TREE GROWING FOR CALGARY AND DISTRICT

Mr. A. Mitchell Begins Work On Demonstration At Victoria Park

VERY IMPORTANT TO CALGARY AT THIS TIME

Manager Richardson Secures Important Incentive For This City

After working for three years Manager Richardson of the exhibition has secured the first government demonstration of tree planting and tree growing for the city of Calgary. The demonstration, which will be a permanent one, will do much to beautify Victoria park and greatly increase the value of those grounds. Archibald Mitchell, of the tree planting division of the forestry branch of the Dominion government, with headquarters at Indian Head, will have charge of the demonstration and establish, which will be one of the most important government works of this nature in Canada. Mr. Mitchell arrived in the city Saturday and will commence operations at once. The demonstration takes the form of tree planting, from seeds and cuts and the growing of saplings for the benefit of the public in general that they may beautify their homes and cities. The seeding of these trees will be carried on every year, and when the trees are sufficiently matured they will be transplanted and when sufficiently grown will be turned over to the city to be used in the various public parks. The demonstration also

gives the public an idea of the best trees to grow in this country and how to arrange the different varieties together to get the greatest effect and ensure the soundest growth. Mr. Mitchell has prepared plans of the work to be done on the exhibit at Victoria park, and when completed it will make a wonderful change in the appearance of Calgary's playground. On the large patch of ground south of the industrial building there will be laid out a small park site, trees being planted for ornamental purposes, and some being put in on the ordinary farm planting basis. The shrub work through this plot will be in the most modern style of growing arrangements, the hardest shrubs and flowers for the west being used. Another large site will be planted immediately in front of the main entrance gates. The east part and the north boundary will consist of specimen plots such as are used in shelter belts on farms. The middle part of the plot will consist of spruce, pine, maples and caragana, the idea being to show the value of mixing different varieties of trees. The front portion, facing the entrance, will be of seed beds of tamarack, white spruce, lodge pole pine, jack pine, and scots pine, also transplant beds of colorado spruce, white pine, jack and scots pine. The evergreen seed beds which will be placed in this section will be shaded by lath screens and then more seed beds of maple and ash will be laid, as well as cutting beds of Russian poplar and willows. On the south side of the plot, bordering on 10th driveway, sixty-four colorado spruce will be planted three feet apart. In all some 7,000 trees will be planted exclusive of the seed beds. The department which Mr. Mitchell represents has just completed shipment of 2 1/2 million trees from Indian Head, sufficient to plant seven hundred acres of solid woods and these will be distributed to over 2,000 farmers all over the three prairie provinces. The department has this year shipped out 62,000 evergreen trees, and it is the first time that a general distribution has been made in the three provinces.

AMERICA'S TRIBUTE TO THE LATE KING

Noble, Eloquent Words to Queen Alexandra From the President of the United States.

Washington, D. C., May 7.—President Taft, upon learning of the death of King Edward, wrote the following message of condolence to Queen Alexandra, which was cabled to Buckingham Palace tonight: "On the sad occasion of the death of King Edward, I offer to your Majesty, and to your son, his illustrious successor, the most profound sympathy of the people of the government of the United States, whose hearts go out to their British kinsmen, in their national bereavement. To this add the expression to your Majesty and to the new King of my personal sympathy and of my appreciation of those high qualities which made the late King so potent and influential towards peace and justice among the nations."

REGINA REJECTS THE CORPORATION

By a Vote of Two to One Declines to Give a Franchise For Street Railway.

