ANNUAL MEETING OF THE SOCIETY,

HELD ON TUESDAY, OCTOBER 19TH, 1869,

IN THE WESLEYAN METHODIST CHURCH, OTTAWA.

JOHN MACDONALD, ESQ.,

IN THE CHAIR.

The Meeting was opened with singing and prayer.

An Abstract of the Society's operations having been read by the REV. DR. WOOD, and the Financial Statement made by the REV. DR. TAYLOR, the following resolutions were unanimously adopted by the Meeting :—

MISCELLANEOUS RESOLUTIONS.

Extracted from the Minutes of the Missionary Committee.

TIME FOR THE BRANCH SOCIETIES' RETURNS.

"It having been seen that the time taken by the Branch Societies for sending in their Lists and Monies was yearly becoming later, and the financial interests of the Society having suffered by the consequent late publication of the Annual Report, it was

"RESOLVED—That the Treasurers' Report shall be closed from year to year on the last day of June, and that Superintendents of Circuits are required to use all practical effort to have the Subscriptions on their respective Circuits collected, and paid to the Treasurers, at or before the Session of Conference."

REPORTS OF MISSIONS.

"RESOLVED—That the Report of the Religious state of Missions be prepared by the Superintendent of each Mission, and read in the May District Meeting, subject to the Revision of that Meeting."

RETURN FROM DISTRICT MEETINGS.

"RESOLVED—That the Chairmen of Districts, in compliance with the Directions of Conference, forward to the Mission Rooms, as early as practicable, a copy of the recommendations to this Board by the September District Meeting for grants of Missionary money, the same to embrace the number of Members, Children on each Mission, and the probable amount of the current income."

NAMES TO APPEAR IN REPORT.

The following minute of the Sub-Committee of Consultation and Finance, was adopted by the General Committee, November 5th, 1868:—

"RESOLVED—That it be recommended to the Missionary Committee to print in the Missionary Report, after the present year, only the names of subscribers who pay \$2.00 or upwards to the Missionary Fund, and that a notice to that effect be printed on the cover of the Missionary Report this year."

NOTE.—This regulation comes into operation for the year 1868-9. Superintendents should be particular in gathering up the Lists of Collectors on their Circuits and Missions, and read the names of all one dollar subscribers, in addition to those of higher amounts, at all their Missionary Meetings annually.

FORM OF A BEQUEST

TO THE WESLEYAN METHODIST MISSIONARY SOCIETY.

I give and bequeath to the Treasurer or Treasurers, for the time being, of the Wesleyan Methodist Missionary Society of Canada, the sum of

out of such part only of my personal estate as shall not consist of mortgages or chattels real, to be paid and expended by them under the direction of said Society, in the aid and support of the Missionaries upon the different Mission Stations of said Society, and the receipt or receipts of such Treasurer or Treasurers, for the time being, shall be a sufficient discharge to my Executors. And the published Minutes of the Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Church in Canada shall be a sufficient evidence of authority for the said Treasurer or Treasurers upon which to demand and receive payment of said bequest.

N.B.—Devises for such purposes as the above, of land, or of money to be obtained from the sale of land, or of money charged on land, or secured on mortgage of land or tenements, or to be laid out in lands or tenements, are void; but money may be given by will, provided that it be directed to be paid out of the personal estate, as is set out in the form of bequest.

ANNUAL REPORT.

Of the past year, our records are principally of an encouraging and assuring nature. Changes are continually going on which remove from the active probationary Church many of varied ages, who are greatly missed and lamented; and, in other instances, some prove weary, or are led astray by the blandishments of the world, or the allurements of the enemy of all goodness; still the living power of a Gospel Ministry exerts its transforming energy on the "dead in trespasses and sins," giving fulfilment to prophetic and remote utterances that the fold of Christ shall continue to extend, and His followers steadily to multiply, until "the whole earth shall be filled with His glory." The Reports of the forty-fourth year of the Society's work, give vivid illustration of the Prophet Micah's predictions,— "He shall stand and feed in the strength of the Lord, in the majesty of the name of the LORD his God; and they shall abide: for now shall he be great unto the ends of the earth."—Chap. v. 4. This is not a time distinguished by violent hostilities to the truth; but, so far as the Committee of this Society is concerned, the openings and invitations for Christian Missionaries are more numerous than is their ability to appoint and maintain them.

HUDSON'S BAY AND SASKATCHEWAN.

RED RIVER DISTRICT.

Red River GEORGE YOUNG, *Chairman of the District*;

The commencement of the Mission to Red River has been attended with the usual hopes and fears, inconveniences and sacrifices, which have marked the histories of new Missions in other parts of the world;

Missions which have long been powerful and successful in moulding communities into the Faith of Christ, and the observance of those laws founded thereon, so essential to the peace and welfare of society. Harvard and his companions in Ceylon; Shaw and Boyce in Africa; Baxter and Warren in the West Indies; and Leigh and his fellow-laborers and successors in Australia, New Zealand, Fiji, and other places, have all given noble examples of zeal and self-denial. Our own brethren in the Mission Field have readily adapted themselves to the demands made upon them as the messengers of Christ to the lost and wandering sheep out of His fold, and with their devoted wives, have cheerfully endured the absence of many social advantages inseparably connected with the first beginnings of a Missionary Church.

Mr. Young's labors have been extended ninety miles beyond Fort Garry, where he met with a cordial reception from many who had long desired to be furnished with the ordinances of religion. Their importunities for a Resident Missionary being very earnest, and accompanied by such offers to provide for his support, beyond what might reasonably have been expected from such a scattered population, the Committee unanimously recommended the appointment of a second laborer to assist Mr. Young, whose arrival, and approved exercises as a minister of Christ, have already been reported. Two Classes have been organized of twenty-five members, the nucleus of a Church which, before many years have fled, will be counted by hundreds. Progress has been made towards the erection of a Sanctuary and Mission Premises,—a very eligible site for this purpose having been made a free gift to the Society by the Hon. Hudson's Bay Company, through the recommendation of Governor McTavish, to whose catholicity of spirit, and steady patronage and friendship, the Society is much indebted. A fine-toned bell, of the value of one hundred dollars, has already safely arrived at Fort Garry, the gift of the Oshawa Sabbath School, of which W. H. Gibbs, Esq., is Superintendent, and Mr. Richard May, Secretary. Mr. Young pronounces it to be "excellent,—of very considerable power,—and beautiful in tone."

This Territory having become a part of the Dominion of Canada, where very shortly may be expected thousands of immigrants seeking new homes on the fertile plains of the West, the Committee feel it their duty to pay special attention to the calls for augmented ministerial agency, and confidently anticipate the continued generous support of the Wesleyans of Canada to accomplish this object, in harmony with

that well-known zeal and devotedness always manifested by them in sending help to the early settlers of a new district of country.

NORWAY HOUSE AND OXFORD HOUSE MISSIONS, the oldest establishments under the care of the Wesleyan Missionary Society in this Northern Territory, furnish results of ministerial toil and privation very welcome and encouraging to the lovers of Zion. These solitary stations are entirely dependent upon the provision made by the Society for the religious instruction and comfort of the living and the dying. Untold advantages have been realized by hundreds of converts from the degradation and thralldom of heathenism, whose happy spirits are before the throne of God; and the membership of the Churches there are reported to be walking "in the fear of the Lord, and in the comfort of the Holy Ghost." Brother Egerton Ryerson Young has entered upon his work cheerfully and heartily: in the true spirit of a Christian Missionary, he has paid two visits to Oxford House, to encourage and assist Mr. Sinclair, the native teacher. He has also visited Nelson River, being the first Minister who has preached the Gospel at that distant and lonely post; welcomed by Christian men, to whom such services had long been denied, and importuned by the dark-minded heathen Indian to abide among them as their Teacher and Guide. Here, and at Beren's River, souls are calling for help; not obtaining this, they perish for lack of knowledge. Mr. E. R. Young's testimony is,—“God is owning our feeble efforts on this Mission. Souls are being converted, and backsliders reclaimed.” Fearful havoc is sometimes made in these communities by the introduction, through the Free-Traders, of the fire-waters; but the Missionaries bear evidence to the great body of their people resisting these allurements to dissipation and death. Mr. Stringfellow's removal to Ontario was much regretted by the Committee, and the Churches and Company's Officers in that part of Hudson's Bay where his services and character were best known and highly appreciated. The friends of the Society will read with interest the following communication, which conveys his impressions of the work, and the openings he is of opinion should be entered. The Committee might obtain the men, but, like other similar institutions, they are wanting the means:—

“Before I left Rossville Mission, I had a visit from the York Factory brigade of boatmen. Eleven years previously I had journeyed with them for more than a week, when on my way from Norway House to Oxford Mission. The impressions I then received (it being my first association with the Indians) are still fresh in my mind. I had none to interpret for me, and therefore could not hold any conver-

sation. I listened to their language, and watched their proceedings, and wondered how Christian Indians would conduct themselves. My impressions were favourable, for their conduct was exemplary. We had morning and evening prayer; I conducted the devotions in my usual manner. On the Sabbath-day we rested, and spent the day in holy duties. I preached twice, my wife being the only one who understood,—to all the rest my speech was that of a barbarian. All were still and reverential, and, I think, profited by the earnestness and solemnity of the services. O, how I longed that Sabbath to tell my congregation in their own speech of Christ and Him crucified! I had that privilege in after years; but I never say so much emotion, or thought so deep an impression was made, as when, shortly before I left the country, I gratified their desire, and took them into our Sanctuary and held a parting service with them. They wept, and seemed to feel the truth spoken with the design of their spiritual good. The York Factory Indians first heard the Gospel from Wesleyan Missionaries (Rev. J. Evans and others,) and still prefer them. They now belong to the Church of England.

“I did not visit Oxford Mission last spring (1868.) I saw a good number of the Indians from there, when they came for furs to carry for the Company down to the sea coast. I was pleased to find that many of them retain their religion, and were in earnest for eternal life. I think that many I saw were sorry that we should not meet again. We held a parting service, at which I felt much. These Indians have a warm place in my heart. Before we parted, they expressed to me their earnest desire that I would again return to them to reside amongst them. That, however, cannot be. I hope to meet them all in heaven. The Oxford Mission is very isolated, and a peculiarly trying one to the Missionary. It has not prospered so much of late years, from various causes, most of which are beyond the control of our brother who now labours there. Under favourable circumstances, there is material for a flourishing Mission.

“I did not preach a farewell sermon at Rossville. My successor arrived on the Wednesday, and I departed on Saturday morning. I have been sorry to learn that Brother Young has had a very trying year, for his first one, in his distant field. I venture to predict that everything will be better with him and his people in the future time he may labor there. He is, I believe, a most proper person for that position. I spent five very happy years at Rossville. The Indians there love the word of God, and quite a number enjoy religion and walk worthy of the gospel, and will help to people heaven at length. We parted from our successors with heavy hearts. Most of the Indians, either at the Fort or at the Parsonage, came to bid us farewell. When we started away from Norway House, in a boat provided by the kindness of the Honourable Company, for Red River, the shore was lined with Indians, and with the servants and gentlemen of the Company, who came to have a last look. I hope we shall welcome them in glory! We left the Fort on the 1st, and reached Red River on the 8th of August.

