VENUS will be *Evening* Star until September 25; thence *Morning* Star the remainder of the year.

MARS will be the *Evening* Star until September 26; it will then be the *Morning* Star to the close of the year.

JUPITER will be the *Morning* Star until April 13; then *Evening* Star until October 21; after which it will be the *Morning* Star to the close of the year.

SATURN will be the *Morning* Star until March 25; thence *Even.* Star until Sept. 29; after which it will be the *Morn.* Star to the close of the year.

Eclipses take place every half year, and at each period there may be one, two, or three; if only one, it must be an eclipse of the Sun; if two,

there will be one of each luminary; and if three, there will be two of the Sun, with one of the Moon between them. When the earth becomes situated between the Sun and the Moon, the latter must be covered with darkness, and there will be an eclipse of the Moon, which will be total or partial, according as the Moon plunges wholly or in part into the cone of the shadow—it will be central, if the centre of the Moon coincides exactly with that of the terrestrial shadow. A total eclipse of the Moon never exceeds two hours, and may be shorter than that period.

When the Moon interposes herself between the Sun and the earth, the former may be eclipsed. The eclipse is *partial* when the Moon hides only a part of the Sun's disk; total, when she covers the whole of it; *annular* when the Sun, masked by the Moon, projects all round in the form of a luminous ring; lastly, it is *central* when the spectator's place is in the prolongation of the line joining the centres of the Sun and Moon.

The Moon being nearly of the same figure as the earth, her shadow and her penumbra are formed in the same manner; only as she is much smaller, her cone of shadow can never cover more than a portion of the earth's surface. A solar eclipse never takes place at the same time all over the earth, and the same eclipse of the Sun which is total for one point on the earth, may be invisible at another. In most solar eclipses, the Moon's disk is clothed with a faint light, proceeding from the reflection caused by the illuminated part of the earth.

EXPLANATION OF THE CALENDAR PAGES.

Column

LEFT HAND PAGE.

1 and 2—Days of the Month and of the Week.

3 “ 4—The rising and setting in *mean time* of the highest point, or of the *upper limb* of the Sun, corrected for refraction.

5.—The Sun's declination for the same as the Equation, 6th column.

6.—Equation of time, (or quantity by which the Sun is *slow* or *fast* of the clock at noon, apparent, not mean, time at Greenwich, or a quarter before eight o'clock in the morning at Halifax.) Equation of time is the difference between *mean* and *apparent* time; and there are only four periods of the year when this difference is nothing—namely, about April 15, June 15, September 1, and December 24, as may be seen by referring to this column.

7.—Days' length in hours and minutes.

8.—The rising of the Moon.

9.—The setting of the Moon.

10.—The time of the Moon's southing, or passing the meridian. This column also gives the time of High Water at Parrsboro', Horton, Cornwallis, Hantsport, Windsor, Newport, Truro, &c.

11.—The symbols in this column indicate the Moon's place in the Signs or Constellations of the Zodiac.

The top of the columns of each month gives the Moon's Phases, or times of New and Full Moon, and of the First and Last Quarters, or quadratures of the Sun.

The FARMER'S CALENDAR is placed at the foot of the columns of each month.

RIGHT HAND PAGE.

1.—Contains the days of the Month.

2.—Sundays, Weather, Anniversaries, &c.

3.—The time of High Water at Halifax, N. S.

4.— “ “ “ Pictou, N.S. and Cape Tormentine. N.B.

5.— “ “ “ Annapolis, N. S., St. John, N. B., and Portland, Maine.

6.— “ “ “ St. John's, Newfoundland, of that tide which immediately precedes the southing of the Moon. These four columns are computed on the supposition that the time of High Water on the days of the New and Full Moon—*L'establissement du port*—is at Halifax, 7h. 30m.; at Annapolis, St. John, N. B., and Portland, 11h. 14m.; at Pictou and Cape Tormentine, 10h., and at St. John's, Newfoundland, 6h. 30m.

All the calculations are made to mean *solar* time.

THERE is no subject so eminently worthy the earnest attention of our farmers, as that of underdrainage. Underdraining lies at the foundation of all agricultural and horticultural improvement. It is erroneous to suppose that *all* land needs it; but it may be assumed that the greater portion of all the arable, and much of the grass land, would be much improved by the removal of all surplus water, by means of underground conduits. Underdrained land can be ploughed earlier in the Spring, and later in the Fall, than that which is not underdrained; and after heavy rains, while the underdrained land is too wet for man or beast to work on, the drained soil is sufficiently dry to allow the usual farm labours to proceed without interruption. In improving a farm, as in everything else, you must "begin at the beginning." Provide means for removing all excess of water from the land, and you are then in a condition to carry out other improvements.

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Explanation of Common Notes, &c.