Regina, May 7.—A proposition to grant a street car franchise for twenty years to J. W. De O'Grady, of Winnipeg and New York capitalists was turned down today by the ratepayers by a vote of over two to one. As a result of the vote, the city will probably proceed at an early date with the building of a municipally owned street car system. The issue was fought out on the principle of the franchise against municipal cars and the council will consider the vote a mandate to proceed with a municipal plant. The by-law required a two-thirds vote to carry and instead of that it was defeated by 371 to 185. Not one of the five wards gave majorities for the franchise. Seven other bylaws, for amounts totaling \$484,500, were carried by large majorities. A bylaw for trunk sewer scheme, costing \$280,000, was carried by a vote of 504 to 28; a bylaw voting \$10,000 for cement sidewalks carried by 425 to 48; a bylaw for street improvements to value of \$115,000, carried by 481 to 45; a bylaw providing \$18,000 for an isolation hospital, carried by 501 to 40; a bylaw providing \$25,000 to complete new general hospital, which has already cost \$102,000, carried by 516 to 29; a bylaw providing \$26,000 to pay off balance of debt on collegiate institute, carried by 519 to 27; a bylaw granting \$10,000 to build children's shelter, received the most opposition of any of the money votes, there being 481 against and 60 for it.

CAT CARRIES KITTEN 40 MILES

Mother Goes Back After Offspring, Abandoned When Family Moved to Another City.

Waterville, Me., May 8.—Eighty miles in two days and two nights, half the distance covered while carrying a four weeks' old kitten, is the world's record for lady cats, set by an athletic tabby belonging to Mrs. Ann Grant of Waterville. Careful search of the records shows that several gentlemen cats have bettered this time for the distance and that some who have been overcome by the wanderlust have walked even farther, but these feline Westons carried no weight and their training was not done in a box a foot long. The Grants moved from Stetson to Waterville, forty miles away. Not long after they had settled in their new home here, after arguing in vain to have her baby taken with her, the mother cat was taken with her. When the family arrived here it was dark, but the cat, as soon as it could escape from the house, started for Stetson. Two weeks later it walked into the house in Waterville with the kitten in its mouth.