"After our arrival at Red River, we were entertained at the Company's Forts. We remained nineteen days, and were at no expense for board, &c. Both upon arrival at Red River, in 1857, and on our departure for Canada, in 1868, we had accommodations afforded us at the Fort, through the kindness of the Governor, William Mactavish, Esq., and had every attention and respect shown us as Wesleyan Missionaries. This is deserving of mention. The day after I arrived in Red River I had an opportunity to preach in the dining-room of the Company's Fort. It was filled. On the following Sabbath, I had the gratification of listening to the Rev. George Young, in the court-room at Fort Garry. There was a large gathering of people. The sermon was appropriate, and the audience attentive. The following Sabbath I tried to preach in the same place, from Rom. i. 16.

"I was much rejoiced to see a Wesleyan Minister in Red River. We have those in Red River who fail to see what business we have to intrude upon them there; on the other hand, there are those who think John Wesley's sons a little dilatory in establishing themselves in that part of his 'parish.' Our people there will yet be numerous and powerful. There exists no doubt on my mind as to the great and prosperous future of the Red River, Swan River, and Saskatchewan River countries. Millions of people will yet have their homes, happy and prosperous ones, in those regions. A greater future awaits those parts than any one is capable of predicting. Wesleyan Methodism, it is to be hoped, will do its duty there.

"There are several places in the neighbourhood of the stations I have occupied which should have a Missionary sent to them. 'Nelson's River,' which takes the waters of the Red River, Saskatchewan, and Swan Rivers, Lake Winnipeg, &c., down to the ocean, has a trading post upon it, about six days' journey from Rossville Mission. It was visited by the Rev. J. Evans twenty years ago, and still it has no Missionary. Several hundred Indians trade there. 'Beren's River,' on the east of Lake Winnipeg, has a number of families which frequent it to trade at the Company's post there. They have asked for a Missionary. It would be a suitable place for a native brother.

"I scarcely think we could have a better opening than the one at the 'Grand Rapids,' at the mouth of the Saskatchewan, in Lake Winnipeg. The Indians there have earnestly desired a Wesleyan Missionary. A few houses have been built there by baptized Indians, who have carried on a school among themselves. There are good fisheries on the spot, both white fish and sturgeon. The 'Grand Rapids' will become an important point, so soon as 'steamers' ply on Lake Winnipeg for the Saskatchewan plains. I cannot say if wheat would grow there. A Mission would prosper there. Hundreds of natives pass and re-pass the spot.

"I left Red River with my family about the 27th August, and reached Toronto on the 30th September. We returned to Canada

much more comfortably than we journeyed from it. The roads were improved, &c. On returning through the State of Minnesota, I found a very different state of things from when I passed through it in 1857. Then, for sixteen days, we saw none but our own company, and felt like travellers in a wilderness, but on our return we found the country settled, and towns and villages almost everywhere dotting the landscape. At St. Anthony's, we found a few scattered houses when we first saw it,—we slept in our tent on the grass,—where now there is surrounding the spot a town of 8,000 people, and the railway passing by it. In ten years from hence what will our own North-West be?

“I met a band of Chippewas on the banks of Red River, in Dacotah Territory, with whom I had some conversation. They complained of their treatment from the Indian agents, and considered themselves a defrauded people. They said they were wicked and ignorant, and were sorry that they could not have Christian teachers to guide, settle, and instruct them. It is greatly to be desired that the Indians of our own North-West may be fairly dealt with, and that the gospel may be freely preached unto them.

“I trust I shall never cease to pray for, and to be a true friend to the Indians all my days.”

The membership in the Red River District now reaches 370. Increase 80

Of these Missions nothing has been received beyond what has already appeared in the Missionary Notices. The whole party safely arrived at their appointed stations; Mr. Campbell, at Edmonton, opening his Mission under favorable auspices, and when last heard from was prosecuting his labors among the Indians, and the white population of the Fort, hopefully. The murder of a Chief and several of the Cree people, has, for a time, embarrassed the movements of the Missionary appointed to the Blackfeet Indians; but still, the strongly-expressed impotunity of this tribe for Christian Teachers from this

Society, leads us to anticipate the early establishment of a successful Mission among them.

The Mountain Stoneys send their hearty thanks to the good people of Canada for sending them the blessed Gospel,—the great Light. By many a camp-fire they talk over these things, and in their strange tongue praise the Lord for the joys religion confers upon them. The Church among them at the Woodville Mission has recently been opened, and consecrated to the service of God. In this District of magnificent distances, the “dwellers in the vale and on the mountain-tops catch the flying joy” emanating from hearts controlled by a Saviour’s love.

White Fish Lake Mission, under the care of Mr. Steinhaur, is steadily advancing in numbers and importance. When he first appeared among them, he found naked savages who thought only of to-day, and trusted to the Conjuror and his Medicine-bag for to-morrow—now he lives among a Christian community, with their little houses and gardens. In place of the dancing-lodge they have their church, to which they are called to worship by the voice of a bell, given to the Mission by John Macdonald, Esq., of Toronto; and the children, once so destitute, are clothed and cared for by Christian parents. They are delighted with their day-school, having 48 daily attendants, under the care of an excellent teacher. Mr. Steinhaur says,—“We are looking for better times in the Saskatchewan. Our numbers are increasing, and your Missionaries are doing all they can to save the souls of men.”

The Chairman’s removal with his family to the Plains of the Saskatchewan, in consequence of the scarcity of food at Victoria, and the death of the Cree Chief and his people, are events which awaken sympathy and earnest prayer for Divine interposition and protection for our brethren and their families throughout the whole of this District.

No District “Minutes” have yet been received; and although all the Missionaries have spoken of increase, we only now report the number of members as given last year,—viz., 397.

Several interesting features mark the year's history of these Missions. The opening of the Cariboo Mission, the steady advancement of the work of conversion among the Indians, and the prospect of Native and Colonial Agency, raised up within the bounds of the Pacific Work, call for gratitude and praise to Almighty God for having visited his people. The following Reports from the several Missions are worthy of careful perusal :—

VICTORIA.

Having arrived here in the midst of the year, my Report of this Mission must be chiefly confined to the latter part of the year. To the praise of God, much might be recorded of the energy, liberality, and devotion of the Church.

After the lapse of nine or ten years since the erection of the church edifice, repairs in the fall of 1868 were found necessary, and which were made, involving an outlay a little short of \$400; and could another \$400, or even twice that, be afforded by the Trust Fund, for further improvement—particularly on the Parsonage—it would but meet an urgent demand.

The debt of the church in October, 1868, was \$4,400, drawing ten per cent. in England. Towards the liquidation of this debt, some \$1,400 were assumed in a meeting called for that purpose, and which amount, covering a period of four years from January 1st, 1869, is

payable in annual instalments. Besides this financial draft upon some fifty members, one thousand dollars have been raised this year as Circuit Funds. Such energy and liberality are worthy of foreign support.

With special difficulties arising from various epidemics in the city, thinning the schools and congregations generally, yet there has been a delightful increase in the attendance to the Sabbath-school, prayer-meeting, and preaching. The Sabbath-school numbers about one hundred scholars, and for whose welfare there is earnest effort and prayer.

Souls have been converted to God lately and added to the church, which is enjoying unity and peace, while being "knit together in the comfort of love." After losses by one triumphant death and five removals, we report an increase.

NANAIMO.

During the first half of the past year this Mission was without a regular resident pastor, but by the efficient aid of local preachers, and one visit from the Rev. A. Browning, and three from the writer, the Sabbath and week-day services were all kept up; and although the Circuit income fell off considerably, the religious tone of the Church was well sustained. Since my return to this Circuit, six months ago, we have enlarged our borders by taking up new appointments, and in the work previously begun there has been encouraging progress, amidst many trials of faith and patience.

The Circuit receipts for the past half-year are over fifty dollars in advance of the corresponding quarters a year ago; and during the same period we have considerably lessened our church debt, and augmented the funds of our Sabbath-school, while the school in other respects has been greatly improved.

We have had to mourn the tragical death of one of our Stewards, and the Superintendent of our Sabbath-school, on Salt Spring Island, during the year, by the hand of an assassin. They were both treacherously shot in their own houses on the Lord's-day, when alone—probably by Indians, but this has not been yet fully ascertained. We have also lost, by removals, my worthy friends and relations, Thomas Cummings and family, and some others. After filling these vacancies our membership among the whites is about the same in number as reported last year.

The repeated and long absence of Brother Crosby, in his important and successful Mission on the main land, has been felt in

our work here among the natives; still we are much encouraged. The members reported last year have all been faithful, and five more have been added, and two on trial.

I have never known the heathen portion of the camp to make more determined efforts to sustain their old customs, and to win back our young Christians to their former ways, than during the past winter; and I have never known our members so united and faithful as our little band has been during this trying *dancing season*. They have come out of the trial greatly improved. For three months they kept up prayer-meetings every night, excepting Saturday; and Kushan, my interpreter, has frequently taken the morning preaching service on the Sabbath. They have contributed more than twenty dollars towards improving their church, and a small amount to the Circuit Funds. I shall lead them in this direction as fast as their knowledge and means will permit. Three are now members of our Quarterly Official Board, and seem to feel a lively interest in what is said and done. Members, 34, on trial, 1; Indians, 10, on trial, 3; Total, 48.

NEW WESTMINSTER AND THE LOWER FRASER.

Six months ago, I succeeded the energetic and successful Chairman of this District in the superintendency of this Mission. I found four appointments on this Mission: New Westminster; Bunard Inlet, 12 miles north-east of New Westminster; and two other appointments on the Fraser River, distant respectively 16 and 40 miles. There was no local-preacher on the Mission, which necessarily made the division of ministerial labour perplexing and unsatisfactory. The brethren, however, have met and borne this difficulty the best they could, and as the year now about opening will give us a Circuit Plan, with one local-preacher and four promising exhorters, the field will be more fully and faithfully occupied. The Sacramental and other ordinances of our Church have been seasons of grace and sweet delight. Believers have been stirred up to faith and good works, and sinners translated from the kingdom of Satan into the kingdom of God's dear Son.

Our membership is more than doubled, and a healthy state pervades and controls the life of the Society, extending its influence, whilst contributing to its internal strength. Two-thirds of those received on trial are heads of families, and among the remainder are several promising young men. This will shew the peculiar character of our social life, when I state that there is not an unmarried female among those converted, and that, in fact, the name of but one unmarried woman is found on the books of this Mission. Relevant to this is the existence of that moral gangrene of British Columbia, the

alliance of white men with Indian women in all the semblance but without the reality of marriage. This social pestilence at one of our appointments defied common decency, and nullified the labors of Bro. Crosby, our devoted Indian Missionary; but God interposed, and while some have put away the evil thing, and given themselves unto God, others who have families, have, in the fear of God, determined to marry the mothers of their children.

The munificent subscriber to our Mission and Circuit Funds, Thomas Cunningham, Esq., has long since left us, and the removal of the capital to Victoria has seriously depreciated trade and lessened our population; yet our Circuit Funds are \$87 in advance of our estimated income, and our Missionary list is as honorable to the subscribers as it is encouraging in its total amount.

