the firm in this case. When the present Government came into power the case was taken out of the hands of the Court, and referred to one sole arbitrator in Brockville, whose abilities did not entitle him to such a responsible duty, and by him an award of \$101,000 was made, and the amount was handed over to the Government. Not one thousand of this, I believe, was really due, or would have been awarded by the Court had the matter been left in its hands. I will not touch upon your time by referring at length to the REMEDIATION OF THE PACIFIC RAILWAY.

Further than to say that in my mind no greater mismanagement could well be charged against a Government than that with which the present Government are chargeable in dealing with the great contracts A and B. Those are the sections east of Ras Portage and west of the finished portion of the road. Our policy was that the initial portions should be built as soon as possible, and after that that no progress should be made except that warranted under the existing rate of taxation. Since we left office the public debt has been increased by twenty millions of dollars, and it will go on increasing at something like that rate every year if the present extraordinary mode of conducting these great public works is carried out. We had bound to do the best we can for British Columbia, but we are bound also to the tax-payers of the country at large to stay our hand when the taxation reaches a point which makes it a serious burden for the people to bear. I believe the present mode of conducting the Pacific Railway will be ruinous. On opening the debate last session, in answer to my question, the Minister of Public Works informed me that all the papers necessary to the discussion were upon the table. We proceeded with the discussion in utter ignorance of what was afterwards ascertained, that before this time the Government had actually passed an Order in Council in effect setting aside our selection of the Burrard Inlet route and selecting that by Bute Inlet. When Mr. Young told you that that route was 300 miles longer than this other, and would cost \$21,000,000 more, he told very little. The grades upon the route that have been selected are 104 feet to the mile, or nearly twice the highest grade upon the Burrard Inlet route. It will cost \$600,000 more each year to run it, and every train will have to carry a load more. These facts will give you some idea of the magnitude of the blunder—no, I can hardly call it a blunder—of the magnitude of the crime against the people of Canada which is to be committed. Another instance of the Government's recklessness in the management of this railway. It has my eyes open to my policy to agree if possible with the engineers as to the cheapest and shortest route. We did that, and in Manitoba they have changed the route so as to make it thirty miles longer, entailing a cost of a million dollars more. You hear the statement occasionally made by those who are on the whole perhaps disposed to be fair, that after that they will have any struggle between the Tories and Reformers—that the Reformers have accomplished most of their work, that the Tories are as willing to accomplish the remnant as they are, and that after all it is mostly a STRUGGLE BETWEEN THE IRON AND THE STEEL.

While I believe that, even if that were true, it would be an absolute necessity in the interests of the country to maintain intact the line of party in the Government of the country, I believe there is nothing else which can save us from disaster, social and political. We sometimes hear it said that there is no difference between the parties. I think there is a great difference. I believe there is such a thing as a reactionary spirit with many of those who are essentially Conservatives. I am not saying a word in disparagement of the progressive doctrines. I understand perfectly what they mean, although I cannot agree with them.
