While thanking the generous friends, who have so liberally aided the Building Fund, and in particular, Mrs. Cameron, for crowning her gift of the cancer ward with the supplement of \$1,200 for its equipment, we yet earnestly hope that other friends may willingly help to provide the balance needed to open the new buildings, free of debt ; the sum required will be \$15,000."—Carried.

Fourth Resolution: Moved by the Rev Dr. Potts, seconded by Barlow Cumberland, Esq., " That we thankfully acknowledge the faithful and efficient services rendered by Mrs. Craigie, in her admirable management of the domestic affairs of this Home ; and that with increasing satisfaction we anticipate the great advantage of her experience and capability in the future charge of the Institution ; we would also

express our high appreciation of the efficient and hearty co-operation given by the staff of nurses and employés. We beg to remind our friends of the need of redoubled efforts to maintain this Home, with the large increase of inmates during the present year."—Carried.

## THIRTEENTH ANNUAL REPORT

OF THE

# TORONTO HOME FOR INCURABLES,

ENDING MARCH 1st, 1887.

---

THIS Institution, for the reception of those suffering from incurable disease, has now reached the thirteenth year of its existence ; and the Board of Management, in issuing this Report, thankfully bear witness to its continued activity and extended usefulness.

The beds have been kept constantly filled—the death, or removal, of one inmate only making room for another anxiously waiting to enter its doors. For want of room many deserving cases have been debarred from gaining admittance. A large number of the inmates are utterly helpless—some so stricken with paralysis, some with rheumatism, as to require an attendant to feed them ; and some there are who never rise from their beds.

The object of this Institution is well known : the care and comfortable maintenance of those who are afflicted with incurable diseases, and have no one to help or befriend them in their extreme need. The Management of the "Home for Incurables" have aimed to make it what its name implies—a "Home"—for that large class of sufferers whose diseases are pronounced incurable. The liberality with which this Institution has been supported has proved that a Home for Incurables is one of the most needed and deserving of charities, and a source of precious benefit to the suffering and distressed.

There are, at present, 61 patients in the Home. Twenty new cases have been received ; six have been removed to live with friends ; one left because sufficiently recovered to resume her ordinary duties ; seven have died. One patient, admitted in the last stages of con-



sumption, lived only ten days after her admission ; another, in a dying state with heart disease, who lived only six weeks—thus adding to the death rate.

The advice given in the Medical Report of last year concerning the admission and removal to the Home of patients almost in a dying state, is often disregarded. Their removal under such circumstances cannot fail to aggravate their disease, and hasten their end, besides adding much to the discomfort of the inmates. We would respectfully suggest its consideration.

The medical staff, who certainly are the most competent judges, use this emphatic language :—“ It is respectfully submitted, and strongly urged, that great care be exercised in the non-admission of cases in a dying condition, and thus avoiding an unfair exaggeration of the death rate.”

Many gifts have been received during the year, including books, magazines, much fruit and flowers, a liberal supply of ice from Mr. Chapman, a much-needed invalid chair, and a large comfortable sofa—all most acceptable.

The Management are glad to report their recognition of valuable aid derived by the Institution from the zealous care of Mrs. Craigie in keeping up the efficiency of the nursing department, in the general order, neatness, and system, observed throughout the Home, and in the increasing efficiency of her superintendence of the house ; and to Mr. Grasset, the resident medical officer, their sincere and cordial thanks for his unvarying kindness and attention to the patients are cheerfully given.

Much pleasure has been afforded the inmates by several musical and interesting entertainments which have been given by many kind friends, whose efforts are most cordially appreciated.

The religious services of the Home have been maintained throughout the year. For their ever ready and willing assistance in these services special thanks are due to the clergymen of Parkdale. And we also warmly acknowledge the kindness of those ladies who have taken part in the musical services, and of those who come so frequently to read and converse with the patients.

