

The Big Exhibition at Halifax.

This year the Nova Scotia Provincial Exhibition will open on Wednesday, September 12th, and close on Thursday, September 20th. From the advertisement which appears elsewhere in this issue, it will be seen that the commissioners are offering upwards of \$17,000 in prizes, which is the largest prize list ever offered on Eastern Canada, coming next to Toronto. Increases are noted in the amounts offered for cattle, swine, poultry, dairy products, agricultural products, horticultural department and domestic department. Halifax is the only place in Nova Scotia capable of accommodating a large number of visitors. During the past year a large number of medium sized hotels, as well as many boarding houses, have been opened up, and the lodging houses in connection with the exhibition will be such that everyone is comfortably housed. The Halifax exhibition grounds are the most modern in Eastern Canada. In fact they cannot be excelled this side of Toronto. While the commissioners have placed a large amount of money here, in order to stimulate the various agricultural and industrial industries and thus secure a splendid exhibition from farm, forest, fisheries and mine, they have also given attention to what is termed the special attractions. This year the leading feature will be the battle of Passburg. Every man, woman and child in Nova Scotia has heard of this famous battle in which the British troops defeated the Boer forces in 1897. It was a battle which is being re-enacted in the most wonderful manner, and is expected a number of the Nova Scotians who took part in the famous fight will be present on the 12th of September. It will be put on by Hand & Tyle, of Hamilton, Ontario, who was on the Boer side of the battle in 1897, and who was pronounced to be the best re-enactor of the battle of Passburg. There will be two programmes of attractions each day—afternoon and evening. The afternoon programme is now arranged for specialities of a high order. The fireworks will display this year will eclipse any previous effort. There will be four days horse racing, the handsome purse \$10,000, and the race will be the very best horse race to take part. The government has expended \$100,000 on horses for the purpose of improving the stock of the province. Some of the horses were purchased in Upper Canada and the remainder in Scotland. Some of the latter were prize winners at the Royal Agricultural Show at York, England. They comprise bloods, coaches, hackneys and clydes, and will be on exhibition at the fair grounds, where they will be sold by auction. The exhibition manager claims that exhibits will be carried to and from the show practically free on the railways.

