Increasing Demand for Cool Cured Cheese.

BUILDING NEW CURING ROOMS—THE PATRON'S INTEREST—Department of Agriculture, Commissioner's Branch.

Ottawa, Sept. 15th. Judging from the greater demand for cool cured cheese which exists this season, the Old Country merchants are beginning to realize more fully the advantage there is in having cheese cured in a room where the temperature is higher than sixty degrees. These factors that are able to offer a much better product than the ordinary cheese that is made in a factory are beginning to be appreciated by the public.

The experience gained at the Government curing rooms has demonstrated that, while the first requisite is to control the temperature, it is also necessary to provide for some circulation of the air to carry off the moisture which escapes from the cheese, and which comes from the tendency to mold badly.

The system adopted at the Government curing rooms has worked admirably, and it can be employed with difficulty and at a moderate cost in connection with any cheese factory. Indeed, a large number of factory curing rooms have already been remodelled on this system.

The Seed Division of the Department of Agriculture, Ottawa, has just issued an illustrated bulletin on the "Cool Seeds commonly found in Timothy, Alkali and Red Clover Seeds." It is well known that large quantities of seeds of many noxious weeds are each year unwittingly sown with grass and clover seeds. The resemblance of many weed seeds to the commercial seeds with which they are found makes their detection difficult to an untrained eye, even if they are present to the extent of several hundred per cent.
