FIRST SEDERUNT.

At Montreal, and within the Victoria Hall there ; Tuesday, the fifteenth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-five years :—

Which day the General Assembly of the Canada Presbyterian Church, the Synod of the Presbyterian Church of Canada in connection with the Church of Scotland, the Synod of the Presbyterian Church of the Lower Provinces, and the Synod of the Presbyterian Church of the Maritime Provinces in connection with the Church of Scotland, met according to appointment for the purpose of consummating the union of their respective Churches.

The Rev. George M. Grant, M. A., Moderator of the Synod of the Presbyterian Church of the Maritime Provinces in connection with the Church of Scotland, gave out the hundredth psalm, which was sung. The Rev. Principal Snodgrass, D. D., Moderator of the Synod of the Presbyterian Church of Canada in connection with the Church of Scotland, read appropriate passages of Scripture, and the Rev. Principal Caven, D.D., Moderator of the General Assembly the Canada Presbyterian Church, engaged in prayer.

The minute, adopted by each Synod, agreeing to the consummation of union and instructing its Moderator to sign the articles of union, was read by the Clerks of the respective Supreme Courts in succession. This minute in the case of the Canada Presbyterian Church, dated this, the fifteenth day of June, is as follows :—

The General Assembly of the Canada Presbyterian Church, at its meeting in the month of November last year, having, after taking the necessary constitutional means for ascertaining the mind of the Church on the subject, resolved to unite with the Presbyterian Church of Canada in connection with the Church of Scotland, the Presbyterian Church of the Lower Provinces, and the Presbyterian Church of the Maritime Pro-

vinces in connection with the Church of Scotland, on the ground of the articles of union agreed upon by the Supreme Courts of the negotiating Churches; and having, by the help of God, completed all preliminary arrangements, does now—whilst recounting with fervent gratitude all the goodness and mercy vouchsafed to this Church in the past—humbly trusting that the Divine sanction will be given to the solemn and important step about to be taken—and earnestly praying that the Holy Spirit in all His quickening and sanctifying influences may descend largely on the united Church—RESOLVE, and hereby does record its resolution, to repair forthwith as a constituted Assembly to the VICTORIA HALL, the appointed place of meeting, for the purpose of consummating the Union with the aforesaid Churches, and of forming one General Assembly, to be designated and known as The General Assembly of the Presbyterian Church in Canada,—and does at the same time declare that the united Church shall be considered identical with the Canada Presbyterian Church, and shall possess the same authority, rights, privileges, and benefits to which this Church is now entitled.—And further, with the view of ratifying the act of Union, the General Assembly does empower its Moderator to sign in its name the Preamble and Basis of Union, and also the Resolutions adopted in connection therewith.

The Minute, adopted by the Synod of the Presbyterian Church of the Lower Provinces and the Synod of the Presbyterian Church of the Maritime Provinces in connection with the Church of Scotland, is of the same date, and couched in the same terms, the names of the Churches being simply transposed. That, adopted by the Synod of the Presbyterian Church of Canada in connection with the Church of Scotland, is dated Monday, the fourteenth day of June, and varies from the foregoing only in the following particulars, in addition to the transposition of names, viz :—Instead of the words “to repair forthwith as a constituted Assembly,” insert “to repair on the adjournment of the Court to-morrow morning.” Also, after the words “and benefits to which this Church is now entitled,” add “excepting such as have been reserved by Acts of Parliament.”

The Preamble, Basis and accompanying Resolutions, which form the Articles of Union, were read by the Rev. William Reid, M. A., one of the Joint Clerks of the General Assembly of the Canada Presbyterian Church. These are as follow:—

PREAMBLE.

The Presbyterian Church of Canada in connection with the Church of Scotland, the Canada Presbyterian Church, the Presbyterian Church of the Lower Provinces, and the Presbyterian Church of the Maritime Provinces in connection with the Church of Scotland, holding the same doctrine, government and discipline, believing that it would be for the glory of God and the advancement of the cause of Christ, that they should unite and thus form one Presbyterian Church in the Dominion, to be called the “Presbyterian Church in Canada,” independent of all other Churches in its jurisdiction, and under authority to Christ alone, the Head of His Church, and Head over all things to the Church, agree to unite on the following Basis, to be subscribed by the Moderators of the respective Churches in their name and in their behalf.

BASIS.

1. The Scriptures of the Old and New Testaments, being the Word of God, are the only infallible rule of faith and manners.

2. The Westminster Confession of Faith shall form the subordinate standard of this Church; the Larger and Shorter Catechisms shall be adopted by the Church, and appointed to be used for the instruction of the people; it being distinctly understood that nothing contained in the aforesaid Confession or Catechisms, regarding the power and duty of the Civil Magistrate, shall be held to sanction any principles or views inconsistent with full liberty of conscience in matters of religion.

3. The government and worship of this Church shall be in accordance with the recognized principles and practice of Presbyterian Churches, as laid down generally in the "Form of Presbyterian Church Government" and in "The Directory for the Public Worship of God."

ACCOMPANYING RESOLUTIONS.

RELATIONS TO OTHER CHURCHES.

1. This Church cherishes Christian affection towards the whole Church of God, and desires to hold fraternal intercourse with it in its several branches, as opportunity offers.

2. This Church shall, under such terms and regulations as may from time to time be agreed on, receive Ministers and Probationers from other Churches, and especially from Churches holding the same doctrine, government and discipline with itself.

MODES OF WORSHIP.

With regard to modes of Worship, the practice presently followed by Congregations shall be allowed, and further action in connection therewith shall be left to the legislation of the united Church.

FUND FOR WIDOWS AND ORPHANS OF MINISTERS.

Steps shall be taken, at the first meeting of the General Assembly of the united Church, for the equitable establishment and administration of an efficient Fund for the benefit of the Widows and Orphans of Ministers.

COLLEGIATE INSTITUTIONS.

The aforesaid Churches shall enter into union with the Theological and Literary Institutions which they now have; and application shall be made to Parliament for such legislation as shall bring Queen's University and College, Knox College, the Presbyterian College, Montreal, Morrin College, and the Theological Hall at Halifax, into relations to the United Church similar to those which they now hold to their respective Churches, and to preserve their corporate existence, government and functions, on terms and conditions like to those under which they now exist; but the united Church shall not be required to elect Trustees for an Arts' Department in any of the Colleges above named.

LEGISLATION WITH REGARD TO RIGHTS OF PROPERTY.

Such legislation shall be sought as shall preserve undisturbed all rights of property now belonging to congregations and corporate bodies, and, at the same

time, not interfere with freedom of action on the part of congregations in the same locality desirous of uniting, or on the part of corporate bodies which may find it to be expedient to discontinue, wholly or partially, their separate existence.

HOME AND FOREIGN MISSIONARY OPERATIONS.

The united Church shall heartily take up and prosecute the Home and Foreign Missionary and Benevolent operations of the several Churches, according to their respective claims; and with regard to the practical work of the Church and the promotion of its Schemes, whilst the General Assembly shall have the supervision and control of all the work of the Church, yet the united Church shall have due regard to such arrangements, through Synods and Local Committees, as shall tend most effectually to unite in Christian love and sympathy the different sections of the Church, and at the same time to draw forth the resources and energies of the people in behalf of the work of Christ in the Dominion and throughout the world.

