The following resolutions were adopted: Report of appointment of Sec rectory lands and land investment committee; report of the mission boards; report of the widows and orphan's fund and theological students fund.

In the afternoon a rather exciting and painful scene occurred. In the morning Mr. Sibbald, of the diocese of Ontario, had been invited to a seat on the floor of the house, and on Mr. Sibbald making some remarks, a motion was proposed that the motion be withdrawn and peace once more restored.

After the members had cooled down business, on motion of Rev. Mr. Cayley, \$500 was voted to form a book depository in connection with the Sunday schools, which was chiefly for the purpose of procuring a copy of the Bible for every child in the school.

At night a meeting was held in St. James' schoolhouse. Bishop Swetsman occupied the chair and the chief speaker was Mr. Sullivan, bishop of Algoma, who delivered a long, eloquent and impressive speech.

Mr. Blake's University Speech.

The Mail article of yesterday on Mr. Blake's speech must have been written by a sufferer from indigestion, for one who had partaken too freely of a solid and his own distinguished senatorial friend. It is to the effect that all the agitation that has occurred so far in favor of increased endowments of the provincial university and college has been unsuccessful, and that this was mainly due to the timidity of Mr. Blake's organ and the timidity of the Ontario government. Now we wish to tell the Mail that Mr. Blake's speech, if properly interpreted, shows that remarkable progress has been made in putting the case of the provincial university before the people. Every day witnesses many converts to the provincial view, as against the sectarian view in the matter of higher education. It is true that the Ontario government have so far been afraid to adopt any line in this respect; but there is every reason to hope for an early removal of the main drawback to a vigorous policy, viz., the opposition of two or three important denominations. And if this is out of the way the government will have no reason for delay. We are happy to say that the disposition on the part of the methodists to accept the state institution for the arts training of their students is becoming more and more apparent especially among the lay element, and once that important body comes into line with the presbyterians, the anglicans of the Protestant Episcopal divinity school, the baptists and the Roman Catholics, it is certain that the university will be put on a better footing. But because the Globe has been afraid to say anything, and because the Ontario government have been timid, it does not follow that the Mail should abandon the reputable position that it has taken heretofore, or take a stand that would jeopardize the consummation of what it appears to have at heart. Even the Mail has not lost faith in the cause, for in its closing sentence it expresses willingness to make another effort.

We propose from time to time taking up some of the points in Mr. Blake's address, and to show wherein we think the policy he outlined in regard to university matters is the best possible one for the people of this province.

Cooking and Heating With Gas. The Scientific American says: Dr. J. B. Rich, of 37 West 22d street, New York, has been conducting for some time past interesting experiments with gas stoves. The doctor weighs the articles he bakes, boils, roasts, or otherwise cooks, and keeps an exact record of the quantity of gas consumed and the time occupied in cooking each article, or all together. The manner in which the experiments are conducted impart interest in the doctor's investigations, and will insure, when completed, a pretty accurate conclusion as to the relative cost of coal and gas for cooking and heating purposes.

The gas stoves used in the experiments are from different manufacturers, and the doctor has one of his own invention; but unlike most sanguine persons he does not think his stove much better than some others. But that there is a vast economy in the use of gas for all kinds of domestic purposes the doctor has not a doubt, and when through with his experiments the gas companies, gas stove makers, and the public are all to have the benefit of his investigations.

French Evangelization. The breeze in the presbyterian assembly on Tuesday over the report of the board of French evangelization is only the advance guard of a heavier storm which will make itself felt before long. Mr. Ball, who brought the matter up, presented it in such a way that it was not considered on its merits, and Mr. Carmichael who assisted Mr. Ball was apparently so much impressed with the punishment administered to the latter that he took refuge in something like a peccavi. Rev. Principal McVicar is a heavy man, and when Mr. Ball placed himself in a position to be sat on the principal sat down with a will. Of course, it served Mr. Ball right; he should not have made statements reflecting on individuals without warrant. Equally, of course, the report was carried without further discussion, though many members of the assembly are extremely doubtful about the expediency of trying to presbyterianize the French Catholics of Quebec.

We have already pointed out that for all the money expended on this particular mission there are very meagre results to show, and even the speakers who backed up the report of the board failed to make plain that the propaganda is a success. It converts are made among the French people they drift back in many, perhaps not a few, instances, to the Catholic Church. One speaker said the priests, who were once disturbed over the scheme now laugh at it. This corresponds with the assertion heard from time to time, that amongst the

French people it is looked upon as a kind of out-door relief for poor people. What use is made of the books distributed? What becomes of the pupils educated at the schools? It is a good thing for any community to have \$20,000 spent in its midst so long as its members have not to pay it in taxes; but what about the presbyterians of other parts of Canada who voluntarily are themselves to raise the money? The laymen of the church will probably have something to say in the matter now that Mr. Ball has in his own rough way broken the ice.