SOLAR CYCLE is a period of 28 years, after which the days of the week return in the same order, and at the same day of the month, whilst the bissextile (leap) years follow regularly every 4 years. The Leap years also recommence, at the termination of the solar cycle, the same course with respect to the days of the week on which fall those of the months. The solar cycle owes its origin to the fact that the year does not contain an exact number of weeks, since it consists of 52 weeks and 1 day. This cycle would therefore be only of 7 years (since in that period the extra day of each year would make a week) if there were no bissextile years; but as there is one every 4 years, the cycle cannot be complete without

MANURE is a necessary application, in order to bring an impoverished soil into a productive state. Nothing is more certain, all agree. And yet, how much of the unprofitable farming of the country results from the attempt to grow crops on worn out soils *without manure*. Plant corn or grain on such land—the crop is a meagre one, both from want of strength in the soil to grow it, and length of the season to mature it. A rich or well manured soil will ripen this crop weeks earlier than a poor one. An acre of land, rich, deeply tilled, planted in good season, and thoroughly and cleanly cultivated, will produce more than five acres poor, shallow-ploughed, late planted, and half-cultivated, and at perhaps one-half the expense of the latter. Much labour on little land, is the secret of success—enough labour, at least, to do everything in the best manner. The causes of unprofitable farming are not exhausted, and it is a proper subject for the examination of the farmer. Let him look into the matter, and see *where* and *why* he failed.

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containing 7 leap years, so that the extra day of each of these may give a week.

GOLDEN NUMBER, or lunar cycle, is a period of 19 years, after which the sun and moon meet again in the same position, or nearly so: since the conjunctions, oppositions, &c., of these bodies are, within $1\frac{1}{2}$ hours, the same as at the beginning of this period, and on the same days of the month. Meton, a celebrated astronomer, imagined a period or cycle of 19 years, which conciliated the motions of the sun and moon, by embracing a finite number of revolutions of those two bodies. This period was composed of 235 lunations, viz: 228 at the rate of 12 to the year, and 7 others for the 11 days, by which the solar exceeded the lunar year. The 7 lunar months, of which 6 were of 30 days each, and the 7th of 29, were called *embolismic* or intercalary months. This arrangement appeared so admirable to the Greeks, that, when it was proposed at the Olympic games, it was received with acclamations, and adopted by all

LAND lying long in grass needs repeated dressings of manure,—there is no occasion for ploughing up our grass lands half as frequently, if we would only give them some fertiliser, like composted barn manure, ashes, bone dust, guano, &c., every two or three years. Cultivation and manure would work wonders in the improvement of the grass crop of the country—a rich deep soil, and such alone can produce a large growth of hay or pasture. That preparation of the land which gives the best grain and root crops, will give the greatest grass crop, or will best prepare the land therefor. On a rich, deep and porous soil, drought has very little effect—on a poor, shallow and hard one, the grass or other crop always suffers severely from any lack of rain. More attention to seeding would go far in the improvement of grass lands. Nature does much, but man can assist and direct her operations. A well drained soil is as much better for growing grass, as it is for any other crop.

THE DOMINICAL or SUNDAY LETTER is one of the first seven letters of the alphabet, which letters are used to denote respectively the days of the week, and one of which letters must of course fall to the Sunday throughout the year. But, owing to leap year, their order is every 4th year disturbed; so that the solar cycle must pass round before the letters can fall respectively to the same days of the week. The year 1852 being leap year, there are two Sunday letters; the left hand let-

ALL who raise carrots are aware that much depends upon hoeing and thinning. The carrot, at first, is so small as to be hardly discernible, and many wait too long before they commence to hoe, allowing the weeds to get the advantage; and no amount of hoeing can insure a good crop after it has once been overrun and choked with weeds. The best plan to distinguish the rows as soon as any other garden vegetable, is to mix and sow with the carrot seed a small quantity radish, as that starts quick, and has a broad leaf. The carrot can then be hoed as soon as above ground, or a week or two sooner than without. The radishes can be pulled at the first hoeing, or allowed to remain till they acquire some size, and you have a crop of radishes without injury to the carrots, if they are not suffered to remain too long. With the use of ordinary means, a crop of 1,400 bushels of carrots have been raised on an acre.

ROMAN INDICTION was a period of fifteen years, appointed by the Emperor Constantine, A. D., 312, for the payment of certain taxes from the subjects of the Empire.

NUMBER OF DIRECTION.—It having been decided by an assembly of Christian Bishops, at the council of Nice, in Bythynia, of Asia Minor, A. D. 325, that Easter-day is always the "first Sunday after the full moon, which happens upon, or next after, the 21st of March;" it follows that Easter-day cannot take place earlier than the 22nd of March, or later than the 25th of April; so that from one date to the other (both inclusive) are 35 days. The number of direction is that day of the 35 on which Easter Sunday falls.

WHEAT, as a general farm crop, has for some time, and to a large extent, ceased to receive that attention formerly bestowed upon its culture. To grow Wheat, we need a fertile, well drained soil—either a porous, heavy loam, or a clayey soil made porous by artificial drainage. What is called a *warm, quick soil*, is most certain to secure a thrifty, perfect growth and an abundant product. Another requisite is that the land be well tilled; it should be *in the best order possible*: if manured before sowing, the fertilizer applied should be intimately mixed with the soil, and not far below the surface. Let the land be in fine tilth, and then drill in the seed, and an additional security is had against winter-killing, and other injuries thereon. Rolling is an excellent practice, if the soil is mellow, and likely to remain too light for wheat, as is occasionally the case. Another demand of the wheat crop, is sowing so early that the plants may get a fair autumn growth, and be prepared for the rigour of our winters.