GOVERNMENT GRANTS TO DENOMINATIONAL COLLEGES.

In the united Church the fullest forbearance shall be allowed as to any difference of opinion which may exist respecting the question of State grants to Educational Establishments of a Denominational character

These Articles of Union were then subscribed, in the name and by the appointment of the Supreme Courts of the several Churches entering into union, by their respective Moderators. Whereupon the Rev. P. G. McGregor, Moderator of the Synod of the Presbyterian Church of the Lower Provinces, solemnly declared as follows:—

The Moderators of the Synod of the Presbyterian Church of Canada in connection with the Church of Scotland, of the General Assembly of the Canada Presbyterian Church, of the Synod of the Presbyterian Church of the Lower Provinces and of the Synod of the Presbyterian Church of the Maritime Provinces in connection with the Church of Scotland, having signed the terms of Union in name of their respective Churches, I declare that these Churches are now united and do form one Church, to be designated and known as the "Presbyterian Church in Canada."

The Moderators of the four Courts gave each other the right hand of fellowship, after which Psalm cxxxiii was sung.

The General Assembly of the united Church was then constituted with prayer by the Rev. P. G. McGregor.

The rolls of the Supreme Courts of the four Churches were read by the Clerks of the respective Courts, and these were declared to constitute the Roll of the First General Assembly of the Presbyterian Church in Canada.

ELECTION OF MODERATOR.

It was moved by Dr. Taylor, seconded by Dr. Bayne and carried by acclamation, that the Rev. John Cook, D.D., Minister of St. Andrew's Church, Quebec, be Moderator of this Assembly for the current year. Dr. Cook was conducted to the chair, thanked the House for the honour thus conferred, and addressed the Assembly in suitable terms.

Principal Caven produced and read a telegraphic despatch which had been received from the General Assembly of the Presbyterian Church in Ireland, congratulating this Church on the auspicious union which had now been consummated.

ELECTION OF INTERIM CLERKS.

It was moved by Dr. Topp, seconded by Dr. Jenkins and passed unanimously, that the Clerks of the several Supreme Courts, which have merged into and constitute this Court, be *interim* Clerks of this Assembly.

COMMITTEE ON BUSINESS.

The Moderator nominated a Committee to prepare the business for to-morrow, composed of the following members, viz : the Moderators of the hitherto existing Supreme Courts who have just retired from office, the Clerks, the Conveners of the late Committees on Union of the several Churches, Dr. Jenkins and Dr. McVicar; Dr. Topp, Convener.

It was agreed to hold the future sederunts of this Assembly in Erskine Church.

An invitation to a social entertainment to be given this evening in this place by the Members of the Church in Montreal, for the purpose of celebrating the consummation of Union, was accepted.

It was unanimously resolved to hold a diet of prayer this afternoon at four o'clock in St. Paul's Church.

The Assembly adjourned to meet in Erskine Church to-morrow morning at eleven o'clock, of which public intimation was made, and this Sederunt was closed with praise and prayer.

In accordance with the resolution of the Assembly, a Diet of Prayer was held in St. Paul's Church at four o'clock, p.m. The Moderator presided. Devotional services were engaged in. Judge Blanchard, Mr. John McKinnon, Dr. Ormiston of New York, Professor Mowat and Dr. Burns led the Assembly in prayer. The meeting was closed with the Benediction.

SECOND SEDERUNT.

At Montreal, and within Erskine Church there ; Wednesday, the sixteenth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and seventy five years :

Which day the General Assembly of the Presbyterian Church in Canada met pursuant to adjournment and, after praise and reading of the Scriptures, was constituted with prayer by the Moderator.

The minutes of the First Sederunt were read and sustained.

REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON BUSINESS.

Dr. Topp, Convener of the Committee on Business, presented a report. The Assembly resolved to consider its recommendations *seriatim*.

It was agreed to adopt the following recommendation :—

That, until rules for regulating the business of the Courts of the Church are adopted, these shall be governed by the well-understood principles and practice of Presbyterian Churches; it being understood that no rule or precedent of any one of the four Churches just united, inconsistent with the principles or practice of any of the other Churches, shall be of binding force, until it has been re-affirmed by the Assembly.

The Assembly agreed to the following hours of meeting for the present Session, viz.:—In the forenoon, from ten o'clock until one; in the afternoon, from three o'clock until six; and in the evening, from eight o'clock until ten or half-past ten, according to the exigencies of business.

The other recommendations of the Committee as to the order in which the several matters of business should come before the House were adopted.

The Assembly re-appointed for the present session the Committee on Business nominated yesterday, with the addition of the following members, viz.:—Dr. Waters, Hon. John McMurrich, Messrs. John L. Morris, Thomas McCrae, James Croil, David McCurdy, Charles Robson, and Dr. Gordon.

REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON RE-ORGANIZATION.

Mr. Moore, Convener of the Committee appointed to prepare a plan for the re-construction of Synods and Presbyteries, presented and read a report. It was, on motion to that effect, resolved to receive this report and proceed to consider its recommendations.

Said report is of the following tenor:—

I.—That it would not be advisable to divide the Lower Provinces into two Synodical districts, and that in the meantime these should be constituted into one Synod, to be called the Synod of the Maritime Provinces. That this Synod be divided into the following Presbyteries:—

1. *Sydney*—To be the same as the present Presbytery of Cape Breton.

2. *Victoria and Richmond*—To be bounded as the present Presbytery of that name.

3. *Pictou*—To include the congregations in the Counties of Antigonish, Guysboro' and Pictou, except those of River John and West Branch River John.

4. *Wallace*—To include the congregations in River John, West Branch River John, Earltown, Tatamagouche, New Amman, Wallace, Pughwash, Goose River, Amherst and Springhill.

5. *Truro*—To be bounded as the Presbytery of that name in connection with the Presbyterian Church of the Lower Provinces.

6. *Halifax*—To be bounded as the present Presbytery of Halifax in the Presbyterian Church of the Lower Provinces, except Newfoundland.

7. *Lunenburg and Yarmouth*—To be bounded as the present Presbytery of that name.

8. *St. John*—To include the same territory as the Presbytery of that name in connection with the Presbyterian Church of the Lower Provinces.

9. *Miramichi*—To include the present Presbyteries of that name and Restigouche.

10. *Prince Edward Island*—To include the Province of that name.

11. *Newfoundland*—To include the Island of Newfoundland.

II.—*Synod of Montreal and Kingston*—To comprise all the Province of Quebec, with the exception of the territory occupied by the congregation of New Carlisle of the Canada Presbyterian Church, which should be transferred to the Synod of the Maritime Provinces and be united with the Presbytery of Miramichi, the Presbyteries of Ottawa, Brockville and Kingston of the Canada Presbyterian Church, and the Presbyteries of Glengary, Ottawa, Perth and Kingston of the Presbyterian Church of Canada in connection with the Church of Scotland.

III.—*Synod of Toronto*—To be coterminous with the present Synod of Toronto of the Canada Presbyterian Church, and to include also the boundaries of the present Presbyteries of Guelph and Durham of the aforesaid Church.

IV.—*Synod of Hamilton and London*—To be coterminous with the present Synods of Hamilton and London of the Canada Presbyterian Church, with the exception of the territory embraced by the Presbyteries of Guelph and Durham of the aforesaid Church.

