





## STANDING RULES

FOR THE

## CONSTITUTION AND GOVERNMENT

OF THE

## Newfoundland Church Society.

#### NAME.

1.—The Name of this Society shall be " The Newfoundland Church Society."

#### **OBJECTS**

2.—The objects of this Society shall be, (1) to contribute towards the maintenance of the Clergy and Licensed Lay-Readers, (2) to assist in the erection, enlargement or repairs of Churches, Parsonages, or School-Rooms, and in the purchase of land for Glebe or other Church purposes, (3) to provide for sale a supply, of Bibles, Prayer-Books, School-Books, and other Religious Books and Tracts, (4) to assist in creating and sustaining a Special Fund for the endowment and support of the Theological College in St. John's, and (5) to create and maintain a separate Fund for assisting the Widows and Children of deceased Clergymen of this Diocese.

#### MEMBERS.

3.—The Members of this Society shall be, (1) all persons who shall have paid to their Clergyman or the Treasurer the two preceding years the annual

sum of ten shillings for the object of the Society; and (2) all Clergymen who shall have officiated in Newfoundland or Labrador the two preceding years with the Bishop's license.

4.—All Members shall have power to vote at the

annual and other general meetings.

OFFICERS.

5.— The Officers of this Society shall be (1) the Lord Bishop of the Dicesse, President; (2) the Venerable the Archdeacon and the Rural Deans Vice-Presidents; (3) a Treasurer; and (4) a Secretary; the last two to be chosen by the members of the Society at the annual general meeting; but in case of resignation of office, or removal, of either Secretary or Treasurer, during the interval between two Annual Meetings, the Committee shall appoint a person to act in either case, until the next Annual Meeting.

MANAGERS.

6.—The Committee of Management shall consist of the officers of the Society, and certain Lay-Members, elected as Representatives in each of the Deaneries; viz., four elected by members of the Society resident in the Deanery of Avalon; three by Members resident in the Deanery of Conception Bay; two by Members resident in the Deanery of Trinity Bay; two by members resident in the Deanery of Bonavista Bay; three by Members resident in the Deanery of Notro-Dame Bay; two by Members resident in the Deanery of Placentia Bay; and two by Members resident in the Deanery of Fortune Bay.

7.—The election of Representatives shall be as follows:—Or some day in Easter Week, in the year 1859, and in every succeeding fourth year, a Meeti of the Members resident in each mission, shall be convened by the Clergyman in charge at some convenient hour and place, of which notice shall be given (with the Bishop's consent) in each Church in the

Mission on some Sanday in the previous month; at which Meeting the Clergyman or, in his absence, some other person then to be chosen by the Members shall preside, and the Members present shall vote seriatim for the prescribed number of Representatives.

- 8.—When the voting which may be continued, if necessary six hours, but not longer) is completed, the presiding Officer in each Mission shall report the result to the Rural Dean and the persons who have obtained a majority of votes in the Deanery, shall be elected Representatives; provided that every person to be a member of the Committee must be a Communicant of the Church of England.
- 9.—The Rural Dean shall report the result of the election in his Deancry to the Secretary in St. John's, the first convenient opportunity.
- 10.—The new Representatives shall be convered by the Secretary at the Michaelmas Quarterly Meeting; until which time the former Representatives shall continue in office.
- 11.—As often as it shall become necessary, from the death, absence from the Colony, resignation, disqualification or refusal to serve, of any of the Representatives, to appoint another or others in their place, a special meeting of the Members, in the Deanery where the vacancy has arisen, shall (as soon as the Rural Dean, or, in his absence, the Clergyman next senior in standing in the Diocese may in his discretion appoint) be convened in like manner as the Easter meeting, when the required Representative or Representatives shall in like manner be elected.
- 12.— The President or a Vice-President, and six other Members of the Committee shall be competent to manage the business at every meeting duly convened.

13.—All Clergymen of the Diocese holding the Bishop's license, shall be ex-efficio honorary members of the Committee with the right of speaking, but not with the exception of the Officers, of voting at its Meetings.