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The JULIAN PERIOD consists of 7980 years; which is produced by the multiplication into each other of the solar cycle, the lunar cycle, and the Roman Indiction; ($28 \times 19 \times 15 = 7980$.) This period is reckoned from 700 years before the creation of the world, when the three cycles are supposed to commence together, which circumstance cannot take place again until the lapse of the entire period, A. D. 3267.

The Roman Indiction and the Julian period are not now of practical use in the calendar; but they are still noticed, on account of the historical references that belong to them.

There was also a cycle, called the *Victorian* cycle, which was invented by Victorinus of Aquitain, A. D. 463. It was called likewise the *pascal* cycle; its object being to regulate the computation of Easter. It

JUNE is the most favourable month for doing up "Statute Labour"—that our system is an imperfect one, as well as expensive, is very generally admitted;—the Statute Labour Act, passed during the last Session of the Legislature, and which came into effect on the first of September last, repealing the old Act, we trust will remedy many of the abuses of the old law. The great difference between good roads and bad ones, lies in the fact of their perfect or imperfect drainage. It is impossible for a good road to exist where water stands and stagnates, and where the rain that falls cannot run off. There must be ditches at each side, and these must be made to lead away, and not to hold the water, or the road-bed will soak up more or less of the moisture, and thus remain rutty and muddy. Thorough drainage must be provided for either by surface or covered ditches. An underdrain directly beneath the track would furnish the most economical foundation for a dry and good road.

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was produced by multiplying the years in the Lunar cycle by those in the Solar, which gave a period of 532 years. It was in use until the Roman Empire became extinct.

EPOCH.—Since the solar and lunar years do not recommence together till after 19 years, there is in this interval an excess of the former over the latter. It is this number of days by which the solar year exceeds the lunar, that is designated by the name of *epact*, which implies something *added*. The annual epacts, which are those given yearly with the chronological notes, page 2, are the excesses of the solar above the lunar. Hence, as the Julian solar year is 365d. 6h., and the Julian lunar year 354d. 8h. 48m. 38s., the annual epact will be 10d. 21h. 11m. 22s., that is almost 11 days: consequently the epact for 2 years is 22 days; of 3 years, 33 days; or rather three, since 30 days make an *embolismic*, or

At this busy season of the year, farmers are very apt to neglect to properly house their carts, ploughs and farming tools—they are left in the field at night, where they are likely to be wanted on the morrow; but a storm comes on and the tools are exposed through a drenching rain. This injury done to the tools by being exposed to a rain, and then using them in the sun, is greater than may be at first supposed. It is slight at first, and imperceptible, and that is the reason why farmers do not notice it. A pair of cart-wheels properly housed, both in summer and winter, will outlast two pair suffered to stand out in all weathers, and through all seasons. A farmer will buy a plough or a pair of cart wheels, and after using them for a few seasons, taking no pains to protect them from the weather, he will, as they begin to get out of order, say they were not made good; when the fact is, he has neglected to house them, and the rain has found its way into the joints, decay began, and after a short time they are gone.

The moon's mean distance from the earth is 237,000 miles—Diameter about $\frac{1}{4}$ of that of the earth—and its bulk about one-fiftieth—so that with an instrument which magnifies one thousand times, she will appear to the naked eye as if she were only 237 miles off.

The sun is 1,300,000 times greater than the earth, and its mean distance from us is about 95,000,000 of miles.

THE comparative merits of barns, as regards economy and space, is an important subject for farmers. The old fashioned buildings are rapidly giving place to the new, and comfort and cleanliness are superseding misery and filth. Once, barn cellars for housing manures were scouted. Now such a place is considered most valuable. Many farmers who have barn cellars use no bedding for their cattle; the manure and urine are thrown into the cellar, but the fresh dung can imbibe no more liquid, and of course the urine drains off or soaks into the ground; this is a serious loss. Other farmers make use of muck, litter, or other absorbents, to take up the liquids. If the manure is frequently spread about, and a few hogs kept upon it, or young cattle occasionally turned in, so as to tread it solid, decomposition will go on slowly, with little escape of gases. As soon as the snow is off, and the frost is out of the ground, farmers can profitably devote a few days in putting up heaps of rubbish, which would become a vegetable mould.

BUCKWHEAT is an important crop for the farmer. The time of sowing varies with the season and place, but from the 20th June to the 4th July is regarded as the best and most proper season. If sown too early it is liable to blast, and if too late, is apt to be hurt by frost. The general practice has been, to sow buckwheat on the poorest land, when there is no crop which will pay for liberal and generous manuring. It is a crop that spreads very much, and therefore, less seed is just as good as more,—a half bushel is amply sufficient for an acre—and this, if sown evenly over that surface, will give as many stalks as can comfortably grow: for if a larger quantity were sown, the growth of straw would be so abundant that it would lodge down, and this would not fill so heavily, or ripen so evenly. After being cut it should lay for a number of days on the ground, and if out in two or three showers no damage is done, if it be turned over so as to dry off. When hauled into the barn, it should be thrashed immediately.