V.—*Synod of Manitoba*—To embrace the Province of Manitoba, all the Territories of the North-West and the Province of British Columbia. The Synod of Manitoba to meet in the Presbyterian Church, Winnipeg, on the second Wednesday of July, at ten o'clock in the forenoon, to define the boundaries of Presbyteries and attend to all other competent business.

That it be remitted to Synods to prescribe the boundaries of Presbyteries in the Western portion of the Church, subject to the following general instructions:—

1. That, being duly convened, the first item of business shall be the definition of the boundaries of Presbyteries.

2. That each Presbytery, with the Ministers and Churches within its limits, be defined as to boundaries by geographical lines, or with respect to the most convenient lines of travel.

3. That the formation of small Presbyteries be discouraged.

4. That when two or more congregations, on different sides of a Synodical or Presbyterial line, are under one pastoral charge, they shall for the time belong to that Presbytery with which the Minister is connected, but only so long as such congregational relation continues.

That the Synods and Presbyteries heretofore existing, which shall lose their present organization by consolidation under these arrangements, shall be considered and designated as continuing their succession in that Synod now defined, or Presbytery to be constituted, which includes the largest portion, counting both Ministers and Churches, of said Body, as existing at the date of Union, to attend as may be found necessary to its business and interests.

That the Clerks of all Ecclesiastical Judicatories, except Kirk Sessions, procure new Minute Books, in which to record their proceedings from and after the date at which the Union takes effect in such Judicatories; that all newly-arranged Presbyteries be instructed to place the Records of their predecessors in safe keeping until the General Assembly acquire a secure and fire-proof building or apartment in which to deposit them; and that the Assembly take immediate steps to obtain such a building or apartment in connection with the Agency of the Church.

The Assembly unanimously adopted the paragraph relating to the Synod of the Maritime Provinces.

With reference to the paragraph anent the Synod of Montreal and Kingston, it was moved by Mr. Coulthard and duly seconded, That the recommendation of the report be adopted. To this it was moved in amendment by Dr. Jenkins and seconded by Dr. Snodgrass, That this Synod be called the Synod of Montreal and Ottawa, and that it extend no farther West than the eastern boundary of the present Kingston Presbyteries. A vote having been taken, the amendment was carried over the motion, and became the judgment of the Assembly.

The next paragraph was taken up, when it was moved by Dr. Topp and seconded by Mr. J. K. Smith, That the recommendation of the report be adopted,

with the addition of the Kingston Presbyteries. It was moved in amendment by Mr. Andrew Wilson and seconded by Dr. Snodgrass, That the recommendation of the Committee be adopted, with the addition of the Presbyteries of Kingston, and that the Synod be called the Synod of Toronto and Kingston. These having been put to the House, the motion was carried over the amendment, and the Moderator declared accordingly.

The Assembly proceeded to the consideration of the next section, when it was moved by Dr. Jenkins and seconded by Dr. Proudfoot, That the recommendation of the report as to the Synod of Hamilton and London be adopted. To this it was moved in amendment by Mr. McCall and seconded by Mr. Dawson, That the recommendation be adopted with the exception of the name, which shall be the Synod of Hamilton. A second amendment was proposed by Mr. Goldsmith and seconded by Mr. McTavish, That the recommendation of the report be adopted, except that the Synod shall be called the Synod of London. A vote having been taken, the motion was carried successively over the second amendment and the first amendment, and became the judgment of the Assembly.

The Synods, thus constituted, were instructed to meet for organization this afternoon at three o'clock in the following places, viz.:—The Synod of the Maritime Provinces in Stanley Street Church; the Synod of Montreal and Ottawa in Erskine Church; the Synod of Toronto in St. Paul's Church; and the Synod of Hamilton and London in Knox Church. In each case the oldest ordained Minister present shall preside as Moderator.

Consideration of the paragraph referring to Manitoba was deferred.

The remaining recommendations in the report were unanimously adopted.

COMMITTEE TO NOMINATE STANDING COMMITTEES.

The Assembly appointed the following members, viz.:—Dr. Topp, *Convener*, Dr. Jenkins, Dr. Bayne, Dr. Bell, Dr. Snodgrass, Dr. Caven, Dr. McVicar, Dr. Waters, Messrs. G. M. Grant, Cochrane (Brantford), Dohald McRae, *Ministers*; Hon. John McMurrich, Dr. Waddell, Messrs. Croil, John L. Morris, Charles Robson, David McCurdy, Thomas McCrae and John Stirling, *Elders*, a Committee to nominate Standing Committees and report to the House.

COMMITTEE ON CONSTITUTION OF GENERAL ASSEMBLY.

The Assembly appointed a Committee, consisting of Professor Gregg, *Convener*, Dr. Taylor, Professor McLaren, Messrs. G. M. Grant, Kenneth MacLennan, Robert Campbell (Montreal), G. Patterson, *Ministers*; Hon. John McMurrich and Mr. John C. Thomson, *Elders*, to prepare and report a measure for the constitution of the General Assembly as a Representative Body.

The Assembly adjourned to meet in this place at eight o'clock this evening, and was closed with the Benediction.

THE ACTS AND PROCEEDINGS OF

THIRD SEDERUNT.

In the same place and on the same day as before, at eight o'clock p.m.

The General Assembly resumed business after devotional exercises had been engaged in.

The Minutes of the Second Sederunt were read and sustained.

CONGRATULATIONS FROM METHODIST CONFERENCE.

The Moderator read a telegraphic despatch which he had received from the Montreal Conference of the Methodist Church, in session at Kingston, conveying the fraternal salutations of its members, and congratulating the Assembly on the happy consummation of Union. Dr. Topp and Mr. Reid were appointed a Committee to reply to this communication, as well as that which had been received from Ireland.

FRENCH EVANGELIZATION SCHEME.

Professor Campbell presented and read a memorial, suggesting a scheme for the organization and conduct of the work of French Canadian and Acadian Evangelization, submitted by a Conference of the Committees on French Canadian Missions of the several Churches now merged in this Church, and embracing the following recommendations, viz. :—

1. That the work of French Evangelization hitherto carried on by these Churches be united under a General Assembly's Board of French Canadian Evangelization, whose office shall be in Montreal.
2. That the members of the said Board, resident in Montreal, constitute an Executive Board for the conduct of the Board's operations in the Provinces of Quebec and Ontario; and that the members resident in the Maritime Provinces constitute a similar Executive Board, having its seat at St. John, N.B., for the conduct of the same in the said Provinces.
3. That for the successful prosecution of the work a General Secretary be appointed, who can speak and preach in French and English, and whose duties in addition to raising funds shall be defined by the General Assembly.
4. That the training of French Ministers and Missionaries in the Presbyterian College, Montreal, be made, as heretofore in the Canada Presbyterian Church, a first charge upon the Fund for French Evangelization.
5. That schools and mission-stations be planted, wherever openings can be made for them, throughout the wide extent of the French Canadian and Acadian fields.

