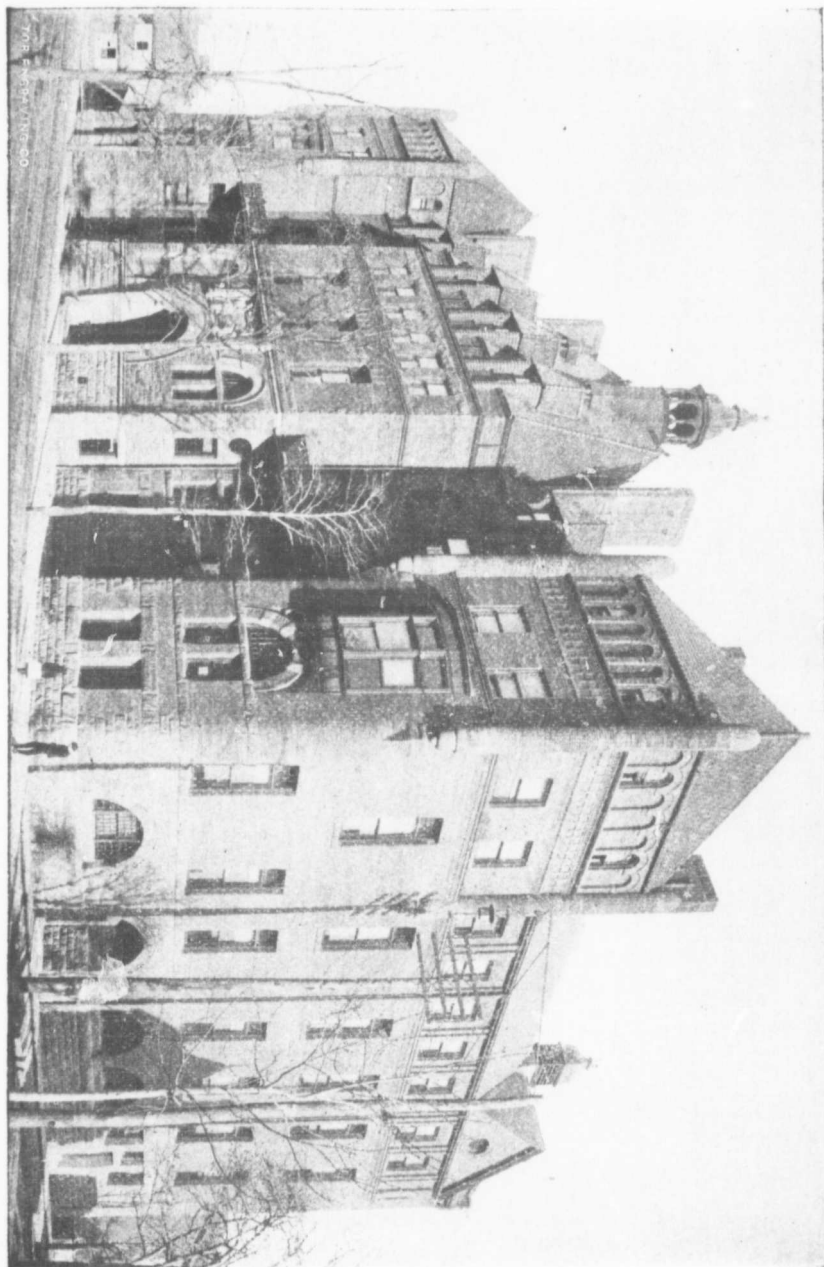

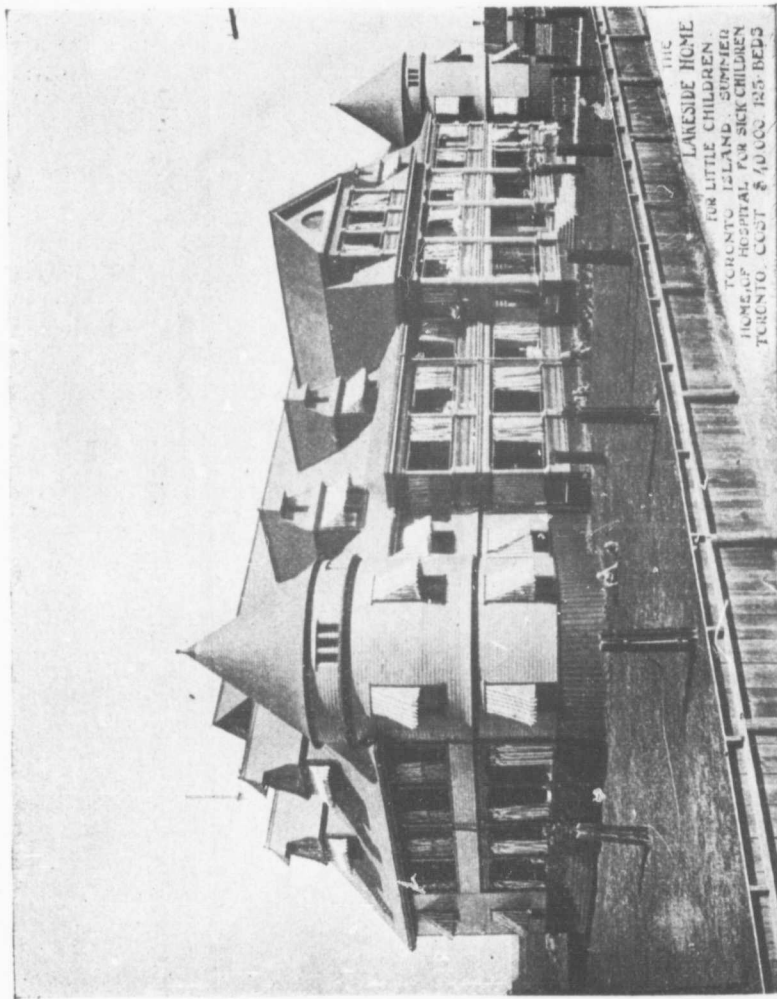

TWENTY-THIRD ANNUAL REPORT.

The Trustees of the Hospital for Sick Children, College street, Toronto, in which corporation is also included The Lakeside Home for Little Children, on Toronto Island, beg to present to the public the Twenty-third Annual Report of the institution.

In doing so it is with gratification that the Trust are enabled to announce that the area of the work of the Hospital has extended, that a greater number of cases has been treated and that there is a visible and satisfactory increase in the percentage of cases where perfect cure and improvement have been effected.

The Government year for hospitals and charities ends on the 30th September, and the financial year of the Hospital, therefore, closes on the same date. Hitherto it has been customary to pay the September accounts in October, but this year the Trust has directed that, in order to conform to the Government returns and show exactly the expenditure to date, all accounts up to the end of the financial year shall be paid within the year. The actual income and expenditure for the year ending 30th September is given in the financial statements, so that for the past year the statement will show twelve months' income and thirteen months' expenditure. Future years will, of course, show the usual twelve months' expenditure.

The gross income for the year 1898 is \$43,575.24, being \$26,408 less than that of 1897. This shortage is accounted for by a decrease in bequests of \$21,455, a decrease in the Government grant and in special donations.

While the income has decreased, it is satisfactory to note that the sources of income have visibly augmented, as follows:—

Donations from the general public and fraternal societies have increased by \$2,700; Sunday schools and churches by \$370; pay patients by \$390, and cot support \$20, and students' fees by \$164.

These new sources of income have developed in 1898, viz., from the Toronto Public School children, \$1,397; Ontario Public School children, \$1,153 municipalities outside of Toronto, \$1,078, or a total increase of \$7,272.

The expenditure for the year ending 1898 is \$32,837.02, that is, for thirteen months. Deducting one-thirteenth from this amount for comparison with 1897, there remains \$30,311, which is actually \$633 less than 1897, although 1898 had an increase of 15 per cent. of the daily average of patients.

The per capita expenditure per day for 1897 was 99.15c; for 1898 it was 88.33c.

