The Atlantic Investigation.

The judgment, which is to be given in the above case to-day, can easily be anticipated. There cannot be the slightest doubt in any one's mind as, to where the chief, if not the entire blame, will be laid. Whether deserved or not, the one who will suffer most in public estimation, will be Captain Williams. This unfortunate man has already won public pity for his unhappy condition, and he must now submit to an official condemnation for having, through his carelessness and bad seamanship, caused the frightful disaster which sent such thrill of horror throughout the length and breadth of the land.

But, while we pity, and may sym pathize with him in the unhappy position in which he is now placed, we cannot shut our eyes to the great issue at stake in the matter. Serious responsibilities were placed in his hands, and he did not lessen them by turning from his proper course. We need not particularly allude to

we need not particularly allude to what the evidence so plainly shows, that none of the ordinary precautions necessary in the navigation of such a dangerous coast were adopted; that the captain appears to have run without any correct knowledge of his speed, for fourteen hours—there being a mistake of at least one knot in his calculations, besides other items of serious import—as bearing upon the terrible catastrophe, and all of which indicate both ignorance and meapacity on the part of the Captain.

But, while we most in strict, justice, lay the great and chief blame upon the explain, whose conduct, however, in the moment of the disaster, out have been all that could have been desired, we cannot refrain from expressing our opinion that the White Star Company are by no means exonerated from a participation in the condemnation which has fallen upon their Captain. According to Captain Williams, if the supply of coal had been of the usual quality, the quantity would have been discovered, atil too lafe to remedy it. Who then, is responsible for this bad coal.
