THE CITY'S LANDS.

Just now while civic matters are engaging the attention of the citizens, a little information in regard to the city lands and their management will not doubt be of general interest. The history of the city lands, if it were written, would make quite interesting reading, and a few points in this way will not be out of place here.

The lands now owned by the city, the revenues of which are paid into the chamberlain for the benefit of the whole city are known as Eastern Lands, Carleton Common Lands, Lancaster. Eastern Lands comprise what is left to the city of the lands granted to it at the time or its charter in 1785. These lands then included all ungranted lands south of Union street and covered a considerable portion of the city. The public squares, market places and military grounds were reserved and a large portion of the lands were drawn by lot by the old soldiers who had settled here. Of what remained of these lands many lots have been disposed of by sale and otherwise till nowthe Eastern Lands are mostly included in a narrow strip extending along the harbor front below Water street and down to the military grounds; and from there to Union street, along Courteney bay and below Pitt street. There are a few lots further up in the city in some parts. By the city charter it was provided that these common lands on the east side of the harbor should be for the use of the

By the city charter it was provided that these common lands on the east side of the harbor should be for the use of the inhabitants of the east side of the harbor only, and that the rents, issues and profits, arising from the sale or other disposal thereof, should be applied for the sole improvement, benefit and advantage of that part of the city on the east side of the harbor, forever.

Seven of them mount 100 ton guns of the Armstrong pattern, and the others are armed with guns that are equally efficient. Besides these powerful ships, Italy has 21 ironclands of the second class, several of which are large enough to cross the ocean. Altogether the Italian navy comprises 238 vessels, with a tonnage of 209-138 tons, armed with 583 guns and manned by 16,786 seamen. Four of the big Italian iron clads could destroy New York and Brooklyn from a point south of Long Island without the possibility of injury from any fortifications which the Americans have there. They could do the same to Portland, Boston, Baltimore and the other cities of the Atlantic coast. San Francisco on the Pacific would be still more open to their attacks. The only inconvenience the Italian navy would suffer from would be the lack of a depot for coal on this side of the Atlantic, but they could easily obtain one by taking possession of some small island on the coast of the United States,

with a good harbor, such as Martha's Vineyard. Once in possession they could not be dislodged, owing to their great superiority in naval strength and from it they could keep the whole coast north of Cape Hatteras in a state of slarm.