The average daily number of patients for 1897 was 87.26; for 1898, 100.30, and yet the expenditure for the latter year with the increased number of patients and attendance is actually \$633 less than for 1897.

The expenditure for food supplies for 1897 shows a cost of 21.20c. per patient per day; for 1898, it shows 21.63c, although there was an increase of ten per cent in the attendants for 1898.

The dispensary department shows an increase in the expenditure for medical and surgical appliances of \$503 over 1897, but this is owing to the increased number of orthopedic cases—that is, cases of deformities in the feet and legs of children. There has also been an increase in the number of patients at the Out-door Department, and yet the total expenditure for this department for 1898 shows a decrease in the per capita rate, that for 1897 being 7.25c, and for 1898 7.20c.

The greatest care is exercised in the Out-door Department, so that only those who are absolutely unable to pay receive advice and medicine free. In order to still further provide against any imposition, the Trust has ordered that every person applying for relief shall bring a circular, signed by either a clergyman or a medical man, stating that the applicant is unable to pay.

This is the seventh year of the work in the College street building, and in order that it might be kept up to the best standard of efficiency the building has required a certain amount of renovation. The same may be said of the furniture. This renovation has to be made about every seven years.

Over one-half of the expenditure for buildings and furniture was made in accordance with special donations, which could not be varied. These donations included re-modelling the entire front of The Lakeside Home by enlarging the verandah space, thus materially increasing the facilities for work and the comforts of the Island home.

During this year a night supervisor has been added to the staff. This has been found necessary in order that perfect discipline may be attained, and that every ward in the Hospital during the hours of the night may be visited by an official who is continually making the rounds of the wards.

Another valuable addition to the work is the appointment of a competent masseuse, an expert, who is now treating about a dozen cases per day. The results of her work are most encouraging. In addition to her massage duties she aids the Lady Superintendent and Assistant Superintendent in whatever work is allotted her.