Whereupon it was moved by Dr. Jenkins and seconded by Dr. Waters, That the General Assembly has heard with profound thankfulness the statements which have been submitted in the memorial now read, and hereby adopts the recommendations which it contains for the future prosecution by this

Assembly of the important work of Evangelization. To this it was moved in amendment by Mr. J. K. Smith and seconded by Mr. Andrew Wilson, That the Assembly receive the memorial and proceed to consider its recommendations *seriatim*. A vote having been taken, the motion was carried over the amendment, and the Moderator declared accordingly. The Assembly resolved to appoint the following as their Board of French Canadian Evangelization for the present year, viz.:—Principal McVicar, *Chairman*; Mr. Robert Campbell (Montreal) and Dr. Waters, *Vice-Chairmen*; James Croil, Esq., *Treasurer*; in the Maritime Provinces, Dr. Bayne, Dr. MacIse, Dr. Burns, Messrs. P. G. McGregor, G. M. Grant, James Bennett, Donald McRae, Robert J. Cameron, W. Stuart, J. C. Burgess, Thomas Duncan, E. A. McCurdy, Isaac Murray, T. Cummings, Neil McKay, *Ministers*; Dr. Waddell, Messrs. R. Cruikshanks, J. B. Logan, F. J. Bremner and J. S. Maclean; in the Provinces of Quebec, Ontario and Manitoba, Dr. Cook, Dr. Taylor, Dr. Jenkins, Dr. Bain, Dr. Caven, Dr. Topp, Dr. Proudfoot, Professor Campbell, Professor McLaren, Professor Hart, Messrs. P. Wright, Chiniquy, Doudiet, J. C. Baxter, William M. Black, J. S. Black, C. A. Tanner, Scrimger, Robert Laing, A. Young, D. M. Gordon, W. Armstrong, Joseph White, Andrew Wilson, T. G. Smith, J. K. Smith, J. C. Smith, W. Mitchell, W. Bennett, W. M. Roger, J. M. King, Macdonnell, J. G. Robb, Warden, Thomas Wardrope, W. Masson, D. H. Fletcher, J. It was further resolved to appoint the Rev. C. A. Tanner General Secretary of the Board, with a salary of sixteen hundred dollars (\$1,600) and travelling expenses, and the Committee were instructed to define his duties for the present year and report thereon.

ADDRESSES ON MISSIONS.

Mr. Cochrane (Brantford) addressed the Assembly on the subject of Home Missions.

Addresses on Foreign Missions were delivered by Professor McLaren, Dr. Bayne and Mr. J. Fraser Campbell, Missionary-designate to Madras.

The Rev. G. W. Coan, a Missionary on the staff of the American Board of Foreign Missions, was introduced to the House, and gave interesting details of mission work among the Nestorian Christians in Persia.

It was agreed to add Mr. Cochrane (Brantford) to the Committee on Business.

The General Assembly adjourned, to meet in this place to-morrow morning at ten o'clock, of which public intimation was made, and this Sederunt was closed with the Benediction.

FOURTH SEDERUNT.

At Montreal, and within Erskine Church there; Thursday, the seventeenth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-five years:

Which day the General Assembly of the Presbyterian Church in Canada met pursuant to adjournment, and was constituted with prayer.

The minutes of the Third Sederunt were read and sustained.

Dr. Topp, Convener of the Committee on Business, presented a report. Its recommendations as to the order of business were adopted.

CONGRATULATIONS FROM THE ANGLICAN DIOCESE OF MONTREAL.

The Moderator produced and read a letter which he had received from the Metropolitan Bishop of Montreal, transmitting a resolution which had been adopted by the Synod of the Church of England in the Diocese of Montreal. Said letter and resolution are as follows:—

“MONTREAL, June 17, 1875.

“MY DEAR SIR,—I have been requested by the Synod of the Church of England in this Diocese to convey to the Presbyterian Church in Canada the following resolution, which was passed by a very large majority in our Session of yesterday, and which has, I can assure you, my most hearty concurrence.

“I have the honour to be,

“My dear Sir,

“Yours very faithfully,

(Signed) “A. MONTREAL.”

(Enclosure.)

“That this Synod, having learned with pleasure that the Union of the several Presbyterian Churches in the Dominion of Canada has been happily effected, would respectfully request the Most Reverend the Metropolitan to convey to that United Body our sincere congratulations.”

It was moved by Dr. Topp, seconded by Dr. Jenkins and passed unanimously, That the Moderator be requested to convey to the Diocesan Synod of Montreal, now in session, an expression of the satisfaction with which this Assembly has received the congratulations of the Synod, as communicated by the Metropolitan, on the Union of the Presbyterian Churches, now so happily consummated, and its earnest prayer that the Divine blessing may largely descend on the members of the Diocesan Synod in the work of the Lord.

REPORTS FROM SYNODS.

Reports of the proceedings of the several Synods at their meetings held yesterday afternoon were called for.

Mr. Alexander Young, Clerk of the Synod of Montreal and Ottawa, gave in the report of that Synod.* It was moved by Principal Caven and seconded by Mr. Ross (Lochiel), That the arrangement of Presbyteries within the bounds of this Synod, proposed by that Body, be confirmed by the General Assembly, and that the next meeting of Synod be appointed to be held in St. Paul's Church, Montreal, on the second Tuesday of May, 1876, at eleven o'clock in the forenoon. To this it was moved in amendment by Professor McLaren and seconded by Mr. Gillies, That the report be received, and the arrangement of Presbyteries recommended be confirmed *ad interim*; that it be remitted to the Synod of Montreal and Ottawa to describe the proposed Presbyteries by geographical boundaries and report to next Assembly; and that the Synod hold its next meeting in St. Paul's Church, Montreal, on the second Tuesday of May, 1876, at eleven o'clock in the forenoon. A vote having been taken, the motion was carried over the amendment by a majority of 60 to 55, and the Moderator declared the same to be the judgment of the House.

The report of the proceedings of the Synod of Toronto was given in by Mr. John Gray, Clerk of that Court.* It was moved by Dr. Jenkins, seconded by Dr. Waters and passed unanimously, That the report, defining the boundaries of Presbyteries within the Synod of Toronto, together with the Overture unanimously adopted by the Synod respecting the name of the Synod, to wit, that it be designated the "Synod of Toronto and Kingston," be and hereby is adopted, with the exception of the recommendation respecting the congregations of Walkerton and Brant; further, that Mr. Park be first Moderator of the Presbytery of Saugeen.

Mr. Cochrane, Clerk of the Synod of Hamilton and London, read the report of that Synod.* It was moved by Mr. Andrew Wilson, duly seconded and passed, That the report be received, and that the arrangement of Presbyteries, together with the recommendations therein, be confirmed.

Mr. Falconer, Clerk of the Synod of the Maritime Provinces, reported that, as instructed, they had met yesterday and ratified the arrangement of Presbyteries referred to in yesterday's minutes. The Assembly confirmed the action of the Synod.

The Assembly took up the consideration of the paragraph in the report of the Committee on the reconstruction of Synods and Presbyteries relating to Manitoba, deferred from yesterday. It was agreed to instruct the Presbytery of Manitoba—embracing the Province of Manitoba, the territories of the North-West, and the Province of British Columbia, and possessed of Synodical powers—to meet in Knox Church, Winnipeg, on the second Wednesday of July at ten o'clock in the forenoon, to attend to all competent business; Mr. Black to be Moderator.

On motion of Mr. John Gray, duly seconded, it was unanimously resolved, That the Clerks of the several Synods and of the Presbytery of Manitoba be instructed to furnish the rolls of said Synods and Presbytery, together with the date of ordination of each minister, to the Interim Clerks of the General Assembly, with the view of their being printed as an Appendix to the Minutes.

* The Reports of Synods as to the boundaries of Presbyteries will be found in the appendix.