The thanks of the Board are gratefully extended to the medical staff for valued and important services rendered to the Institution ; and to their solicitor, Mr. Mortimer Clark. To the editors of the

daily papers the Managers are much indebted for gratuitously inserting in their papers matters relating to the Institution for the past year.

A garden party was given in the grounds of the Home, and subsequently an entertainment and a sale of fancy articles was held at the "Queen's Royal," Niagara, at which several ladies interested in the Home assisted; and from these sources the sum of \$309 was realized and placed to the furnishing fund account.

The Lady Managers are most anxious, by the time the new wing is completed, to have in hand sufficient to furnish it, and every effort is now being made to carry out this work; and assistance will be most thankfully accepted from those who approve our plans and who sympathise with us in our labours.

The Board gratefully acknowledges the liberal grants of the Ontario Government and City Council; also a handsome donation from the Council of Parkdale "as a recognition of the important work in which the Home is engaged;" and their many kind and thoughtful acts, in reference to the Home, are most cordially recognized by the Board.

It will be remembered that to the liberality of Mrs. Alexander Cameron we are indebted for the munificent sum of \$7,500 to build the Cancer Ward. She has shown her continued interest and sympathy in the Home by a further contribution of \$1,200 to furnish it, and it will now be known as the "Cameron Ward." It is a cause of great thankfulness that, by Mrs. Cameron's kind consideration in this matter, the Management are relieved from all financial anxiety regarding it, and would again express their appreciation of Mrs. Cameron's never-to-be-forgotten generosity to this Institution.

In our last Report reference was made to the bequest of the late Mrs. Roaf, endowing a bed in the new wing, in memory of her husband, to be called "The Roaf Bed." We cherish the hope that persons who are living, or Benevolent Associations, may be led to follow this noble example, and, by the endowment of \$1,500, provide for the permanent support of a bed for some indigent and worthy incurable.

The following bequests have been received during the past year:—  
From the estate of the late Mrs. Pidgeon, formerly an inmate of the Home, \$100; Mr. Wright, of Brampton, \$20.

The new wing is fast nearing completion, and includes a Ward for Consumptives, entirely separated from the Cameron Ward. The

Building Committee confidently expect the wing will be finished and ready for occupation by mid-summer. The work has been pressed on as rapidly as the season would permit by the architects, Messrs. Darling & Curry.

The appointments for the accommodation of double the number of patients, together with those of the Cameron Ward, have demanded and received the most careful consideration from the Building Committee ; and, though requiring some additional outlay over the sum at first proposed, they are so adapted to prudent and economic management in the future that we trust the friends of the Home will speedily supply the funds needed to meet the expenditure.

The sum required for the proposed equipment of the laundry and kitchen will be about \$2,500. By the introduction of these contrivances, and the use of steam, far more than this sum will be saved to the Institution in economy of management for years to come.

Many kind-hearted friends, who have aided so materially in the usefulness of this work, and encouraged its Management by many evidences of interest and approval, have never visited the Home. We would invite them to visit these poor people ; and, though surrounded by the sick, a happy hour would most assuredly be spent. To visit them with a word of cheer will gladden many weary hearts. Still more, a word of good report to their more favoured friends might be the means of obtaining more substantial aid, and thus enable the Committee to finish the Home for Incurables—free of debt.

Thus may we all, in proportion to our means and opportunities of doing good, blend our efforts to help the suffering whom God has graciously entrusted to our provident care, bearing in mind that in rendering service to "one of the least of these" we are rendering it unto the Lord Himself.

## HOME RULES.

---

Visiting days, Tuesdays, Thursdays and Saturdays, from 2 till 5.

I. No person shall be admitted to the Home for Incurables until the Board is satisfied as to their character and respectability.

II. The inmates must at all times show proper respect to the Manager and Lady Superintendent, and a strict regard for the rules and regulations of the Institution. They are also urged to cultivate kind and cheerful dispositions, thereby making a happy Christian Home.