So much has been published in past years, respecting the history, culture and value of Indian Corn, that it would almost seem that nothing now could be written on the subject. It is now about 240 years since the white man commenced its culture. To insure a heavy crop of corn, in addition to a favourable season, the soil should be adapted to its growth, and should be rich either naturally, or made so by manure; it should also be well and evenly ploughed,—the depth of the ploughing should be graduated somewhat by the depth of the surface soil, and the quality of the subsoil. After ploughing it is highly important to have the soil thoroughly pulverized by the use of the harrow, roller and cultivator. It makes a material difference in the cost of growing an acre of corn, whether it takes one day or four to hoe it each time. Most farmers plant corn for its grain, not for its fodder; the larger the growth of stalks, the greater the exhaustion of the soil.

* THE best food for young pigs is *milk*—first from the sow, and, after this ends, skim-milk from cows. In all changes of the food of animals the transition should be gradual. Sudden changes always injure. Pass gradually from new milk to skim-milk, and from the latter to sour milk. If there is not enough skim-milk and sour milk for all the pigs to eat through spring and summer, then reduce their number; or barley or pea-meal may be gradually added, and increased in quantity. As the pigs grow larger and the milk decreases, grain takes its place. There is a great mistake often made in feeding milk to pigs, by allowing slop and dish-water to be thrown into it, which dilutes it, and consequently the animal cannot take in enough for his most rapid growth. Feed the milk in its concentrated state. To give hogs a start when first put up for fattening, there is no better food than good ripe pumpkins.

NOTICE.

It will be noticed that the title of *Esquire* has been entirely omitted in this Almanack, and that the only titles of distinction retained are those of the Clergy, the members of the Executive and Legislative Councils, and the Judges of the Courts.

The word *ESQUIRE* is defined as a title of distinction, next below that of a knight, and above that of a simple gentleman. The origin, both of the name and the thing, is very obscure. Walker defines it as the armour-bearer or attendant on a knight; a title of dignity, and next in degree below a knight. Blackstone says it is a matter somewhat unsettled, or who is a real *esquire*; for it is not an estate, however large, that confers this rank upon its owner. Camden reckons up four sorts of them:—I. The eldest sons of knights and their eldest sons in perpetual succession. II. The eldest sons of younger sons of peers and their eldest sons in like perpetual succession. III. Esquires created by the King's letters patent or other investiture, and their eldest sons. IV. Esquires by virtue of their offices: as Justices of the Peace, and others who bear any office (superior public officers) of trust under the Crown. To these may be added the esquires of Knights of the Bath, each of whom constitutes three at his installation.

Sir Henry Spellman says that in addition to those above named as entitled to the distinction are Sheriffs of Counties, Sergeants at Law, Mayors, Counsellors at Law, Lieutenant Colonels, Majors, and Captains, during the time of their commission. Lastly, the heads of some English families who are likewise esquires by prescription. To these may be added all foreign, nay Irish peers; for not only these, but the eldest sons of peers of Great Britain, though frequently titular lords, are only esquires by the law, and must be so named in all legal proceedings.

All too late Letters and *Telegrams* will be received on board the Steamer by the Officer in charge of the Mails, who is alone authorized to receive them. Letters 12½ cents—*must be prepaid*. Newspapers *free*. Unpaid Letters will be forwarded with a fine of 12½ cents each. Letters to the Imperial Public Departments are exempt from prepayment.

The charge on Books, Pamphlets, Maps, Printed Letters, Parliamentary Papers, &c., to the United Kingdom, Newfoundland, Bermuda, and British West Indies, by Book-Post, is for a package not exceeding 4 oz., 7 cents; above 4 oz. and not exceeding $\frac{1}{2}$ lb., 12 $\frac{1}{2}$ cents; and 12 $\frac{1}{2}$ cents for every additional $\frac{1}{2}$ pound or fraction of a $\frac{1}{2}$ pound. Package not to exceed 2 feet in length, width or depth. *Must be prepaid.*

Closed Mails for the United Kingdom *via* the United States are made up to meet the Steamers leaving New York for Liverpool. Letters to be specially addressed "*via New York.*" Letters 20 cents; Newspapers 2 cents. *Must be prepaid.*

The Mails for NEWFOUNDLAND are made up *once a month* in December, January, February, and March; and *fortnightly* in the other months, including Cape Breton, closing *finally* on the *Thursday evening* of the week the Steamer is due from Boston. Letters 10 cents; when posted in the interior, 13 $\frac{1}{2}$ cents. Newspapers 2 cents. *All must be prepaid.*

Prepaid letters from Newfoundland are charged an additional postage of 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ cents; unpaid letters are taxed 10 cents.

The Mails for the UNITED STATES by the Steamers from Liverpool, G.B., to Boston, are made up on *Tuesday evening* of the week the Steamer is due, at 8 o'clock. Should the Steamer not arrive by 6 o'clock the following morning *Supplementary Mails* will be made up. Should the Steamer arrive *previous* to Tuesday evening, the Mails will then close *immediately* upon her arrival. Letters 10 cents; when posted in the interior, 13 $\frac{1}{2}$ cents. Newspapers 2 cents. *All must be prepaid.*

Mails for CANADA are made up and forwarded at the same time. Letters to be specially addressed, "*Closed Mail for Canada.*" Letters 12 $\frac{1}{2}$ cents—*prepayment optional.*

