FRANCE A HEAVY RECORD OF FIRES. Everything is Pointing Towards a Revolution, According to Well-Posted Writers.

Plain Truth is That France Has Ceased to Exist as a Free Country—Court Masqued. New York, Feb. 12.—Cableing to The Times from London regarding the action of the French Chamber of Deputies on Friday last, in passing the trial revision bill, Henry Norman says:

It is difficult to convey any idea of the situation in France, without using expressions which would seem exaggerated and meaningless to you, 3000 miles away. But the plain truth is that France has ceased to exist as a civilized country.