Wood, the manager and secretary at Halifax, will supply prizes, speed programmes and all information desired. NEWS OF THE WORLD. In the Irish Channel last Saturday, during a heavy fog the Cunard line steaming company, on route for Liverpool from New York, struck the Liverpool rock. The ship was bound for New Zealand. The exhibition sank immediately. Seven of the crew were killed and the other 11 members of the ship's company, including the captain, were drowned. Since the Welland canal dynamic outrigger a coast watch has been put on all canals. The force on the Cornwall canal has been strengthened by the addition of 30 special constables in anticipation of trouble. Mount Ararat, near Banda Inn, Japan, which was the scene of a volcanic disaster in 1888, broke into eruption on Tuesday July 17. Two hundred persons were killed or injured. Several villages were engulfed by the streams of lava from Mount Ararat, and great damage was done to adjacent districts. The Arctic exploring steamer Windward sailed last Thursday for the north, and the winter quarters of Lieut. Peary. A Newfoundland cable is in charge. Mr. Peary's trip to the North Pole is the first of his kind. The Windward is provisioned for two years. It is officially announced that last week in the Philippines two hundred insurgents were killed, and one hundred and thirty were taken. Several Americans were killed and wounded. In a collision last Sunday outside of Belfast, Lond. between the British passenger steamers Bromyard and Alligator five passengers were killed and upwards of fifty were seriously injured. An advance in the price of iron due to the Chinese difficulties, is already felt in the wholesale market. Dealers in raw materials are adjusting accordingly. There are at present several grades of iron that have advanced in price from one to two cents a pound. It is a great deal more to import than it did last year. Portions of the State of Texas have been visited by a series of waterpockets that have done terrible damage; and three hundred families are reported to be missing. The Fair exhibition has been pronounced by the best authorities, "a complete financial failure." The profits of the fair and the French outbreak against England, as well as other things, have contributed towards this result. At the meeting of the National Rifle Association at Halifax last Friday, the Rogers cup (seven shots at 200, 500 and 600 yards) was won by the amateur coach with 725. Canada was third with 710. The Prohibitionists in Winnipeg have appointed Sunday, Aug. 12th, a day of abstinence in thanksgiving for the Prohibition Act. A Steamship Amalgamation. After five months of work, New York people have completed an amalgamation of steamship companies. The new corporation is the Manhattan Steamship Company, and has been incorporated under the laws of Delaware. It comprises the New York and Portland Line for Portland, Me.; New York and Bangor Line for Bangor, Me.; Canadian, Belfast, Bangor and Bangor; Me.; New York and Halifax line for Halifax, N. S.; Cape Breton and Prince Edward Island; New York and Cottage City for Cottage City, Mass.; New York and St. John for St. John, N. B.; Eastport and Cuba line, and John N. E. It will have 50 to 100 passenger vessels of the line and will be operated by the management on each steamer. The capitalization is \$800,000, per cent, common stock is shares of \$100. Mr. Richard Morris has been elected president; United States Treasurer James S. Huston, treasurer. Our New Lieutenant Governor. Morning Chronicle, July 20th. It is expected that Hon. A. G. Jones will receive his commission as Lieutenant Governor of Nova Scotia next week, and will be sworn into office on Wednesday, Aug. 1. As Government House has to be renovated and painted, the new Governor will not take up residence there until the autumn. Matthew B. Daly's tenure of office expires on July 25th, on which date, accompanied by Lady Daly and Miss Daly, he will leave for Chester, where he will spend the summer. They will spend the winter in England. On Wednesday evening the Lieut. Governor gave a farewell dinner at Government House. French Ardian Convention. Mr. A. T. LeBlanc, travelling passenger agent of the International, has been among the French of Digby and Yarmouth counties working up an interest in the great French Ardian convention, which opens at Arras, August 15th. This gathering occurs every ten years, and the next one, it is believed, will be the largest in its history. Two hundred delegates are expected from the United States, fifteen hundred from the Maritime Provinces, and a high thousand from Upper Canada. Sir Wilfrid Laurier will attend the convention and afterwards address two or three meetings in Nova Scotia. The Late Sir John Thompson. At the Halifax county court house last Wednesday afternoon a life-size bronze bust of the late Sir John S. D. Thompson, the great executive statesman, was unveiled by Governor Sir Malcolmy Daly who made an appropriate and eulogistic address. Speeches were also made by Chief Justice Macdonald, Archbishop O'Brien, Attorney General Langley and R. L. Borden. The bust stands in a conspicuous place in one of the halls of the county house, and shows the late premier quite as a Canadian in Paris, and stands on an ornate and marble pedestal. Kentuckians Coming to Canada. Ottawa, July 19.—Mr. Edgus, Canadian Immigration Agent, is here in company with four Kentuckian farmers from Kentucky, as representatives of a large German colony who are on the way to the North-West to erect homesteads, and should they return favorably thereupon, a party of sixty will migrate from Kentucky.

THE CHINESE SITUATION.

China Defeated by Russian Troops. The Russians, according to the news from St. Petersburg, have completely defeated the Chinese and have occupied Manchuria with a large force. Since Cribb (not Gribb) chief of state in Port Arthur, has taken over the supreme command in Manchuria, reinforcements have been sent, and the general situation has been greatly improved. The Chinese minister of the interior has issued a notice that the Siberian railway is closed to traffic in the north. The Russian authorities were not prepared for such an event, and they have taken brisk measures and they believe that China will soon be too much preoccupied around Peking to conduct serious operations in the north.

China Makes War on Russia. London, July 20.—The Daily Mail publishes a dispatch from St. Petersburg, dated July 19th, which asserts that there is no doubt that China has declared war against Russia. The Russian press, says the correspondent, is restricted to the publication of official despatches, and the publication of anything from the front has been prohibited. I hear, however, from a reliable source, that a Russian transport laden with munitions, arms and other supplies, was captured by the Boers on the Russian frontier, killing almost the whole crew.
