers were also much indebted to Mr. Gurney for the present of a large kitchen range. The water-pipes have never frozen in the building, but extensive alterations had to be made by the plumbers to ensure good drainage, which is so essential to health everywhere, and towards this extra expense the city authorities kindly made a special grant of \$600, which was much appreciated by the Managers.

The Board lost two members and the services of the 2nd Directress, Mrs. J. S. McMurray, who retired during the autumn, much to the regret of all. It is to the kindness of Mr. and Mrs. McMurray the Managers are indebted for the pleasing picture of the Home in the front of the Report, and they only wish the verandah had been built at the time it was taken, as it is a great improvement and pleasure to the little ones. It was put up at the suggestion of Mrs. John Cawthra, who contributed \$100 towards its erection.

Nor was this the only building going on, as the Public School Trustees, having received from the Managers a deed of land sufficient upon which to put up a good four-roomed school, for the use of the children of the Protestant Orphans' Home, have, by their workmen, made excavations and proceeded with the walls, which are now well on towards completion. It is needless to say how grateful the Managers feel for this act on the part of the Trustees, as it will be finished with all the most modern requisites for health and comfort and will increase the capacity of the Home, thus enabling them to take in other applicants.

By the receipt of half of the late Mr. William Gooderham's noble legacy, the Managers were enabled to reduce the debt to \$14,000, and, as they have been informed the balance of it will be paid before winter comes, they hope to reduce it to \$9,000, when they feel confident a generous public will soon wipe it out altogether.

Their solicitor, Mr. Huson Murray, who has transacted all their law business with indefatigable zeal, deserves their most sincere thanks, as he has had no sinecure in attending to it, but a great deal of difficult and responsible work.

Having received an invitation to send delegates to the meetings of the Associated City Charities, the 1st Directress and Treasurer were asked to attend.

The Lady Managers desire to offer their sincere thanks to *all* who have contributed towards the support of the orphans under their care, also to Mr. Graham and the lady teachers, Miss Armstrong and Miss Simpson, and to their invaluable matron, Miss Wheelwright, who for more than 22 years has worked with unsparing effort for the success of the Home. They wish to express their gratitude to the Physicians, by whose watchful care (under Providence) health has been wonderfully good throughout the year. Also to Dr. Ryerson, for offering, most kindly, to attend to the children's sight.

During the hot weather the excursions by water were greatly enjoyed, and also Mr. Carlyle's annual treat of ice-cream and cakes to all under the roof. The Band of Hope kindly gave a concert after Easter, and a very successful entertainment was given in the Victoria Rink. A full report of ways and means will be furnished by the Treasurer.

Among many kind and interesting letters, one was received from his Lordship the Bishop of Toronto, thanking the Lady Managers for their maternal care of the orphans.

So now they will bring their report to a close in the words of an orphan boy, "May God bless and keep each one of us."