There are two points of view from which this mission may be viewed—is as a matter of fact viewed by its chief promoters. One of these Dr. McVicar is fond of urging—the "political view." Here is a people, he in effect says, that forms a present an unsatisfied mass in the centre of the dominion. It holds the balance of power, and thus occupies a position dangerous to the liberties of the rest of the people—all the more dangerous on account of the ignorance of the electorate and the disposition of the habitations to follow their leaders at the instigation of their clerical advisers. Let us do what we can to break up this undisciplined mass and free its constituent parts from priestly domination. To do this we must first of all make it clear to the evangelists justice they do not put this forward as their main purpose; in other words the political benefit of the scheme is to be an incidental benefit.

We warn Dr. McVicar, his friends, and the church generally, that they are here treading on dangerous ground, and that other churches besides theirs can play at the game of proselytizing for political purposes. We warn them also that in so far as the political end is concerned they are foredoomed to inevitable failure. The French people are more united now than ever before, and all the efforts of all the protestant churches will not break them up. So long as they are allowed to draw at will from the dominion treasury they will never suffer themselves to be politically educated. The only remedy for the danger apprehended is to close that treasury against them and teach them through their pockets.

On purely evangelical grounds the mission might perhaps be defended if the church had plenty of funds to spare for it, but it is not the most pressing work of the presbyterian denomination from any point of view. There are many localities in Ontario where presbyterians are left comparatively neglected while thousands are spent yearly without visible results in the vain attempt to steal away a few members from the Catholic Church. The illimitable field of the great Northwest is left only partially cultivated, and no provision is made for the future in that vast region of unknown possibilities. The question whether the presbyterian church will leave the Northwest neglected for the chance of capturing Quebec is one that will soon press for an answer, and when the people come to understand the situation they will decide the matter without much reference to the promoters of the French mission in the general assembly.

Getting Rid of Brown. The only activity shown in the Globe, of about that institution, is in the direction of getting rid of the "old Brown staff." There was a solicitude about the opinion of the Browns and about everything connected with them that reflected the vigor of their intellects and the strength of their opinions. But since the Browns went out there has been no more of that kind of part of those who succeeded, at throwing out of the windows the opinions and methods of the former Globe; and now when these have been pitched out, even George Brown's front window and balcony is to be torn down and sent the same way, in order to make room for something more in the gingerbread style. The Globe of to-day more resembles the Globe of three or four years ago than does Shakespeare's great play with Hamlet and Hamlet out. All its pronounced opinions have been emasculated and something thin and namby-pamby has been put in their place. Telegraph Competition. As the people of both Canada and the States know full well there are "gobblers" of telegraph lines as well as of railways. The latest stroke of business in telegraph gobbling is, however, one that the public will rather approve of. The Bankers and Merchants' telegraph company's line has been taken over by the Postal Telegraph and Cable company, the latter being what is also called the Bennett-Mackay company, which is about to give us the benefit of real and not merely mook competition in ocean cable business. This secures that the concern first named shall not be swallowed up by the Western Union, as was feared by some. The New York Herald gives the following account of the transaction:

A. W. Dimock, the banker and broker, whose firm was forced into suspension during the financial storm of 1873, was the leading spirit and largest stockholder in the Bankers and Merchants' telegraph company, and when he resigned the presidency of that company on the day of his business suspension the directors of the Postal company immediately sought an alliance with the concern thus suddenly deprived of its head. The negotiators on behalf of the Postal company were Henry Cummins, George S. Hart, George S. One, George W. Cass and Henry Rosser, and for the Bankers and Merchants' company were W. Dimock and E. Burton Hart. President Dimock of the Postal was ex officio a member of the committee, but was absent from the meeting.

These gentlemen, who constitute the executive committees of their respective companies, held a meeting on Friday last, and agreed upon the terms of a contract for pooling the resources of the two companies, to run for five years. The agreement was signed by the respective committees of both lines on Friday, June 6, and a consultation of the two companies was held on Saturday, June 7, at which it was unanimously approved by the full board of directors of the two companies. It does not need to be formally voted upon by the stockholders in a special meeting.

The orchard men are not easily bluffed: as a body said of Wellington's soldiers, they don't know when they are beaten. About two weeks ago the New York Herald proved by good testimony that the damage to fruit by the frost of the last week in May was comparatively trifling, notwithstanding the howl that had been made. In the countries along the Hudson river, in "York State," the fire-worms are doing a fearful ravage in the apple orchards. "The worms, which are black, or nearly so, are about three-quarters of an inch long, and completely cover the roads. A team of oxen and their driver were driven together from a field by the worms crawling upon them." That must be a worm "as is a worm," we should say.

It appears that cigars seized for violations of the British revenue laws are burned by the authorities, not, however, in such a way as to afford a cheerful smoke to anybody, but just as log-heaps, and brush-wood, and other refuse, are piled up, and the cigars might be sold and the proceeds put into the treasury, but this plan does not seem to have occurred to the official mind.
