## WILSON SAYS NO!

## Germany's Peace Offer Refused Armistice Cannot Be Considered

Ind War Must Continue Until Germany Surrenders Unconditionally -Turkey's Note at Washington---Allies Begin New Attack in Flanders

WASHINGTON, D.C., Oct. 14.
President Wilson to-day answered Germany's peace th a German Government controiled by a military auith a German Gornment controiled by a military au-
cracy and no thought of an armistice while German rocities continué on land and sea. President Wilson toinformed Germaniy that the orly condition upon which armistice could be granted is that atrocities on land and a must cease. He also gave notice that autocracy must before peace can come. sea, and not the ships alone but the very boats in which safety, and in their forced withdrawal from Flanders to rom France the German armies are pursuing a course of anton destruction, which has always been regarded as direct violation of the rules and practices of civilized arfare. Cities and villages are being destroyed and stripped of all they contain, not only that but often their very finhabitants. The nations associated against Germany cannot be expected to agree to a cessation of arms while acts of inhumanity, spoilation and desolation are being continued which they justly look upon with horror and with burning hearts. It is necessary also in order that here may be no possibility of misunderstanding that the resident, should very solemnly call the attention of the overnment of Germany to the language and plain intent one of the terms of peace which the German Govern ment has now accepted. It is contained in the address of he President, delivered at Mount Vernon on the fourth f July last. It is as follows: "The destruction of every arbitrary power anywhere that can separately, secretly and of its single choice, destroy the peace of the world, or f it cannot be presently, destroyed, at least its reduction virtual impotence.
