BUSINESS IS SATISFACTORY

Best Reports Come From the Pacific Coast and From the South and Southwest.

SPECIAL ACTIVITY IN IRON.

Large Orders Placed at Pittsburgh for Bessemer Pig Steaded the Market.

New York, Jan. 25.—Bessemer's to-morrow will say: Despite some irregularities in reports from different sections and industries, trade as a whole is satisfactory for this time of the year.

The best reports come from the Pacific coast, the south and southwest, where spring demand is opening up well.

Bank savings and various savings make very good comparisons with similar periods in preceding years, while business embarrassments are about normal.

Special activity has been noted in some branches of the iron trade and sentiment has been on the whole helped by a clearer view of the possibilities contained in the recent "war" speculation.

Speculation in iron is nearly all in lines of product and in stocks and it is probable that clearing returns at present largely reflect the activity of business in the higher grades of iron.

Prices show few higher changes, the cereals being slightly lower with dairy products weak.

The general range of values of the whole stock, also some shading as the higher grades of wool have advanced.

From steady earnings on 10 roads for \$1,800,000, to a total of \$1,800,000, or an average of 10 per cent.

Business is satisfactory.

The feature of the week in iron has been the placing of large orders (200,000 tons) of Bessemer pig, the equivalent of \$12,500,000.

This has steadied the market for Bessemer pig, and has also helped to steady the market for other grades of iron.

Official reports of the production of iron in 1900 show a total of 7,812,242 gross tons, a continuation of the upward trend in this column a month ago.

The total output would be little below 14,000,000 tons. Among the other metals copper has advanced, and is showing sympathy with a break in prices abroad.

A large export shipment of zinc ore from Missouri is anticipated, the quantity equalling 30,000 tons.

Including four shipments for the week aggregated 4,838,678 bushels, against 3,881,700 in the corresponding week of 1900, a gain of 956,978 bushels, or 24.6 per cent.

CLIMAX OF HEAVY DEALINGS.

Iron and Steel Industry in the United States Has Taken Another Forward Stride.

Bank clearings at New York gained 32.1 per cent. over 1900 and 12 per cent. over 1899 for the week, while at other cities outside of New York there is a gain of 14.9 per cent. over 1900, and 11.4 per cent. over last year, and 24.9 per cent. over 1899.
