## Bogus Count Gets Castle.

Carries Bluff Well and Takes His Place in German Society—Leaves Politic Note to Officials.

One of the most accomplished and plausible swindlers in Germany is at large again after serving only a few months of his last term of imprisonment. He was incarcerated in Hellbronn prison, but on Monday morning when the warden went to his cell the bird had flown. The bars of the cell window, which looks out on to a narrow lane, were filed through.

The swindler, who goes under many names, was serving a sentence as General Count von Passy. He first became prominent about five years ago as Major von Schiemangk, and called himself an American major of cavalry. His uniform was that of the United States cavalry, plus several bits of gold lace and numerous gilded buttons, which were not in the army regulations. He cynically explained afterwards that ladies liked these gilded additions, and that they enabled him to reach their hearts more speedily. Be this as it may, he carried on his adventures for some time with impunity, and was said to have netted considerable sums from gullest maidens and from widows.

Impersonates Major.

At last he made the acquaintance of the widow of a naval officer, who was on the point of handing him over three thousand marks as guarantee money, when she thought better of it and asked for the assistance of the police. The result was that the major went to prison for three years.

Last August he was liberated from gaol, and it seems that he at once resumed operations in the same field. After several small affairs he happened on the daughter of a rich citizen of Hellbronn, and introduced himself as Count von Passy.

On the strength of forged documents he had become possessed of the fine old castle of Stettenheim in the neighborhood, and the wealthy young lady, having ambitions and desires of becoming Countess von Passy of Stettenheim, was induced to fly with her count to Berlin, where he put her up at one of the best hotels of the capital. It was at this point that the young lady's father took action.

The count, finding Berlin too hot for him, fled to Frankfurt, where Nemesis overtook him and he was removed to Hellbronn.

Has Bearing of Soldier.

Before he escaped on Monday he wrote a polite note to the crown prosecutor begging forgiveness for causing so much trouble. "The fact is," he wrote, "I am obliged to attend to certain very important matters, and must therefore renounce your hospitality."

The "count" is described as a man of the most engaging personality, with the frank and easy bearing of a soldier. He is at his best when narrating his military experiences in the Philippines, but it is doubtful if he has any closer acquaintance with the islands than can be acquired by the study of a map.

White double-faced satin with a soft color on the under side makes up into delightful coats, the big collars and cuffs showing the colored side and touches of black velvet or heavy lace serving as additional trimming.

Lingerie frocks and silk coats will last as long as they can possibly be worn alone or under an auto coat. To make them very smart the taffeta coat must be short, as a bolero or coat with plaited or gathered basque, and bordered with swanstown, taffeta glazed.

Negliges are highly interesting, many of them being fashioned with the exaggerated armhole that stimulates the kimono effect and that has the sleeve cut a little wider at the top and fitted into the arm with a self-covered cord.

Shawl-shaped mantles promise to become one of the leading shapes for the winter in fur, velvet, cloth and the heavy, double-faced satins. Of all sizes the point of the largest reaches to the hem of the skirt, and borders of fur above heavy fringe will be the favorite adornment of them. On the sides, under the arms, the ample folds are caught together to form a sort of sleeve.

Mention must be made of the new blouses that have assumed coarser semblance. They are termed "reversible" or "coat waists" by their sponsors, and in many instances are made of two-tone or double-faced satin, finished with revers of the "wrong" side and having as a salient feature, a belt of the material or of leather.