This year the Trust has added \$8,069.63 to the assets of the Hospital, which now stand \$162,710.77, as against liabilities of \$54,315.05.

While this is satisfactory, it must be borne in mind that all income over and above the grants made by the Ontario Government and corporation of Toronto has to come by the grace of the friends of the Hospital.

The actual expenditure of the Hospital for maintenance for twelve months is \$30,311, or about \$2,500 per month. Exclusive of bequests and special donations the income was about \$35,000. The excess over the amount required for maintenance enabled the Trust to pay a part of the debt that was pressing and had to be discharged. It must be borne in mind that with all this effort the Hospital has a mortgage of \$50,000, which takes \$2,250 per year in interest, and a bank overdraft for \$4,000. Indeed, were it not for the bequests paid during the past four years, the work of the Hospital would be hampered to a great extent.

The medical and surgical work of the Hospital has been attended by most satisfactory results.

At the beginning of the year 1898 there were 86 patients in the Hospital and 547 were admitted during the year, making a total number of patients under treatment up to 30th September last 633.

Of these 633 cases there were 470 from the city of Toronto and 163 from places outside of Toronto. Last year Toronto furnished 444 patients and

outside places 118. These figures show that the patients from outside places are increasing and, naturally, the interest in the Hospital work as well. This year patients were received from 136 places outside of Toronto; last year from 83 places.

In this connection it will be borne in mind that the contribution of \$7,500 per year to the Hospital by the city of Toronto is so much per capita for every patient in the Hospital, irrespective of locality.

The results for the year ending 30th September, 1898, are as follows:—Of the 633 patients received 515 were discharged alive, of which number 334, or 65 per cent. were cured, 141 or 37 per cent. improved, and 40 or 8 per cent unimproved; and there were 24 deaths; 94 patients remained in the Hospital at the end of the year. The average stay in the Hospital was 57 $\frac{3}{4}$ days as compared with 56.57 for 1897.

It is to be noted that in the number of deaths four cases were children under the age of 3 years, which were in the Hospital an average of 13 days, and that in very many of these cases patients were brought into the Hospital when their condition was hopeless, 5 being less than a day each in the Hospital.

The percentage of deaths to those discharged alive is 4.56.

There were 415 surgical operations this year, for 1897 258, being an increase of 157.

The treatment at the Out-door or Dispensary Department, was accorded to 4,466 cases, being an increase of 333 over last year.

With a view of increasing the interest in and aiding the work, the Trust has placed this year in 150 shops and public buildings collection boxes, and will shortly have 300 such boxes in operation. From this source an increase of \$1,500 may be reasonably expected.

The amount needed for surgical appliances is a severe tax on the funds, while at the same time it is gratifying to know that a score of cases every year enter the Hospital walking with the aid of crutches, and that as they pass out of the doors of the institution they bid farewell to these aids forever.

The noble gifts of the Ontario and Toronto Public schools call for the special thanks of the Trust. The generosity of the little ones, for their brothers and sisters who lie suffering in our cots and beds, has brought them many comforts otherwise unattainable. There are two cots named in the interests of these donors: the "Ontario Public School Children's Cot" and the "Toronto Public School Children's Cot." It is hoped that the interest already taken will be increased, and that both these cots will be fully endowed by the givings at the coming Christmas season.

This year we are indebted to the generosity of Mr. John R. Barber, of Georgetown, and Mr. E. B. Eddy, of Hull and Ottawa, for the paper used in the twenty thousand copies of these reports which are issued.

The aid from many of the fraternal societies has been generous, as will be seen by the cash donation list. The Masonic fraternity has remembered the sick little ones every Christmas. Last year the lodges sent in \$2,200, and during the past seven years the private lodges have given \$5,637, exclusive of the Grand Lodge of Canada gift of \$2,000 and a like sum from the Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of Canada.

The contributions from the Sunday schools have been a great help, totalling \$1,457. From many other sources, as the cash donation list shows, friends all over the Province have been liberal.

The Medical Staff, the Secretary, Mr. J. H. Gordon, the Lady Superin-

tendent, Miss Louise C. Brent, and all the officials have been most attentive to their duties.

The Committee of Ladies who supervise much of the inside work, have been most attentive to their duties; and Miss Buchan, the Treasurer of the Board, has been most devoted to the task of caring for the funds; indeed, all around, as Dr. Chamberlain, the Government Inspector, says, "the work is a model for all such institutions—an example of what labour reduced to a perfect system will do in the carrying out of the business of a great charity, which produces the best results in its line of work."

The funds of the Hospital are so low at the present time that the Trustees are compelled, as before stated, to make an overdraft at the bank to pay current expenses.

The Hospital for Sick Children is not in any sense a local institution. It is a Provincial charity, and takes care of sick children from every township in every county in Ontario.

The institution is undenominational. Its doors fly open at the cry of suffering childhood, irrespective of creed, colour or nationality.