The Mails for BERMUDA and the BRITISH WEST INDIA ISLANDS are made up *finally* on the *Thursday evening* of the week the Steamer is due from Boston, at 8 o'clock, once a month the year round. Letters 10 cents; when posted in the interior, 13 $\frac{1}{2}$ cents—*prepayment compulsory.* Newspapers 2 cents—*must also be prepaid.* Prepaid letters for Halifax, from Bermuda, Newfoundland, and the West Indies are taxed an additional postage of 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ cents the $\frac{1}{2}$ oz; those received from those places and from the United States, unpaid, for Halifax delivery, are taxed 10 cents; for other places in Nova Scotia, 13 $\frac{1}{2}$ cents; also for Cuba, Honduras, Lagayra, Mexico, Venezuela, and the Foreign West India Islands. The rates of postage vary to these places. The postage on letters and newspapers must be prepaid. A Mail is also forwarded *via* Bermuda, Chagres, and Panama, to places on the Western Coast of America. Letters 33 $\frac{1}{2}$ cents; Newspapers 8 $\frac{1}{2}$ cents—*must be prepaid.* In all cases the inland postage to Halifax (5 cents) must be paid in addition to the above rates.

The Mails for ST. PIERRE and MIQUELON are forwarded to Newfoundland by Steamer. Letters 8 $\frac{1}{2}$ cents; if posted in the interior, 5 cents additional. Newspapers 2 cents. *All must be prepaid.*

Letters for registry must be mailed *half an hour* previous to the closing of the Mail by which they are to be sent. The charge for the registration of a letter addressed to any place in Nova Scotia or British North America is 10 cents; to the United States, 10 cents; to the United Kingdom, 12½ cents; to Australia, foreign countries, and other places, when passing through the United Kingdom, 25 cents. *All to be prepaid*, as well as the postage.

Parliamentary papers pass *free* throughout Nova Scotia.

Printed Circulars, Prices Current, or other printed matter of a like description, when unconnected with any written or manuscript communication whatever, passing between any office in Nova Scotia and any place in British North America, or the United States, will be one cent per oz.; *must be prepaid*.

Books, Pamphlets, and other printed matter of a like description, mailed in the Province for delivery in the Province, are charged one cent per oz.; *must be prepaid*.

Periodicals (other than Newspapers) printed and published in a foreign country, when specially devoted to religious or general Education, to Agriculture, to Temperance, or to any branch of Science, and addressed directly from the office of publication, are transmitted to any place in Nova Scotia to which they are addressed *free of charge*.

British reprints of copyright Works from the United States, *by steamer*, are charged letter postage.

LAND MAILS.

Letters posted in Nova Scotia, addressed to any place within the Province, *must be prepaid*. Postage, 5 cents per ½ oz. On letters to CANADA and NEW BRUNSWICK the rate is 5 cents—*prepayment optional*. Letters to and from PRINCE EDWARD ISLAND *must be prepaid*; if posted wholly or in part unpaid, they will be forwarded to their destination, with a fine of 5 cents in addition to the postage. On letters to the UNITED STATES (except Oregon and California) the postage is 10 cents; to Oregon and California, 15 cents—*must be prepaid by stamps*.

All letters are charged by weight, and a uniform rate of postage has been established throughout British North America. A single letter must not exceed ½ oz. The rates of postage mentioned all refer to a *single letter*. If a letter exceeds the ½ oz. it is charged double, treble, &c., according to weight.

All British and Colonial Newspapers are transmitted free of charge.

Newspapers printed and published in any foreign country, when received in Mails, and addressed to any place in Nova Scotia, are charged *one cent* each.

Letters dropped in the letter box during the night, *prepaid* by stamps, will be forwarded with the Mails despatched the next morning. All letters *partially* unpaid will be retained until the parties to whom they are addressed have been notified to pay the additional postage; if *wholly* unpaid they will be sent to the Dead Letter Office, where they will be opened and returned to the writers.

Letters posted in any town in the Province, for delivery in the same town, are charged 2 cents. For Dartmouth *daily*, postage 2 cents. If unpaid they are taxed 4 cents.

Official letters addressed to the Provincial and Military Departments are exempt from prepayment.

PARCEL POST.

Parcels by Mail can be sent through a Post or Way Office to any part of Nova Scotia. For a parcel not over 1 lb., 25 cents; more than 1 lb. and not exceeding 2 lbs., 50 cents; more than 2 lbs. and not exceeding 3 lbs. (beyond which weight they cannot be sent), 75 cents; 10 cents additional if registered—*both must be prepaid*. No parcel must exceed 1 foot in length or breadth, or 6 inches in thickness.

☞ All letters, parcels and newspapers, when marked in the foregoing “*to be prepaid*,” must be paid by having stamps of the amount affixed to them, as money is not received at the offices. Postage stamps can be obtained at any Post or Way Office, and at the Druggists and Stationers in Halifax.

☞ Masters of vessels arriving in the Province are entitled to receive for each letter they may deliver to the Postmaster at the first Office they touch or arrive at, or with which they may communicate, when inward bound, 3 cents.

The Postmaster General has the exclusive privilege of conveying letters throughout the Province. Persons receiving and conveying letters incur a penalty of \$1 for every letter so conveyed, except—1. Letters sent to be mailed in the nearest Post or Way Office. 2. Letters to a place out of the Province, and sent by sea, and by a private vessel, not being a Packet. 3. Letters sent by a Messenger purposely, on the private affairs of the sender or receiver. 4. Letters lawfully brought into the Province and immediately posted in the nearest Office. 5. Letters of Merchants, Ship-owners, or of cargo sent by Merchant vessels, and delivered to the party to whom addressed without charge or fee.

