

The butter market during the past tendays has been rather a disappointment to the merchants in general, for it was expected that prices would be maintained, if not advanced to a higher level than quoted at that time.

On the contrary the feeling is not so strong and dealers report that their sales of this very necessary article of food consumption are much smaller than for some time past.

While the market is quiet, with a lower tendency, there seems to be no possibility of a break in prices at the moment on account of the small stocks in hand, and those who were freely predicting 40 cent butter can hardly expect these figures to be realized.

BUTTER WILL BE
LOWER IN PRICE

In England the same position of affairs exists, only in a more pronounced way. Prices there soared, owing to the scarcity of supplies, to a level unknown in recent years, but while the advance there was exceedingly rapid, the decline came just as quickly.

The public strongly objected to paying the high prices demanded by the retailers, and the consumption fell off to such an extent as to bring about a reaction putting trade on a normal basis once more, after a decline in one week of 5 cents per pound.

The present situation proves conclusively that when the prices are advanced to high levels, it checks the consumption, as the public are strongly adverse to paying anything like the values that grocery-men have been obliged to demand since the beginning of the year.

Stocks in Montreal are none too large, and had it not been for the recent advance checking the demand, there certainly would not have been sufficient butter to supply the requirements of the market until the advent of the new make.