It is absolutely necessary that before the 1st of January this overdraft should be covered, and that by the 1st of February \$25,000 be paid to the mortgagees. If this can be accomplished the Trust have been assured that the remainder of the debt may be wiped out before the end of the century.

Aid for the Hospital is more than ever necessary this year. The average number of patients is increasing daily and additional nurses are required.

As has been already said, we have before us that great mortgage indebtedness, the yearly interest on which takes away from the funds an amount sufficient to care for 50 sick children—should each patient remain the average time of 57 days.

This shows clearly how the \$50,000 mortgage eats into the sustaining donations of the Hospital.

A special appeal—a strong appeal—is made to the friends of the Hospital to lift this load.

Again and again have we rested in the hope that some of the wealthy residents of the province would come to our relief.

The Hospital is rich in friends and poor in funds. Last year there were many thousand individual donors. Some progress was made. But some means should be devised to bring the claims of the Hospital before the few who can give much.

\$50,000 will seem a small sum when many purses are opened.

There are 500 generous men in Ontario who could spare \$100 each.

And there are 5000 who would not miss \$10 each.

Start now, and the Hospital will round out the Nineteenth Century free from debt.

Help now, and the Hospital will be as rich in funds as it is rich in friends.

This is a call from a work of mercy.

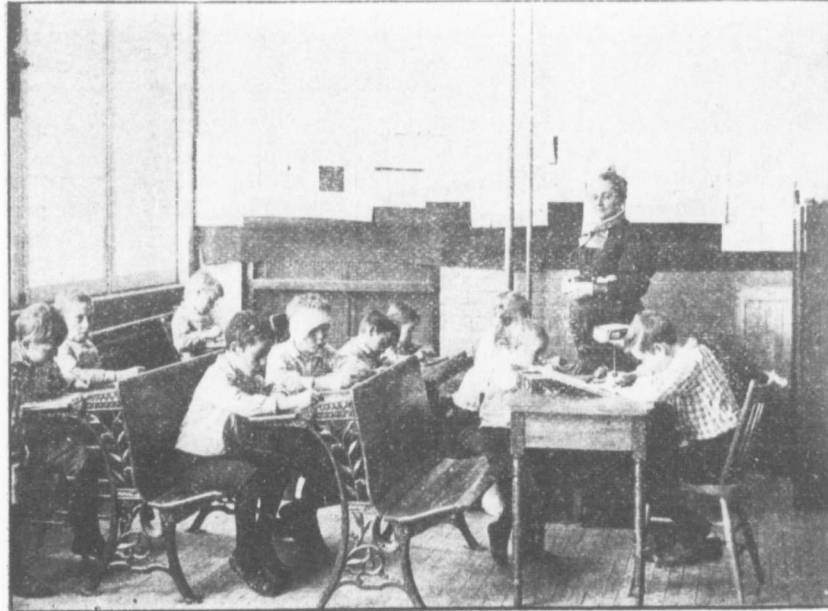
Fig. 9.—After.

