
Ladies and gentlemen: As it seems to be the general desire that I offer myself as a candidate for the position on the city council recently vacated by Mr. Ramsay, I have decided to accept. I may say that I am favorable to a strict enforcement of all our laws with absolute impartiality. I think that a commission should be appointed whose duty it would be to have charge of the administrative department of the city's affairs; that this commission should be composed of the best men available, and that the ybe allowed to act as independently of the city council as would be consistent with the idea of responsible government.

I am favorable to the principle of the municipal ownership of all public utilities and would consent to no dealings with any private individual which in my opinion jeopardised that principle.

The future growth of Calgary as a manufacturing centre depends almost solely upon our ability to furnish cheap power and every legitimate effort should be used to accomlish this end.

I thank those who have honored me with their confidence and if elected I will do my utmost to serve the ward and the city, conscientiously and well.