Like as a number of lesser influences, converging to one centre, prove irresistible in their aggregate and united might, the Spirit of God, attracting and consolidating a number of human agencies, has wrought this which we now see and hear. "One soweth and another reapeth and gathereth fruit into life eternal, that both he that soweth and he that reapeth may rejoice together." Members, 25; on trial, 30; Total, 55.

CARIBOO.

Having left my comfortable home and highly desirable Circuit in Montreal, at a few hours' notice last July, I arrived here on the 7th day of October, 1868. A few days after, Barkerville, the principal town in Cariboo, was destroyed by fire. I soon found a few valuable brethren and many kind friends; but the want of a suitable place of worship was keenly felt. I inquired about the log-church built in 1863, under the direction of Drs. Evans and Taylor, but learned that it disappeared before my arrival, and we could scarcely find the place where it once stood. But we must commence, and the shell of a building in progress for a cow-stable being offered, we gladly accepted of it. Here we worshipped God, preaching to good congregations, for three Sabbaths. By the following Lord's-day, as the result of amazing energy and liberality, our little church was enclosed, minus door and windows, and we took possession with gratitude and hope. Here we continued to work during the six days, and rest and worship on the Sabbath until, at the end of two months more, we were able to praise God for a comfortable church and three convenient rooms for the Minister's residence; and since then we have made further improvements. The whole has cost \$1,850, over \$1,700 of which has been paid, and we are making every effort to remove the balance at an early date. When this is done we shall dedicate the whole to God, but not before. A class of ten members has been gathered, and a very

encouraging congregation. The prayer-meetings are attended with power and liberty of soul, and the meetings of class are seasons of grace and sweet delight. The watch-night on New Year's-eve, and the covenant and communion services on the first Sabbath in the year, were times of refreshing. I have preached several times at Mosquito Creek, and hope to do something at other creeks soon. It would delight our Stewards and myself to meet the other brethren at their annual assembly, but can't for time and expense, yet we shall be with them in spirit, and pray that God may direct and bless.

BRITISH COLUMBIAN INDIAN WORK.

Of the year just closed, the first six months were spent in attending to my former duties as teacher of the Nanaimo Indian Day-school, with occasional visits to neighbouring tribes; but the last six months in a more widely extended itinerancy among some thirty bands of Indians, speaking the same language.

As mentioned in my last letter, I have commenced a new Mission among the Sumass and Chilliwack Indians, who live about fifty miles above New Westminster.

After spending some time at Nanaimo, I went up in January last, since which I have preached to them regularly every Sabbath, and otherwise ministered to their spiritual wants. A spirit of anxious inquiry has been manifested, an instance of which was seen a week ago last Sabbath, when I had a larger attendance than ever, although a Roman Priest had been striving with sophistry and falsehood to prevent them from hearing me. The need of a church edifice is still more apparent, and will, we trust, be supplied as soon as the river steamer runs regularly, so that we can send up building material. There is a vigorous and increasing settlement of pioneer-farmers in the neighborhood, to whom there has been preaching occasionally for several years.

On this visit, after labouring several days among the Indians, some of the settlers wished to have a prayer-meeting among themselves; this was held, and on the following Sabbath, after morning service, we called for a meeting of all who were anxious to flee the wrath to come. Several remained, who showed by their conduct and conversation that the Lord was at work upon their hearts. The evening service gave also additional proof of a powerful work of conviction in many. A meeting was then announced for Monday night, when it was found that the Lord, in the interim, had by his Spirit spoken peace to the troubled consciences of some in their cabins, and they were not backward to declare what great things the Lord had done for them.

The glorious work of conversion having thus begun by the good hand of the Lord, nightly meetings were continued for four weeks, during which many of the most hardened sinners were awakened and converted. Indeed, at some of these meetings, the Divine power was so eminently present, that all felt and acknowledged its influence. When I left to attend the District Meeting, there was a class of thirty-one members, including five who were members before; and earnestly do they request that a Minister be sent to them, and that settlement form the head of a separate Mission, towards which I am sure they would willingly and liberally tender their support. Looking back upon this marvellous work of God, so unexpected by human foresight, of which I have been a favoured witness, I am led with adoring gratitude to exclaim "What hath God wrought! Not unto us O Lord, not unto us; but unto Thy Name be the glory."

More recent information than what is collected from the "Minutes" of the District Meetings held in March, gives us the pleasing news that "many Indians have been converted," and that the triumphant death of an Indian woman at the Nanaimo Station had the happy effect of stirring up the Christian Indians to more earnest prayer and holy living. An additional Class, of 14 members, had been formed. Three of the earlier converts are very useful in keeping up the means of grace in the necessary absence of the Missionary.

A Church for divine worship at the Sumass and Chilliwack Mission is expected to be completed in November. Mr. Crosby reports them as extremely anxious to hear the Gospel, and is very ardent in the expression of his hope that "many of them will be converted to God."

Our monumental tablets, in and around the Church, proclaim the high awards of the tribe to the late Rev. P. Jones and Chief Sawyer, men whose memories are as "ointment poured forth."

Much forbearance and long-suffering have to be exercised in regard to some of our members, as adverse influences have been fearfully at work during the year.

Your Missionary has re-organized the Sabbath-school, acting as Superintendent himself. A library, the Wesleyan Catechisms, and other books, are greatly needed. We return 29 scholars. We have two Day-schools on the Chippewa Reserve; but as both are sustained out of the Indian Funds, your Missionary's supervision is not recognized. Maps, books, and other school apparatus are much wanted, in order to greater efficiency. The Chippewas have repaired one school-house and fenced in both, besides re-constructing a bridge, involving an outlay of more than \$300. The Delawares have also fenced in the acre of land deeded to the Missionary Society.

We are thankful for the amount granted by the Missionary Committee for repairs, etc., as such has enabled us to add to the comforts and conveniences of the Mission House, a desideratum for one who has for nine years been amongst the dwellers in tents. Members—Indians, 62, on trial, 4; Whites, 9; Total, 75.

GRAND RIVER.

With gratitude to God we are enabled to report favorably of this old Mission for the year now closing. In addition to the ordinary means of grace, special efforts have been applied with some success. A few who had wandered from the fold have been reclaimed; and others who had until lately lived without "hope and without God in the world" have been led to seek the Saviour.

A new appointment in a neighborhood where we have hitherto had no foothold, has been taken up, and a Class and Sunday-school formed. The congregation is composed chiefly of young people, and bids fair, if faithfully looked after, to become, in a year or two, a flourishing Society.

Our finances, in the aggregate, are in advance of last year. We have now a new parsonage, a new barn, wood-house, etc., and the church painted and repaired. Since I came to this Mission, there has been in all upwards of one thousand dollars' worth of improvements, against which there is now, I am happy to say, not a dollar of debt.

Death has taken but two only of our number during the year. These left with us indubitable assurance that "all was well" with them in the final hour. In the death of Bro. David Stenebaugh, the Mission has sustained a great loss, though "our loss is his infinite gain." We could ill afford, however, to spare such a man. His last hours were hours of great physical suffering, but, through grace, he triumphed, and shouted in the final struggle, "Victory! Victory! through the blood of the Lamb!" Members—Indians, 81, on trial, 3; Whites, 70, on trial, 9; Total, 163.

MUNCEY.

We have had a year of spiritual prosperity on this Mission. We held a camp-meeting in Oneida last fall, which proved a blessing to our Indians; a number professed to obtain religion, and united with us in church-fellowship. At one of our appointments, about seventeen persons who were once members of our Church, but for the last few years were connected with another Church, have all united with us again: among the number is a good local-preacher, exhorter, and class-leader. We have now service twice a day in a church we did not occupy last year.

A number of our old members have died during the year; their end was peace. I may mention one, Sister Carey, who was converted about forty years ago, at Port Credit, during a camp-meeting held by Elder Case, assisted by the Reverend William and J. Ryerson. A few years after she removed to Muncey, and continued a faithful and exemplary member until her death. Among her last words were these,—“O Jesus, take me to heaven!”

All the means of grace have been well attended, and all our Connexional Funds taken up. Our Indians are making some improvement in agriculture—the Oneidas especially.

Our Missionary subscriptions are in advance of last year; and we have had a good average attendance at our day-schools, and we can say, “The best of all is, God is with us.” Members—Indians, 114, on trial, 20; Whites, 4; Total, 138.

ONEIDA.—(No Report).

MORAVIANTOWN.

This band of Indians numbers about one hundred and twenty. Methodism has been established among them for many years; but owing to some difficulties which arose a few years ago, we have lost our church and nearly all our members.

There were only six members returned to us, two of these have died, and we have received seven during the year, thus showing an increase of five.

The little class had not met for three years, but we prevailed on the Leader to organize again, so that they have met several times; and a prayer-meeting has also been sustained part of the year.

The poor Indians require much encouragement, and also very gentle dealing. By carefulness a good Class may yet be formed among them. Members, 10; on trial, 1.

The past ecclesiastical year has been one of peace and prosperity among our Indians. For some years they have been quite divided on Georgina Island; but we are happy to say that peace is restored, and that they have but one fold and one Shepherd. Members, 30.

R A M A .

We have much reason for gratitude to our Heavenly Father for His goodness towards us through another year. Although it has been a year of much toil and difficulty, yet it has been one also of many mercies and blessings. There has been a great deal of sickness both among our people and in the Mission House; but we are thankful to record that but one death has taken place.

Our means of grace have been well attended, and have proved "times of refreshing, coming down from the presence of the Lord." We cannot record any increase in our membership. We have had to experience the painful necessity of dropping and expelling some, and others have left for other places.

Our Indians are now exposed to great temptations, and amidst our difficulties it shows the power of Divine grace that not more of them have been led astray. In our immediate neighborhood there are several large lumbering establishments in operation, where great numbers of men are employed, and where very great immoralities are too often practised. Taverns are also multiplying around us, so that the temptations to which our Indians are exposed lead us to wonder that our people are so mercifully preserved. I am glad to be able to contradict the too universally entertained opinion that the Indians are fast dying out, as our Indians here are increasing yearly, by births over deaths.

Our School has been more than usually prosperous during the past year, under the care of Miss Jacobs. It has been kept open longer and with a larger average attendance. In addition to the usual routine of the school, quite a number of Scripture texts have been committed to memory. The Sabbath-school, under the care of Mrs. Brooking and Miss Jacobs, has been of a very encouraging character.

This we can say with thankful hearts, that our labor has not been in vain in the Lord; though often cast down on account of the continued and hardened impenitence of some, and still more distressed by the unfaithfulness and sin disclosed in a few professors of Christ, we have abundant occasion to rejoice in the steadfastness and faith and love, and solid, sterling Christian principle manifest among the Church membership generally, so that we can undoubtedly declare that they are "growing in grace." At the same time there are not a few signs of thoughtfulness and encouragement, both among the adults and children outside the Church, reminding us of the command and gracious promise, "Cast thy bread upon the waters and it shall be found after many days." May this people be indeed a people saved of the Lord! Members—Indians, 102; Whites, 8; Total, 110.

