The commission appointed to inquire into the defenses of the Dutch East Indies has reported in favor of establishing a Dutch navy, comprising nine Dreadnoughts of 21,000 tons each, five of which shall be constantly stationed in the Indies, the construction of a naval base and three forts at Janjongpriok and the organization of a naval institute.