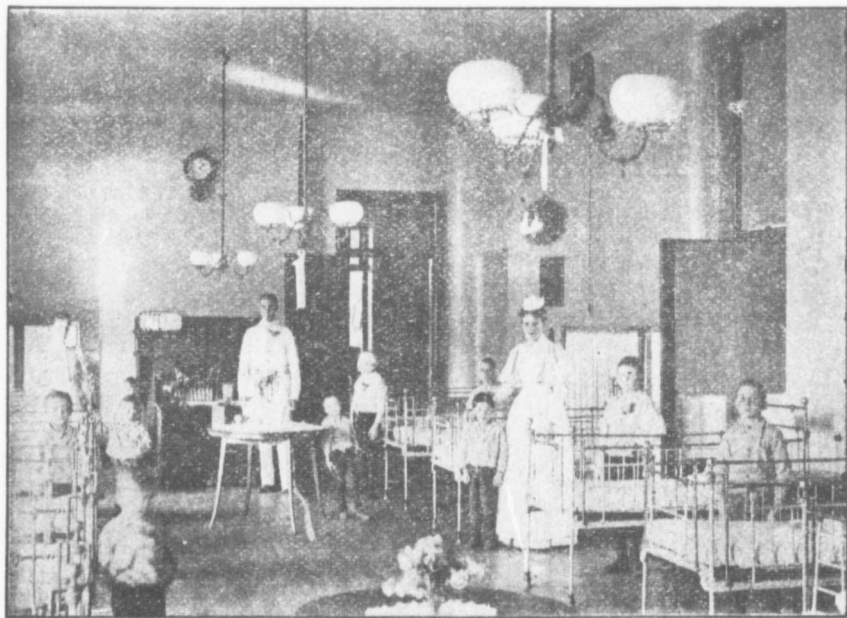

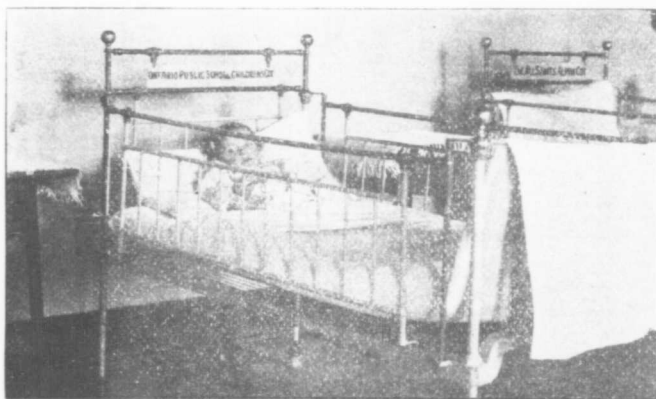

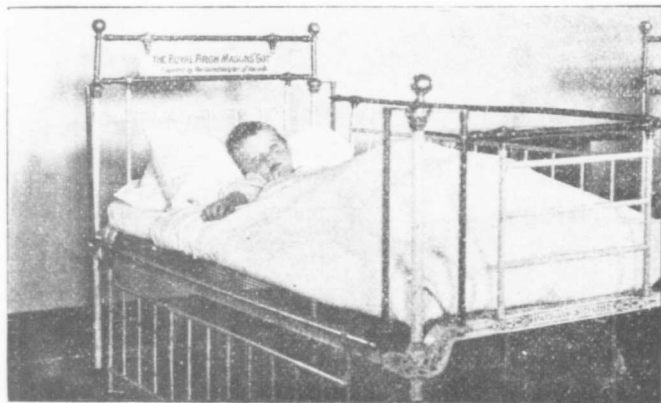
GRAND LODGE OF CANADA COT, No. 1.

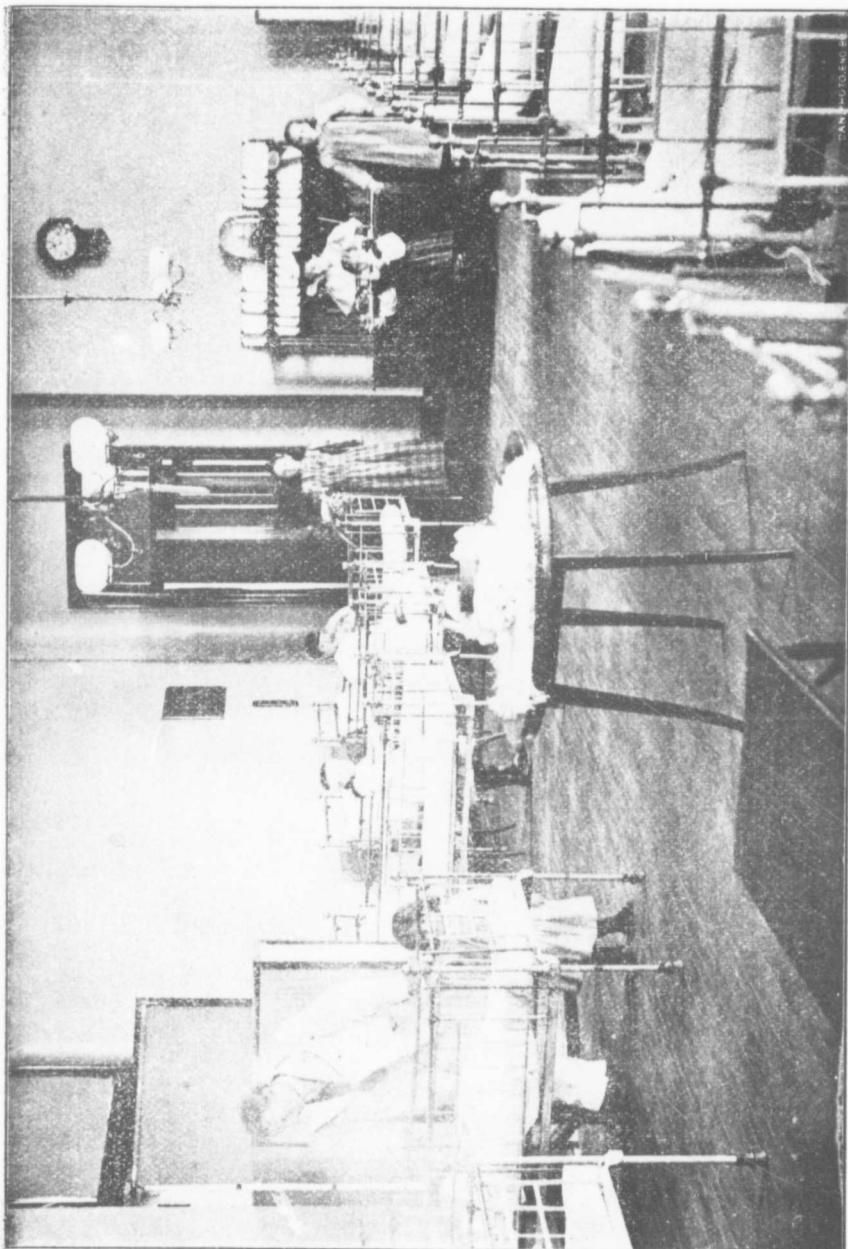

THEIR BEAUTIFUL BAZAAR.