REPORT ON CONSTITUTION OF GENERAL ASSEMBLY.

Professor Gregg, Convener of the Committee appointed to prepare a measure for the constitution of the General Assembly as a Representative Body, presented a report.

It was moved by Mr. John Laing, duly seconded and passed unanimously, That the Assembly receive the report and consider its recommendations *seriatim*.

On motion of Dr. Proudfoot, seconded by Dr. Waters, the Assembly agreed not to adopt the recommendation making provision for an Interim Act on this subject.

It was resolved that the General Assembly of next year be not a Representative Body, but be composed of all the Ministers and representative Elders of the Church, as this year.

A suggestion having been offered that the provisions in the report for an Interim Act might be converted into the clauses of a Draft Act, Professor Gregg, on motion of Dr. Topp, duly agreed to, read the same to the House. Whereupon it was moved by Principal Caven, and seconded by Dr. Burns, That the matter of preparing a Draft Act for the constitution of a General Assembly be remitted to the Committee already appointed on this subject, with the addition of the following names, viz.:—Principal Snodgrass, Dr. Proudfoot, Messrs. Macdonnell and Laing, with instructions to report at as early an hour to-day as possible. It was moved in amendment to this, by Dr. Topp and seconded by Mr. McGillivray, That the Draft Act, now read, be received and adopted by the Assembly. A vote having been taken, the amendment was carried over the motion by a majority of 69 to 59, and the Moderator declared accordingly.

Said Draft Act, thus adopted, is as follows :—

1. That the General Assembly shall consist of one-fourth of the whole number of Ministers on the Rolls of the several Presbyteries, with an equal number of representative Elders.
2. That, should the number on the Roll of any Presbytery be incapable of division by four, then the fourth shall be reckoned the fourth of the next higher number divisible by four.
3. That the members of Assembly shall be appointed by each Presbytery at an ordinary meeting held at least thirty days before the meeting of Assembly.
4. That each Presbytery shall grant to Ministers and Elders, on their appointment as members of Assembly, Commissions in due form, attested by the Clerk, who shall forward them to the Clerk of Assembly, at least eight days before its meeting; and that from such Commissions the Clerk shall prepare an *Interim* Roll, to be called at the opening of Assembly, and which, being amended if necessary, shall be confirmed as the Roll of Assembly.
5. That any twenty-five of these Commissioners, of whom at least thirteen shall be Ministers, being met on the day and at the place appointed, shall be a quorum for the transaction of business.

It was further resolved to send down the aforesaid Draft Act to Presbyteries for consideration, with instruction to report thereon to next meeting of Assembly.

The Assembly adjourned to meet in this place this afternoon at three o'clock and was closed with the Benediction.

FIFTH SEDERUNT.

In the same place, and on the same day, at three o'clock in the afternoon :—

The General Assembly met pursuant to adjournment and was constituted.

The minutes of the Fourth Sederunt were read, and after amendment, were sustained.

Mackenzie, John Stirling, Robert Cruikshanks, Alexander McAlister, Dr. Holden, and Dr. Waddell, *Elders*, with instructions to meet in St. Paul's Church, Montreal, on the first day of September next, at noon, to consider fully and carefully the following subjects, viz.:—Ecclesiastical procedure, Parliamentary legislation, Synodical functions and business, Missionary and other Schemes, Colleges, education for the Ministry, examination of Students, admission of Ministers from other Churches, amalgamation of Ministers' Widows' and Orphans' Funds, Agency, Periodicals, Clerkship of the General Assembly, mode of electing the Moderator of the Assembly, Standing Orders for the conduct of business in the Church Courts, and such other subjects as bear upon the general work of the Church, or as may be referred by the Assembly to this Committee, and to report to the next annual meeting of the Assembly such recommendations anent these subjects, or any of them, as may appear to the Committee to be of practical importance and utility; and further, to obtain such legislation from the Dominion Legislature as may be deemed necessary or expedient; to make arrangements, if such be found practicable, for the publication of a periodical, or periodicals, at the beginning of the next calendar year; and to print, if it seem desirable to do so, the results of their deliberations for circulation among the members of Assembly.

NEXT MEETING OF ASSEMBLY.

On motion of Dr. Burns, seconded by Professor Gregg and passed unanimously, the Assembly agreed to hold their next meeting at Toronto, and within Knox Church there, on the second Thursday of June, 1876, at eleven o'clock in the forenoon.

MEMORIAL ANENT HOME MISSION AGENCY.

There was read a memorial, numerously subscribed by members of the Assembly, in the following terms, viz.:—

"Whereas the Home Mission work of the Church has now become so extensive as to demand the supervision of at least one Agent, who shall give his whole time and attention to this important work, visiting Presbyteries and congregations, and taking a general charge of the entire Scheme, as the Assembly may direct; and whereas it is believed that, by the appointment of such an Agent, the Home Mission work of our Church would be greatly extended, and the liberality of our Church developed—it is, therefore, respectfully overtured that the General Assembly take this important work into their serious consideration, and, should they approve of the proposal contained in this memorial, instruct the Presbyteries of the Church, during the ensuing ecclesiastical year, to nominate one or more Ministers of this Church, in order that an appointment may be made at next meeting of the General Assembly."

Mr. Cochrane (Brantford), was heard in support of the Memorial.

It was moved by Dr. Topp, seconded by Mr. G. Patterson and passed unanimously, That this Memorial be referred to the Committee this day appointed on the General Procedure and Schemes of the Church, to consider the same in connection with the whole subject of Home Missions.

GENERAL PRESBYTERIAN COUNCIL.

Attention having been drawn to the fact that a meeting preliminary to a General Presbyterian Council was called to meet in London, England, on the twenty-first day of July next, it was moved by Mr. Cochrane (Brantford) and seconded by Mr. G. M. Grant, That a Committee be appointed to suggest names of Delegates to represent this Assembly at said meeting. To this it was moved in amendment by Mr. Macpherson (Stratford), and duly seconded, That the Rev. Michael Willis, D.D., the Rev. Alexander Topp, D.D., the Rev. William Snodgrass, D.D., the Rev. Patrick Gray, the Rev. Daniel M. Gordon, B.D., and Henry B. Webster, Esq., be appointed Delegates to attend the aforesaid preliminary meeting. A vote having been taken, the amendment was carried over the motion, and became the judgment of the House. The Clerk was instructed to furnish a commission to each of the Delegates thus appointed.

THE BIBLE AS A TEXT BOOK IN SCHOOLS.

A reference from the late General Assembly of the Canada Presbyterian Church, regarding the Bible as a Text Book in the schools of the Province of Ontario, was brought before the House. It was unanimously agreed to refer this subject to a Committee, consisting of Dr. Snodgrass, Dr. Proudfoot, Messrs. Macpherson (Stratford), John Gray, J. M. King, Ministers; Hon. John McMurich, and Mr. Thomas McCrae, Elders, with instructions to consider the same and

report thereon to the next meeting of the General Assembly—Mr. Macpherson to be Convener.

DESECRATION OF THE SABBATH ON RAILWAYS.

There was also produced and read a reference from the late Synod of the Presbyterian Church of the Lower Provinces, bearing on the matter of a desecration of the Sabbath by the Railway Companies in Nova Scotia and New Brunswick. It was moved by Principal Caven, seconded by Dr. Burns and passed unanimously, That the documents connected with this reference be committed for consideration to the Assembly's Standing Committee on Sabbath Observance, hereafter to be named.

