A Dramatic Appeal. "Let me tell you simply this : The day on which, amid the shock of furious poli-tical passions, I saw let loose over our coun-try this tempest of madness, when I saw everything I had learned to revere and love since childhood imperilled, I, a Frenchman, the son of a soldler, endured every torture. When I turned my eyes towards Devil's Island, where was buried alive one who, from the bottom of my heart, I believe to be a martyr, I began to wonder if divine justice had not abandoned him. Since then I have recovered. I have hearkened to the voice of my conscience and have pursued an undeviating course, free from anger and passion, not heeding hatred or prejudice. I have done my duty. You will do yours, which is to mete out justice." Dreyfus' Position Defined. The Sixth Document. The sixth document was a letter written by Count Von Munster-Ledenburg, the Ger-man Ambassador to France, from Germany to Col. Schwartzkoppen, the Military At-tache to Germany at Paris, containing the words, "as regards Dreyfus, we are easy." M.