We have reason to believe that the Indians on the Island have made some progress during the past year. The change in their appointment from the week-day to the Sabbath morning, has had a beneficial effect on their religious enjoyments. Members, 14.

HIAWATHA—RICE LAKE.

In presenting our Annual Report of the spiritual state of this Mission, we would express our devout thanksgiving to the "God of all our mercies," that although the success of our efforts to gather the "outcasts" into the fold of Christ, has by no means equalled our wishes, yet we have not been permitted to labor in vain. At a special service held here in the month of January, many of the members of the Church were greatly quickened, and five persons professed to experience the pardoning love of God, all of whom have hitherto held fast their confidence in Christ.

Our Sabbath and day-schools are both in successful operation, and are doing much to mould the character, and fix the destinies of those who now enjoy their advantages.

Five united with us during the year and five have removed; one has died, one withdrawn, and two have been dropped. Members—Whites returned, 5; Indians, 50; Total, 55.

MUD LAKE.

A review of the labors of the past year, in supplying this Mission) in connection with the Lakefield Circuit, affords no particular ground of encouragement. But little improvement has been evident in the spiritual condition of the Indians: none certainly in their temporal circumstances. Congregations have been good, and apparent interest has been manifested in the services; yet, the difficulty of speaking to them intelligibly, either with or without an interpreter, and extending to them suitable pastoral oversight, greatly retards any successful results. The consistent walk of some, and the triumphant death of others, are, however, sufficient encouragement to continue preaching to them "Christ crucified." Members, 43.

ST. CLAIR.

During the connexional year now closing, we have experienced bereavement. With the exception of myself, every one in my family has had an attack of sickness. Through kind Providence we are now all well.

With the views of the local brethren on the Mission, I report that there is an improvement in the religious state of our people. The ordinary means of grace have been kept up with the help of the official members. A meeting was lately held, in which our people resolved and subscribed to build a Church. The Missionary subscription is larger than that of last year.

Greater efforts are being made by several of the natives to cultivate the soil. Their hearing of the forthcoming Act, to enable Indians to hold deeds for their lands, seems to encourage them.

The attendance on both Day and Sabbath-schools is encouraging. The St. Clair Mission House needs repairs. Kettle Point is visited monthly. The people at that place are anxious for a school-teacher, and they are now finishing, with their own means, a teacher's house.

Inducements are set forth to increase the unhappy religious division on this Reserve. However, no vital members of our Church have as yet deserted us. Three members died, dropped four, one removed. We have now in full membership 165, and 20 on trial. Total, 185.

ALLEN SALT.

WALPOLE ISLAND.—(No Report).

SAUGEEN.

On this Mission, while there are many hindrances, there are some things to encourage. We have this year built a Church, 38 x 60 feet, well finished, and furnished with a Victoria Organ.

In my last quarterly visitation, I called on a poor, aged, and afflicted Indian woman, a Pagan. I told her the simple story of Jesus, and the happy effects produced by believing in Him. She felt deeply, and requested to be baptized. After explaining the nature of the Sacrament, I conducted the ceremony, and recommended her to use some simple prayer; and when I called again in about two weeks I found her much comforted.

On this Mission we have two day-schools and two Sunday-schools. We held a Juvenile Missionary Meeting of the Indian children, which, morally and financially, was a great success.

I have visited the new Settlement in the Township of Amabel, preached to the people, and baptized their children. They are anxious to have the ministration of the Word furnished from our Missionary Society, and will gladly aid in paying your agent. Members, 75.

CAPE CROCKER.

The Indians at this place are very kind to us in many respects. During the past winter we had good times: the Lord hath sent His spirit to us, and manifested His love. A good many give testimony of receiving the blessing of God. Praise to God! I should be willing to live and die with these people if my wife were strong enough to endure the cold weather.

Our regular means of grace are preaching every Sabbath, morning and evening. The Class meets at the close of the evening service, and we have a prayer-meeting on Thursday evening. All the meetings are well attended. May God bless the people of this place! Members increased from last year. Members, 67.

CHRISTIAN ISLANDS.

This Indian Mission in its present shape, embraces several appointments far up on the North Shore of the Georgian Bay. Your Missionary has his home on Christian Island.

These distant places are visited only in the summer season. Our first meeting with our Indian friends from Nashkadayong and French River, was at the Parry Sound camp-meeting last August, where they received much religious instruction, which greatly encouraged them on their way to Heaven.

In September we visited them at their homes, *via* French River, Nashkadayong, and Shawanaga. At French River we found a very interesting Society in connection with our Church, and a population, all told, of 52 souls. As one evidence of what Christianity has done for them, they authorized your Missionary to say to Dr. Wood that if the Missionary Society would send them a School Teacher they would pay \$100 per year towards defraying the teacher's salary, and likewise put up a house for him.

At all these places we held several services among our Indian friends, and did what we could to encourage them in the service of the Great Spirit. The small Society at Beausoliel has been visited during the year, summer and winter. They are doing well. In the absence of the Missionary they have their prayer and class-meetings.

On Christian Island all our religious services are well attended. The new church is now out of debt. During the year the Indians have purchased a very fine chandelier and eight lamps for the church, and a good bell.

The Sabbath-school has been kept open all the year when the children are at home.

The day-school has been kept for the past six months, and the children have made good progress under the care and faithful instructions of Miss Jeffrey.

During the year we have received three members; one has died, very happy in the Lord, and one removed. We report 140 members.

MOUNT ELGIN INDUSTRIAL INSTITUTION, MUNCEY.

The largest number of scholars in attendance at any one time has been 56; the total number receiving instruction in the Institution during the year, has been 38 boys and 28 girls.

Our last quarterly report shows that 46 boys have been taught spelling, 46 reading, 41 Arithmetic, 21 English Grammar, and 16 have studied Geography.

Our regular hours for teaching are from 9 o'clock a.m. to 12, and from 1 to 4 o'clock p.m., but several of the boys spend about one hour in each evening at study; in this, they are encouraged by the teacher and assisted as they desire. Three of the young men are learning the carpentering trade, and two are working at shoemaking. In both of these branches, the young men are making satisfactory proficiency. A building 60 x 25 is in the course of erection on the premises for a range of workshops, where the "Mechanical and Industrial Arts" are to be taught.

Our Sabbath-school has been regularly kept up on the morning of each Sabbath. During the first year, the scholars recited 11,623 Scriptural verses; and in the year now closing, they have recited 18,720 verses; making in all, 30,343 Scriptural verses in two years.

Our friends are aware that this is an *Industrial Institution*, and that the boys are required to work on the farm and at their trades out of school hours. The girls are also employed out of school hours at sewing, spinning, knitting, and "house work."

Owing to the want of funds, we have been under the necessity of turning away a large number who have sought admission as scholars. This lack of assistance from the "Indian Department" is to be very much regretted, especially as we have ample room for a much larger number.

These Reports show the watchful care and attention which the Committee continues to exercise over the scattered tribes and bands of Indians in Ontario. The Conference itself views with unabated interest the ample provision which is annually made for their religious wants, and all are gratified by the willing offerings they make for the prosperity and permanency of their several Missionary establishments. The Saugeen Band gave eighteen hundred dollars for the erection of their neat and expressive Sanctuary; the Band at Christian Islands, fourteen hundred for the same purpose; and further movements in other places have been made for the same godly objects.

In addition to the Committee's responsibilities for the maintenance of the older Indian Missions, they have been powerfully appealed to on behalf of the greater part of the Indians residing at the Lake of the Two Mountains, near Montreal, for the supply of a Missionary and day-school teacher. A very remarkable document, embodying this appeal, was received by the President of the Conference, signed on behalf of the whole Band by the principle men and their wives on the Reserve; one which, as a Church, could not be heard and neglected without manifest unfaithfulness to the sacred principles committed to us for dissemination by its great Head. For a long time uneasiness and dissatisfaction pervaded the great body of the people, which, having arrived at its culminating point, manifested itself by their voluntary separation from the formal and ritualistic system of religion in which they had been trained, and by which they had been mentally and spiritually

These firm and independent Separatists from a corrupt system amount, with their families, to four hundred souls; for the spiritual welfare of these supplicants for our help, the Committee are making the most efficient arrangements they can secure. Many of the adults recently partook of the Sacrament of the Lord's Supper, administered by our worthy Oneida Missionary from Muncey Town, the Rev. A. Sickles, whose language is a dialect of the Iroquois, and who could intelligibly preach to them the truth, and conduct Divine Services to their great benefit and edification.

An opinion generally prevails that the Indian element of the Dominion population is fading away, and such as remain to this day, though professing to be Christians, show no improvement in the comforts of social life. Both these impressions are incorrect. In one District under the supervision of one of the Indian Superintendents, who has courteously furnished the Committee with statistics of his last enquiries, and in which the Wesleyan Missionary Society have no less than ten different stations, there has been an increase in the year of sixty-seven, and only one decrease in one, and two in another Band. The number on these ten stations is nineteen hundred and seventy-four, including children and youth under mature years; and of these we have five hundred and sixty-nine communicants; whilst the whole population of these ten Stations alone, with but very few individual exceptions, are under the pastoral care of the Society's Missionaries.

The Committee rejoice in the present existence of peace and harmony on these Missions. In both sections of Ontario—East and West—tokens of prosperity attend the laborers, who, in the prosecution of their toilsome appointments and visits, are welcomed heartily by their countrymen from Europe, who have sought for permanent homes in this inviting asylum of peace and prosperity. True, like others who have long preceded them, and are now cultivating broad acres of freehold farms, unobstructed by the roots of the forest trees which stood for ages unassailed by the onward march of civilization, they have at first manfully to battle with anticipated, and now, realized difficulties; yet are they cheered in their daily labors in the partially-cleared wilderness, by an assurance of ultimate success rewarding their industry and sacrifices with an independent and plenteous home. As contributing to their contentment and comfort; the observance of the Sabbath—the visits of Christian Missionaries—the public and social ordinances of the Church, and the communion of Saints, must be placed among the prominent and important institutions and agency which shed their light upon our German brethren, many of whom are occupying localities at present remote from the towns and cities of Canada; whilst in such places as Hamilton, Paris, St. George, and Preston, they have the privilege of listening in their own tongue to the Society's Missionaries offering the blessings of life and salvation, and exhibiting "the wonderful works of God."

HAMILTON AND PARIS.

Through "fightings without, and fears within," has an all-sufficient Providence led us another year, and done for us abundantly above all we could have asked. To Him be all the praise!

During the past year we were frequently absent from our immediate sphere of labor, assisting in various ways the brethren on the Upper German Missions. Special services on our own Mission have been blessed by the conversion of several precious souls; the ordinary means have on several occasions been very signally blessed. Oh! that these refreshings were more frequent and powerful!

Rejoicing in the above, it was also our painful duty to have dropped several, from various causes; notwithstanding which we are enabled to report an increase in membership, for which we thank God, and take courage.

It is also a notable and grateful fact that eight out of our small membership are converted Roman Catholics, who, with one exception, were brought to see the true light by your Missionaries. During the past year we attended two, who, though dying in the bosom of that Church, yet died in the triumphs of Christianity.

