An Act to vest in Ephraim Doolittle and Robert Johnson, a certain allowance for Road in the Township of Haldimand.

WHEREAS Ephraim Doolittle and Robert Johnson, both of the Preamble.
 Township of Haldimand, in the County of Northumberland, farmers, and divers other freeholders of the said Township, have by their petition represented, that the said Ephraim Doolittle is the owner in fee
 5 and occupier of the north halves of lots numbers fourteen and fifteen, in the Broken Front, Concession A, of the said Township, and that the said Robert Johnson is the owner in fee and occupier of the south halves of the same lots; that the allowance for road between the said lots has never
 10 been opened, but that instead thereof, and for the greater convenience of the public, in consequence of the extreme unfitness of the said road allowance for a road, a strip of land taken for the most part from off the east
 side of the said lot number fourteen, has been used by the public as a highway for nearly fifty years, and is now used as such from the regular
 15 highway, between Cobourg and Kingston to the Lake Shore; for which no compensation has been made to the said Doolittle and Johnson, and the petitioners have prayed that the said present highway may be confirmed, and the original road allowance vested in the said Ephraim Doolittle and Robert Johnson, each for his proper share, and it is right to grant the
 prayer of the said petition; Therefore Her Majesty, &c.:

20 I. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary in any Act or Law, so much of the original allowance for road between lots numbers fourteen and
 fifteen in the said Broken Front, Concession A, of the said Township of
 Haldimand, as lies between the north halves of the said lots, is hereby
 vested in the said Ephraim Doolittle, his heirs and assigns forever; and so
 25 much of the said allowance for road as lies between the south halves of the said lots is hereby vested in the said Robert Johnson, his heirs and assigns forever; and the strip of land mentioned in the Preamble as being
 now used as a highway instead of the said allowance for road, shall be
 30 a public highway from the main road between Kingston and Cobourg to the Lake Shore.

Road allowance vested in Doolittle and Johnson.

Present Road confirmed.

II. This Act shall be deemed a public Act.