Description of an Interesting Event at the Hospital for Sick Children—What was Seen and Done.

Bazaars are nothing new in Toronto. The fine taste of our ladies—and of children trained in fancy work—has often been shown in this way. But never before in the history of this city has a bazaar been held of so unique a character as that in the Hospital for Sick Children on College street, Friday afternoon, Nov. 5th, 1897.

It was unique because the articles on exhibition were all made by sick, invalid and crippled children—inmates of that institution. Under the auspices of the Public School Board a school is open there for such children as are able to attend. In this way the little people lose no time in the convalescent period and their education is going forward without interruption. Miss E. Y. Sams, a lady especially qualified for this kind of work, is the teacher. Not only are "the three R's" taught, but music, drawing, sewing and needle-work also receive attention.

For eighteen months these busy bees have been making about 300 articles for their bazaar. The designs in some cases, are original, though Miss Sams sketched most of them. In Ward E they were arranged in two sections; the first containing a quantity of useful and ornamental articles of various patterns, and the second being a dolls' table.

Here were dollies of all nationalities, in all stages of growth—from the baby dolly to the mature woman dolly. True most of them bore marks of budding genius only, while others were most tastily dressed, the work being finely wrought. There was a chilly little doll from Iceland and a peek-a-boo Japanese dolly; there was a widow who felt very sad and another who blushed behind her sombre veil and had a twinkle in her eye that was not mournful; there was a fashionable widow dressed in the finest black silk with "a perfect fit." There were Diana and Chloe dollies, in graded shades; there were chubby boy dolls and a young dolly-bride "just too sweet for anything"; there were ladies of high degree and maids of low estate, there were dollies galore, and Santa Claus could get many a hint from this wonderful collection.

Some fine-looking little misses served the many customers who came to buy the babies. The sales-girls were inmates of the Hospital and wore its badge of white silk with the Red Cross.