III. Those inmates who are able will be required to keep their own rooms in order, and to assist in such other domestic duties as they are able to perform.

IV. All such inmates as are able to leave their rooms are required to take their meals at the general table, and for sanitary reasons no one will be allowed to carry food or drink to their rooms; good manners and cleanly habits are particularly requested at table.

V. All who are able are expected to attend morning prayers, prayer meetings and Sunday services at the hours appointed.

VI. Inmates shall not leave the premises without the consent of the Lady Superintendent. Any inmate wishing to be absent for more than one day must obtain the consent of the Board.

VII. Male inmates shall not be allowed in the rooms occupied by females, nor female patients in those occupied by males, unless in special cases.

VIII. Inmates desiring to make a request or complaint shall inform the Lady Superintendent, who will thereupon bring the request or complaint before the Weekly Board.

IX. The inmates shall not receive wines or spirits or other stimulants without the knowledge of the Lady Superintendent.

X. The inmates may be visited by their friends on Tuesdays, Thurs-



days and Saturdays in each week, between the hours of two and five o'clock. No visits at any other time except in special cases.

XI. Should an inmate become dissatisfied or unhappy, he or she is at liberty to leave the Home, taking with them only such articles as they brought to the Home.

XII. If any inmate shall not conform to the rules of the Home or behave rudely or improperly, such inmate may be discharged by the Weekly Committee at their first meeting after the insubordination has been duly investigated.

## THE THIRTEENTH ANNUAL MEDICAL REPORT.

MARCH 1ST, 1886, MARCH 1ST, 1887.

THE Medical Staff of the Toronto Home for incurables beg to present their report. The mortality for the year has been low. There have been fewer admissions than in the preceding year. We have now sixty-one patients in the institution. Six were removed during the year.

Comparing the two years they stand as follows :

1885	Admissions.....	25	Deaths.....	14	No. of inmates.....	57
1886	“ .....	20	“ .....	7	“ .....	61

The low death rate is probably due to the rejection of applicants who are in a dying condition. This is undoubtedly a wise regulation as each death seems to have a very depressing effect on those who are left.

We hope those who are incurable more from the advance of age than from the actual progress of disease, those who are incurable from some minor disease that does not prevent them from earning a livelihood, will be rigidly excluded, because our beds are demanded for more urgent cases. We would also again urge that re-admissions after dismissals be not allowed, unless under very exceptional circumstances, as they interfere with the internal management of the institution.

Too much cannot be said in praise of the services rendered us in the discharge of our duties by the excellent matron, Mrs. Craigie, and the zealous Medical Assistant, Dr. Grassett, and by the nurses of the Institution. They are continually studying the comfort of the patients and we feel sure that more contented or happier invalids than those under their care cannot be found anywhere. These invalids are a regiment of the very bravest soldiers, facing death without fear and bearing intense pain with patience and fortitude.

We hail with delight the approaching completion of the new wards and feel that the reception of cancer patients will be conferring a boon on the community at large.

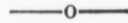

CONSTITUTION  
OF THE  
HOME FOR INCURABLES

Adopted and Amended 28th March, 1884.

I. This institution shall be known as "The Toronto Home for Incurables."

II. Its objects shall be to afford maintenance, nursing, and medical and surgical aid to persons suffering from incurable disease, and to provide for them, while inmates of the "Home," the ministrations of the Gospel.

III. Every subscriber of two dollars and upwards per annum shall be entitled to vote at the annual meeting, at which a Board of Managers shall be elected for the ensuing twelve months. Every individual who shall pay in advance, and at one time, the sum of fifty dollars, shall be entitled to the same privileges for life.

IV. All money now in the possession of the "Home," or which may hereafter be collected or acquired by it, shall be applied (unless otherwise directed by the donor) to the general objects, uses and requirements of the "Home."

V. The affairs of the "Home" shall be under the direction, control and management of a Board of Managers, of whom at least forty shall be ladies and twelve gentlemen, and who shall be elected at the annual general meeting of subscribers, qualified as set forth in Article III.