Further, on motion of Professor McLaren, seconded by Mr. W. T. McMullen, it was agreed to petition the Dominion Parliament to abolish unnecessary Sabbath labour on public works, and traffic on Railways under Government control, and recommend Presbyteries to petition to the like effect.

DELEGATE FROM THE PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH IN THE U.S.

A Commission was presented from the General Assembly of the Presbyterian Church in the United States of America, appointing the Rev. James Allison, D.D., of the Presbytery of Alleghany, and Mr. Benjamin Lyman, Elder, of the Presbytery of New York, Delegates to represent that Church at this Assembly. A letter from Dr. Allison, stating his inability to be present, was read. Mr. Lyman was introduced to the House and addressed the Assembly. The Moderator conveyed the thanks of the Assembly to Mr. Lyman for his presence and address.

AGENTS OF THE CHURCH.

A reference from the Committee on Business, in regard to the position of the Agents of the several Churches merged in this Church, was brought before the Assembly. It was moved by Principal Caven, seconded by Mr. G. Patterson and passed unanimously, That in the meantime the Assembly confirm the Agents in the offices which they held previously to union, and that the whole question of Agencies and Publication be referred to the Committee appointed to meet in Montreal in September next.

The General Assembly met pursuant to adjournment, and was constituted. The minutes of the Fifth Sederunt were read and sustained.

SPECIAL PRAYER FOR GENERAL ASSEMBLY.

On motion of Mr. Ross (Dundee), the General Assembly resolved to recommend to all the Churches under its care to offer special prayer during the devotions of the Sabbath preceding its annual meeting in each year, and entreat all its members to continue their supplications in their domestic services during its session, that God of His great mercy would so give the General Assembly the light of His countenance, the power of His wisdom, and the life of His Spirit, as to promote His own glory and advance the kingdom of Jesus in the earth.

FUNDS FOR MANITOBA COLLEGE.

A reference from the late General Assembly of the Canada Presbyterian Church, bearing on the desirableness of at once providing three thousand five hundred dollars (\$3,500) for the purpose of purchasing a suitable building for the College in Manitoba, was brought before the House. Mr. Robertson (Winnipeg) was heard in support of the same. The following deliverance in regard thereto was unanimously adopted:—That the Assembly do very earnestly recommend that a subscription be raised to aid the funds of that Institution to the extent now required, and that all the friends of the Church be entreated to extend their liberality to an object so important to the interests of the Church in that distant Province. Further, the Assembly agree to appoint a Committee, consisting of Mr. G. M. Grant, Convener; Messrs. Macdonnell, Moore, Ministers; Messrs. Thomas

McCrae, John L. Morris and Croil, to raise forthwith the amount required by a collection in the Churches or otherwise, as they deem most expedient.

ARREARS OF STIPEND.

The following motion was proposed by Mr. Moore, seconded by Mr. W. T. McMullen and passed unanimously :—

Whereas it appears from the Financial Report that during the past year some congregations have not implemented their engagements in the matter of stipend, the respective Presbyteries, within whose bounds such congregations are found, are hereby instructed to deal with them at their first meeting, for the purpose of securing the prompt payment of arrears and increased liberality in the future, and in no case shall the Presbytery allow arrears of stipend to go on accumulating. Presbyteries are further instructed to see to it that, when congregations have not sent in a financial report for the past year, said congregations be required to give in such report to their respective Presbyteries without delay.

CERTAIN COMMITTEES CONTINUED.

The attention of the Assembly having been called to the fact that in some of the Churches which have merged in this Church, there were certain Committees who have not completed the business entrusted to them, the Assembly resolved to sanction the continuance of these Committees, until such time as their affairs are wound up.

CORRESPONDENCE WITH OTHER CHURCHES.

PASTORAL LETTER.

The following motion, proposed by Mr. Croil, and seconded by Mr. Daniel McGillivray, was unanimously agreed to :—That Presbyteries be instructed to take an early opportunity of appointing Deputations to visit the Congregations within their bounds, for the purpose of giving information regarding the Union now consummated, and the several Schemes that will engage the attention of the Church ; and that, in furtherance of this end, the Moderator be requested, as he hereby is, to issue a Pastoral Letter to the Ministers and Congregations of the Church ; which Letter shall be read from the pulpit.

MEMORIAL FUND.

Attention having been drawn to the propriety of raising a Memorial Fund, as a praiseworthy and practical mode by which the members of the Church may testify their gratitude for the consummation of the Union, now so happily effected, and to the success which attended such a scheme adopted on the reunion of the Churches now constituting the Presbyterian Church in the United States of America, it was moved by Dr. Waters, seconded by Dr. Topp, and passed unanimously :—That the Committee, appointed to meet in Montreal next September, be instructed to consider the propriety of raising a Memorial Fund, and to take such steps as may be most appropriate for attaining this object.

VOTES OF THANKS.

It was moved by Mr. Cochrane (Brantford), duly seconded, and passed with acclamation :—

That the cordial thanks of this Assembly are due, and are hereby given—

1. To the Christian friends in the City of Montreal, for their generous hospitality ; and to the Committee of Arrangements, for their diligence.

2. To the Ministers and Trustees of Erskine Church, St. Paul's Church, Knox Church, St. Gabriel's Church, and Stanley Street Church, for the accommodation afforded.

3. To the different Railway and Steamboat Companies, for their kindness in granting reduced fares.

4. To the various newspapers in the City and elsewhere, for their report of the proceedings of the Synods and General Assembly.

The Minutes of this Sederunt were read and sustained.

CLOSE.

The Moderator then suitably addressed the House ; after which, at the Moderator's request, Mr. Archibald Henderson offered prayer. The Assembly engaged in praise, singing Psalm cxlii., verses 6-9 ; after which the Moderator declared this General Assembly dissolved ; appointed the next General Assembly to meet at Toronto, and within Knox Church there, on the second Thursday of June, in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-six, at eleven o'clock in the forenoon ; and closed this Session with the Apostolic Benediction.

SYNOD OF MONTREAL AND OTTAWA.

At Montreal, and within Erskine Church there; Wednesday, the sixteenth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and seventy five years, at three o'clock in the afternoon:—

Which day and place the Synod of Montreal and Ottawa, of the Presbyterian Church in Canada, met by appointment of the General Assembly, and was constituted with praise, reading the Scriptures, and prayer by the Rev. Archibald Henderson A.M., the oldest Minister present, and as such, appointed by the General Assembly to be the first Moderator of the Synod.

On motion of Mr. John Crombie, seconded by Mr. Donald Ross (Dundee), and passed unanimously, Mr. Alexander Young was appointed Clerk of the Synod.

The Synod proceeded to the election of a Moderator for the ensuing year. It was moved by Dr. Taylor, and seconded by Mr. Kenneth McDonald; That the Rev. Archibald Henderson, A.M., be Moderator for the year. Mr. Henderson expressed thanks for the proposed honour, but begged to decline the office on the ground of age and infirmity. In accordance with Mr. Henderson's request, the motion was set aside.

It was then moved by Mr. James Patterson, seconded by Mr. David McGillivray, and passed unanimously, That the Reverend William Taylor, D.D., of Erskine Church, Montreal, be Moderator for the next Synodical year. Dr. Taylor being present, took the chair and thanked the house.

