Coun. Ready corroborated the remarks of Coun. Irvine and said policeman Hennessey and a constable had some account of fines collected by Justice Olive. Policeman Hennessey had been instructed to bring all cases before Justice McNaught and the money from him was all right.

THE PERSON CALLETTO CASES AND THE ADMINISTRATION OF THE ADMINISTRA part paying 4 per cent. The 6 per cent bonds of Canada payable in London are now reduced to the small sum of of \$526, 573 of which \$73,000 will be paid off in November of this year, and the balance in April 1894. The 5 per cent bonds payable in London aggregate \$2,433,333 and they fall due in Oct. 1903. The funded debt of Canada payable in Canada amounts to a total of only \$13,674,075 paying \$563,451 in interest. Of this the 6 per cents amount to \$246,000 payable in March 1893. Nearly all the funded debt payable in Canada falls due before the close of the century. Still the amount is small and the prospect of reducing the interest account to any considerable extent except by buying up our own bonds in open market thus paying them off is not very promising. It is worthy of note, however, in this connexion that with a debt three times as large as we had in 1868 we are paying less than twice as much interest. In 1868 our net debt was \$75,757,134 and the net interest charge, after deducting inerest received from investments was

\$4,375,149. In 1890 our net debt was \$237,533,211 and the net interest charge was \$8,574,570. This is a satisfactory