When the Mail arrives from England before 9 p. m. they will be delivered the same evening; after that hour at 7 the following morning.

All other Mails arriving before 7 p. m. will be delivered the same evening; after that hour at 7 the following morning.

The Postmaster General is not liable for the loss of any letter or packet, unless such loss should arise from his own default.

No person is obliged to send pamphlets, books or newspapers, by Mail.

LIGHT HOUSES.

On the Coast of Nova Scotia; the Coast of New Brunswick in the Bay of Fundy; Cape Race, Nfld.; Gulf and River St. Lawrence; and Strait of Belle-Isle.

West from Halifax.

MEAGHER'S BEACH—East side Halifax Harbour. *A fixed light.*

DEVIL'S ISLAND—An *Octagonal Light Beacon* on the S. W. point of the Devil's Island, at the entrance of the Eastern passage to Halifax Harbour. Exhibits a *red light* on the seaward sides, to distinguish it from Sambro and Meagher's Beach lights; stands 45 feet above high water mark; rise and fall, 6 feet. The Tower painted dark brown, with a white Belt between the Balcony and Lantern, to distinguish it in day time.

SAMBRO ISLAND—Western entrance Halifax Harbour. *A fixed light.*

CROSS ISLAND—Entrance to Lunenburg Harbour. Two lights—*flash light above, fixed light below.*

IRON-BOUND-ISLAND LIGHT—Off the entrance to LaHave River. *A bright flash light*, of 20 seconds duration, followed by eclipses of thirty seconds. The lantern is placed on a square, wooden tower, painted *white*, on the Southern side of the Island, and is visible from all points of approach. Elevation 70 feet above sea level.

PORT MEDWAY—*Beacon Light* on Admiralty Head, west side of the entrance of the port. Building square, painted *white* with *black square* in the centre of the seaward sides,—a *white light*, 44 feet above sea level, and stands within 30 fathoms of the shore.

LIVERPOOL—South end of Coffin's Island, off the entrance of the Harbour. *A plain revolving light.*

FORT POINT LIGHT, at the head of Liverpool Harbour. *A bright fixed light*, visible from all points of approach, and must be left on the larboard hand, when entering the harbour.

GULL ROCK LIGHT, OFF THE ENTRANCE OF RAGGED ISLAND HARBOUR. Building square and painted *white*, exhibiting a *clear fixed light*, at an elevation of 51 feet above the sea level, and is situated in lat. 43° 39' N., and long. 64° 66' W.

SHELBURNE—On McNutt's Island, off the entrance of the Harbour. *Two fixed lights*—one above the other.

BARRINGTON—Baccaro Point, east side of the entrance to Barrington Harbour. *A flash light*, of thirty seconds.

CAPE SABLE ISLAND LIGHT—Building octagon, painted *white*. *A fixed red light.*

PUBNICO HARBOUR LIGHT—*A Beacon light* on the S. E. side of the entrance to Pubnico Harbour, situated on the E. side of the entrance to the Bay of Fundy, about 13 miles northerly of Cape Sable. Building square, painted *white*. *A bright white light*, on the seaward side, 28 feet above high water level, (rise and fall 12 feet,) and stands fifty fathoms from low water mark. The point of each is bold.

CAPE FORCHU LIGHT—On Cape Forchu, western side of the entrance to Yarmouth Harbour. *A plain revolving light*, visible one minute and a quarter, and invisible half a minute. Building painted *white*, elevated 135 feet above the level of the sea.

A FOG BELL has been erected on the E. Cape of Yarmouth Harbour, a few feet to the southward of the Light House, and about one and one-quarter miles from the extreme outer point of the Cape. Strikes seven times per minute.

BRIER ISLAND—*A plain white light*, situate about half a mile N. E. from the N. W. point of the Island.

WESTPORT—Peter's Island, at the south entrance of the east side of the Bay of Fundy. *Two white lights*, placed horizontally, to distinguish it from Brier Island Light, at an elevation of 40 feet above high water mark.

DIGBY GUT LIGHT—On the west side of Digby Gut. This light is chiefly intended as a guide into Annapolis Basin. *A fixed white light*.

PORT WILLIAMS (late Marshall's Cove) BEACON LIGHT—Building square and painted *white*; exhibits at a distance of about 5 miles, *a white light*, and on nearer approach *a green light*. Port Williams is distant from Digby Light House E. 25 miles, and from Black Rock Light House W. 27 miles.

MARGARETVILLE BEACON LIGHT—Building square and painted *white*; exhibits at a distance of about 5 miles *a white light*, and on nearer approach *a red light*. Margaretville is distant E. 37 miles from Digby Light House, and W. 15 miles from Black Rock Light House.

The lights in the above two beacon lights distinguish them from other lights in their vicinity.

BLACK ROCK LIGHT—On the south shore of the Bay of Fundy. *A fixed white light*, 27 miles E. of Port Williams.

A Spar Buoy has been placed on the Budget Ledge, at the entrance of Cape Negro Harbour, on the N. E. side, half-way from the lower to the upper end of the Ledge, in six fathoms of water, and about 70 feet from the shoal water.

