



Wide Tires.

Elaborate tests of the drafts of wide and narrow fired waggons have just beer completed by the Missouri Agricultura College Experiment Station, extending over a period of a year and a half These tests have been made on a macadam, gravel and dirt roads in all conditions, and on the meadows and ploughed fields of the experiment farm. Contrare to the public expectation, in nearly all cases draft was materially lighter when the satisfact of the wide were used, than when tires of standard width. The load handed was in all cases the same, and the draft was most carefully determined by means of a self-recording dynameter. 