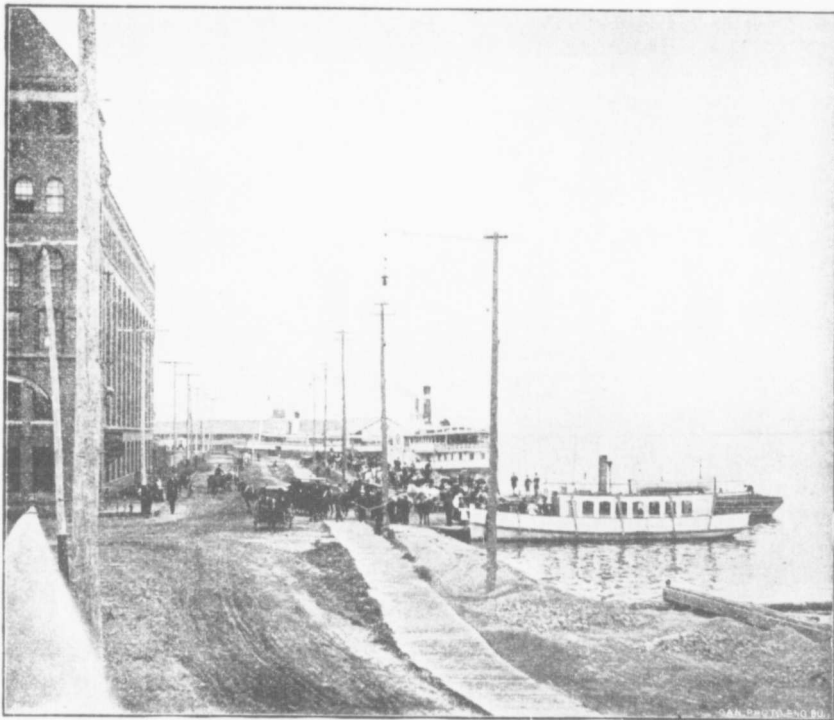

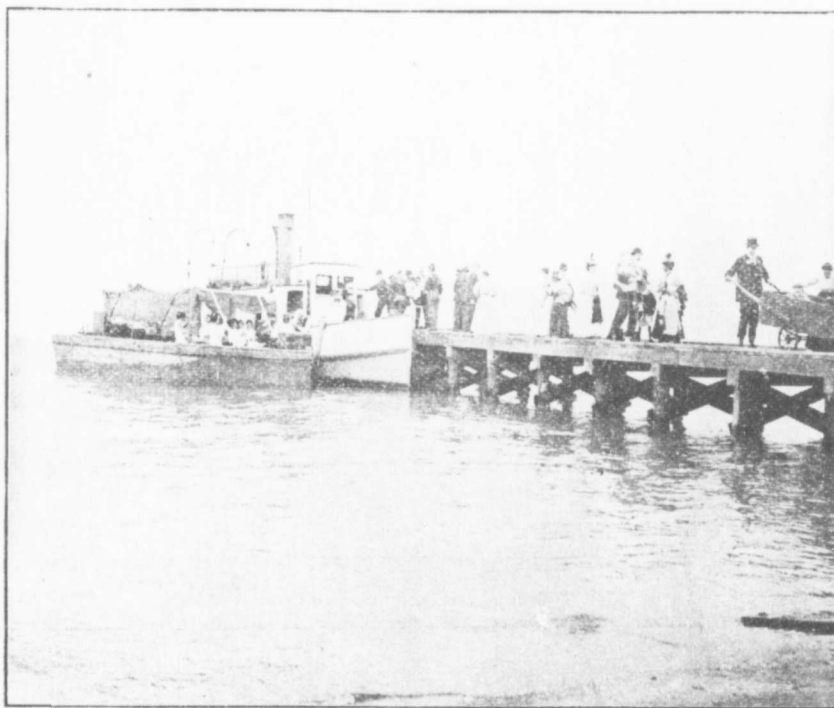

"Miss Sams," said a poor little crippled boy, "I want a dog sketched." The "dog" was outlined and the little fellow patiently worked into it the floss and zephyr to bring out a life-likeness of the bow-wow. Strange to say, many of these articles were made by boys, and so deftly was the work done that it could not be detected as that of little fellows, whom cruel sickness tied down so that they could not take to ball and bat, and the usual games in which boys delight.

The work thus had its pathetic side. One could well imagine that there was inwrought in these pretty articles many an ache and pain; for some of these boys and girls are pain-bearers always. It is a token of infinite patience and remarkable skill.

It would take several pages to describe these articles. There were mats, handkerchief holders, corncob zephyr handles, bootees, cushions, little beds completely furnished, decorated bureaux, housewives, a commercial traveler's sample ribbons, worked into a handsome Joseph's coat, embroidered articles, pen wipers of all kinds, baby carriage robes, little jack tars, birds, etc., etc., each one bearing the name of the maker.

The bazaar opened at two o'clock, and continued well into the evening. The room was constantly crowded, the sales were brisk, and, doubtless, a handsome sum was netted for this beneficent and popular institution. The Ladies' Committee of the Hospital was energetic in the arrangement and disposal of the goods. A large Canadian flag was swung across the ward, and the beautifully decorated tables presented a most pleasing picture.

The ladies' fancy table was laden with donated articles in charge of Mrs. Donald and the Misses Dack, Eby, Mara and Bessie Hees. The candy table, laden with choice sweet-meats, had as its presiding coterie Misses Mabel Lee, Alice Stewart, Agnes Drynan, Jean Smith. Those presiding at the tea table were Mrs. F. Snyder, Misses E. Tyner, A. Gzowski, F. Montzambert, M. Abell. The ice cream dispensers were Misses Susanne Mara and Louise Matthews. Those who sold the sweet-scented flowers were Misses Kathleen and Harriet Cassels. Recipes for cooking and other household work were sold by Mrs. J. Price and Miss

H. Hough. The misses who sold the children's work were Nora Eby, Kate Crawford, Annie Shipway, Bessie Patton and Ettie Nixon.

Tea was served to a great many ladies, and to a few gentlemen. Then followed a fine concert, given by Mrs. Scrimger-Massie, soprano, Miss Ella Ronan, contralto, Mr. W. Rundle, tenor, Mr. Arthur Miller was accompanist.

For the benefit of the children the trustees had Oldfield's Punch and Judy imported into the conservatory playroom, and here the invalids, their nurses and friends had a jolly time, as they saw the antics of the old man, his wife, the luckless baby and Mephisto, and all the rest of it. Take it all through the affair was a delightful one, and those who bought the articles made by the patients, and in other ways patronized the bazaar, felt themselves doubly repaid.

It may be added that the children who made these articles, and thus helped to contribute to their Hospital Home, are, by no means, all Toronto children. They come from upwards of 60 villages, towns and cities of the Dominion. This shows the cosmopolitan character of the Hospital for Sick Children, and how it dispenses its glorious charity throughout the length and breadth of our land.

FOR CONVALESCING BREEZES.

Removal of 77 Patients from the Hospital for Sick Children to Their Summer Home on Toronto Island.

Twenty-four carriages laden with pale-faced children passed down Yonge street Tuesday afternoon, June 2nd. They were preceded by Professor Geddes, of the City Ambulance. In all, seventy-seven children were in the carriages and in the ambulance. They were the convalescent patients from the Hospital for Sick Children. Little girls and boys who were struggling back to health and strength after a wrestle with weakening disease—these children were on their way to The Lakeside Home for Little Children. The Lakeside Home is situated on the south-western corner of the Island, where the pure fresh breezes give aid to the physician and the nurse in bringing back the bloom to the cheeks of the little children.

Laid in the two ambulances which headed the procession of carriages there were ten little boys and girls who could neither sit nor stand. They reached the wharf first, and, though

weak and weary, happiness beamed in every eye of the ten sufferers when they were carefully pillowed in the launch that was to carry them over.