#### TRUSTEE.

14.—The Lord Bishop of the Diocese shall be the Trustee of this Society, and shall have power to let or to take houses or lands, and to receive all rents and interest of monies as the same shall fall due, and shall pay the same to the Treasurer for the time being, taking his receipt, and handing it over to the Committee.

#### GENERAL MEETINGS.

- 15.—An Annual General Meeting of the members and friends of the Society shall be holden in St. John's on the second Thursday after Trinity Sunday, or as soon after as the Bishop may appoint. The Secretary shall give notice to each of the Clergymen in St. John's who shall publish it [with the Bishop's consent] in his Church on the previous Sunday.
- 16.—At the Annual General Meeting a report on the state of the Society, with the Treasurer's accounts duly audited shall pe submitted by the Committee, to be printed, or otherwise, as shall be then add there determined by the members.
- 17.—A special general meeting may be convened at any time, [1] by the President; [2] by a Vice-President and six members of the Committee; or [3] by any twelve members of the Scciety whose payments are not in arrear; provided notice of such meeting be duly given as in the case of annual general meetings.
- 18.—The Chairman shall not vote at any general meeting, except in the case of an equality of votes.

#### COLLECTIONS.

19.—It is expected that a collection for the various objects of the Society will be made every year by every Clorgyman in the Diocese, from every head of a family and every adult member of the Church in his Mission, assisted if need be by his Churca wardens and other respectable members of his congregation.

20.—Every Clergyman shall transmit to the Secretary a list of the contributors to the objects of the Society in his Mission, with the amount of their several payments, and to the Treasurer one fourth at least of his whole collections on or before the last day in

every year, or as soon after as practicable.

N. B.—This Rule does not apply to the Clergy of St. John's who shall send in the whole of their col-

lections to the Treasurer.

I

21.—All Clergymen who have collected as far as possible from every head of a family, and from every adult Member of the Church in their Missions, towards the objects of the Society, for the two years immediately preceding, and who have remitted to the Treasurer one-fourth of the whole collections, shall be entitled to assistance from the funds of the Society towards any of its objects in their own Mis-ion; provided that no Clergyman shall make a collection for his own maintenance separate from, or independent of the general collections; and that pew-rents and assessments be not considered as part of the said collection or collections.

#### GRANTS.

22.—It shall be the duty of the Committee to determine from time to time on the appropriation of the Funds, by making grants towards the objects of the Society under the recommendation and sanction of the President.

23.—No Clergyman declining or neglecting to collect for the Society, or to transmit a list of the con-

tributors, and their payments, and a fourth part of his collection (as directed in Rule 20) shall be entitled to receive any grants from the Society, for himself, or for any of the objects of the Society, in his Mission; provided that where a collection has been duly made, and the list with the fourth-part of the collections transmitted for the two previous years by his predecessor, any Clergyman newly in charge may, before sending his annual collections, ask and receive for any of the objects of the Society, excepting only his own maintenance.

24.—It shall be competent to the Committee to make grants in the usual manner to any Mission, in connection with the Society, which supports its own Clergyman; and any such Mission shall be held to be in connection with the Society whose Clergyman subscribes ten shillings, and makes a collection in his Mission, annually towards the general funds of the

Society.

25.—If a Clorgyman leave his Mission before the time for sending in his annual collection, the Committee shall have power, on the recommendation of the President, to grant him a sum which shall appear equitable.

DUTIES OF OFFICERS.

26.-In the absence of the President, the Archdeacon, or in his absence, the Senior Vice-Presidet shall take the Chair at all meetings of the Committee

or Members, and shall have a casting vote.

27.—The Treasurer shall receive all monies forwarded to him for the objects of the Society, and shall pay or disburse the same as determined by the Committee, and shall furnish to the President and Committee a statement of accounts up to the day appainted for auditing the same.

28.— No money shall be paid or disbursed by the Treasurer except on a written order, specifying the

amount to be paid, and its object; which order must be signed by the Chairman of the Committee at which the grant was made, or in his absence, by the Senior Officer of the Society in St. John's.

29.—The Committee shall meet for the despatch of business in St. John's on the first Thursday after every quarter day, at 2 o'clock, P.M.

30.—A special meeting of the Committee may be convened at any time, either (1) by the President, or [2) by two Vice Presidents, or (3) by any five Members of the Committee; provided due notice of such meeting with its objects be given the day before to all the other members of the Committee in St. John's.