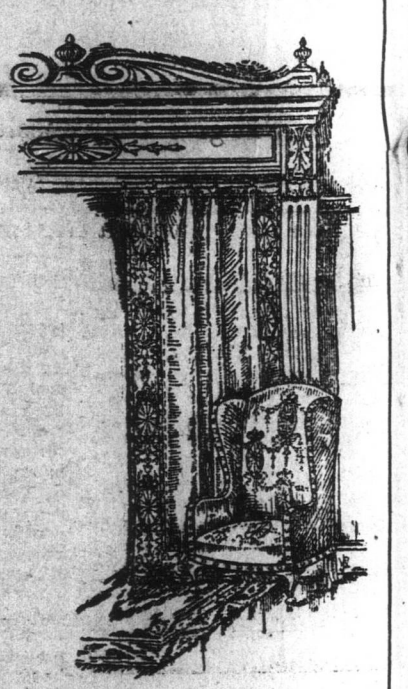

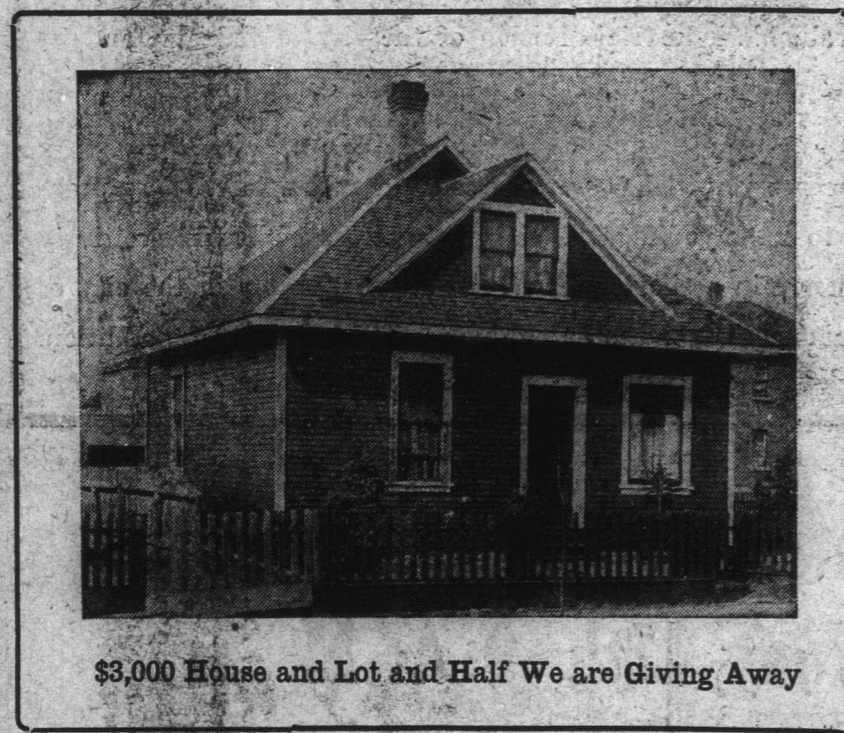

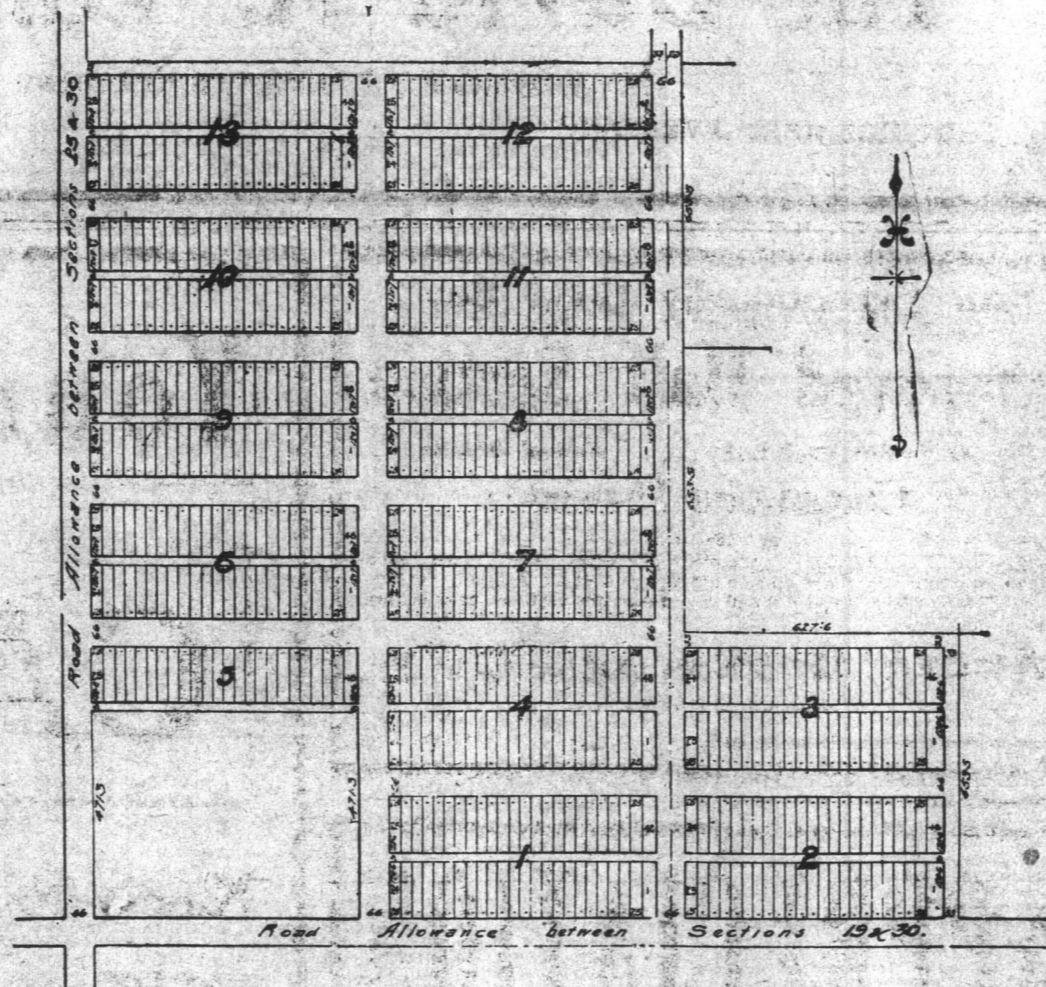
BIRDSEYE VIEW OF CALGARY SHOWING LOCATION OF "THE BRONX"