Half a dozen young medical men offered their assistance. They carried the children from the Hospital door to the carriages. They placed the helpless ones in the lap of the nurse—one of whom rode in each carriage, and at the embarkation and disembarkation they tenderly lifted the crippled and weak ones.

Sadness and gladness were blended together in the sight. Though sick and suffering there was a bright look on the face of every child. Some of the little ones found time to sympathize with the patients who had to be left behind at the big College street institution—some too sick and weak to be moved—others so strong and well that they would be going home in a day or so. Others again were awaiting the time when they should undergo surgical operations, after which they too will be removed to the convalescent home at the Island. In all there were 33 patients left behind, making a total of 110 tiny inmates of the Hospital for Sick Children.

Clark's launch and steamer awaited the coming of the children at the foot of Bay street. With such order and precision was the embarkation conducted that it occupied but a few moments. The house surgeons took up their position in the launch and carefully laid the children away as they were carried from the carriages to the wharf. "I won't need much room. I've only one leg now," whispered one little fellow as he was being laid on a couch of cushions.

It was a delightful sail across the water—out through the western channel and along the Island foreshore to the new wharf just built and known as "The Lakeside Home wharf." Not a mishap nor a hurt to anyone.

The people of Toronto take a warm, deep, tender interest in the little patients at the Hospital for Sick Children. But for their generosity, their help, and the help of 30,000 of Toronto's school children it had not been possible to take care of so many sick children at the Home.

Along the streets as the procession passed the sympathizing faces on the sidewalks must surely have possessed some curative power.

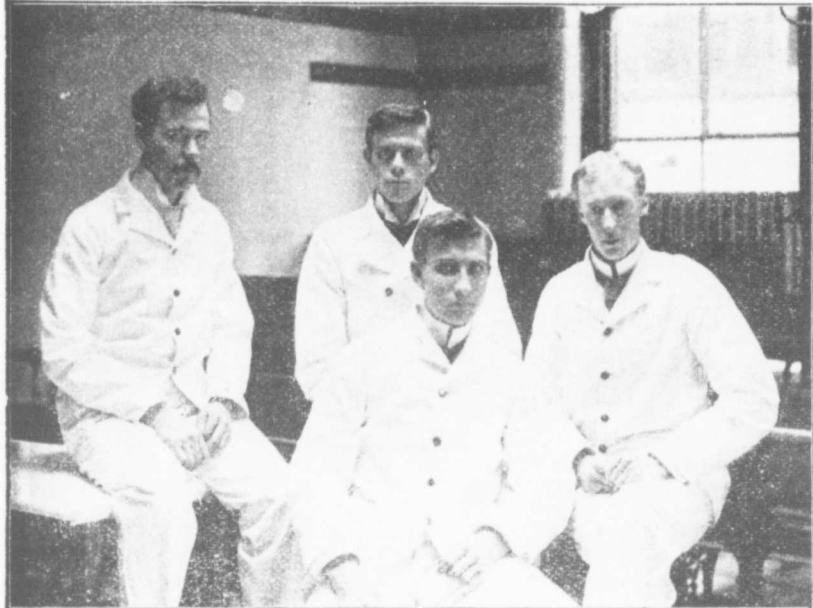

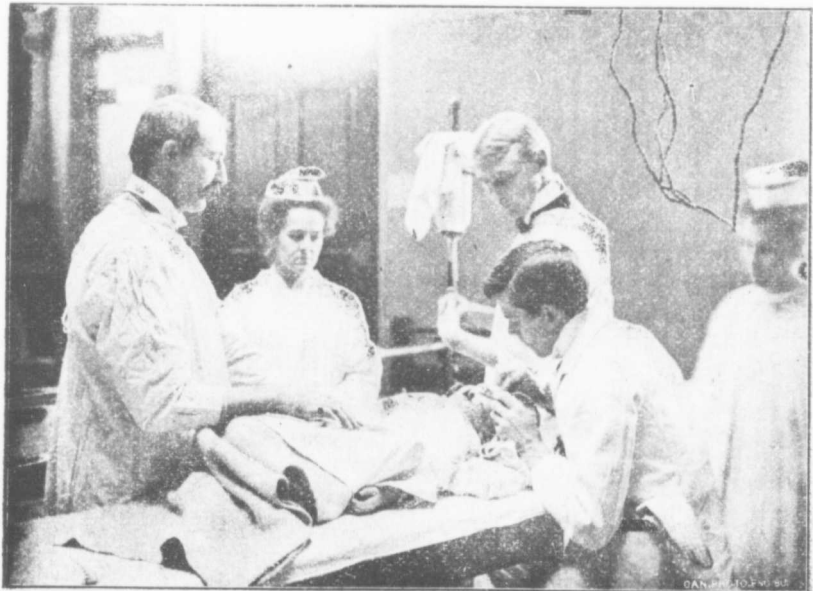