Our Missionary Meetings were well attended, and highly interesting, chiefly owing to the fact that our respected Chairman, the Rev. E. Evans, D. D.,—who, by the way, is the best English-German scholar whom we have met—gave us his services. If our Chairmen, in whose Districts the German Missions are situated, could by any means transgress upon their other duties, and occasionally lend us their influence on these occasions, it would greatly further our cause.

Financially, too, we report an increase on three appointments, having raised for connexional purposes the sum of \$244 12., viz:—Hamilton, \$109 13; Paris, \$91 81; St. George, \$43 18. We deem it proper to say that our English friends have liberally contributed towards our Missionary efforts. May we never weary in well-doing! Members 56; on trial, 6.

PRESTON.

At the last Conference I was sent back for the fifth year to Preston, and as all the other regular appointments in connection with this Mission had been taken away, I had, therefore, to pioneer again, and seek to extend our borders. Though not having success everywhere, yet, in the rising village of Hespeler a few have been gathered who regularly attend on the ministry of your Missionary.

The Preston congregation has this year suffered severely by removals and otherwise, so that at the close of the present year we stand thus: Removals, 18; dropped, 7; members, 31.

Taking into consideration the commencement and progress of our German Work, the nine years of hard toil and labor on a peculiar field, which I, by the grace of God, was honored to begin, I feel thankful to say that, notwithstanding the great opposition with which I had to contend, and the innumerable trials and even persecutions I had to endure, yet the Lord has not permitted his servants to labor in vain; not only are there churches and congregations as the fruits of our labors, but those also, of whom we can say, "Ye are our joy and crown of rejoicing in the day of the Lord Jesus."

And now, as this is very likely my last report from that part of the Lord's vineyard in which I have hitherto been engaged, I take leave of the German Work with mingled feelings of joy and sorrow.

Praying that the God of Missions will continue to bless the German Work, and increase it a hundred fold more.

WATERLOO & GREY.

WATERLOO.—This Mission was, last Conference, placed under the superintendence of the Rev. Jacob Freshman; but, after several months of joint labors, Brother Freshman resigned his office in the German work, which was then in a somewhat dissatisfactory state; after which the Mission was divided into two parts, of which six appointments were allotted to me. With fear and trembling, but in the trust of the help of the Lord, I undertook my work, and, with love and friendship I attempted to meet all enemies of Methodism, and, thanks to the Lord, I have overcome some, who one after another put up his sword in his sheath. The people amongst whom I labored were kind and liberal towards me, and by most of them I was kindly entertained, which gave me much pleasure to labor amongst them.

The meetings, with few exceptions, were tolerably well attended. Several souls were converted—others were strengthened in faith.

The increase of membership is equalled by its decrease through death. In financial respects, this Mission has done better than either I or all who were with me, who were acquainted with the several hinderances, had expected. May the blessing of God rest upon the German work! The best of all is, that the Lord was with me, and to Him be all praise and glory for ever! Members, 23.

In view of the tide of immigration flowing into Grey, it became evident that our first great necessity was a Church, into which the people might be collected for public worship. The work seemed difficult indeed, with but six members on trial ; but we began in the name of the Lord. And both English and German friends being appealed to responded with a subscription of \$152 ; \$141 of which have been paid. We have erected a substantial frame building, 25ft. x 30ft. at a cost of \$337, in which we have worshipped over six months of the year. It will require, however, nearly \$100 more to finish it completely. At the opening conducted by Rev. C. Allum, we had a precious season. Our special meeting in the new Sanctuary, in which several persons were seeking salvation, was interrupted by the breaking-up of the roads with the coming spring. We have lost two families by removal ; six persons have been dropped. We now report eighteen members in full, and three on trial. Class and prayer-meetings are regularly held. We have a Sunday-school attended by from 25 to 30 children, in which a deepening interest is felt by the people. Our friends have contributed towards the funds of the Missionary Society the sum of \$33 42. We are alone in this field of Christian toil, and there are prospects of growth and blessing by the increasing favor with which your Missionary is received, and the continued immigration of German families.

VENNACHAR.

In reviewing our labors for the three years past on this Mission, we are happy to report that our efforts have been blessed in the conversion of many souls. About seventy persons have experienced religion, and about ninety more received as members of the Church.

Three places of worship and a parsonage have been erected, and although the Missionary Committee assisted us kindly in the grant of \$100 to build the parsonage, it required a great deal of labor besides. Not only has God blessed our labors in the conversion of souls, but the influence of the good work goes far a head, like the morning light before the rising sun. There is a great change, even among those who have not as yet experienced religion. Our work has a good foundation, and if carried on in the future with energy and zeal, promises an abundant harvest. We have two appointments, but on account of the depths of the snow, not so much good could be accomplished as if it had been otherwise.

We received 21 members on trial during the past year. We have now 100 members on this Mission. Our people are willing to do the best they can for the support of the Gospel, and are thankful for what the Missionary Society has done for them in sending to them the bread of life. May God bless his own work, and give to his servants success, in the prayer of your Missionaries.

FRENCH MISSIONS.

A Committee has been appointed by the Conference to take up the whole subject affecting these Missions, whose recommendations and plans will enable the Committee to carry on this branch of the Society's operations with greater efficiency. Of MONTREAL, the Rev. J Borland says:—

"Bro. Rivet was appointed to Montreal the past year, for the two-fold purpose of prosecuting those studies required of candidates for our ministry, under the kindly volunteered supervision of the Rev. R. W. Ferrier, and that he might labor among those of his fellow-countrymen to whom he might obtain access. These objects were both prosecuted during the year with creditable results. Of the latter it may be said, that he visited from house to house with varying encouragements;—one or two exceptions occurring only, in which he was driven from the house in belligerent language and action by the inmates. He several times preached to considerable numbers in the open air, aided by some of our ministers and lay friends, by whom a portion of each service was conducted in English. At other times he convened congregations of from thirty to fifty persons, to whom he preached, conducting a regular service in one or other of our Churches in the suburban parts of the city. For several months he taught a class of French youths, usually on the Sabbath, and sometimes on a week-day evening as well. Subsequently he made a commencement to hold a school for a couple of hours each day in the week, to impart secular instruction to those children whose parents had become favorably disposed towards him."

ROXTON SOUTH.—Mr. Parent's labors during the year were seriously interrupted by personal and family afflictions: he narrowly escaped the grave himself, but was spared to mourn over the death of two of his sons. Of these visitations and his work he says,—

"Notwithstanding all this, the Lord has been good to me. I think it was for our good as a family and for the people. We have already seen the fruits of it among them.

"Our work as a Mission is not a failure, nor ever will be, as long as we employ converted men to do the work. Methodism is, I believe, one of the best systems adapted to the conversion of the French Canadians. May God add his blessing to the Mission!

"The beginning of the year was quite encouraging in the anxiety of the people attending the meetings, and their attention to the reading of God's Word.

"Our meetings were of the most spiritual kind, having the presence of Him who promised to be with those assembled in His name. A revival among the people broke out just before the Missionary Meeting, and consequently, having to attend the Missionary Meeting, the protracted meeting was discontinued, and at the close of the Missionary Meeting the hand of affliction fell upon me."

ROXTON FALLS.—Mr. Chartier is of opinion that "Rome is losing ground," but laments the want of courage in many who are thoroughly convinced of its errors, and the absence of sympathy even among Protestants. A tone of discouragement pervades his report, in which, however, is the following statement, that will awaken astonishment among many, as to the state of Eastern society, if his opinion be correct:—"There is a time coming when Missionaries will find it profitable to go through the parishes, street-preaching, but the time is not yet; and he who would undertake it would die as the fool dieth!" Would that we had a Canadian Gideon Ouseley to test it!

HURON.—Some encouragement cheers Mr. Dorion, who has "preached the word" to the French settlers on this Mission:—

HURON.

Early last autumn I held protracted meetings, for five weeks in succession, in which much good has been done. By the power of God, many sinners have found peace to their souls through faith in Christ, and this blessed power continues His gracious work even to this day.

The two preaching appointments on Sabbath have been kept during the year; at the Sauble, at 10 a.m., and at 3 p.m. at La Pointe, except between nine or ten weeks during the winter season, that I have preached alternatively at one appointment in the morning, and generally in the afternoon. When time permitted it, I held a meeting for prayer and mutual edification, and this was thought the most expedient; for the two appointments are between ten to eleven miles apart.

I have also organized a weekly prayer-meeting on Wednesday evening at the Sauble, and another at La Pointe on Thursday evening. I did not appoint them both on the same day, so that it would afford me an opportunity to attend both places. I have likewise organized a temperance meeting, and about sixty-five persons have already signed the pledge. Some of them were much addicted to intemperance, but they remain faithful to their pledge, to their great credit and honor.

Three families have left the Roman Catholic Church during the year, and have united themselves with us. There was one death, Alexander Challet, a young man of thirty years of age. He is very much regretted by his numerous friends and relatives. He was highly esteemed by all, and promising to be useful. His end was peace, and left a good testimony that all was well with him. His death has impressed both young and old to "strive to enter in at the strait gate."

This is a very peculiar Mission field; there are only twenty-six Protestant families on it, and these are much divided; but forty persons among the most influential, both by their affluence and piety, have subscribed their names, in order to manifest their gratitude and thankfulness for what you have already done, and also desiring that you will continue your work of faith and labour of love, in my re-appointment for the coming year; and likewise they feel that it is their duty and privilege to contribute of their temporal means, according to their ability, to help to support their minister, and hope that you will comply with their request.

May it please the Lord to bless this small section of his moral vineyard!

DAVENPORT, SEATON, AND LESLIEVILLE.

During the past year, these three appointments have been worked together as one Circuit, instead of separately, as was previously the case. By a different arrangement of services, the Superintendent has been enabled to preach once at each appointment every Sunday, and an additional service has been maintained at each place by the aid of an efficient staff of local-preachers.

The general interests of the Circuit have given token of marked improvement. Eighteen new members were received and twelve dropped or removed, leaving a net increase of six. At Leslieville, especially, has the increase in congregation and finances been most marked. The congregation has risen from twelve or fifteen to over seventy. The Sunday-school has been re-organized and maintained in vigorous operation.

This Society has raised for various purposes, local and general, over \$300. This includes the sum of nearly \$80, the proceeds of a sermon by the President of the Conference.

The church has been improved to the value of about \$100. Considerable accessions to the church and congregation are anticipated in consequence of the extension of the brick-yards in the neighborhood. Fourteen new houses are now in course of erection in the immediate vicinity of the church.

A great amount of spiritual destitution, intemperance, and Sabbath-breaking, however, prevails. There is no other Wesleyan service below the Don for many miles, and indeed very little religious service of any kind, yet the population is large and is rapidly increasing. The amount raised by the entire Circuit, whose membership is only forty-eight, was over \$800, or over sixteen dollars per member. Members, 43; on trial, 5.

MONO.

The past year has been one of peace, and, in most respects, of prosperity. The Missionary Fund, to which our people are much attached, is in advance of any former year. Three new churches have been erected, completed, and dedicated to the worship of God, and a new parsonage has been built and partly furnished since last Conference.