The Synod proceeded to consider the arrangement and erection of Presbyteries within its bounds, when it was moved by Mr. Nathaniel Paterson, seconded by Mr. Henry Edmison, and unanimously agreed to: That the Synod resolve itself into a Committee of the whole to consider the arrangement and erection of Presbyteries. Dr. Jenkins was called to the chair.

Mr. William Moore produced and read a paper, setting forth certain suggestions for the consideration of the Committee, on the matter of arranging the Presbyteries.

After deliberation, and on motion to that effect, the Committee rose; the moderator took the chair, and the Chairman submitted the report of the Committee, which was received and adopted, and is as follows:—

The Synod of Montreal and Ottawa shall be divided into five Presbyteries, viz.:—Quebec, Montreal, Glengarry, Brockville, Ottawa.

The Presbytery of Quebec shall comprise the following congregations:—St. Andrew's, Quebec; Chalmers' Church, Quebec; Valecartier; Three Rivers; Point Levi; St. Sylvester; Leeds; Inverness; Danville; Richmond; Melbourne; Sherbrooke; Lingwick; Winslow; Hampden; Lake Megantic; Kennebec Road; Riviere du Loup, and Metis.

The Presbytery of Montreal shall contain the following congregations, viz.:—St. Andrew's; St. Paul's; Knox Church; Erskine Church; Stanley Street Church; St. Joseph Street Church; St. Matthews, Nazareth Street; St. Marks; Free Church; Cote Street; St. Gabriel Street Church; Chalmers' Church, St. John's, in the City of Montreal; Cote des Neiges; Lachine; Beauharnois; Chatham; Grenville; Dundee; Elgin; Athelstane; Huntingdon; Ormstown; Georgetown; Beachridge; Russelltown; Hemmingford; Laprairie; St. Louis de Gonzague Valleyfield; Lagnere; Rockburn; Gore; English River, Howick; Chateauguay Basin; St. Andrew's; Henry's Church, Lachute; First Church, Lachute; Mille Isles, Harrington; Ste. Therese; Grande Fresniere; St. Eustache; New Glasgow; Farnham Centre, and Covey Hill.

The Presbytery of Glengarry to comprise the following congregations, viz.:—Jamester; Williamstown; Martintown; Indian Lands; Kenyon; Lochiel; Vankleekhill; Alexandria; Dalhousie Mills; Cote St. Genge; Cornwall; Roxborough; Finch; Osnabrock; East Hawkesbury.

The Presbytery of Brockville to contain the following congregations:—Waddington; Brockville; Prescott; Spencerville; Edwardsburg; Bell's Corners; Morrisburgh; Williamsburg; Dunbar; Matilda; West Winchester; Morwood; South Gower; Mountain; Kemptville; Oxford Mills; Merrickville; Burritt's Rapids; North Augusta; Fairfield; Yonge; Lyn; Newboro'; Westport; Bishop's Mills; Oxford; Smith's Falls; Perth; Lanark; Middleville.

The Presbytery of Ottawa to comprise the following congregations, viz.:—Admaston; Douglas; Grattan; Pembroke; Almonte; McNab; Wakefield; Fitzroy; Tarbolton; Beckwith; Russell; Gloucester; Pakenham; Aylwin; Alice; Pettawawa; Ramsay; Metcalfe; Osgoode; Nepean; Bell's Corners; Carleton Place; Litchfield; Arnprior; Coulange; Westmeath; L'Orignal; Hawkesbury; Buckingham; Cumberland; Chelsea; Huntley; Ross; Bristol; Richmond; Plantagenet; St. Andrew's Church, Ottawa; Knox Church, Ottawa; Bank Street Church, Ottawa; Daly Street Church, Ottawa.

The Synod proceeded further to appoint the first meetings of the several Presbyteries, when the following appointments were made:

That the first meeting of the Presbytery of Quebec, be held in the city of Quebec, and within St. Andrew's Church there, on the second Wednesday in September next, at 12 o'clock noon. The Rev. John Cook, D.D., to be Moderator.

That the first meeting of the Presbytery of Montreal, be held in the city of Montreal, and within St. Paul's Church there, on the second Tuesday of July next, at 11 o'clock, a.m. The Rev. William Taylor, D.D., to be Moderator.

That the first meeting of the Presbytery of Glengarry be held in St. John's Church, Cornwall, Ont., on the first Wednesday of August next, at twelve o'clock, noon. The Rev. H. Lamont, D.D., to be Moderator.

That the first meeting of the Presbytery of Brockville be held in St. John's Church, Brockville, Ont., on the last Tuesday of June current, at three o'clock in the afternoon. The Rev. Wm. Bain, D.D., to be Moderator.

That the first meeting of the Presbytery of Ottawa, be held in the city of Ottawa, and within Knox Church there, on the first Tuesday of July next, at three o'clock in the afternoon. The Rev. Alexander Mann, A.M., to be Moderator.

The meeting was closed with the benediction.

SYNOD OF TORONTO AND KINGSTON.

This Synod met within St. Paul's Church, Montreal, on the 16th June, 1875, at 3 o'clock p.m., and was opened with devotional exercises by the Rev. W. Fraser of Bond Head, the oldest acting minister present at the hour of opening.

Mr. John Gray of Orillia was appointed Clerk.

The Roll of Synod, comprising the Roll of the Presbyteries of Kingston, Toronto, Victoria, and parts of those of Hamilton and Saugeen of the late Presbyterian Church of Canada in connection with the Church of Scotland, and the Presbyteries of Kingston, Cobourg, Ontario, Toronto, Simcoe, Owen Sound, Guelph and Durham, of the late Canada Presbyterian Church, was read.

The Rev. W. Fraser was appointed Moderator for the ensuing year.

The Synod proceeded to erect Presbyteries within its bounds, and agreed to commence with its eastern limits. The following resolutions were adopted:—

I. PRESBYTERY OF KINGSTON.

That a Presbytery be formed, to be designated the Presbytery of Kingston, and that it include the territories formerly occupied by the late Presbyteries respectively, of the same name, of the Canada Presbyterian Church, and the Presbyterian Church of Canada, in connection with the Church of Scotland, and that Professor J. B. Mowat, M.A., be the first Moderator thereof.

After reasoning, it was carried that the first meeting be held on the 13th July, 1875, at ten o'clock a.m., in Chalmers' Church, Kingston.

II. PRESBYTERY OF PETERBOROUGH.

That a Presbytery be formed, having the same bounds as those of the Presbytery of the Canada Presbyterian Church, formerly designated the Presbytery of Cobourg.

It was also, after reasoning, decided that the name of the foregoing Presbytery be Peterborough; that the Rev. J. M. Roger M.A., be the Moderator; and that the first meeting be held in the Millbrook Presbyterian Church, on the 6th July 1875, at eleven o'clock a.m.

III. PRESBYTERY OF WHITBY.

It was on motion duly made and seconded, decided, that a Presbytery be formed, to be called the Presbytery of Whitby, that it extend from Pickering in the west to Clarke in the east inclusive, and northwards, as far as Claremont, Utica, Port Perry and Williamsburg; that the Moderator thereof be Mr. A. Kennedy; and that the first meeting be held at Whitby, and within the second Presbyterian Church there, on the sixth day of July next, at eleven o'clock a.m.

