"CAN GET RID OF ONE."
Sensational Evidence in the
St. Thomas Murder Trial.

ALLEGED "FIXING" OF A JURYMEN
If True the Trial Must Begin
Again With a New Jury.

Evidence As to Blood Being on Welter's
Face When He Gave the Alarm—Henderson
Shot Talked of Insuring Some One and
Then "Removing Him"—Attempt to
Exclude the Prisoner's Testimony Given
At the Coroner's Inquest—Henderson
Clearly Connected With the Crime.

St. Thomas, Ont., March 10.—Opinion
here as to the probability of the conviction
of John Henderson and W. D. Welter
has veered around, and it is now
believed that when the case is given to
the jury on Thursday afternoon next
they will bring in a verdict of guilty
against both the accused, after a short
absence. Until the startling evidence of
Saturday afternoon was adduced, the
general opinion was favorable to a dis-
missal. The testimony of the two
witnesses, Henderson and Welter, has
changed materially, however, and the
admission of the evidence and the
court room is pending the con-
cluding authorities.

Deceased Was Struck While Standing.
The first female witness called was
Mrs. Duncan Henderson, sister-in-law
of the prisoner. She washed the outer
undershirts of the dead man two days
after the killing. There was a quantity
of blood on the undershirts, and she
declared that the blood was fresh.

Blood stains were still visible
on them, and were pointed out to
the witness. She stated that the blood
that deceased must have been struck
while standing up. The defence will
try to show that the blood was on the
undershirts after the killing.

Mrs. Emily Mearns, a pleasant-faced
woman, who lives at Ingersoll, and who
affirmed instead of kissing the book, was
given as the witness. She stated that
she was present at the inquest, and
remembered to tell at length of a con-
versation between her husband and John
Henderson. She stated that Henderson
said that he had been struck by a
bullet, and that he had been struck
while standing up.

House May Meet This Month
Opinion at Ottawa Strongly in
Favor of a Session.

Greenway by Procrastination May Throw
Action on the Manitoba Case
Over For a Year—Compensation to
Injured on the Intercolonial—The
Premier's Budget Statement.

Ottawa, March 10.—The impression is
growing that any conclusion the
Government may reach in the Manitoba
case will not be brought before
the Provincial Legislature at its
present session. There is no power by
which the federal authorities can com-
pel Premier Greenway and his colleagues
to act promptly. If they decline, there-
fore, to ask the Legislature to for-
mally pass on any remedial order which
may be made, the question will carry
over for a year as the Dominion Parlia-
ment will not have jurisdiction to act
until the Provincial Legislature has put
itself on record as declining to do any-
thing. Meanwhile, the current of
opinion is strongly in favor of the
holding of a session before dis-
solution, and there are those here
who believe that the Government will
in the range of possibility. Some go
so far as to suggest March 28 for the meet-
ing of the Legislature, and the possibil-
ity of a few days now before the meet-
ing will finally be set at rest.

First: The article was precisely what its makers claimed it to be; it has never changed—no improvement has been found. Used for years—always alike. Second: The public was kept informed about Pearlina. This was necessary. With anything so new and so different from old ideas, people had to be educated.
