James Sutherland, Formerly of Halifax, Arrested as th Guilty Party.

BOSTON, Jan. 24.- James Sutherland, formerly of Halifax, was ar-
aigned in the municipal criminal court this afternoon before Judge Burke, charged with manslaughter. The complaint alleges that he caused the death was found dead at 117 Chambers street, Iast Saturday. Death, N. B., whe docu-