These buildings cost us very near \$3,400; \$3,000 of which amount has been paid during the year, and a part of the remaining \$400 is provided for. Removals, death, and sin have robbed us of near seventy members since this time last year; but about the same number has been gathered from the world to Christ and added to the Church, so that our membership remains the same.

Our congregations are very good, and I have thought of late that our prospects of a revival of the work of God are brightening. Members, 370.

ORANGEVILLE.

Your Missionaries, after arduous and continued toil, are led to exclaim,—“Who hath believed our report? and to whom is the arm of the Lord revealed?” Scriptural dearth appears to prevail to a large extent in this region. The “removals” of the year have been unusually numerous, and, together with the defections and “prunings” incident to Circuit life, prevent the return of more than 140 members, being a net increase of but two.

The Sabbath-school work is, however, prosperous and cheering, giving indication of a brighter day about to dawn.

A valuable site, consisting of half an acre, has been secured by regular deed for a parsonage and a new Church in this rising town, at a cost of \$700. Considerable effort has already been put forth in preparing to build largely; but the straitness of the times in this section of the country necessitates the postponement of the erection of the much-desired buildings until a more favorable opportunity

The work of the past has been somewhat like that of David: the work of the future will require a ministerial Solomon. That such may be the character of the incoming minister, or ministers, is the fervent prayer of the retiring Pastor at the close of his very eventful three years' term.

CAINSVILLE.

In giving our third annual report of this Mission, we are thankful that we can say that the work of God is still steadily advancing on this field of labor. The blessing of the Lord has, in an abundant manner, rested upon the labors of His servants, and as a result we have had both spiritual and temporal prosperity. The new stone Church at the Shaver appointment, was dedicated last October. Its cost was \$3,034 ; but we are glad to say that, through the liberality of its friends, it has been entirely freed from debt. The new brick Church at the Plank Road appointment was dedicated in February. Its cost was \$1,350, and is also free from debt. In the old village of Ancaster we have succeeded in purchasing an eligible building lot, which has been regularly deeded to the Connexion, and a neat stone Church, 30 x 40 is now in course of erection, to be completed by the 1st of October next. This will greatly strengthen our Society there, and give us a position which ought to have been ours years ago. While engaged in Church building, the Connexional Funds have not been forgot. Our Missionary contributions which, three years ago were \$160.57 are this year \$242.75 ; the Superannuated Ministers' Fund Collections, then \$15.45, are this year \$48 ; the receipts from Classes, then \$503.24, are this year \$738.42 ; and the Membership, then 152, is now 244, showing a net increase of 92 on the three years, after making up for the loss of 11 by death and 54 by removals, besides a number dropped. For these evident manifestations of the Divine favor we feel grateful to God, and still pray for further increase. Members, 233 ; on trial, 11 ; total 244.

DUNNVILLE.

I was promptly at my post the first Sabbath in July, and, to my surprise, learned that my predecessor had been absent about eight weeks; and hence much dissatisfaction at being so long without the regular ministrations of the word. Was left no list of members, save that by an ex-predecessor, which, when I came to renew the first quarterly tickets, required more than usual pruning. With the aid of the Official Board, after a careful examination of the class-books, we made out a little over half the number reported. An old frame house had been purchased for a parsonage, which I found in a state of half repair; had to make it tenable, erect a stable, sink a well, and other necessary fixtures, with my own means. All these together were not surely encouraging. Methodism is sadly divided. Three altars are erected at the same hour every Sabbath, the congregations are consequently small—ours is much the largest; a few have been added during the year; but, with a large emigration to other parts, of our best families, we can report only sixty members. I preach three times every Sabbath, morning and evening in the village, and two afternoon appointments alternately supplied, besides an occasional service in a back settlement.

We have scarcely a suitable class-leader on the Mission; so that the whole work, or nearly so, devolves on the minister himself. Still we cannot complain, we have tokens of good, and are looking and praying for greater prosperity. Our Connexional Funds are somewhat in advance; but the Circuit support is very small, and, with the Mission grant, is under five hundred dollars, exclusive of claim on the Children's Fund. Hard work and strict economy to make out a living. People here are very poor, and were it not for two or three liberally-minded families, the minister would suffer embarrassment, as the income from all sources will not meet expenses. Members, 60.

The Official Board have therefore unanimously requested the appointment of an additional laborer,—conditional upon the continued and increased assistance of the Missionary Committee. The greater part of our people, though willing to contribute liberally, are poor, and will require generous aid. They feel grateful for past favors, and earnestly desire still to receive aid, hoping that the time is not far distant when they will be able to support their own ministers. Our membership at the present is 165, and two on trial.

One of the principle causes of the comparative religious dearth in this section of country, is the sectarian spirit which exists among the different bodies of Methodism. I pray that God may pour out of His Spirit, and make us more of one heart and mind!

This Mission sustained a sudden and severe loss in the decease of the Rev. Thomas Robson last October. The remainder of the year I have labored as his successor. MOORETOWN.

Having no colleague in the early part of the year, the work on this Mission was very much disarranged. However, since the arrival of Bro. Joseph Little, who has rendered us valuable service, the work has been regularly supplied, and we have taken up three new appointments, which promise well. We have been blessed with peace in all our borders, and find both members and hearers kind, considerate, and liberal. We have not seen so many conversions during the year as were looked for, and desired, yet we have sown the seed of the Kingdom in faith, and hope, with the Holy Spirit's blessing, to see many sheaves gathered, to the honor and glory of the Lord of the harvest. WALLACEBURG.

In consequence of your Missionary and his family having suffered so much during the year from ague and fever, the work of the Mission has been imperfectly done; nevertheless, some progress has, we think, been made. The Connexional Funds are largely in advance of preceding years. Moreover, a commodious lot has been purchased, upon which, doubtless, a parsonage will soon be built. As to membership, there has been a falling off. We found it necessary to drop a large number, who, for years, have neglected Class, and even the preached word. We have just organized a Sabbath-school in Dawn Mills, with hopeful prospects of usefulness; and have recently revived another such interest in our Lindsay Road appointment. ERIN.

We are thankful to be able to report improvement in every department of our work. Our congregations are good; in some places they have greatly increased. At some of the appointments a gracious work has been progressing during the year, by which several have been added to the Church. We have a net increase of 18 members, after filling up the vacancy caused by the dropping of 2 and the removal of 16. The financial condition of our Church edifices has ceased to be embarrassing, though a considerable debt still remains on two of them. At another, from which the debt was entirely removed last year, a spacious driving-shed has just been completed. The contributions to our Connexional Funds are all increasing. It cannot be said that the spiritual state of our people generally is very satisfactory; the want of maturity in knowledge, experience, and character, is too obvious; but, with devout gratitude, we can say that many pleasing indications of increased spirituality are visible. It has been our simple aim, during three years of hard labor, to speak God's word faithfully in reference to the final account. We wait for the harvest to see the results, hoping to find mercy of the Lord in that day. What this Mission needs above all things is, an abundant out-pouring of the Lord the Spirit.

ROCKWOOD.

Since my coming to this Mission difficulties have been settled, the mortgage on Rockwood Church removed, and a shed built at Everton appointment. The Connexional collections are the best for eight years, and the Missionary subscriptions the best reported for four years. The congregations are good. The Classes are well attended, and furnish evidence of increased piety on the Mission. Two new appointments have been taken up, at one of which a protracted meeting is being held, which, we hope, will result in the formation of a Class. Meetings have been held somewhere on the Mission nearly every night since November last, and thirty conversions have been noted. Members, 137.

BERLIN.

The Berlin Mission, formed by the union of the former Preston Mission with the Berlin Circuit, is a large and laborious field of labor, and somewhat barren in a Methodistic point of view. There are many difficulties in the way of the Missionary, arising from the geographical features of the Mission, the character and language of the great mass of the community, their lamentable want of spirituality, fewness of the friends of Methodism, and the frequent removals of our people. Though these difficulties have done much to retard our work, yet we have not been altogether without success. One Church has been built and dedicated, and is likely, shortly, to be out of debt, where at the beginning of the year a new Church was scarcely thought of. The erection of another Church is in contemplation, in view of which a considerable amount of subscription has been offered, and a Ladies' Aid Society been formed, which has already done much to supplement the Building Fund; and the debt of another Church has been reduced by more than one-half, with the prospect of entire liquidation by another vigorous effort during the ensuing year. We are happy to report, too, that all our Connexional Funds are in advance of last year, some of them considerably so. And of the general funds of the Circuit, we are able to present a favorable report. The same territory cost the Connexion last year, by way of Contingent and Missionary grants, fifty dollars more than the present year, and yet reported a deficiency of one hundred and seventeen dollars; whilst this year we have no deficiency to report.

Our return of members, though not what we desire, is not altogether discouraging, for though out of a membership of 178 received from our predecessors, we have lost 15 removed, 4 dropped, 2 deceased, and 1 withdrawn; yet we are able, by the blessing of God, to return a net increase of 8. Our prospects, though not of the most encouraging kind, are somewhat brighter than at the commencement of the year. Our congregations are in some instances improving. Our love-feasts give evidence of a good tone of religious experience. Two new Sunday-schools have been organized, which we hope will soon be governed according to the Constitution and By-laws contained in the Discipline of our Church. There are some points within the bounds of our Mission where, perhaps, new appointments might be formed, but our hands are full, and the peculiarities of the Mission are such, that a less amount of preaching at any one appointment, in order to take up new ground, would be injurious to our present work. TEVIOTDALE.

With pleasure we record the goodness of God toward us during another year. While having to report a decrease in the membership, owing to an unusual number of removals, we are thankful that our labors have not been in vain in winning souls to Christ. We have lost three by death, and fourteen have been dropped. Our present membership is 90. We have one Sabbath-school kept open and worked efficiently throughout the year; we expect to re-organize two others shortly. Our parsonage has been brought to a state of completion, and is neat, comfortable, and commodious. The Ebenezer Church has been disposed of for \$300, which amount, after paying the remaining debt on the building, will leave us a small balance toward the erection of a new Church in a convenient locality. Church accommodation is our great need throughout the Mission. The inability of our people is the only reason of its longer continuance.

This has been a year of great temporal depression—the crops in many instances being almost complete failures. It is gratifying under the circumstances, that our local and commercial interests have been so well sustained. Most of our funds are in advance of last year. The sum raised for all purposes will average \$5 per member. Yet your Missionary suffers an embarrassing deficiency. Amid discouragements there are yet many things to cheer and encourage the Christian Missionary in this new and rising part of the country.

In order to supply this neighborhood with the means of grace, a journey of 16 miles, over roads exceeding rough, has to be travelled. This part of the country being new, the people are able to give but little toward the support of the Gospel. Notwithstanding the very serious drawback to the Mission's prosperity in the loss of the appointments referred to, in connection with the length and severity of the winter, and comparative failure of the crops last summer, we are grateful that nearly as much has been realized towards the Missionaries' support as last year; and for all the other funds, with the exception of the Missionary Fund, a little in advance. Also \$53 95, which has been appropriated towards improving the parsonage and purchasing a Sabbath-school library and stove. The attendance on the public means of grace is generally good. One Sabbath-school, with an encouraging attendance, has been kept up all the year.