31.—At a special meeting to be holden seven days before the annual meeting, the Committee shall appoint two of their number to examine the Treasurer's Accounts up to that season, which accounts examined approved, and signed by the Auditors as correct, shall be submitted to the Committee to be by them incorporated in or appended to the next yearly Report and so presented to the members at the next annual general meeting.

32,—The Committee shall fix the salary of the Secretary, and shall provide for all the contingent expen-

ses of the Committee and the Society.

#### DUTIES OF THE SECRETARY.

33—The Secretary shall summon and attend all meetings of the Committee and Members, and shall arrange the business, and record minutes of the same to be signed by the Chairman. He shall prepare the Annual Report, and superintend the printing of the same; shall conduct the correspondence with the Clergy and others on behalf of the Committee; and shall be responsible for the safe custody of all books, receipts and papers belonging to the Society.

#### PRAYERS.

34.—All meetings of the Society, or of the Committee, shall be opened and closed with the prayers used at the meetings of the Society for the Propagation of the Gospel, or others provided for the pupose by the Bishop of the Diocese.

#### ALTERATION OF RULES.

35.—These Rules may be altered, repealed or added to by the members assembled at any general meeting: provided the proposed alteration has been stated in writing by any person intending to propose it to the Secretary at least a month before for the information of the President and Committee, and that assent has been given to it by the President and a majority of the whole Committee convened for its consideration; and provided also, that it shall be competent to the President to propose any alteration to a general meeting, notwithstanding such alteration may not have received the assent of the Committee.

#### NEW DEANERIES.

36.—New Deaneries created by the Lord Bishop of the Diocese shall be allowed to elect Representatives; provided that in every Deanery there shall be at least two resident Clergymen, and ten Churches and Congregations.

#### SECURITIES.

37.—At each annual meeting there shall be appointed three members of this Society who shall be requested to examine all securities belonging to the general funds of the Society, or belonging, or appertaining to the Clergy Widows' and Orphans' Fund, or to any other fund over which the Society has, or shall have, control, and to report in writing to the President, or, in his absence, to the Senior Vice-President in St. John's, their opinion upon the sufficiency or insufficiency of the same, and if necessary a special

meeting of the Committee shall be convened to consider such report, and to take such action upon it as

shall be deemed requisite.

38.—All Title Deeds, Mortgages and other Securities belonging to the Society, or over which it has control, shall be deposited and preserved in a suitable muniment box to be provided by the President for the time being, at the expense of the Society, and to be always kept in his charge for the use of the Society.

Note.—While it is expected that every Clergyman in the Colony will make a yearly collection for the promotion of the objects of the Church Society, and impress upon every individual under his Pastoral charge, the obligations by which he is bound to contribute thereto, year by year,—the system of the Church Society does not require any Clergyman to withhold the ordinances of the Church in any case of refusal or neglect to pay towards his support.

## BYE-LAWS OF THE COMMITTEE OF THE NEWFOUNDLAND CHURCH "SOCIETY RESPECTING GRANTS.

#### NEW BUILDINGS.

- 1.—No grant shall be made towards the erection of any Church, School, or Parsonage, or towards the purchase of any Land in any Mission or Settlement, until the land has been secured in trust, for the Members of the Church of England resident in the said settlement for ever.
- 2.—No grant shall be made towards the erection of any Church, School or Parsonage, until a plan with an estimate of the cost, and the means of meeting the cost, have been submitted to the Committee.
- 3.—No grant to any Church shall exceed one-third, and no grant to any School or Parsonage, shall exceed one-fourth of the estimated and probable cost; except under special circumstances, approved by the Committee.
- 4.—The first moiety of any grant towards the erection of any Church, School, or Parsonage, shall not be payable until the building is at least boarded all round and covered in; and the second moiety shall not be payable until the building is finished and ready for occupation and use.
- N.B.—All the above rules shall apply in respect of the enlargement of any Church, School or Parsonage House.