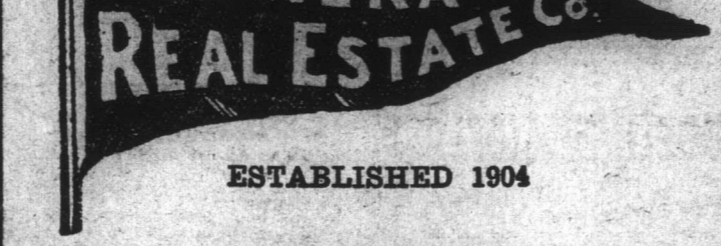

RAILWAYS PLANNED THROUGH SOUTH B.C.

Mon. Thomas Taylor is Looking Over a Trunk Road in Which Alberta is Interested. Nelson, May 7.—Hon. Thomas Taylor, minister of public works, arrived Monday evening from the coast, meeting here J. H. Schofield, M.L.A. for Ymir and spent yesterday in visiting various parts of the coast. He left this morning on the Crow boat. "My visit," said Mr. Taylor, "is in connection with the trunk road through the southern portion of the province. When completed it will extend from Vancouver to the Crow's Nest on the Alberta boundary, a distance of 750 miles. The most difficult section is that over Hope Mountain, and for the ascent to the summit we have decided to make use of the old Sappers' and Miners' road, a very fine highway. When the present on this side is made, we will connect with the existing road, which goes clear through to Rossland. "At Trail it will be necessary to construct a bridge across the Columbia. At or near Creston, on the Crow, the Kootenay river, will also have to be bridged, in addition to giving access east and west. I hope to see this trunk road give the governments of the states to the south by connecting at the border with their trunk roads. Although I have not yet taken up the matter of interlocking trunk roads, "One result would be the bringing up of a great tourist automobile travel from these states into British Columbia and the north railway line. The high standard of the government of Alberta is already co-operating by a trunk road in the south to connect with our trunk road, at the boundary in the Pass. "As to the early commencement of railway construction, Mr. Taylor said that while Mackenzie president of the Canadian Northern Railway Company, was expected in Victoria in a few days, and would then make an announcement. "The minister left Victoria about ten days ago, on the present trip, and it was his design to follow the route of the trunk road clearly as possible. He went down to Nicola, intending to enter this country by the Roseland and the high standard in the Nicola River, however, caused the abandonment of that plan and he returned north to the main line, coming on here by the C. P. R. From here he goes to Cranbrook, thence to Creston, thence to Fernie, and further along the Pass, and in each constituency he will be accompanied by the local member. About next Tuesday he will make Nelson again and will go on to the high standard in Grand Forks, Phoenix and Midway. "GROUND OPENS AND SWALLOWS UP CATTLE Startling Occurrence Takes Place in Valley in Nevada Reno, May 7.—Cremasses from two miles west in width and twenty feet in depth, and of great length, have appeared during the past twenty-four hours on the smooth plain of Jake's Valley, twenty-five miles west of Ely. "The cremasses have filled rapidly with water, and the water has been thus far the ranchers in that section have found the carcasses of twenty-eight head of stock. The search is still in progress, and it is not known how many have perished. "It is not believed that any human lives have been lost, but ranchers for miles about were terror-stricken. "Without warning the ground opened up, preceded by rumbling noises and a trembling of the ground. This startling news was sent into Ely from Illipah by Robert Burke, of the government forestry service, it was received by Royal J. Mathias, chief of the service in that district. "Much apprehension is felt among the residents of Jake's Valley, not so much for their personal safety, as for that of the hundreds of head of cattle grazing in that section. "One of the unexplainable mysteries of the strange action of nature is the appearance of water in the cremasses. It is believed here the cremasses are of greater depth than that reported by Forester Burke, and that investigation will show this, and that probably the water is from a subterranean stream. "Searching parties have been organized at Illipah, and efforts are being made to learn whether any lives were lost, and to determine the number of head of stock which was swallowed up. In the meantime the cattle grazing in the valley are being driven to higher ground away from danger. "The disturbance might have been of local nature, for no shock was felt in Ely.