The medical staff attending the "Home" shall be *ex officio* members of the Board of Managers.

In case of a vacancy arising, the Board may elect a member to fill the vacancy until the next annual general meeting.

The Board shall control and direct all the business of the institution and their decision upon all points of management shall be final.

There shall be chosen annually, and by the vote of the Board, a President and Vice-President, and, from among the Lady Managers, the following officers, viz : First Lady Directress, Second Lady Directress, Third Lady Directress, Secretary, Assistant-Secretary, and Treasurer.

For the more convenient working of the Institution, the Board may from time to time appoint committees of not less than three of their number, such as an Executive Committee, and committees for visiting and superintending the "Home."

The Board may also enact By-laws for regulating the duties of the various officers and employés of the "Home."

The By-laws shall not be altered except at a regular meeting, after notice duly given, at least a month previously.

VI. The Board of Managers shall hold stated meetings at least once a month, and may hold adjourned meetings when necessary. At such monthly meetings the Board shall have power to make additional By-laws regulating its own government, and for the government of the officers and employés, as before provided, and when necessary, after due notice, to alter and amend the same.

Special meetings of the Board may be called by the President and one of the Lady Directresses, or on requisition of five or more members of the Board. When a special meeting is called, the time and place of meeting, and the business for which it is called, shall be stated in the notice calling the meeting, and no other business shall be taken up at such meeting.

VII. The annual general meeting of the subscribers, qualified as set forth in Article III., shall be held in the month of March.

It shall be the duty of the Board of Managers to make all necessary arrangements for said annual meeting ; to lay before the subscribers a report of the proceedings of the previous twelve months, and to exhibit a full and accurate view of the funds, property, and effects of the "Home."



VIII. In view of the large contributions given by the citizens of Toronto, and the grant made by the City Council in aid of the "Home," applicants from the city of Toronto for admission to the "Home" shall have preference over others.

IX. The Board will receive incurable persons from any municipality in Ontario outside of Toronto, on condition that a bond be given by said municipality to pay such sum as the Board may determine from time to time for the maintenance of each patient so sent. Provided always, that a certificate as to general character and circumstances shall have been received from such persons as the Board may approve; that a certificate be given by the gaol surgeon of the municipality, or by such other medical gentleman as the Board may approve, that the person seeking admission is incurable; provided also, that such certificate be endorsed by the medical officers of this Institution, and that the application be approved by the Board at a regular monthly meeting.

X. The foregoing Constitution shall not be altered, unless it be at an annual general meeting of subscribers, notice of such alteration having been given at least three months before the annual meeting, and approved by a majority of the Board of Managers.

# BY-LAWS.

Amended and Adopted March 28th, 1884,  
and March 20th, 1886,

---

I. DUTIES OF OFFICERS.—At meetings of the Board of Managers the Chairman (elected as such from amongst the gentleman Managers) shall preside. In his absence the Managers present shall name a Chairman *pro tem*.

The Chairman shall be the judge of order, and his decisions thereon shall be acquiesced in without debate.

He shall direct the Secretary when special meetings are ordered, to insert in the notices the import of the special business upon which the Managers are to convene.

II. The Secretary shall keep fair and regular minutes of the proceedings of the Board of Managers in a book to be provided for that purpose.

She shall preserve all the records and papers of the Society which do not belong to the office of Treasurer.

She shall cause a notice of each stated meeting, and of each special meeting of the Board of Managers, to be sent to the address of each Manager, at least one day previous to the day fixed for the meeting.

The Assistant Secretary shall assist the Secretary in her duties when required, and act for her at meetings of the Board in her absence.

III. The Treasurer shall receive all moneys belonging to the Society, and shall give a receipt to the persons from whom she may receive money.

For the sake of regularity, and in order to establish the amount, all persons who may hand money to the Treasurer are requested to ask for a receipt for the money so paid over.

