

EXPLANATIONS
AND
Principal Articles of the Calendar for 1881.

EXPLANATIONS.

The calculations are reduced to the nearest minute of local mean time for Charlottetown, with the exception of the equation of time, which is given for apparent noon, and the Sun's declination for mean noon, both Greenwich time.

If the declination is required at apparent noon it may be readily found, multiplying the hourly variation of declination by the equation of time reduced to the decimal of an hour, and applying the product to the declination at mean noon, attending to the following directions:—

These data may be reduced, if required, to Charlottetown time, by multiplying the hourly difference by the constant 4.208, and adding or subtracting the result according as the data are increasing or decreasing.

For convenience of reference, the Sun's semi-diameter is given for every day in the year, in a separate table on page 17 of the Calendar, from which may be obtained the horizontal parallax by dividing the seconds of semi-diameter by the constant 107.44, and the parallax in altitude by multiplying the result by the cosine of the apparent altitude. Example:

For March 25, sun's semi-diameter, 16'5"2	$\frac{965.2}{107.44} = 8.98$	horizontal parallax

The bearing of the Moon at the time of full and changes are given for assisting or testing weather forecasts, and the time of the Moon crossing the equinoctial, and of its reaching its greatest declination north and south are given as days of expected atmospheric disturbance. When these days fall on or near the time of the Moon's change or perigee, the disturbing influences is proportionally increased these cases are marked with ** or *** according as two or three of these are combined, the stronger and more certain may be the disturbance expected.

ECLIPSES.

There will be four eclipses during the year, viz.

I. A partial Eclipse of the Sun, May 2nd, five minutes before midnight, Greenwich time, visible to the northern parts of Asia and America, beginning at sunset—carried east.

II. A total Eclipse of the Moon, Greenwich time of conjunction, June 11th, 18h. 44m. 23sec., visible at Charlottetown, commencing two minutes past midnight, ending 5h. 20m, after the moon has set.

III. An annular Eclipse of the Sun, Nov. 21, G. M. T., 4h. 42m., only visible as such near the South Pole, visible as a partial Eclipse at Cape Horn and Patagonia.

IV. A partial Eclipse of the Moon Dec. 5, G. M. T., 5h. 7m. 11sec, invisible at Charlottetown.

There will be a transit of Mercury across the Sun's disc, November 7th, from 10h. 16m. 13sec. to 15h. 37m. 41sec., Greenwich time, therefore invisible to Charlottetown.

PLANETS.

MERCURY.—Will be stationary to the east or west of the Sun on the following days:—March 1, E.; March 23, W.; July 2, E.; July 27, W.; October 27, E.; and November 16, W.; between these dates his apparent motion being alternately retrograde and direct. On the 7th of November he will transit the Sun.

VENUS.—Motion direct till April 11; retrograde till May 16th, afterwards direct till the end of the year, a morning star till April, re-appearing as an evening star in May, after her conjunction with the Sun. She will be occulted by the Moon, March 3 and August 20, the latter invisible here, that of March 3 seen as a near approach shortly before the moon sets, in conjunction with Saturn, June 5, with Jupiter, June 18.

MARS.—Apparent motion direct till November 18; in opposition to the Sun, December 26; in conjunction with Saturn, July 6; with Jupiter, July 22.

JUPITER.—Motion direct to September 14; retrograde till the end of the year; in opposition to the Sun November 12; in conjunction with the Sun April 22; reappearing as a morning star about the middle of May; in conjunction with Mars and Venus as above noticed; with Saturn, April 22.

SATURN.—Motion direct till August 25; retrograde to the end of the year; in conjunction with the Sun, April 22; in opposition, Oct. 31; planetary conjunctions as already noticed.

URANUS.—Motion direct from May 9 till December 23; retrograde during the rest of the year; in opposition to the Sun, March 1; in opposition, Sept. 6.

NEPTUNE will be in conjunction with the Sun, May 3; in opposition, November 6.