Received during the year, 21 members; after deducting 7 for death, removals, and dropped, we report an increase of 14. On the whole there is cause for gratitude. We believe with a co-operation of faithful persevering labor, this comparatively barren soil will become fruitful. Members, 52; on trial, 2.

At our first Quarterly Meeting, the Board spontaneously made, in comparison with former years, a very liberal advance on each item of their appropriation.

We earnestly hoped that our camp-meeting in September would have resulted in such a revival of religion throughout the Circuit, that henceforward at every appointment the class and prayer meeting would be well sustained. Although these wide spread results did not follow, still some of the camp-meeting services were among the most profitable and blessed means of grace I ever attended.

During the year, as the result of a house to house visitation, and direct personal appeals, our prayer-meetings in the town have been largely attended, and at different times we have seen as many as ten and fifteen seeking mercy. Converting grace has also been vouchsafed to us. We have made some material progress.

There is a felt necessity for more Church accommodation in the town. Towards the erection of a new brick Church, our people have made a noble home effort. We are building a new frame Church on the lake shore: the funds are nearly all provided except for plastering. We expect to be worshipping in it by the 1st of June.

Our Missionary subscriptions are one-fourth more than last year. We have lost 11 members by removal and one by death, still we report an increase of 11. Members, 110; on trial, 11.

PENETANGUISHENE.

The year just closing has not been characterized by any special revival on this Mission, yet we have been encouraged by assurances of steady and permanent success. In some respects this is one of the most discouraging fields of labor in the Connexion. Its boundaries are quite extensive; the membership small and scattered; our people, with a few exceptions, rather poor—many of them likely to continue so, at least for a considerable time, owing to the poverty of their land, and many of them not very well instructed in Wesleyan Methodist discipline. Large sections of the community are bitterly opposed to Methodism. It is a matter of gratitude, however, to your Missionary, that in the face of almost mountain difficulties, we are able to report encouraging indications of a widening Methodist influence, and gratifying evidence of the increase of the Redeemer's kingdom.

During the year, a suitable new Church, the contract for which was let under the superintendency of my predecessor, was erected, and the entire cost provided for by reliable subscriptions. At our last Quarterly Official Meeting, a Trustee Board was created for the erection of another new Church during the year at an appointment taken up some two or three years ago, but rapidly increasing. Some attention has been devoted to the improvement of the Sabbath-schools; and now we have four strictly Methodist schools, which give promise of much good for the future. All of our Connexional Funds have been slightly advanced, excepting one. We have five regular Sabbath appointments, one of which is met every Lord's-day, and one week-night appointment. Our public congregations manifest a gratifying increase. After deducting deficiencies by excision, removals, and death, we report an increase of 12 in our membership. Generally, peace and harmony prevail among our people. Members, 84; on trial, 6.

COLLINGWOOD.

As my third year is near its close, allow me to make the following remarks:—It is well known that a few years ago, the Church and Parsonage were both destroyed by fire. The Rev. Charles Fish, the minister in charge, put forth most extraordinary efforts for the recovery of the loss, and the result was the erection of a large Church, which

cost the sum of \$7,200. Mr. Fish, being removed in one year from this time, left the Church under a heavy debt. Soon after this, a great reaction took place in the affairs of the town, the population and the Church shared in the common disaster. Our people became minified and discouraged, so that both at home and abroad the Church was denounced as a great blunder,—too large an edifice for the place, and too large a burden for the few people to bear. For the edification of all sympathisers with this Mission, I am able to state that this blunder existed only in imagination. The Church was not too large, for it is respectably filled twice every Lord's-day, and the debt is entirely extinguished, and we can now say it is entirely the Lord's. This Church is an abiding memorial of the Connexional and princely spirit of the Methodists who aided in gifts for its erection; an evidence of the far-seeing wisdom of Dr. Wood, who planned its capacity; and a demonstration of the self-denying labour of the Rev. Charles Fish, who raised most of the funds; and an honor to the people of the town, who (during my time with them) have, with the aid of others, finally extinguished the debt. This is a good Church in a most important place: First, in relation to the North Shore, rich in lumber, minerals, and agriculture, and must be developed; secondly, to the opening up of the Great North-West, towards which all eyes now turn, and ultimately to free through-trade with the great grain growing States of the American Union. Why not this town become a city, and this Church too small, and one Church too few for the accommodation of the people who shall worship here? Members, 50.

MUSKOKA.

In reviewing the labors of the past year, we feel thankful to the Giver of all good, that He has not permitted us to labor in vain, or spend our strength for nought, but has given us a measure of success temporarily and spiritually. We have succeeded in securing, by Conference deed, two lots in the village of Bracebridge, at a cost of \$50, for Church and Parsonage purposes. We have let the contract for a frame Parsonage, 18 x 26, with wing attached, 16 x 18, to be lathed and plastered throughout, having four rooms in under story, and three in upper, all to be completed and ready for occupancy by the first of August next. We have also erected a frame stable on parsonage lot, 12 x 16, with an enclosed shed, or driving-house attached, 10 x 16. The whole cost of lots and buildings will be about \$600.

In reference to our spiritual prosperity; after making the following deductions, viz., 2 deaths, 2 withdrawn, 3 dropped, and 11 removed,—i.e. a total loss of 18 members—we report a net increase of 20. We have taken up two new appointments, at one of which we have organized a promising Class of six members. On the whole, we are encouraged in reference to the ultimate success of the Mission, and prayerfully labor for the day when the "little one shall become a thousand, and the small one a strong nation." BRUCE MINES.

The continued decline in the mining interests here affects unfavorably, as a matter of course, the report from this Mission. During my

sojourn on this field of labor I have received into the Church 157, while during the same period there has been a loss of 110 by removals alone. I do not think the population is over one-half what it was a few years ago, and those who remain are in great uncertainty respecting the future.

I am not able to record the signal triumph of last year, as to numbers converted; but God has been in His own ordinances, and those previously brought into the fold have been nurtured and strengthened in the good way. The congregations have continued large during the whole year, and there has been no falling off in the liberality of our friends. Your Missionary and all the Church funds have been supported—numbers and circumstances considered—beyond anything with which I had been previously acquainted. May God abundantly bless this noble-hearted people! The membership at the May Quarterly Meeting was 130, but quite a number of these will have left before my successor arrives.

The Sabbath-school has been "Union" up to this last year, when it was re-organized as a Wesleyan school, and is well sustained. The distance between the appointments is such that if the preacher will but fill all his regular or ordinary ones for the year, he will, by the very fact, have travelled seventeen hundred miles, and all that travel over the worst of roads, and unless in the winter, almost entirely in the saddle, and on the way to and from one appointment there are fences to be taken down and to be put up again.

The people on this Mission are comparatively poor, and it cannot be expected that they would be otherwise, the lands are so barren in many parts. I do not think that I would be doing justice to the people or to myself if I were to overlook these facts, for otherwise the deficiency in the financial returns would remain unaccounted for. I held two protracted meetings during the winter, and though I cannot boast of getting many to join the Church, yet I have no doubt much spiritual good was effected. Dropped 7 members for not having attended Class for the last seven years; one moved away. Present members 68; on trial, 1; total, 69.

We have been encouraged during the past year by the regular attendance on the means of grace of many of the young people and of the members of the Church ; a better attendance at the Sabbath-school, and a general spirit of seriousness among them. A few conversions have taken place, and sixteen have joined on trial,—a net increase of fourteen members. We have been favored with harmony, a pleasing growth in divine grace, and a few members have received the blessing of perfect love. The Church has exhibited a noble spirit of unity, and continued liberality in the support of the cause of Christ. Members, 48 ; on trial, 16.

FRANKLIN CENTRE.

This Mission was reported last year under the name of "Manningville." For many reasons we praise God for this year's labor, yet we feel humbled because we have not been more successful in extending His kingdom. Owing to the interruption of our work, caused by the exchange of our junior preacher, and the unusually stormy winter, we have been able to hold only one special service, and consequently report an apparent decrease of 12, but an actual decrease of 9. We believe, notwithstanding this decrease, that our membership is as strong to-day as it was last year ; and that, by the blessing of God, a year of preparation and seed-sowing will bring an abundant harvest. We have received 19 into the Church ; 9 were dropped, 15 removed, and 4 have died. Those who died were aged members of our Church, who "endured, as seeing Him who is invisible," until the veil was removed and they beheld the glory which is excellent. One of these was the relict of the late Frederick Broder, Esq., who introduced Wesleyan Methodism into this section of the country, and whose house was ever

the preacher's home. One new Sunday-school has been organized, and \$60.80 expended in S. S. Libraries and requisites. A beautiful frame and brick Church, 43 feet by 32 feet, commenced by the Rev. A. Andrews, has been completed at a cost of \$1,400, and opened free from debt. Ground has been secured by Conference deed, materials prepared, and \$700 subscribed, part of which is paid, for the erection of another Church to unite two minor appointments. From receiving a Mission grant of \$50 less than anticipated, and our expenses being considerably more than usual, we suffer by deficiency a loss of \$125. Yet our people are willing and kind, and your Missionaries thank God that they are permitted to labor among them. Members, 189.

ORMSTOWN.

We are grateful to God that at the close of our third year all our appointments are in a healthy prosperous condition. Our last Quarterly Meeting was a season of peculiar interest, when many present could say, "Master, it is good for us to be here." And though in consequence of emigration we have lost some of our members, still we report a small increase. The Sabbath-school in the village has been increasing both in numbers and in interest. The addition of a good library, together with the faithful teaching of our own Catechism, have been productive of much good. There are other Sabbath-schools on the Mission, with which our people are identified as teachers, and our Catechism taught to the children of our own people, but we cannot report them as Wesleyan schools. LACHUTE.

The past year has been one of difficulty for this Mission. This arose from the almost entire failure of the crops, and an unusually severe winter—almost one continued storm. By proper efforts, however, the other financial matters were brought to their usual standard. The attendance on public worship was very satisfactory, as was also the attention to the Word. As some of the members appear to be more spiritually minded, we indulge in the hope that a revival of the work of God may not be far distant. Some, that the Mission could ill spare, were removed during the year by death: one of these, Mrs. Lockie, of St. Andrews, in acknowledgment of her indebtedness to Methodism, left \$1,000 to the Superannuated Preachers' Fund. NORTH GORE.

Our people are loyal Methodists and devoted Christians. They evidently enjoy religion, and our Quarterly Love-feasts have increased in interest and profit during the three years we have labored among them. The class-meetings are well attended by most of the members. At our public service the congregations are good, attentive, and devout. We have held special services at some of the appointments, and we have had some conversions as remarkable as they were sincere and true. The greater part of those admitted on trial last year have been received into full connection with the Church, and are doing well. But we have lost several members: by removal, 12, and by death 1, so that we cannot report any increase of membership.

We are pleased to be able to report, in reference to this Mission, that the Connexional Funds have been as well sustained as last year. The debt on the parsonage has been cancelled, and we have \$700 subscribed towards the erection of a new Church at the head of the Mission. It is expected that when the subscription list is again circulated it will reach \$1,000. At West Gore appointment, the school-house, in which we hold our public service, is to be replaced by a new brick one during the ensuing summer. Members, 116.