#### REPAIRS.

- 5.—No grant shall be made towards the repair of any Church, School, or Parsonage House, until an extimate of the cost, and the means of meeting the cost, have been submitted to the Committee.
- 6.—No grant shall be made until after an interval of seven years from the last grant for a like purpose; and no grant towards the repair, including painting, of any Church shall exceed one half, or of any School or Parsonage one-third of the probable and estimated cost; except under special circumstances, approved by the Committee.
- 7.—No grant towards the repair of any Church, School, or Parsonage House shall be payable until the work is fully completed, and the cost ascertained, and the whole amount, with the Society's grant provided for.

## PROCEEDINGS,

At the Thirtieth Anniversary of the Newfoundland Church Society holden at St. John's in the Cathedral Sunday School Building, on Wednesday, June 28th, 1871.

The Chair was taken at eight o'clock, P. M., by His Excellency Governor Hill, C. B., supported and assisted by the Right Rev. the Lord Bishop of the Diocese, President, and the Right. Rev. the Lord Bishop Coadjutor.

After prayer, the business of the evening commenced with the reading of the Report and of the Treasurer's Accounts, after which the following Resolutions were proposed, seconded, and carried unanimously:—

Moved by F. B. T. Carter, Esq., seconded by Rev. W. K. White,—

Resolved,—That the Report now read with the Treasurer's accounts be adopted and printed.

Moved by Rev. G. Hutchinson, seconded by Rev. A. Bayly,—

Resolved,—That this meeting desires to acknowledge with devout thankfulness, the great goodness of Almighty God manifested towards this Society the past year.

Moved by the Hon. Judge Robinson, seconded by the Hon A. W. Harvey,—

Resolved,—That this Meeting desires to give an expression of hearty welcome to the Clergy and lay delegates from the outharbors, and of its earnest desire that their deliberations with their brethren in St. John's, under the guidance of the Bishop of the Diocese, may result in the successful foundation of a Synod for the Government of the Church in this Colony, and in making necessary arrangements towards securing the perpetuation of the Episcopate.

Resolved,-That the thanks of this Meeting be given to the President, Officers and Committee of this Society, for their labours in the management of its affairs since the last Annual Meeting. That W. H. MABE, Esq, be appointed Treasurer, and the Rev. G. M. JOHNSON Secretary, for the ensuing year; also that the Hon. A. W. HARVEY, and G. T. RENDELL, Esq., be appointed to perform the duties indicated by the 37th standing Rule.

Resolved,-That the hear'y thanks of the Meeting be respectfully tendered to His Excellency the GOVERNOR, for his kindness in presiding.

A Resolution expressive of the thanks of the Clergy from the Out-harbors, for the kindness experienced by them in the houses of their entertainers of the Laity, during their present visit to St. John's, was also moved by the Rev. J. C. HARVEY, Rural Dean of Conception Bay, seconded by the Rev. E. Colley, and assented to by the Clergy present at the meeting.

## REPORT FOR 1870-71,

NEVER, it is believed, since the foundation of the Newfoundland Church Society, have its friends and supporters assembled under circumstances of greater interest and importance, than at this crisis in the

history of the Church in this Colony.

Your Committee, it will be understood, allude to the contemplated establishment of a Synod for the purpose of securing the perpetuation of the Episcopate amongst us, and the government of the Church, under the rule of its Bishops, from time to time elected by the Synod, according to such constitutional regulations as may be agreed to at its lawful meetings.

Beyond these general remarks upon this subject, your Committee feel that it would be perhaps improper for them to venture at this present time. They teel themselves however impelled to tender their hearty welcome to the Clergy who have come together in such largo numbers to debate upon this important business, and no less to those of the Laity who are in attendance from the Out-harbors as Delegates to the meeting now in session, regretting only that the number of Lay Representatives resident in the Out-harbors is so few, and giving utterance to the earnest hope that, should a Synod now be successfully inaugurated, as is very much to be hoped may be the case, a larger attendance of such Representatives may be obtained in future. Your Committee pray that God's blessing may rest upon the deliberations of the assembled meeting, that they may be conducted

in harmony to a successful termination, and that the issue may redound to the glory of Almighty God, and the welfare of His Church, through Jesus Christ our Lord.

Your Committee now proceed to lay before the meeting a statement of the condition of the general and special funds, with the care of which they have been entrusted.

