The Reciprocity Treaty.

So many contradictory statements have appeared regarding the position of the question of trade with the provinces of British North America, and settlement of the fisheries disputes settlement of the fisheries disputes and the free navigation of the river St. Lawrence, that it has been con-St. Lawrence, that it has been considered proper to obtain correct information upon the subject. The following dispatch from Washington fully explains how the negotiations stand at present:—"Mr.Thornton, the British Minister, addressed a note to Mr. Seward in July last, calling his attention to the distressed condition of the people of Nova Scotia in consequence of their exclusion from our markets consequent upon the termination of the Reciprocity Treaty, and saking him to enter into legal negotiations. Mr. Seward referred Mr. Thornton's communication to Mr. McCulloch, Secretary of the Treasury. Mr. McCulloch replied that the treaty having been abrogated by the legislative branch of the government, he considered it would not advisable to resume negotiations until Congress should be reported, and at the same time expressing his opinion that it was for the interest of the United States and the committee of ways and means just before the July adjournment.