NEW GLASGOW.

We have enjoyed uninterrupted harmony and some measure of success, rejoiced over the conversions of sinners and the progress of believers; and bowed in submission to the will of God in the peaceful and triumphant death of two of our old Wesleyville members. Mr. Davis and wife were converted to God under the preaching of the evangelical Ouseley, in Ireland; they both maintained their attachment to the Wesleyan Church upwards of fifty years, and last winter were called to their reward.

Having only two Sabbath appointments on the Mission, I felt anxious if possible to extend its boundaries. No opportunity of doing so offered till recently, when, by the removal of the Church of England minister, an opening occurred in the township of Kilkenny, lying north of New Glasgow, where I have led, during the last winter, two interesting congregations. Notwithstanding the embarrassed circumstances of many of our members, arising from the failure of their crops, and the unusual length of the winter, the finances of the Mission have been maintained on an equality with previous years. The class-meetings have been well attended; and the balance of a debt remaining on the parsonage paid off. Members in Society, 66.

SHAWBRIDGE.

Our labors have not been without fruits. In the early part of the year we could not engage in special efforts for a revival, in consequence of being wholly taken up with the parsonage, the lower story of which has been completed, except painting. Also, the property has been properly deeded to the Connexion. About the first of December, a revival meeting was begun at Pleasant Valley appointment; several manifested a desire to "flee from the wrath to come," but the severe storms compelled us to close at the end of one week. POINT LEVI.

The work performed has consisted of tract distribution; visits to vessels in port, and to the military hospitals and encampments; leading a Class composed of soldiers, civilians, and seamen; and preaching both at the camp of the Royal Engineers and in the village of Levis. As the forts now in erection are to be completed this season, a large increase of military laborers may be expected. The village itself is rapidly improving in population and material. Financially, this Mission would be self-sustaining did the military authorities pay Wesleyan Ministers for chaplaincy services. In this respect, a marked and unjust distinction is made in favor of the Scottish, Episcopalian, and Roman Catholic Churches. The field, however, is one of true Missionary labor, and requires the appointment at the ensuing Conference of a judicious laborer, as upon his prudence and sagacity will depend, in a great degree, the erection of a Church, for which the way is now gradually opening.

THREE RIVERS.

DANVILLE.

NEW IRELAND.

This field of labor has for a considerable time been Missionary ground. But nevertheless, like Old Ireland, it has been doing good, in sending many of its members to help in building up other Circuits and Missions in Upper Canada and the United States of America. In connection with special services held on the Mission during the year, more than a score of precious souls have been converted to God, Fourteen of these have united with the Wesleyan Methodist Church. Most of them are heads of families, and promise to become valuable members of the Society. Some improvements have been made. Our new Church in Inverness has been inclosed and plastered during the past year. We have commenced a Sabbath-school in the village. In the country our people are very much scattered, and it is very difficult to establish Sabbath-schools. DURHAM, P. Q.

I think on the whole we have abundant reason to bless God, for the past year has been peaceful, harmonious, and successful. We have not as many striking incidents to record as some; but, as a result of the ordinary and of the special means of grace, our work is being consolidated, and the doctrines of the New Testament, as well as the usages of Methodism, are being firmly established in the minds and hearts of the people. Our congregations, usually good, have, on account of the exceeding bad roads of the past winter, occasioned by the unusual depth of snow, been somewhat fluctuating, and thus some of our Connexional interests have suffered; but in the aggregate we are fully up to the figures of last year. We have lost by emigration to the Western States several whole families, members of our congregations, and many of our best young men, whilst many others only await the opportunity of disposing of their property to follow them, so that this Mission is far less able to sustain its interests now than formerly; and which, with the period of scarcity through which our people have just passed, accounts for the increase in the Circuit deficiency. We report 90 members.

PORT NEUF.

This Mission extends over the counties of Port Neuf and Quebec, and is naturally divided into two parts. Bourg Louis and Port Neuf are the principal appointments on one part. The land is unproductive, and farmers have to trade in Quebec, a distance of 35 miles. The day-schools are under the control of the Church of England Minister, and are all closed except one, and it is no benefit to us. The children of our people are growing up without secular instruction. A Sabbath-school was organized in September, and has worked well; I have frequently visited it and questioned the children from the Wesleyan Catechism, and sometimes taught the Bible-class. A few years ago many here were on the "broad way that leadeth to destruction;" but through the instrumentality of Methodism the stony heart has been taken away, and a new heart given, and a new spirit put within them; now they are growing in grace and in the knowledge of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ. METIS.

Midway between Quebec and Gaspé, on the Lower St. Lawrence, this Mission is indeed an oasis in a desert. It is the only Protestant settlement of much importance in a French Roman Catholic population of four hundred miles in extent. The people labor under many disadvantages in addition to that of isolation; they are few and poor, with generally large families; summer is short—winter long and severe. And yet there is progress. They have a commodious Church, left free from debt by my predecessor, Mr. Maudsley, their first Methodist Missionary. The attendance is regular and punctual; the department, most exemplary. The Sabbath-school, numbering about seventy scholars, is a wonder, even to Westerners. It is kept up the year round.

Financially, the year has been one of success seldom surpassed. Nearly every adult of the congregation and some of the children have given, not of their "increase" only, but in some cases their all. Every subscription has been paid in full. Said a sister, on the eve of my leaving them, "I like my preacher best when I pay him." This liberality to their Missionary, has in no wise hurt the Connexional Collections, introduced among them this year for the first time; but, rather helped them, by the already awakened liberality with which they responded. The children, with their Missionary cards, have made a good beginning,—four having gathered nearly twenty dollars. The people often express their gratitude to God for putting it in the hearts of the Committee to send them a man to look after their welfare. We owe much, also, to the distant laity, especially Mr. J. A. Mathewson, of Montreal. He is indeed a Connexional man,—bears a balanced yoke—"begins at Jerusalem," and continues on to the "utmost parts."

GASPE.

The prejudices against us on many parts of the Mission were strong at the commencement, but these prejudices are everywhere giving way, and our beloved Methodism is no longer looked upon as an exotic that can take no permanent root in its soil. I believe our Methodist economy is adapted to all nations and climes—to every cast and form and grade of society—and to every style and characteristic of mind; but I believe it has a peculiar adaptation to the scattered fishing communities of Gaspé; and they are beginning to understand that better every day. There are now not less than 500 Protestant people who listen regularly to our ministry on the coast. The partial failure of the fisheries for the past few years has left our people very poor, and many have left the coast. Some are in Port Hope, some in Cobourg, some in Carlisle on the Waterdown Circuit, and some have gone off to the West; and I believe wherever they are they will enrich and be a credit to Methodism. We have been going on during the year with Church building. At Gaspé Basin, the head quarters of the Mission, we are building a nice Church, 30 x 50, Gothic style. We have expended about \$1000 upon it. It will cost \$1,500 or \$1,600. We are leaving a clean sheet for our successor to continue the work. As far as my own labors are concerned, I think I have labored about to the extent of my mental and physical ability during the year. And I know I have had in my labors not a small measure of that strength which God supplies through His eternal Son. And I have many reasons for thinking that my labors have not been in vain in the Lord.

I will copy a part of a letter from the Rev. Mr. Ker, an English Church Clergyman stationed at Sandy Beach, three miles from Gaspé Basin, which I received just on the eve of my departure. He says:—

"REV. AND DEAR SIR,—I had heard that you were contemplating leaving Gaspé. It is a field on which you have bestowed much labor, and I doubt not but that the fruits of that labor will be seen and felt through all succeeding ages.

We cannot preach Christ in sincerity and truth without some fruit following; and though to some it is the savour of death unto death, and will leave them speechless in the day of Jesus Christ; yet to others it is the savour of life unto life, and they will bless God for the word of His grace through all the ages of eternity. Well may the Apostle say, 'who is sufficient for these things?' How solemn the thought that the word cannot be preached without consequences thus stretching out into eternity! You have great cause for thankfulness that you have had strength to labor, and greater cause for thankfulness that you have the will to devote that labor to the cause of Christ. Were I inclined to envy any one, it would be he who is strong to work for the blessed Master; but the Lord will be served 'of that which a man hath, and not of that which he hath not.' My feebleness has been increasing every winter for some years past, whereunto it may grow, I know not, but I am in the Lord's hands, let Him do with me as seemeth Him good; yet such as I am, I trust that my feeble efforts for the glory of His name, and the good of souls have not been entirely in vain, the day of accounts will show. I should be glad to see you before you set out, and to wish you 'God's speed;' but whether I have that pleasure or not, believe me that I heartily desire your prosperity and happiness, both temporally and spiritually. I know you must be very busy now in packing for a move. Well, may the Lord be with you and bless you and yours, and grant that wherever He leads you you may go in the fulness of the blessings of the gospel of peace. All my family desire to be kindly remembered to you and Mrs. Tallman."

These are supplied with the ordinary means of grace by 186 Missionaries, whose time is wholly occupied in the varied duties of a Missionary pastorate. To the smaller bands of Indians in the vicinity of a Circuit or Domestic Mission, the Committee remunerate 6 Ministers for a supply of the regular ordinances. On the Indian Missions there are 15 Interpreters, 16 Day-schools, and 16 Teachers; making a total paid agency of 223, beside a number acting under the direction of Chairmen of Districts on the Domestic Missions. The whole are assisted by Local Preachers, Exhorters, Leaders, Sabbath-school Superintendents, and Teachers, who render valuable gratuitous aid in carrying on the work of God on all the Stations occupied by the Society. There is also an Industrial School at Muncey, in vigorous and successful operation.

The Membership embraces 2,113 Indians, 237 Germans, 53 French, 14,497 on the Domestic Missions, 35 in Red River and the Saskatchewan, and 156 in British Columbia,—making a total of 17,091 in Church fellowship.

CONCLUSION.

HINDRANCES to the Society's operations are very few and unimportant; but their calls to the destitute are loud and affecting. The Committee rejoice that the Domestic Missions especially have yielded their share of members, which has swelled the increase of the Church, as reported to the last Conference. This ingathering of the fruits on earth, and the harvesting of the ripe and prepared membership from the Church below to the Church in heaven, are stimulating records to continued labor, and to continued consecration of means and time to the Church's glorious object,—The world for Christ, as Christ has given himself for the world! Happy in the remembrance and testimony of the past, which loftily rears its monument of fidelity to Christ's cause in the abounding liberality of His people, the Committee purpose prosecuting their work of maintenance and enlargement of the Missionary boundaries of the Wesleyan Church, feeling assured of the people's prayers for success, and also depending upon the people's gifts to the Lord's treasury, to assist in the coming of His kingdom, and the universality of His reign and dominion! "And in that day shall ye say, Praise the Lord, call upon his name, declare his doings among the people, make mention that his name is exalted. Sing unto the Lord; for he hath done excellent things: this is known in all the earth. Cry out and shout, thou inhabitant of Zion: for great is the Holy One of Israel in the midst of thee."—Isa. xii. 4-6.