With regard to the general funds of the Society, they rejoice to be able to make a favorable report. Returns have been received from all the Missions which last year were in connection with the Church Society, one only excepted. They submit to the meeting, in the first place, an account of the collections in St. John's, as affording the chief source of income from which the Society's votes are made from year to year. These have been as follows:—

The Cathedral collection has been increased by the exertions of W. H. MARE, Esq, by whose kind efforts an additional amount of about £120 has been obtained to secure the services of the Rev. Mr. MATHER, who was in consequence appointed to the Cathedral in December last. The two Cathedral Clergy now receive their stipends in full, from the funds of this Society, so that in fact the collection made by Mr. MARE, may be regarded as a continuation, in connection with the Church Society, of the separate fund heretofore maintained toward the

support of the Assistant Minister. It will be seen hence that so far as the original contributions of the Cathedral congregation are concerned. there has been a trifling lose, but when it is stated that the Secretary has again reported the loss of £40 by the removal of three persons from the Cathedral list, of whom two have left the colony, in other words, that in the last two years, £80 Las been lost by the removal of six individual members of the Society. your Committee cannot but think it a matter of congratulation that the Cathedral list shows still so large a total, and are assured that the meeting will readily understand that it has only been by great exertion that so satisfactory a result has been achieved. With reference to the diminished sum received from St. Thomas', the Secretary has been desired to state that a considerable collection has been made during the past year, by which the enlargement of the building used as a Sunday School has been effected. For the diminished collection from St. Mary's, no particular reason has been given. Your Committee observe however, in revising the list, that nearly one third of the whole sum is contributed by two persons only.

The sealers collection, increased last year from £76 5s. 0d. to £100 5s. 0d., has this year reach ed a total of £119 13s. 11d. Of this amount £72 12s. 6d. has been paid by men belonging to St. Johns, and £47 1s. 5d. by men from neighboring outharbors. Of the former sum the whole has been added to the funds of this Society, and of the latter amount £10 13s. 6d. has been paid to the Treasurer, who has consequently received from this source altogether a not amount of £86 6s. 0d., applicable to the general purposes of this Society. The following are the ships visited, and the sums received from each.

It is only right and proper that it should be said that from the Steamship Eagle £20 of the whole amount was given to the Secretary, in the ships' name, by CHARLES BOWRING Esq. Your Committee gladly place this good act on record as the first instance of any such acknowledgement from owners of Gop's goodness in success that has come under their notice, in the hope that in future years this example may be. as they think it should be, more generally followed. The total payments to the Church Society from St. John's have amounted to £740 10s. 1d., while from the various Outharbors and other sources has been contributed a sum of £310 3s. 7d., making with the balance of £404 3s. 5d., with which the year commenced, a total income of £1,454 17s. ld. Out of this amount the following sums have been voted

The balance reported last year has therefore increased to the sum of £574 4s. 9d. a result which all friends of this Society will rejoice to hear communicated.

#### CLERGY WIDOW'S AND ORPHAN'S FUND.

This fund remains in much the condition reported at the last Annual Meeting. It was not of course to be expected that, with an increased number of claims, and with sources of income that have been stationary, the capital fund would continue to accumulate as in previous years. The following is an analysis of the various sources of income, in the usual form.

Apart from any extra exertions that may be made by the Clergy to secure larger collections and more donations, the only source of increase of income consists in the larger amount that will next year accrue to the fund from the circumstance of the Committee having lately purchased Water Company Shares to the value of £550 and a Government Debenture note for £500 sterling, which will together give next year about £20 additional on account of interest. It is evident therefore that, except by greater exertion on the part of the Clergy, for some years no great addition can be expected to the income of the fund, during which having reference to the list of Clergy, it is rather to be expected that the number of Widows will be increased, a prospect which is by no means so encouraging as could be desired with the small amount of annual surplus at this time existing. Your Committee call the attention of the Clergy present to these facts, and respectfully urge them one and all to use their best endeavours to increase the contributions of their people under the two heads of collections and donations, so that an amount of income may be secured sufficient to meet the largest annual average of pensions that can be expected to arise. Since the last Annual Meeting the Committee have adopted the rule of granting pensions of £4C each to Widows who have children under the age mentioned in the 10th standing rule, and to all others £35 only.

