I have been informed that one of the manufacturers, I do not know whom, has succeeded in producing ferrules which instead of weakening the rod at important points, actually strengthen it.

Next to the rod with a "back-action kick" it is to be avoided, in the long and excessively pliable one. We used to see in quite common use rods of twenty feet in length and almost as limber as a trout rod.

The line guides of the rod should have opening sufficiently wide to permit the line to run freely. Rings I have entirely discarded, for they bind or hold the line somewhat to an extraordinary degree.

As a business concern of (New York and Philadelphia) a year or two ago was preparing to put on the market salmon rod guides which promised to prove a great boon to salmon and bass anglers.