APPLE RIVER LIGHT—North side of the entrance to Apple River, in Chignecto Channel. *Two fixed lights*, placed horizontally.

PARTRIDGE ISLAND RIVER—An octagonal Light Beacon, on the west side of the entrance to Partridge Island River, Parrsboro', on the north side of the Basin of Minas, and exhibits a *plain, white light*, at an elevation of thirty feet above high-water; rise and fall about forty-five feet; the Tower is *white*, and stands close to high-water mark on the beach. Vessels can only enter the harbor at high-water, and must lie aground on soft bottom when the tide is low.

HORTON BLUFF LIGHT—In the Basin of Minas, 95 feet above sea level, high water; rise and falls forty to forty-five feet. Building square, painted *white*; stands sixty feet from the Bluff, and shows a *white light*, which may be seen, in clear weather, over the greater part of the Basin of Minas, (after passing Cape Blowmelon,) and above the Five Islands, and up Windsor River, until intercepted by the continuation of the Bluff to the southward of it.

BURNT COAT HEAD LIGHT—Basin of Minas. The lantern is erected on a square tower attached to the main building, and shows a *plain white light*, about 75 feet above high-water level, and visible from all points of approach. Tower and buildings painted *white*. Bearings and distances: Cape Blowmelon, N. 70, W. 26 5, 10 miles; Brick Kiln Ledges, N. 52, W. 7 5, 10 miles; Economy Point, N. 36, W. 3 9, 10 miles.

SEAL ISLAND LIGHT, off Cape Sable.—The first light on approaching the Bay of Fundy is on the South point of Seal Island. *A white light*, elevated about 80 feet above high water mark, and may be seen, on approaching the island, from any point of the compass. A very dangerous rock, under water, but upon which the sea always breaks, called Blonde Rock, lies about three and one-third miles S. by W., by compass, from the Light House. Between this rock and the Island there are some dangers—the ground is rocky throughout, and large vessels, therefore, ought not to attempt passing between them.

GANNET ROCK LIGHT.—This light is intended to warn vessels of their approach to a very dangerous range of shoals and ledges, which extend from the Old Proprietor to the Seal Islands, off Machias, a distance of about twenty miles. *A white flash light*, twenty seconds dark and forty seconds light in each minute. Building painted in stripes, vertical, black and white. Between the northernmost and the southernmost of the Murr Ledges there is a range of dangerous rocks and shoals, many of them always above water, and extend westward from the Light House about four miles. From this range further westerly, about six miles from the Gannet Light, lies a dangerous breaker called the Bull. This may be avoided by keeping three remarkable headlands near the S. W. end of Grand Manan, open.

MACHIAS SEAL ISLAND LIGHTS.—*Two fixed white lights*, upon the Machias Seal Islands, 45 feet above high water, and bear from each other E. S. E. and W. N. W., distant about 200 feet, by which circumstance, of two Light Houses at the same station, they will be immediately distinguished from all other lights upon the coast (British or American.) Both buildings painted *white*. Vessels standing to the northward between these lights and the Gannet Rock should tack or haul off the moment they bring these lights into one, as will be, then, not more than $\frac{3}{4}$ of a mile from the Murr Ledges, if more than 5 miles to the E. of the lights.

WEST QUODDY LIGHT.—This is an American Light, placed on the west side of the entrance into the St. Croix, by Lubec and Eastport.

HEAD HARBOR LIGHT.—Next in order after passing Grand Manan and the plain *white light* (American) on West Quoddy Point, is Head Harbor Light, placed on the N. E. extremity of Campo Bello, and is a guide to vessels entering the main channel to West Isles, Moose Island, and the inner bay of Passamaquoddy; it enables vessels, also, at all times, to enter Head Harbor. *A fixed white light*. Building painted *white*, with a *red* cross on it.

POINT LE PREAU LIGHTS.—Upon this projecting headland two lights are placed, one above the other, in the same house, and distant 28 feet. Both lights can be seen from every point of the compass where they may be useful. Both are *fixed* and *white*. Building painted *red* and *white*, in stripes, 5 feet broad each, horizontally.

PARTRIDGE ISLAND LIGHT.—At the entrance of the river and harbour of St. John, N. B. *A fixed white light*. The building painted *red* and *white*, in vertical stripes.

BEACON LIGHT.—Within Partridge Island, and upon a spit or bar which extends about half a mile S. S. E. off Sand Point, and which dries at two-thirds ebb, stands the Beacon Tower. *A fixed white light*. Building painted *white* and *black*, in stripes, vertically.

QUACOC LIGHT.—*A revolving white light*, placed on a small rock off

Quince Head, showing twice full and twice dark in a minute. The light can be seen from any quarter where a vessel can approach. Building painted *white* and *red*, in horizontal stripes.

CAPE ESRAVE LIGHT—On the point of that name in Westmoreland, nearly opposite Apple River Harbour, N. S. Building painted *white*, about 120 feet above the tide mark. *A plain white light*.

East from Halifax.

BEAVER HARBOR LIGHT—On Williams' Island. *A revolving light*.