#### BOOK DEPOSITORY.

The Depot continues under the care of Mrs. Rouse, at 296, Water Street, St. Joha's, and is at present in a very prosperous condition. During the last year, the sale of Books amounted to £397 17s. 9d. a larger sale than in any previous year. Your Committee are assured that no exertion will be spared to keep the Depot in this satisfactory condition, on the part of those in charge, and strongly recommend all members of our Church to have recourse to it for all kinds of religious and useful Books.

### THEOLOGICAL COLLEGE ENDOWMENT FUND.

Some additions have been made to this fund since the accounts given in the last Report, raising the total amount received to somewhat more than £7,000 stg., in the English 3 per cent consols, and yielding therefore an annual income not exceeding £200 stg. It will be seen from this statement that the College, for the support of which the original grant from S. P. G. of £300 stg. per annum was always found insufficient, has not yet become independent of extraneous assistance. Subscriptions may still be paid towards this fund through the hands of the Bishop or any of the Clergy.

It will be remembered that in the last Report information was given of a suggestion having been received by the Bishop from S. P. G. that the continuance of the Episcopate in this Colony must depend

on some provision being made for the endowment of the See, and that a vote of no less a sum than £2,000 stg. had been passed by the Venerable Society, subject to the condition that an additional £8,000 stg. be raised in five years from January, 1871. Nothing has as yet been done towards meeting the call thus made, of which the importance can scarcely be over estimated. It is however hoped that some active measures may be shortly taken towards raising the required amount. A Hundred Pounds sterling has already been contributed by an Officer in Bermuda as a foundation for the fund, to which another like sum has been added, and, with a few smaller subscriptions, paid to a separate account in the Commercial Bank under the name of the "Bishopric Endowment Fund." Further additions may be made to this account by any who may be desirous of contributing, either through the Bishops or Clergy, or by payment direct to the Commercial Bank, if this should be preferred. Many such payments it is hoped may be made before another meeting.

The Coadjutor Bishop last year accomplished a Missionary Voyage in the Church Ship "Star," commencing with a call at St. Peter's, and including visits to St. George's Bay, for the purpose of introducing Rev. Mr. HALL as the future Missionary, proceeding thence some distance along the coast of Labrador, and visiting also White Bay, Green Bay, and many places in the Northern Missions, specially those least accessible to their Clergy, so that while the circuit of the Diocese was completed in its course, his Lordship was able to give special attention to those parts which from necessity receive least frequent visits from the Clergy scattered along our coasts. His Lordship will D.V. shortly sail again for the purpose of a visitation of the Western Missions, for which the regular time has this year again come round.

An Ordination was held last autumn when Mr. George Bishop of the Theological College was admitted Deacon, and on Sunday last (June 18) Mr. Charles Warren was also ordained deacon. St. Peters day, it is hoped the Rev. Mesers Skinner. Smith and Meek will be advanced to the Priesthood. Your Committee congratulate the meeting on the presence of His Excellency the Governor in the chair, and of the Bishop of the Diosese and of the Coadjutor Bishop. They also repeat their expression of pleasure at the presence of so many of the Clergy, whose addresses at the last meeting were the means of conveying so much interesting information, and trust that the members of the Church present on this occasion may again be made partakers of like benefit and advantage.

Subscriptions paid after Jan. 31, in each year, will come under a fine of 10 per cent. See Rule 5.

It is particularly requested that all subscription lists and remittances to the Church Society may be made up and sent in, as far as practicable, not later than some time in the month of March in each year.

