Huron, May 30.

Boston was visited with another destructive fire this morning, which at one time threatened to equal the one of last November.

The fire broke out in the upper portion of the extensive fire-warehouse of Healy, Morse & Co., 411 Washington street, and destroyed that building, with the International hotel, Jourdain's Anatomical Museum, with other buildings on the west side.

The flames then crossed to the east side of Washington street, destroying the Globe theatre, Chickering piano-forte warehouses, Arlington Hall, corner of Essex street, and several buildings on the north side of Essex st.

The total loss is estimated at a million and a quarter dollars.

To-day being a holiday all insurance offices are closed, and it is impossible to obtain the amount insured.

John Hill, fireman, was killed by a falling wall.

Freeman's Bank was burned out, but the valuables were saved.

To-day has been generally observed by the soldiers graves.

New Brunswick's Quota for the North West Army.

FREDERICTON, May 31.

The majority of volunteers required for New Brunswick's quota for the North West service, have arrived, and already four have passed satisfactory medical examinations before Dr. Gregory.

The examination of the remainder begins to-day, at 3 p. m. Captain Hosse, of Victoria County, will arrive with his quota by to-day's steamer; also, 6 from Woodstock, 3 from St. Stephen, and others from different counties are expected. The ready volunteering is most satisfactory to the officers in charge. The whole number leave on Tuesday next by 3 o'clock p. m. train.

Arrival of the Remains of Sir George Cartier—Sir Hugh Allan's Successor—Departure of the Wainwright Team—Louis Riel a Candidate for the Commons.

OTTAWA, May 31.

The steamship Prussian, with Sir George Cartier's remains on board, arrived yesterday. At Quebec the steamer Druid will receive the body. Religious services will be held in Montreal, and the body will be laid to rest in the Court House for public view. Robt Allen ve Epsom to-day to superintend the funeral arrangements. The volunteer force of Montreal will attend the funeral.

Reliable advice show that Sir Hugh Allan is being successful in securing the loan for the construction of the Canadian Pacific Railway. He will leave for Quebec on the 13th of June, when the loan will be completed.

One Wainwright Team leaves Quebec for England on the 21st of June.

Louis Riel, the murderer of Scott, is a candidate for Provostship, and is opposed by the death of Sir George Cartier.

LONDON, May 30.

THE EPSON RACES.

The race for the Oakes stakes at Epsom was witnessed by a great crowd. Marie Stuart was the winner, Wild Myrtle second, Angella third. Eighteen fillies ran. The betting, previous to the race, was two to one against Marie Stuart, two to one against Wild Myrtle, and seven to one against Angella.

THE COLUMBIAN VENDOR—THE CABINET.

The French Assembly to-day voted to rebuff the Columbian Vendome, and adjourned until the 5th of June.

The Official Journal announces the appointment of Gen. Dubouat as Minister of War in place of Gen. Declos, which completes the reconstruction of the French Cabinet.

DIPLOMATIC RUMORS.

It is reported that the Marquis Debonville, French Ambassador at Vienna, will be recalled.

SPANISH CIVIL WAR.

Advices from the vicinity of Logrono represent that a great battle between the Carlists and Republicans is on the point of taking place.

BIRTH AND DEATH.

A son was born to the Crown Prince of Hesse Darmstadt Thursday. On the same day Prince Frederick of that house was fatally injured by a fall from a window.

BROWNED.

A Toronto despatch from Three Rivers, says that Gen. Matti, agent for the Messrs Ritchie & Cull, lumbermen; David Lord, freeman, and Leon Houle and Peter Lorne, boatmen, were drowned while descending the rapids of the River St. Maurice.

THE IOWA TORNADO.

Full Details of the Terrible Cyclone - Miles of Devastation and Ruin - Houses, Barns, Fences, Orchards and Forests Razed to the Ground.

A Flock of Fifteen Hundred Sheep Swept Away and Crushed to Atoms - Fifteen Persons Killed and Thirty-Two Injured - Marvellous Scenes - Terrific Incidents.

(Washington, Iowa (May 21) Special Correspondence of the Chicago Tribune.)

The extent of the terrific tornado which swept over Keokuk and Washington counties last Thursday afternoon, was not nearly detailed in the despatches sent from here on Monday.

The damage done seemed too great to be realized, and although the statements made were alarming, they conveyed no idea of the extent of the destruction.

In persons alluded to in the despatches, the absence of telegraphic communication with the interior, nothing definite could be learned, and hence the despatches were made up from rumors, with a few sensational adjectives sandwiched in.

The writer of the despatch had the most vivid imagination, he could not have pictured the devastation and ruin wrought within two hours.

The oldest inhabitant remembers a hurricane twenty-five years ago, that swept across the Iowa prairie, but it was never as destructive as the storm of last Thursday.

No damage whatever was done in Washington, the point near where the storm laid its destroying hand being about six miles distant.

The anger of nature was distinctly heard here, and it is said by farmers who live ten miles away, that they heard a peculiar noise sounded like a heavy freight train at night, when everything was reposing.

Nothing was heard in the storm, but in the line of the storm, everything, except here and there a mile or two over which the whirlwind seemed to pass, was in a desolate-looking, scarcely a house, barn, shed or granary is left.