WHITE HEAD ISLAND LIGHT—On the S. W. point of White Head Island. The tower is square, painted *white*, standing seventy-five fathoms from the water's edge, with an octagonal Iron Lantern, sixty feet above sea level at high water; rise and fall six feet. The light is distinguished by *bright flashes*, of 20 seconds duration, followed by eclipses of ten seconds, displaying alternately three flashes and three eclipses in a minute. The light will not be totally obscured during the eclipse.

CANSEAU, CRANBERRY ISLAND—Two *fixed lights*, one above the other.

GUYSBOROUGH HARBOUR BEACON—On the west side of the entrance to the harbour, head of Chedabucto Bay. *A fixed light*.

EDDY, OR SAND POINT LIGHT—On Eddy or Sand Point, on the west side of the south entrance to the Strait of Canseau, distinguished by *two white lights*, placed horizontally, 25 feet above the sea level. Building square, painted *white*, with a *black diamond* on the seaward side.

WEST SIDE OF THE GUT OF CANSEAU, NORTHERN ENTRANCE.—*A fixed light*.

CAPE ST. GEORGE LIGHT, SYDNEY COUNTY—Building square and painted *white*. *A revolving white light* at intervals of 30 seconds.

PICTOU ISLAND LIGHT—On the S. E. point of the Island. Building square and painted *white*. *A fixed light*, 52 feet above high water mark.

PICTOU LIGHT—On the S. E. side of the entrance to the harbour. Two *fixed vertical lights*—the lower one *red*.

ARICHAU BEACON—A light on Point Mariche, on the east side of the southern entrance to the harbor. Building square, painted *white*. *A white light*, 31 feet above the sea level.

LOUISBURG—On the east side of the entrance to the harbour. *A fixed light*.

SCATARI ISLAND.—*A revolving light*, on the east point of the Island.

FLINT ISLAND LIGHT—On Flint Island, eastern coast of Cape Breton, between Cape Granby and Point Gage, entrance of Cow Bay. Lat. 49°, 11 5 N., and Long. 59°, 45 to 50 W., and exhibits a *bright flash light* every fifteen seconds, visible from all points of the compass. The light is 65 feet above sea level, and can be seen at the distance of 12 miles.

LOW POINT LIGHT—East side of Sydney (Cape Breton) harbour. *A fixed light*.

ST. PAUL'S ISLAND.—*A fixed light* on the N. E. end, and a *revolving light* on the S. W. end.

MARGARIE ISLAND LIGHT—Situated on the North-West side of the Island of Cape Breton, nearly mid-way between Malou and Cheticamp harbours, and distant from the mainland of Cape Breton two and a half miles. *A plain white light*. The lantern is placed on a square wooden tower, painted *white*, near the centre and summit of the Island. The lantern is 238 feet above the sea level; visible from all

points of approach. There is a landing near the S. W. end, in shore, where a few fishing stages and boats are kept in use during the fishing season.

PORT HOOD LIGHT.—When seen from the S. W. shows a *white light*, and from the N. shows a *red light*—both fixed.

A **LIGHT HOUSE** has been erected upon **CAPE RACE**, Newfoundland, a *fixed white light* from sunset to sunrise. The light is visible to seaward from N. E. by E. round by the S. E. and S. W., and is elevated 180 feet above mean water level of the sea, and may be seen in clear weather 17 miles from a ship's deck. The Tower is striped *red and white* vertically. It stands close to the old beacon, which has been cut down. The Light House is in Lat. 46 degrees 39 minutes 19 seconds N., Long. 53 degrees 2 minutes 38 seconds W. Bearings magnetic. Var. 24 degrees W.

In the River and Gulf of St. Lawrence and Strait of Belle-Isle:

BELLE-ISLE LIGHT. An island at the eastern entrance of the Strait of Belle-Isle, separating Labrador from Newfoundland, situated at the extreme south west point of the island. A *single fixed white light*. Building—a circular stone tower, faced externally with fire brick of a light colour. Lat. N. 51° 53' 00"; Long. W. 55° 26' 00". Whole horizon lighted, and seen in fair weather 28½ nautical or 32½ statute miles.

POINT AMOUR LIGHT. Labrador Coast, Strait of Belle-Isle, at the south east point of Forteau Bay. Lat. N. 57° 27' 30"; Long. W. 56° 53' 40". A *single fixed white light*—two thirds of the horizon illuminated, and seen in fair weather 18½ nautical or 21½ statute miles. Building—a circular stone tower faced externally with fire brick of a light colour.

ANTICOSTI LIGHT, at the extreme point west end of the island of Anticosti—Lat. N. 49° 52' 3", Long. W. 61° 35' 00". A *single fixed white light*—two-thirds of the horizon illuminated, and seen in fair weather 15 nautical or 18 statute miles. Building—a circular stone tower, faced externally with fire brick of a light colour.

CAPE ROZIER LIGHT. East Coast of Gaspe, at the extreme point of the Cape. Lat. N. 48° 51' 00", Long. W. 64° 15' 00". A *single fixed white light*—two-thirds of the horizon illuminated, and seen in fair weather 16½ nautical or 19½ statute miles. Building—a circular stone tower, faced externally with fire brick of a light colour.

Signals will be given at, or near, each of the above 4 light houses by means of an air or fog whistle, sounded at short intervals during foggy weather and snow storms, or by a nine-pounder gun, fired every hour, in case of the whistle being out of order.