#### STANDING RULES

#### OF THE

# Clergy Widows' and Orphans' Fund.

- 1—THE NEWFOUNDLAND CHURCH SOCIETY'S Special Fund, for assisting the Widows and Orphans of deceased Clergymen of the Diocese of Newfoundland, shall consist of all monies paid to the Treasurer of the Society for that object.
- 2—The Committee of the Church Society shall nave the management of the Fund.
- 3.—Every Hundred Pounds of available surplus shall be invested by the Committee as opportunities occur. Smaller sums shall be deposited every quarter in the Savings' Bank.
- 4.—All Clergymen in the Diocese holding the Bishop's license may secure the benefit of this Fund by contributing within six months from the time of obtaining their License from the Bishop as follows:—(1) Unmarried Clergymen and Widowers without a child, one pound (£1) per annum: (2) Married Clergymen (and such as shall afterwards become married,) and Widowers with a child, two pounds (£2) per annum.
- 5.—Annual subscriptions shall be payable in advance on the 1st day of January in each year:—provided

that Clergymen on entry shall for that year pay only a rateable proportion of the annual subscription up to the first day of January following. Thirty days grace shall be allowed, but every Clergyman, neglecting to make payment within that time, shall forfeit his claim upon the Fund to be recovered only upon payment of arrears, with ten per cent. thereon, before the following first day of January.

6.—Any Clergyman neglecting to subscribe according to Rule 4, or to pay his annual subscription within the time limited by Rule 5, may, if the Committee see fit to admit or readmit him, secure the benefit of the Fund by the payment of two pounds ten shillings (£1 10) if married or a widower with a child; and one pound ten shillings (£1 10) if unmarried or a widower without a child, from the day on which the last annual subscription be paid was due, or from the date of his being licensed by the Bishop, and from the date of such admission, or re-admission, he shall come under the operation of Rule 4.

7.—Every Clergyman securing the benefit of this Fund will be required to make a yearly collection for the same in his Mission, and to forward the amount with his own annual subscription, to the Treasurer.

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8.—The Widow of every Clergyman who shall have paid his annual subscription, and forwarded an annual collection, till his death, or till incapacitated by mental or bodily infirmity, shall be entitled to receive a yearly Pension of thirty pounds (£30) currency, during widowhood.

9.—If the Fund should at any time permit, the Committee may increase the amount of Pension to any sum not exceeding £50; such an addition, however, being subject to be withdrawn wholly or in part, should the state of the Fund not warrant its continuance.

10 — If the Widow die or marry again, the Pension shall be paid to Trustees for the benefit of such Children of the deceased husband, as may be, if boys, under sixteen, if girls, under eighteen years of ago.

11.—The Trustees named by a deceased Clergymen, in the event of the death or marriage of his Widow, shall be recognized by the Committee in paying the Pension for the benefit of the child or children; but if the Trustees so named are unwilling or unable to act, the Bishop of the Diocese shall act as Trustee in the application of the Pension.

12.—If the wife die before her husband, his child or children shall receive the Pension, so long as there is a claimant under Rule ten.

13.-The Pensions shall be paid half yearly by the Bishop's order on the Treasurer on the first of January and first of July. The first payment to be calculated for the interval from the husband's death to the day of payment.

12 -If a Clergyman, having joined the fund after the 24th June, 1863, removes from the Diocese after having served less than fourteen years, his connection with the fund shall cease, and he shall be entitled to receive back half the amount of the annual supscriptions he has paid If he removes after having served fourteen years and less than twenty-one years, he shall be allowed to remain in connection with the Fund by paying an annual subscription of six pounds, or nine pounds if residing within the tropics; or he may receive back half his annual subscriptions, upon which his connection with the Fund shall cease. If he removes after having served twenty one years, he shall be allowed to remain in connection with the Fund by paying an annual subscription of five pounds, or seven pounds tou shillings if residing within the tropics; or he may receive back three-fourths of his annual subscriptions, upon which his connection with the Fund shall cease. All Clergymen in connection with the Fund previous to the 24th June, 1863, to be governed by the original Rule 14 thereof.

15.—A yearly statement of the Treasurer's accounts with this Fund shall be published with the Society's Report.

16.— None of the above Rules shall be altered, or repealed, except at a general meeting of the Church Society, and after a full years notice to the members of the proposed change.

"The tollowing is the original Rule 14, governing Clergymen in connection with the Fund before June 24, 1863.

14.—If a clergyman removes, with the Bishop's consent, from the Diocese, after officiating in it not less than seven years, he shall be allowed his claim upon the Fund, on the payment of an annual subscription of three pounds (£3); or, if he desire it, may receive back half the amount he has paid; which repayment shall release the Fund from all his claims upon it."




