## NOTES AND NEWS.

### UNITED STATES.

Nothing better illustrates the down-hill tendency of American youths than the fact that one company at Montpelier sold 11,000 studs for children last winter.

'Tis true that 2,000,000 bushels of peanuts are every year devoured in the United States, most of them by pale, heart-broken young ladies.

During the last four years, as shown by the records, 560 men and 9,066 women have been committed to the work-house on Blackwell's Island, New York, each from six to one hundred times for habitual intemperance.

One man and twenty-nine women have thus been committed one hundred times. The record is a sickening one, and all the more so as showing how numerous and repeatedly otherwise "lovely women" can "stoop to folly."

OTTAWA, Feb. 2.

Lord Dufferin and Suite leave for Montreal to-night. They will be away about a fortnight.

Strike is expected in Ottawa this week. A public reception will be given him.

Lord Dufferin intends giving gold and silver medals to the best carriers in the chief cities of the Dominion.
