IMPORT FIGURES: The month of August, 1883, shows an import of cotton goods into Canada to the amount of only \$231,375, as against \$340,144 for the same month in 1882.

Woolens show \$440,775, against \$612,372. Of course one month does not tell the story, but it does seem as if importers were holding up.