When the Treasurer does not require the money in paying accounts which have passed the Board, she shall deposit the money, or such

part of it as may not be immediately required in the Savings Bank, to the credit of her official account as Treasurer.

She shall keep a fair and regular account of the receipts and expenditures, and her account book and bank book shall be open to the inspection of the Managers at each stated meeting.

Prior to the General Annual Meeting, she shall prepare a statement showing the receipts and expenditures of the year, duly classified and audited, that a lucid, full explanation, or exposition of the working of the finances of the "Home," may be submitted at the general meeting.

The Treasurer's accounts shall be audited by a Committee of the gentleman managers named by the Chairman or by the Board.

IV. The Treasurer only shall pay accounts for articles and services supplied to the "Home," when duly certified, and in all cases of payment, shall require a receipt.

Accounts shall be certified to be correct as to prices, by the managers who made the purchase of the articles and shall be initialed "correct," accordingly. They shall then be initialed by the Matron or the Superintendent, to show that the articles were received at the "Home."

The accounts shall then be laid before the Managers at the stated monthly meeting, and when payment is ordered, the order shall be entered on the minutes by the Secretary.

The Treasurer can then pay the accounts, and an entry upon the minutes will be a sufficient authority to the Treasurer to pay whatever accounts or disbursements the Board may have ordered.

V. The Managers may appoint from time to time Committees from amongst themselves to attend to any special duties.

As a rule such committees shall consist of not less than three, and not less than two shall be considered a quorum to act.

These Committees, for the sake of regularity and for future reference, shall as a rule report to the Board in writing.

VI. The stated meetings of the Board shall be held on the last Friday of every month, at such hour as the Board may from time to time appoint.

VII. The Superintendent and Matron shall hold their offices at the pleasure of the Board.



They shall do all in their power to promote the comfort of the inmates of the "Home," and shall follow the instructions of the Board of the lady managers for the week, and of the medical staff when orders are given.

They shall keep a book for entering all such things as they may consider necessary for the use of the "Home," and submit it to the weekly visitors. When disbursements are ordered, a regular account of the same shall be kept for the information of the Managers and the Treasurer.

VIII. The Managers deeming the point of admission of Inmates into the "Home," to be a very important matter, decide that the following formalities shall regularly be observed :

1st. Applicants for admission into the "Home," are to state how long they have resided in the city, their residence, age, disease, and circumstances, also, whether he, or she, has been attended by any medical man, and whether any clergyman has visited.

2nd. Thereafter two of the Managers shall visit the residence named (two ladies if the applicant be a woman, two gentlemen if the applicant be a man). They shall look at the surroundings of the applicant, ascertain what can be practically known of the person's circumstances, habits, and general character, in short get all the available information about the case.

They shall see the clergyman and the doctor, if either have been in attendance, hear what each has to say about the applicant, and report to the Board of Managers.

3rd. That two of the Medical Staff of the "Home" shall visit each applicant for admission, and report to the Board of Managers, the character of the disease, and if incurable ; and for any applicant outside of Toronto, the equivalent testimonials shall be required.

Each application for admission to the "Home," shall be presented at the regular meeting of the Board, and, if entertained, after due investigation shall be acted upon at the following regular meeting of the Board.

4th. All the inmates of the "Home" must distinctly understand, that admission confers no right of permanent residence in the "Home," and at any time the Managers have the power of dismissing an inmate,

for what they may deem a sufficient cause. Of its sufficiency, the Managers are to be the sole judges.

IX. Any person received into this "Home," as a free patient, if possessed of money or property shall be required to convey the same to the Board for the use of the Institution ; and if inheriting property while an inmate of the "Home," and desiring to leave, shall be required to pay the usual charge for board, during the period of residence in the "Home."

X. Any members absenting themselves from three consecutive monthly meetings, except in cases of illness or absence from the city, shall have their names struck off the list of the Managing Committee.