TIDES.

The time of High Water is given in the Calendar for once in the 24 hours. The intervening tide may be obtained by taking the mean of the tides as marked on the two successive days. Example:

COUNTY COURTS.

JURISDICTION OF COUNTY COURTS.

The County Courts have not power to try any of the following actions, namely :

First—Detinue, replevin, ejectment, or any action where the title of land is brought in question. Or, Second—Actions in which the validity of any devise, bequest, or limitation, is disputed. Or, Third—Criminal conversation or seduction. Or, Fourth—Breach of promise of marriage. Or, Fifth—Actions against an executor or administrator, but executors or administrators may bring actions in the said Courts. Or, Sixth—Actions against any Justice of the Peace for anything done by him in the execution of his office. Or, Seventh—Actions upon a Judgement in the Supreme Court. (See Section 16, County Courts' Amendment Act.)

The County Courts have jurisdiction in all civil actions both of debts and contracts, wrongs and damages, where the debt or damages claimed, whether on balance of account or otherwise, do not exceed one hundred and fifty dollars, and on all claims on Bail Bonds or on other Bonds, given under the County Courts' Act, or any Act in amendment thereof, whatever may be the amount sought to be recovered, and in all actions recoverable under any Provincial Statute, where the remedy provided by such statute is by suit before any Court of Commissioners for the recovery of Small Debts. (See Section 17 County Courts Amendment Act.)

Where the debt or demand claimed is a balance not exceeding one hundred and fifty dollars, after an admitted payment, or set off any debt or demand, claimed or recoverable by the defendant from the plaintiff, the Court shall have jurisdiction to try such action. (See section 18 County Courts's Amendment Act.)

The plaintiff, in any County Court, cannot divide any cause or action arising out of a debt or contract, for the purpose of bringing two or more actions; but any plaintiff having cause of action, arising out of a debt or contract, may abandon the excess and can, on proving his case, recover to an amount not exceeding one hundred and fifty dollars; and the judgment of the Court in such cases, shall be in full of all demands in respect of such cause of action against a defendant for goods sold and delivered, and at the same time be the holder of promissory notes, made by such defendant and due and payable to the plaintiff, the plaintiff may sue for the amount of his claim for goods sold and delivered, without being required to sue at the same time upon such promissory notes, or that he may sue for such promissory notes, without being required to sue at the same time for the amount of his account for goods sold and delivered. (See section 20 County Courts' Amendment Act.)

The rate of postage on a letter posted within the Dominion of Canada, for transmission by mail to any place in Canada, is three cents per $\frac{1}{2}$ oz. weight; but the Statute provides that this rate must be prepaid by Postage Stamp at the time of posting the letter.

Any such letter posted wholly *unpaid* (or prepaid less than one full rate of *three cents*) cannot be forwarded to its destination, but will be sent to the Dead Letter Office, with the reason plainly written or marked upon it—"postage not prepaid."

Letters as aforesaid posted in Canada, and addressed to places in Canada, when weighing more than half an ounce, and liable therefore to two or more rates of postage, will be transmitted by mail to destination, though not fully prepaid, if as much as one full rate of three cents has been prepaid thereon by postage stamp; and in such cases will be forwarded charged with double the amount of deficient postage not prepaid: Thus, if such a letter weighing more than $\frac{1}{2}$ oz., and not exceeding 1 oz. in weight, be posted unpaid 3 cents only, it will be rated 6 cents unpaid—"more to pay"—and forwarded to its address.

On letters posted at an Office to be delivered from it commonly known as "*drop letters*," the rate is 1 cent per $\frac{1}{2}$ oz., to be in all cases prepaid by postage stamps affixed to such letters when posted.

Parcels intended to pass through the Mails should not exceed 5 lbs. in weight, or twenty-four inches in length, or twelve inches in breadth, and should be marked "by Parcel Post." Parcels may be Registered by affixing a 5 cent Registered Letter Stamp thereto, in addition to the Postage.