IV. PRESBYTERY OF LINDSAY.

That a Presbytery be set apart, to be known as the Presbytery of Lindsay; that its bounds include that portion of the County of Ontario not comprised within the limits of the Presbytery of Whitby, as well as that part of the County of Victoria not comprehended within the bounds of the Presbytery of Peterborough; that Mr. A. Currie, M.A., be the Moderator thereof; and that the first meeting be held at Lindsay, and within St. Andrew's Church there, on the thirteenth day of July next, at eleven of the clock in the forenoon.

V. PRESBYTERY OF TORONTO.

That a Presbytery be formed, to be designated the Presbytery of Toronto, and that the boundaries thereof be the same as those of the late Presbytery of Toronto, of the Canada Presbyterian Church, but excluding the Northern half of the Township of Melancthon; that Dr. A. Topp be the first Moderator; and that the first meeting thereof be held at Toronto, and within St. Andrew's Church there, on the last Tuesday of June instant, at eleven o'clock a.m.

VI. PRESBYTERY OF BARRIE.

That a Presbytery be formed, comprising the boundaries of the late Presbytery of Simcoe, of the Canada Presbyterian Church, and also including the Township of Mulmur and the south line of Osprey; that it be called the Presbytery of Barrie; that Mr. W. Cleland be the Moderator thereof; and that the first meeting be held at Barrie, and within the Presbyterian Church there, on the sixth day of July next, at eleven o'clock a.m.

VII. PRESBYTERY OF OWEN SOUND.

That a Presbytery be formed, to be called the Presbytery of Owen Sound; that the bounds thereof be the same as those of the late Presbytery of Owen Sound, in the Canada Presbyterian Church, with the exception of the western, which shall be coterminous with the county-line between Grey and Bruce, as far north as the gravel road leading westward to Southampton, and then along said gravel road to Lake Huron, and further, that the congregation of Tara, which is situated south of the gravel road, be included in this Presbytery; that the first Moderator be Mr. D. Morrison, M.A.; and that it meet for the first time

at Owen Sound, and within Knox Church there, on the second Tuesday of July next, at eleven o'clock a. m.

VIII. PRESBYTERY OF GUELPH.

That the bounds of the new Presbytery be the same as those assigned to the Presbytery of Guelph, by the Synod of the late Canada Presbyterian Church, in the year one thousand eight hundred and sixty-one, with the exception of Harriston; Rothsay; Palmerston; South Luther and Little Toronto; Arthur; Cots-wold, and the Townships of Amaranth and Luther.

IX. PRESBYTERY OF SAUOGEN.

That a Presbytery be formed comprising the same bounds as those of the late Presbytery of Durham of the Canada Presbyterian Church, with the addition of the congregations of Harriston; Palmerston; Rothsay; Arthur; Teviotdale; South Luther; and Little Toronto; and that it be named the Presbytery of Sau-geen; that the Moderator thereof be Dr. G. Bell, and that the first meeting be held at Mount Forest, and within Knox Church there, on the second Tuesday of July next, at eleven o'clock in the forenoon.

NAME OF SYNOD.

An overture to the General Assembly was unanimously adopted, praying that the name be changed from the Synod of Toronto to the Synod of Toronto and Kingston.

The Synod adjourned to meet at Toronto, and within Knox Church there, on the first Tuesday of May, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-six years, at half-past seven o'clock p.m., and was closed with the Benediction.

SYNOD OF HAMILTON AND LONDON.

At Montreal, and within Knox Church there; the sixteenth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-five years:—

Which day and place the Synod of Hamilton and London met according to instructions of General Assembly. Mr. Thomas Lowry was appointed Moderator, *pro tem.*, and constituted the meeting with prayer. Dr. Cochrane was appointed Clerk, *pro tem.* The attendance having been marked, the Moderator intimated to the court the business of the present meeting, namely: the reconstruction of Presbyteries within the bounds. Before proceeding to this special work, the Synod agreed to elect a moderator and clerk. Mr. Thomas Lowry was thereupon elected Moderator for the ensuing year, and Dr. Cochrane, Clerk of Synod,

The Synod then proceeded to define the boundaries of Presbyteries, and resolved as follows: That there should be seven Presbyteries, namely: Hamilton, Paris, London, Chatham, Stratford, Huron and Bruce.

Hamilton Presbytery.—It was moved by Mr. McTavish, duly seconded and unanimously agreed, that the Hamilton Presbytery be coterminous with the boundaries of the Hamilton Presbytery of the Canada Presbyterian Church.

Paris Presbytery.—It was moved by Mr. McMullen, duly seconded and unanimously agreed, that the Paris Presbytery be coterminous of the boundaries of the Paris Presbytery of the Canada Presbyterian Church.

London Presbytery.—It was moved by Dr. Proudfoot, duly seconded and unanimously agreed, that the bounds of the London Presbytery be as formerly under the Canada Presbyterian Church.

Chatham Presbytery.—It was moved, seconded, and unanimously agreed, that the boundaries of the Chatham Presbytery be coterminous with those of the Chatham Presbytery of the Canada Presbyterian Church.

Stratford Presbytery.—It was moved by Mr. Hamilton, seconded and unanimously agreed, that the boundaries of the Stratford Presbytery be coterminous with those of the Stratford Presbytery of the Canada Presbyterian Church.

Huron Presbytery.—It was moved by Mr. Goldsmith, seconded and unanimously agreed, that the boundaries of the Huron Presbytery be coterminous with those of the Huron Presbytery, as under the Canada Presbyterian Church.

Bruce Presbytery.—It was moved by Mr. Anderson, seconded and unanimously agreed, that the boundaries of the Bruce Presbytery be coterminous with those of the Bruce Presbytery, as under the Canada Presbyterian Church; but that the Assembly sanction the transfer of the two congregations of Walkerton, and the congregation of Brant, to the Presbytery of Bruce.

It was also agreed to ask the sanction of the Assembly to the following appointments for the next meeting of Presbyteries.

That the Presbytery of Hamilton meet in St. Paul's Church, Hamilton, on the 2nd Tuesday of July, at 11 a.m., and that Mr. J. C. Smith be the first Moderator.

That the Presbytery of Paris meet in Knox Church, Woodstock, on the 1st Tuesday in July, at 1 p.m., and that Mr. J. M. Aull be the first Moderator.

That the Presbytery of London meet in St. Andrew's Church, London, on the 2nd Tuesday of July, at 11 a.m., and that Mr. Gordon be the first Moderator.

That the Presbytery of Chatham meet in St. Andrew's Church, Chatham, on the last Tuesday of July, at 11 a.m., and that Mr. Rannie be the first Moderator.

That the Presbytery of Stratford meet in Knox Church, Stratford, on the 1st Tuesday of July, at 11 a.m., and that Mr. Wilkins be the first Moderator.

That the Presbytery of Huron meet in Knox Church, Goderich, on the 2nd Tuesday of July, at 11 a.m., and that Mr. Gibson be the first Moderator.

APPENDIX.

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That the Presbytery of Bruce meet in St. Andrew's Church, Kincardine, on the 2nd Tuesday of July, at 2 p.m., and that Mr. Duncan Cameron be the first Moderator.

Also that the next meeting of this Synod of Hamilton and London, be held within the City of Hamilton, on the first Tuesday of May 1876, at 7.30 p.m., within St. Paul's Church there.
