

He believed that the government would be returned on trat issue, receiving the votes of many old-time Liberals, who withdrew their support at the last election. Mr. Spence wondered if the temper-ance people would be satisfied with a mere promise. "You know we got that before," he observed, with a suggestion of doubt lurking in his smile; but he might commit himself so far as to try to carry the bill thru the legislature, and, if defeated, appeal to the peoplei on it. That would satisfy the temperance people."

Windows of the theatre thru which many people might have escaped were closed and covered with heavily bolted sheet iron doors, according to Mix. Maud Macdonald Nickey, who to-day, for the first time, was able to relate the details of her escape. Her story may be an important feature of the coroner's inquest. More than a half dozen windows on the first floor within easy reach of those who occupied seats in the orches-ta circle were closed and covered on the outside by iron doors, whose bolts had rusted or would not loosen. Only one of these windows responded to the frantic efforts of a dozen people. Many persons, Mrs. Nickey believes, fell dead trying to open other windows. **Paralyzed Business.** The closing down of Chicago theatres
